By the laws of this State, the Freenen in the counties of New-London and Windham, are to meet in their respective towns on the second Tucsday of September annually; those in the counties of Hartford, New-Haven, Fairfield and Litchfield, on the third Tuesday of September annually, to choose twenty gentlemen to stand in nomination for Assistants, and twelve to stand in nomination for Delegates in Congress; which nominations are printed and sent to each town in the State; and on the Monday next following the first Tuesser.

men's Meeting throughout the State, when twelve gentlemen out of the twenty in nomination for Assistants are chosen Assistants for that year, and seven out of the nomination for Delegates are chosen Delegates, any sive of whom to serve in Congress for that year.

At the above meeting in April, the Governor and Lieut. Governor are chosen out of the freemen at large. The qualifications for Freemen are, that they be

The qualifications for Freemen are, that they be at least twenty-one years of age, possessed of freehold estate to the value of 40s. per ann. or £.40 personal estate in the general list of estates in that year wherein they desire to be admitted Freemen; or are possessed of estate as aforesaid, and by law excused from tutting it into the list; and being of quiet and peaceable behaviour, and producing a certificate thereof from the selectmen of the town that they are thus qualified, are intitled to take the Freemen's oath, which must be done in open Freemen's Meeting; but previous to this they must have taken the oath of sidelity to the State.]

South-Carolina,

A general Description of America.

HIS great western continent, frequently denominated the new world, extends from the 80th degree north, to the 50th degree of south latitude, and where its breadth is known, from the 35 to the 140th degree of west longitude, from

London, stretching between 8 and 9000 miles in

length, and in its greatest breadth 3690. It fees both hemispheres, has two summers and a double winter, and enjoys all the variety of climates which the earth affords. It is washed by the two great oceans. To the eastward it has the Atlantic, which divides it from Europe and Africa. To the west it has the Pacific, or great south sea. by which it is separated from Asia. By these seas, it may, and does, carry on a direct commerce with the other three parts of the world. It is composed of two great continents, one on the north, the other upon the fouth, which are joined by the kingdom of Mexico, which forms a fort of istmus 1,000 miles long, and in one part of Darien, so extremely narrow, as to make the communication between the two oceans by no means difficult, being only 60 miles over. In the great gulph, which is formed between the isthmus and the northern and fouthern continents, lie an infinite multitude of fflands, many of them large, most of them fertile, and denominated the west Indies, in contradiffinction to the countries and islands of Asia, beyond the Cape of Good Hope, which are called the east Indies.

The DEFINITIVE TREATY

Between Great-Britain and the United States of

America; fight'd at Paris, Sept. 3, 1783.

In the Name of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity.

Thaving pleased the divine Providence to dispose the hearts of the Most Screne and Most Potent Prince George the Third, thy the Grace of God King of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, Duke of Brunswick and Lunenburgh, Arch-Treasurer and Prince Elector of the Holy Roman Empire &c. and of the United States of America, to forget all past misunderstandings and differences that have unhappily interrupted the good correspondence and friendship which they mutually wish to restore and to establish such a beneficial and satisfactory intercourse between the two countries, upon the ground of reciprocal advantages and mutual convenience, as may promote and secure to both perpetual peace and harmony; and having for this desirable end already laid the foundation of peace and reconciliation, by the Provisional Articles figned at Paris on the 30th of November, 1782, by the Commissioners empowered on each part, which Articles were agreed to be inferted in, and to constitute the Treaty of peace proposed to be concluded between the Crown of Great-Britain and the faid United States, but which Treaty was not to be concluded until terms of Peace should be agreed upon between Great-Britain and France! and his Britannic Majesty should be ready to conclude fuch Treaty accordingly : and the Treaty between Great Britain and France having fince been concluded, his Britannic Majesty and the United States of America, in order to carry into

