Civil War, brothers Gabriel, David and Cren enlisted in the Federal 1st Vidette Cavalry, Ala-Tenn, Company "D." They were on the Union side; yessir they were YANKEES!

In 1870, Irvin was living with Jazeal and Fannie Tate.

The John Douthit Family

John Douthit, the first Douthit to come to America, came from Coleraine, Ireland in 1724. He settled in Rowan County, North Carolina. John was born May 9, 1709 and married Mary Scott, Feb. 22, 1738. John Douthit was a patriot during the American Revolutionary War and furnished wheat to the militias of North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia. He helped organize and build the first Hope Moravian Church in 1780 at Clemmons, North Carolina. He died in 1784 and was buried in the Old Hope Cemetery, Clemmons, North Carolina.

John Douthit Jr., the second generation, was born April 10, 1740 and died June 9, 1813 in Anderson, South Carolina. John Jr. and Elinor Davis were married March 9, 1764 in Rowan County, North Carolina.

Solomon Douthit, the third generation, was born March 25, 1767 and died Feb. 18, 1836 in Pickens District, South Carolina. His wife Mary died March 1853. Soloman is buried at Mountain Lake Colony. This cemetery is known as Douthit's Cove, South Carolina.

Davis Douthit, the fourth generation, was born Jan. 12, 1796, and he married Ann Masters.

Lorenzo Maxfield Douthit, the fifth generation of the Douthits in America and the only son of Davis and Ann Douthit, was born in South Carolina the year of 1816.

Lorenzo Maxfield and his first wife Quintinia Brummett had four children: Elizabeth was born 1844 in South Carolina and married John C. Lovell, March 27, 1864 in Fannin County, Georgia. Davis was born June 11, 1846 in Fannin County, Georgia. He died August 2, 1921. Davis was married March 22, 1868 to Virginia "Jennie" Knight; she was born August 16, 1852 and died June 23, 1929. They are buried at Mt. Zion Cemetery in Hartman Arkansas. Thomas was born June 30, 1848 in Fannin County, Georgia. He died November 5, 1932. Thomas and his wife "Winney" Emaline Witzel were married March 22, 1868. Winney died Nov. 16, 1926. They are buried at Harmony Baptist Church Cemetery in Fannin County, Ga. Manerva Douthit — record unknown.

Lorenzo Maxfield and his second wife Elizabeth Davis Douthit had three children: Laura was born 1860 and married Thomas F. Elrod, May 28, 1878 in Fannin County, Georgia. Lorenzo Maxfield Jr. was born May 12, 1862 and married Mary Ellen Adeline Patterson on Dec. 2, 1883. They were married at Pearceville, Ga., by William Franklin, M.G. Adeline was born Nov. 27, 1862.

John Harrison Douthit was born April 25, 1867, and died Dec. 5, 1943. He married Rosa Kendrick on Aug. 27, 1892. Rosa died July 25, 1946. They are buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga.

As the Civil War drew near, Lorenzo Maxfield Douthit Sr. enlisted in the Union Army at Cleveland, Tenn., Oct. 20, 1864. He attained the rank of sergeant in Company G, Regiment 5 and was honorably discharged July 13, 1865 in Nashville, Tenn.

Lorenzo Sr., his wife Elizabeth Davis Douthit and children moved to Alaculsv. Ga.. Murray County, shortly after he returned from the Civil War.

Lorenzo Maxfield Jr., the sixth generation of the Douthits in America, his wife Adeline Patterson Douthit, and their children along with the elder Lorenzo Sr. and wife Elizabeth moved from Alaculsy, Ga., to the Little Murray community, then to Cisco, Ga., Murray County. Lorenzo Sr. died on Nov. 25, 1897. His wife Elizabeth died July of 1901. They are buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Georgia.

Lorenzo Douthit Jr. was a timber estimator and buyer for C.C. Brownlee Lumber Company, Cisco, Ga. He was the postmaster of Cisco, Ga., and was a member of Woodmen of the World at Cisco. He was also notary public and a justice of the peace. He died Nov. 30, 1911. His wife Adeline died April 2, 1944. They are buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Georgia.

Lorenzo Jr. and Adeline Douthit had a family of eight children, four sons and four daughters. Davis Roscoe was born Oct. 22, 1884 in Fannin County, Ga. He died Oct. 6, 1958, and is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. Martha Elizabeth was born May 2, 1889 in Fannin Co., Ga. She died Mar. 22, 1966 and is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. Mary Ellen was born Mar. 6, 1891 in Alaculsy, Ga., and died Sept. 16, 1968. She is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. Annie Mae was born Mar. 27, 1893 in Alaculsy, Ga., and died Feb. 4, 1974. She is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. Lorenso Maxfield III (Mack) was born Feb. 28, 1896 in Alaculsy, Ga., and died Feb. 17, 1977. He is buried at Mt. Sumach Cem., Cisco, Ga. Tina Lee Ethel was born Aug. 4, 1900 in Little Murray, Ga. She died Nov. 5, 1984 and is buried at Old Ocoee Cemetery, Benton, Tenn. Thomas Hill was born Feb. 4, 1902 in Murray County Heritage

Little Murray, Ga., and died Nov. 20, 1980. He is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. John Price was born July 28, 1906 in Little Murray, Ga. He died May 13, 1976 and is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga.

Of the eight children only three married. Lorenzo Maxfield III (Mack) married Ova Stout on May 27, 1922 by Sam Higdon, Cisco, Ga. She was the daughter of Marion Richardson and Sarah Nanna Mae Vaughn Stout. Ova died Mar. 15, 1977. Tina Lee Ethel married John Paul Campbell Jr., Oct. 14, 1936. Thomas Hill married Lois Head on April 16, 1931.

Lorenzo Maxfield Douthit III chose to be known as Mack. He is the seventh generation of the Douthits in America. He worked for C.C. Brownlee Lumber Co., Cisco, Ga., He was a farmer, a truck driver for Conasauga River Lumber Co., and Rostex Rug Co., from which he retired in 1961. He was a member of Sumach Masonic Lodge No. 55. Ova was a housewife and later worked at Hopple Textile and Rostex Rug Co., which she retired from in 1964. She was a member of the Eastern Star No. 420 Ocoee, Tenn. Both were of Baptist faith.

Mack and his wife Ova had four children, who are the eighth Douthit generation in America. Phyllis Elizabeth was born Aug. 17, 1923 in Cisco, Ga. She was married Apr. 17, 1943 to James William (Bill) Campbell whose birth date was Mar. 31, 1917. He died May 17, 1979 and was buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II. L.M. Douthit was born Nov. 12, 1926 in Cisco, Ga. He died at the age of 15, Dec. 26, 1941 as a result of a hunting accident. He is buried at Mt. Sumach Cemetery, Cisco, Ga. Florence Wilda was born Feb. 8, 1930 in Cisco, Ga. On April 20, 1956 she married John Roy Brackett; his birth date is Jan. 21, 1925. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II. Marian Maxine was born Sept. 6, 1932 in Cisco, Ga. On April 8, 1955 she married Roy Kersey who was born Feb. 1, 1932 and died Jan. 19, 1973. The Daniel Dunn Family

Sir Daniel and James Dunn were of the Great London Company that promoted the Colony of Virginia. Sir William Dunn-Baronet of Dunn and member of the British Parliament, founder of Dunn, Dunraven, and Dunnsville, descended from some of the ancient kings and chiefs of Scotland.

King Charles the First of England granted titles and arms to the Dunns for military services and loans of money which Daniel and William Dunn made to him in 1625. These Dunns were brothers and had sons by the same names who came to Virginia from London.
