

Benjamin Watts was living in McKeever's district on Mulberry Fork 1803-1805 and he and the orphans of Thomas were listed in the 1805 lottery, and Benjamin in Cochran's district (same area) in 1807. In 1813 the first Methodist Church in what is now Gwinnett County was built near Benjamin's home, and in 1814 William Watts served under Capt. Joseph Whorton at Fort Daniel (Flanigan, History of Gwinnett County, pps. 11,419). Also enumerated in 1820 in Jackson County was William (No. 939); in Gwinnett County Richard J. (No. 546) and Pope H. (No. 644); in Madison County, William; in Walton County, Thomas; in Clarke County, Littleberry; in Jasper County, Leadwell; in Morgan County, Jabez E., Jacobus, John, Mary, Pleasant, Thomas and Thomas B.; in Habersham County, Anne Watt; and various others over the state. In 1827, Benjamin F. was in Morgan County, Henry in Fayette County; Richard J., veteran of the War of 1812, in Gwinnett County; and in 1832, George Watts, a Revolutionary veteran, of DeKalb County, drew Cherokee County land granted 1834. Capt. Jacobus Watts died in DeKalb County May 20, 1825, aged 53; he had lived in Greene and Morgan Counties before moving to DeKalb. Richard and Thomas Watts were taxed 1785 in Hagan's Wilkes County district. Richard was dead by May 5, 1817 when William H. Watts and others were appointed administrators. He left widow Elizabeth and several children, including Richard H. and Nancy S., for whom William Watts was guardian, and Elizabeth, for whom Thomas Watts was guardian. A number of marriages are found from 1796 in Oglethorpe and Wilkes Counties, although the family appears to have scattered by 1820, none being enumerated in either county. An early Virginia family, its members were found in Southside Virginia as early as 1758 and by the 1780s in Bedford, Pittsylvania, Halifax, Franklin, as well as Culpepper, Albemarle and other counties; in Granville County, N.C., by 1755; and in Abbeville District, S.C. by 1788, when Samuel Watts was granted land. Several of the family were enumerated in Abbeville in 1790 and in Pendleton (where Samuel had several tracts) in 1800. Rather sketchy evidence indicates the families in this area were related to the groups in the Wilkes-Rockingham Counties, N.C., and Bedford-Pittsylvania Counties, Va., areas. (See pension papers of Benjamin, Va., Elizabeth, R 11217 and numerous others in Virginia and the Carolinas, Maryland, etc.)

Properly Turberville — the clerk in Jones County also had trouble with this name, spelling Nathaniel's name as Turbwille. The name was originally D'Urbeville, as in Tess of the —. The family arrived in Virginia c1680; among its members was the distinguished Maj. George Lee Turberville of the Revolution, and Richard Turbayell left a will in Bertie Precinct, N.C., 1726. Taple and George Turbeville were residents of Georgetown, S.C., in 1790. The spelling of the name has extreme variations, reaching even Tubbyfill.

Thomas was in McKeever's district of Jackson County in 1803, and was joined in 1804 by Edward. The family was in Wilkes County by 1788 and in 1790 one Thomas of Laurens District, S.C., lived near a family later in Jackson County. William, above, perhaps married a Hogan girl, as he was named a legatee of the estate of Shadrack Hogan, a family in Wilkes and Jackson Counties. In 1827, one William was in Fayette County, and William S. was in Hancock County, where a Thomas was enumerated in 1820.