full effect the Provisional. Articles above-mentioned, according to the tenor thereof, have conftituted and appointed, that is to fay, his Britanuic Majesty on his part, David Hartley, Esq; Member of the parliament of Great-Britain, and the faid United States on their part, John Adams, Efg; late a Commissioner of the United States of America at the Court of Versailles, late Delegate in Congress from the State of Massachusetts, and Chief Juffice of the faid State, and Minister Plenipotentiary of the faid United States to their High Mightinesses the States General of the United Netherlands; Benjamin Franklin, Efg; late Delegate in Congress, from the State of Pennsylvania, Presidents of the Convention of the said State, & Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America at the Court of Verfailles : and John Jay, Esq; late President of Congress, and Chief Justice of the State of New-York, and Minister Plenipotentiary from the faid United States at the Court of Madrid, to be the Plenipotentiaries for concluding and figning the present definitive treaty; who, after having reciprocally communicated their respective full powers; have agreed upon and confirmed the following Articles.

AET. I. His Britannic Majesty acknowledges the said. United States; viz. New-Hampshire, Massachusetts. Bay, Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations, Connecticut, New-York, New-Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virgiair, North-Carolina, South-Carolina, and Georgia, to be free, sovereign, and independent States; that he treats with them as such, and for himself, his heirs and successors, relinquishes all claims to the government, propriety, and territorial rights of the same, and every part thereof

ART. H. And that all disputes which might arise in future on the subject of the boundaries of the faid United States may be prevented, it is hereby agreed and declared, that the following are and shall be their boundaries, viz. From the North-west angle of Nova-Scotia, viz. That angle which is formed by a line drawn due north from the source of St. Croix River to the Highlands, along the faid Highlands, which divide those rivers that empty themselves into the river St. Lawrence, from those which fall into the Atlantic Ocean, to the North-westernmost head of Connecticut-River; thence down along the middle of that river to the forty-fifth degree of north latitude; from thence by a line due west on said latitude, until it Arikes the river Iroquois or Cataraquy thence along the middle of the faith is ver into Lake Ontario; through the middle of faid lake until it strikes the communication by water between that lake and Lake Erie; thence along the middle of faid communication into Lake Erie; through the middle of faid lake, until it arrives at the water communication between that lake and Lake Huron, thence through the middle of faid lake to the water communication between that lake and Lake Superior; thence through Lake Superior northward of the Isles Royal and Philipeaux to the Long Lake; thence through the middle of faid Long Lake and the water communication between it and the Lake of the Woods, to the said Lake of the Woods; thence through the faid Lake to the most northwestern point thereof, and from thence on a due west course to the River Missisppi; thence by a line to be drawn along the middle of the faid Ri-

ver Missinppi, until it shall intersect the northernmost part of the thirty-first degree of north latitude. South, by a line to be drawn due east from the determination of the line last mentioned in the latitude of thirty-one degrees north of the equator, to the middle of the River Apalachichola or Catahouche; thence along the middle thereof to its junction with the Flint-river: thence ftraight to the head of St. Mary's River; and thence down along the middle of St. Mary's River to the Atlantic Ocean. East, by a line to be drawn along the middle of the River St. Croix from its mouth in the Bay of Fundy, to its fource, and from its fource directly north to the aforesaid Highlands which divide the rivers that fall into the Atlantic Ocean from those which All into the River St. Lawrence, comprehending all islands within twenty leagues of any part of the shores of the United States, and lying between lines to be drawn due east from the points where the aforesaid boundaries between Nova-Scotia on the one part, and East-Florida on the other, shall respectively touch the Bay of Fundy and the Atlantic Ocean, excepting fuch islands as now are or heretofore have been within the limits of the faid Province of Nova-Scotia-

