 I give to my Granddaughter Eliza Rhodes, my newest dressing glass, the toilet & Basin upstairs, one toilet case, one pair sheets & one pair Blankets; to her then heirs forever.
 I give to my Granddaughter Rachel Singelton, my best Hexagon quilt, one pair sheets, my yellow straw bottomed sitting chairs; to her then heirs forever.
 I give my Granddaughter Sarah Lawton, one Feather Bed, one Bolster & two Pillows, (already delivered) my feathered quilt & four dishes, to her and her heirs forever.
 I give to my Granddaughter Adeline Robert, my summer seat containing two acres of land & the Buildings, my new patchwork quilt, to her then heirs forever.
 I give my Granddaughter Martha Amanda Lawton, my Regis Seal Horni-
 shell, Sam's eldest daughter, the bedstead on which I sleep with
 the Valance attached thereto, my Hawaiian Counterpane, my black
 candlesticks, flower pots, Rocking chair, best dam silver tea spoons
 (last bought) silver sugar tongs, Basin & Goblet in my room, one toilet
 case & her choice of my trunks; to her and her heirs forever.

 silver teaspoons, marked L. my new Bonnet, the remaining half of
 my clothes, my Tea kettle & Chafin dish, my Teakettle, dalled bowl, my
 hand-ker quilt, and all household & kitchen furniture (except the
 large iron pot.) not directed particularly to any other, to her then heirs
 forever.
 4th I give to my daughter-in-law Lucinda Lawton ten dollars, with which
 I desire she will purchase some furniture for the use of her family;
 to her and her heirs forever.
 5th I desire it to be remembered that it is not for want of parental affec-
 tion that I do not place the family of my deceased son William on the
 same footing, in the distribution of my small estate, with my surviv-
 ing sons. They are abundantly blessed with the goods of this world,
 & do not need it. They have been affectionate and attentive children
 to me.
 6th With the same feelings & views, moreover because her grandfather,
 my late husband, has left her a special legacy at my death, I have
 not bequeathed any thing to my Granddaughter Anna Briskard.
 7th I give to my son Alexander S. Lawton, my horse Perry, my interest
 in the stock of hogs, saw gin, horse Corn mill stones, plantation tools,
 & complements of husbandry & house supplies; to him & his heirs forever.
 8th I desire the four pictures in the parlour to be bought at a reasonable
 price, & I devise them to Sarah Flournoy, my Granddaughter.
