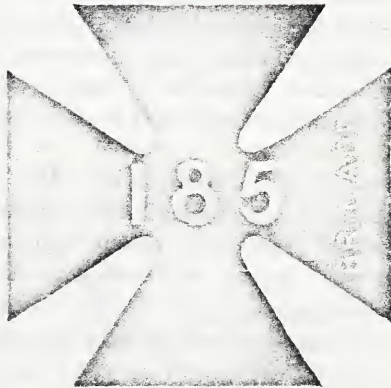

## COMRADES:

Since the publication of the Company rolls last spring, the Roster of the Regiment has been thoroughly revised by means of correspondence, interviews with officers and men of the regiment, and by a careful examination of the muster and muster-out rolls in the Adjutant General's office in Albany. The revised Roster is published at the request of the Executive Committee, and each man in the regiment will be furnished with a copy, so far as practicable.

## Abstract

The purpose of this study was to determine the effect of a 12-week resistance training program on the strength and endurance of the lower extremities in healthy young adults. The subjects were 20 male and 20 female college students, aged 18-25, who were randomly assigned to either a resistance training group or a control group. The resistance training group performed a 12-week program of resistance training, while the control group did not. The subjects were tested at baseline and at the end of the 12-week program. The tests included a 100m sprint, a 400m sprint, a 800m sprint, a 1600m sprint, a 3200m sprint, a 6400m sprint, a 12800m sprint, and a 25600m sprint. The results showed that the resistance training group had significantly better performance in all of the sprint tests compared to the control group. The improvement was most pronounced in the 100m and 400m sprints, where the resistance training group was significantly faster. The improvement was also significant in the 800m, 1600m, and 3200m sprints, but less pronounced in the 6400m, 12800m, and 25600m sprints. The results suggest that a 12-week resistance training program can improve the strength and endurance of the lower extremities in healthy young adults.