Ant. III. It is agreed that she people of the United States shall continue to enjoy unmoleded the right to take sish of evory kind on the Grand Bank, and on all the other banks of Nawsoundland, also in the Gulph of St. Lawrence, and all other places in the fea, where the inhabitants of both countries used at any time heretofore to sish: And also, that the inhabitants of the United States shall have liberty to take sish of every kind on such part of the coast of Newsoundland as british sishermen shall use (but not to day or core the same on that Island) and also on the toaste, bays and creeks of all his Restannic Majesty's dominions in America; and that the America

can historien shall have liberty to dry and cure fish in any of the unfertled bays, harboure and creeks of Nova-Scotia, Mig alen Maode and Labrador, for long as the fame shall remain unfertiled; but so soon as the fame or either of them shall be ettled, it shall not be lamful for the said sishe men to dry or cure sish at such settlement, without a previous agreement so that purpose with the inhabitants, proprietors or possessor of the ground.

An. IV. It agreed that the creditors on either fide first meet with no lawful impediment to the recovery of the full value, in testing money, of all bina fide debts heretofore contracted.

An Toy Val. It it agrand that Congress faill earnefily recommend it to the Ergiffatures of the respective States, to covide for the remifution of all effactor, rights and properties, which have been confi cated, belonging to real British fubjects; and also of the offaces, rights and properties of persons resident in diffeidte in possession of his Majeste's arme, and who have not boine arms againft the faid United States; and that perfone of any other description that! have free liberty to go to any part or parts of the Thirteen United States, and therein to remain twelve months unmolested in their endeavours to obtain the refrigution of fuch of their effater, rights and properties, as may have been confifcated ; and that Congress shall also caraufily recommand to the feveral flates a re confideration and evision of all Ade or Laws respecting the premites, fo as to rouder the faid Acteur Lews perfectly confifent, not only with juffice and equity, but with that fairlt of conciliation, which, on the return of the bleffings of peace foodld univerfally preveil: And that Congress that also carnefly recommend to the several fraces, that the effeter, rights and proporties of fuch last mentioned pa-fone fixel be reflored to them, they refunding to any persons who may now be in posse fin the bono fide price ( where any has been given) which fuch perfore may have paid on purchafing any of the faid lands, rights or properties fines the confeation. And it is agreed, that all perfore who may have any interest in conditented lands, either by debts, marriager fittlements, or otherwife, thall most with no lewful impediments in the profecution of their just rights.

Arroll. That there shall be no future confiscations made, nor any profecutions commenced egainst any person or persons for, or by reason of the part which have they may have taken in the present war; and that no person shall, on that account,

uffer any future loss or damage, e ther in his perfon, libertys property : and that those who may be in confinement on uch charges, at the time of the ratification of the Treaty in America fhall be immediately fet at liberty, and the profecu-

ion fo commenced be discontinued.

ART. VII. There shall be a firm and perpetual peace be. tween his Britannic Majefty and the faid flates, and between the furieds of the one, and the citizens of the other; wherefore all hoffilities both by fea and land faail, from henceforth. ceafe ; all prifonere un both fides fatt be fet at liberty, and his Britannic Mojeft, fall, with all convenient fpeed, and without caufing any defruction, or carrying a way any Neg oca or other property of the American inhabitante, withdraw all his armies, garrifons and fi ere from the filb U-ired States, and from every poft, place and harbour wishin the fame, leaving in all fortifications the American artitlery that may be therein ; and thall also order and cause all sech eves, becorde, deeds, and rapers belonging to any of the faid flates, or their citizens, which in the course of the war may have fallen into the h nos of his officere, to be forthwith reflered, and delivered to the proper flates and perfone to whom they belong.

ART. VIII. The navigation of the river M finion, from its fources o the ocean, thall forever remain free and open to the Subjects of Great-Britain, and the citizens of the United States. ART. 4X. In case it should so happen that any place or territory belonging to Great Britain, or to the United States, should have been conquered by the arms of either from the other, before the arrival of the faid Provinonal Articles in America, it is agreed that the fame feall be reffered without

difficulty, and wishout requiring any compensation.

ART. X. The folemn Ratifications of the prefent Treaty. expedited in good and due form, thall be exchanged between the contracting Parties in the frace of fix months, or fooner, if pollible; to be computed from the der of the fanature of the prefent Freaty. "In winnel whereof we the underfiened. their Minifters Plenipotentiary, bave in their name, and in virtue of our fall powers, ligned with our hands the prefent Defi fitive Treaty, and caufed the Seals of our Arme to be af-Done at Pasis, Septemberigd, 1784. fixed thereto.



[By the laws of this state, the Freemen in the counties of New-London and Windham, are to meet in their respective towns on the second Tuesday of September annually; those in the counties of Hartford, New-Haven, Fairfield, Litchfield and Middlesex, on the third Tuesday of September annually, to choose twenty gentlemen to stand in nomination for Assistants, and twelve to stand in nomination for Delegates in Congress; which nominations are printed and sent to each town in the state; and on the Monday next following the first Tuesday in April annually, is Freemen's Meeting throughout the state, when twelve gentlemen out of the twenty in

nomination for Assistants are chosen Assistants for that year, and seven out of the nomination for Delegates are chosen Delegates, any sive of whom to serve in Congress for that year.

At the above meeting in April, the Governor and Lieutenant-Governor are chosen out of the Freemen

at large.

The qualifications for Freemen are, that they be at least twenty-one years of age, possessed of freehold estate to the value of 40s. per ann. or £.40 personal estate in the general list of estates in that year wherein they desire to be admitted Freemen; or are possessed of estate as aforesaid, and by law excused from putting it into the list; and being of quiet and peaceable behaviour, and producing a certificate thereof from the select-men of the town that they are thus qualished, are intitled to take the Freeman's outh, which must be done in open Freemen's Meeting; but previous to this they must have taken the oath of sidelity to the state.

A short description of NEW-ENGLAND.

The general Name, NEW ENGLAND, comprehends the present STATES of

New-Hampshire,
Massachusetts.

RHODE-ISLAND AND PRO VIDENCE PLANTATIONS, And CONNECTICUT.

THE first effectual settlement of Europeans in this tract of Country, was made at the town of Plymouth (or New Plymouth, as it was then called ) A. D. 1620, by some English people, wbo, to awoid perfecution in England, fled to Holland, and afterwards removed to America. They landed at Cape Cod in the month of November, and suffered, during the winter, almost incredible bardships. Upon their arrival, they drew up a writing, in which they recognized King James as their King, formed themfelves into se a civil body politic," for the purpose of government, and thus laid the foundation of the Colony of New Plymouth. About the same time a Corporation was erested in England by the name of " The Council established at Plymouth, in the County of Co Devon, for the planting, ruling, ordering and governing of New-England;" to whom the King gave all the country from the 40th to the 48th degree of north latitude, by a patent bearing date November 3d, 1620. This Council retained the powers granted them by the crown, until the year 1635, when they resigned their charger, bawing first made many grants of land to adventurers who peoposed forming lettlements in New England ; among others they g anted the Province of Main, to Robert Gorges, in 1622, Mo Jachusette-Bay to Sir Henry Rofwell, Sc. in 1627, Se. Ge. Plymouth Colony and Maffachuffetts, were the mis respectable fettlements which were made in confequence of thefe grants :

alshough the former was the oldest, the latter foon became in most populous; and emigrants from it settled upon the Riva Cennedicut, and laid the foundation of the Colony of the name, so early as about the year 1635. Hartford was the capital of Connecticut, as New-Haven was of New Have Colony, which was founded about the same time. The Dutch who had stated at Manhattans (now New York) had a trading bouse at Hartford, and considered both that place and New-Haven as within their limits, and subject to their jurification. This occasioned some unrassins, and as the native Indians also were very troubless, me, the Reglish found usion among themselves essential to their sofety, and therefore, in the year 1643, the four Colonies of

Plymouth, Connecticu', and Mossacbusetts, New Haven,

agreed upon Articles of Confederation, whereby a Congression formed, confishing of two Commissioners from each Colony, who were confishered as the Representatives of 4: The United Colonies of New England. The powers delegated to the Commissioners were much the same as these now possified by Congress; and were exercised by them till about the time of the Revolution in England.

### Of New-Hampshire.

This flats was granted by the Council of Plymouth, to Capt. John M yon: The capital of it is Pottlmouth, situate upon the River Piscataquo, which has a very fine barbour, and this, indeed, is the only port of any consequence in the State.

#### Of MASSACHUSETTS.

The flate of Massachusetts comprehends the colony of Massachusetts Bay, granted by the Council of Plymenth, to Respond and others, in 1627; the colony of Plymouth, granted by the same Council, to William Braciford, in 1629; and, the Province of Main, granted by the same Council to Robert Gorges, in 1622. The two latter, together with the territory of Sagadebick, were annexed to the sprear by a Royal Charter dated October 7th, 1691. Boston is the capital of this state, it is built upon a peninsula of an irregular form, at the bottom of a large bay, contains about 2000 dwelling bouses, and

## Of RHODE-ISLAND and PROVIDENCE PLANTATIONS.

The first settlers of this state, were inhabitants of some of the other New England Colonies, from whence they removed on account of a difference in their religious sentiments. Some of them fixed themselves at Providence, and others on Rhode-Island; and their settlements were diffinguished by the names of Providence and Rhode-Island Plantations. The town of Providence was the capital of the former, and Newport of the latter; but in the 15th of Char. It. a charter passed the Great Seal, uniting the two stitlements under the same government, by the name of "The English Colony of Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations."

### Description of CONNECTICUT.

Length - 90 between { Degrees. 40 and 43 N. Lat. 72 and 74 W. Long.

TICUT and NEW-HAVEN, and is divided into eight Counties, viz: Hartford, New Haven, Nem-London, Fai field, Windham, Litchfield, Middlefex and Tolland.

The face of the country is generally very uneven, and in many places extremely firm, yet the foil is fartile, and the produce plentiful: the latter confifts of what, rye, indian corn, oats, barley, flax, hemp. Sc. The large quantities of paffure and moving grounds which this fixte affo ds, enable the inhabitants to roife great numbers of neat cattle and horfer, many of which are driven to other places, or fant to the West Indias for falt. Their principal exports, besides live cattle and horses, are sheep, salted pork (for which Connessicut is samous) and beef, lumber, pot and pearl offer, sax sed, Sc. in return for which they usually receive European and East and West India goods.

The old Colony of Connecticut was originally festled by emigrants from Massachusetts-Bay, about the year 1635; and in 1662 the colony of New Haven was united with it, and the common name Connecticut given to both. Since fi

Junion the fate bas bad two capitals, Hartford and New-Haven, which are, alternately, the feet of government. The former is situated on Connecticut River, 50 miles from the sea, and contains between 4 and 500 bouser, which are mestly built of wood (as the bouses in New-England generally ars) but bave a neat appearance. The latter contains about 500 bouset, and is situated on the found which divides Connecticut from Long-Island. This city is neat and regular, but as it lies in an bollow, cannot be feen from any great diffance. In 1700 a college was founded bere, salled Yale College, wbich at present is respectable among the American Universities .-The Rev. Dr. Ezra Stiles is prefident.

Connecticut is bounded on the north by Maffachusetts, on the east by Rhode Island, on the west by New-York, and on the fouth by Long-Island found.

Besides the cities of Hartford and New-Haven, three others bave been lately incorporated, viz.

New-London, fisuated at the mouth of the river Thomes,

which bas the best barbour in Connecticut.

Middletown, elegantly fituated on the weft bank of Con-

Norwich, a manufacturing town, 14 miles diftant from New-London, and fituated on a branch of the river Themes, called Sbetuckes.

The principal rivers in the state are, the Connecticut, Thames, and Housatonick or Stratford River. The first is above 300 miles in length.

The number inhabitants is estimated at 220,000, whereof 6000 are Indians and Negroes.

All religions, not inconfiftent with the peace and good order of the Bate, are tolerated bere.

The General Court or Assembly, in which the supreme legislative authority of the flate is wested, confifts of two branches, called the Upper and Lower Houses. The upper boufe is composed of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and twelve Affiftants, all chofen annually by the Freemen; and the lower bouse confifts of the Representatives of the towns, most of which fend two, the others one : these are chosen twice in a year. The flated times for bolding the General Tembly, is May and October.

FREEMEN'S MEETINGS in the State of Con-NECTICUT, as established by law, viz.

IN the counties of New-London, Windham and Tolland, on the fecond Tuesday in September. In the counties of Hartford, New-Haven, Fair field, Litchfield and Middlesex, on the third Tuesday in September. And in every town in the State, on the Monday next following the first Tuesday in April, at 90° clock in the morning.

The qualifications for Freemen are, that they be at least twenty-one years of age, possessed of freehold estate to the value of 40s per ann. or £. 40 personal estate in the general list of estates in that year wherein they desire to be admitted Freemen; or are possessed of estate as aforesaid, and by law excused from putting it into the list; and being of quiet and peaceable behaviour, and producing a certificate thereof from the select men of the town that they are thus qualified, are intitled to take the Freeman's oath, which must be done in open Freemen's Meeting; but previous to this they must have taken the oath of stately to the state,

The 1st of January and July annually, is the time for each retailer and consumer to make out

his manifest.

## CONSTITUTION of the UNITED STATES of AMERICA.

We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect union, chablish justice, infure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and fecure the blef fings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

ARTICLE I.

Sed. 1. ALL legislative powers herein granted, shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall confist of a Senate and House of Representatives. Sed. 2. The House of Representatives shall be compoled of members cholen every fecond year by the people of the feveral states; and the electors, in each state shall have the qualifications requifite for electors of the most numerous branch of the state legislature.

No person shall be a representative who shall not have attained to the age of twenty-five years, and been feven

years a citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an inhabitant of that state in which he shall be chosen.

Representatives and direct taxes shall be apportioned among the feveral flates which may be included within this Union, according to their respective numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole number of free persons, including those bound to service for a term of years. and excluding Indians not taxed, three-fifths of all other perfons. The actual enumeration shall be made within three years after the first meeting of the Congress of the United States, and within every subsequent term of ten years, in fuch manner as they shall by law direct. The number of representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand, but each state shall have at least one representative : and until such enumeration shall be madethe state of New Hampshire shall be entitled to chuse three. Massachusetts eight, Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations one. Connecticut five, New-York fix, New-Jersey four. Pennsylvania eight, Delaware one, Maryland six, Virginia ten, North-Carolina five, South-Carolina five, and Georgia three.

When vacancies happen in the representation from any state, the executive authority thereof shall issue writs of

election to fill such vacancies.

The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other officers; and shall have the sole power of im-

peachment.

Sect. 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two senators from each state, chosen by the legislature thereof, for six years: and each senator shall have one vote.

Immediately after they shall be assembled in consequence of the first election, they shall be divided as equally as may be into three classes. The seats of the senators of the first class shall be vacated at the expiration of the second year, of the second class at the expiration of the fourth year, and of the third class at the expiration of the fixth year, so that one third may be chosen every second year: and if vacancies happen by resignation, or otherwise, during the recess of the Legislature of any state, the Executive thereof may

make temporary appointments until the next meeting of the Legislature, which shall then fill such vacancies.

No person shall be a senztor who shall not have attained to the age of thirty years, and been nine vea wentizen of the United States, and who shall not, the interest and inhabitant of that State for which he is the

The Vice-President of the United States the President dent of the Senate, but shall have no vote, under a

equally divided.

The Senate shall choose their other officers, and also President pro tempore, in the absence of the Vice-President, or when he hall exercise the office of Prefident of the United States.

The Senate shall have the fole power to try all impeach ments. When fitting for that purpose they shall be on oath or affirmation. When the Prefident of the United States is tried, the Chief Juffice shall prefide: And no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two thirds of the members prefent.

Judgment in cases of impeachment shall not extend farther than to removal from office, and difqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor, trust or profit under the United States; but the party convicted fhall nevertheless be liable and subject to indictment, trial, judgment and punishment, according to law.

Sed. 4. The times, places and manner of holding elections for fenators and reprefentatives, shall be prescribed in each flate by the legislature thereof; but the Corgress may at any time by law make or alter fuch regulations, except

as to the places of chooling Senators.

The Congress shall affemble at least once in every year. and fuch meeting shall be on the first Monday in December, unless they hall by law appoint a different day.

Sea. s. Each house shall be the judge of the elections returns and qualifications of its own members, and a majority of each shall constitute a quorum to do business : but a smalle number may adjourn from day to day, and may be authori fed to compel the attendance of abfent members, in fuch manner, and under fuch penalties a seach house may provide Each house may determine the rules of its proceedings; punish its members for diforderly behaviour, and with the

Each house shall keep a journal of its proceedings, and from time to time publish the same, excepting such parts as may in their judgment require secrecy: and the yeas and nays of the members of either house on any question shall at the desire of one fifth of those present, be entered on the journal.

Neither house, during the session of Congress, shall, without the consent of the other, adjourn for more than three days, nor to any other place than that in which the two

houses shall be sitting.

Sec. 6. The fenators and representatives shall receive a compensation for their services, to be ascertained by law, and paid out of the treasury of the United States. They shall in all cases, except treason, selony and breach of peace, be privileged from arrest during their attendance at the selfion of their respective houses, and in going to and returning from the same; and for any speech or debate in either house, they shall not be questioned in any other place.

No senator or representative shall, during the time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil office under the authority of the United States, which shall have been created, or the emoluments whereof shall have been encreated during such time; and no person holding any office under the United States. shall he a member of either house during the united States. shall he a member of either house during the United States.

ring his continuance in office (...

Sea. 7. All bills for raising revenue shall originate in the house of representatives: but the scuate may propose

or concur with amendments as on other bills.

Every bill which shall have passed the house of representatives and the senate, shall, before it become a law, be presented to the President of the United States. If he approve he shall sign it, but if not he shall return it, with his objections to that house in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it. If after such reconsideration two-thirds of that house shall agree to pass the bill, it shall be sent, together with the objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered, and if approved by two thirds of that house, it shall become a law. But in all

fuch cases the votes of both houses shall be determined by yeas and nays, and the names of the persons voting for and agis st the bill, shall be entered on the journal of each house frespectively. It any bill shall not be returned by the President within ten days (Sundays excepted) after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law, in like manner as if he had signed it, unless the Congress by their adjournment prevent its return, in which case it shall not be a law.

Every order, resolution, or vote to which the concurrence of the senate and house of representatives may be necessary (except on a question of adjournment) shall be presented to the President of the United States; and before the same shall take effect, shall be approved by him, or being disapproved by him, shall be repassed by two thirds of the senate and house of representatives, according to the rules and limitations prescribed in the case of a bill.

Sect. 8. The Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes, duties, imposts and excises, to pay the debts and provide for the common desence and general welfare of the United States: but all duties, imposts and excises.

shall be uniform throughout the United States.

To borrow money on the credit of the United States.

To regulate commerce with foreign nations, and among the feveral states, and with the Indian tribes.

To establish an uniform rule of naturalization, and uniform laws on the subject of bankrupcies throughout the United States.

To coin money, regulate the value thereof, and of foreign coin, and fix the standard of weights and measures.

To provide for the punishment of counterfeiting the securities and current coin of the United States.

To establish post offices and post roads.

To promote the progress of science and useful arts, by securing for limited times to authors and inventors the exclusive right to their respective writings and discoveries.

To constitute tribunals inferior to the supreme court.

To define and punish piracies and felonies committed on the high seas, and offences against the law of nations

To declare war, grant letters of marque and reprifal, and make rules concerning captures on land and water.

To raise and support armies: but no appropriations of money to that use shall be for a longer term than two years.

To provide and maintain a navy.

To make rules for the government and regulation of

the land and naval forces.

To provide for calling forth the militia to execute the laws of the union, suppress insurrections and repel invasions.

To provide for organizing, arming and disciplining the

militia, and for governing fuch part of them as may be employed in the fervice of the United States, referving to the States respectively, the appointment of the officers, and the authority of training the militia according to the

discipline prescribed by Congress.

To exercife exclusive legislation in all cases whatsoever, over such district (not exceeding ten miles square) as may, by cossion of particular States, and the acceptance of Congress, become the seat of government of the United States, and to exercise like authority over all places purchased by the consent of the legislature of the state in which the same shall be, for the erection of forts, magazines, arsenals, dock-yards, and other needful buildings—And

To make all laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into execution the foregoing powers, and all other powers vested by this constitution in the government of the United States, or in any department or officer thereof.

Sect. 9. The migration or importation of such persons as any of the states now existing shall think proper to admit, shall not be prohibited by the Congress prior to the year one thousand eight hundred and eight, but a tax or duty may be imposed on such importation, not exceeding ten dollars for each person.

The privilege of the writ of habers corpus shall not be sufpended, unless when in cases of rebellion or invasion the

public fafety may require it.

No bill of attainder or ex post facto law shall be passed. No capitation or other direct tax shall be laid, unless in proportion to the census or enumeration herein before directed to be taken.

No tax or duty shall be laid on articles exported from any state.

No preference shall be given by any regulation of com-

merce or revenue to the ports of one state over those of another, nor shall vessels bound to or from one state be obliged to enter, clear, or pay duties in another.

No money shall be drawn from the treasury, but in confequence of appropriations made by law; and a regular statement and account of the receipts and expenditures of all public money shall be published from time to time.

No title of nobility shall be granted by the United States. And no person holding any office of profit or trust under them, shall, without the consent of the Congress, accept of any present, emolument, office, or title, of any kind whatever, from any king, prince, or foreign state.

Sea. 10. No state shall enter into any treaty, alliance or confederation, grant letters of mark and reprisal, coin money, emit bills of credit, make any thing but gold and filver coin a tender in payment of debts, pass any bill of attainder, ex post facto law, or law impairing the obliga-

tion of contracts, or grant any title of nobility.

No state shall, without the consent of Congress, lay any imposts or duties on imports or exports, except what may be absolutely necessary for executing its inspection laws, and the nett produce of all duties and imposts laid by any state, on imports or exports, shall be for the use of the treasury of the United States, and all such laws shall be subject to the revision and controul of the Congress. No state shall, without the consent of Congress, lay any duty of tonnage, keep troops or ships of war in time of peace, enter into any agreement or compact with another state, or with a foreign power, or engage in war unless actually invaded, or in such imminent danger as will not admit of delay.

II.

Sec. 1. The executive power shall be vested in a president of the United States of America. He shall hold his office during the term of sour years, and, together with the vice-president, chosen for the same term, be elected as follows: Each state shallappoint in such manner as the legislature thereof may direct, a number of electors equal to the whole number of senators and representatives to which the state may be entitled in the Congress: but no senator or representative, or person holding an office of trust or prosit under the United States, shall be appointed an elector.

The cleators shall meet in their respective states, and vote by tailot for two persons, of whom one at least shall not be are habitant of the same state with themselves. And they shall make a list of all the persons voted for, and of the number of votes for each; which list they shall sign and certify, and transmit scaled to the seat of the government of the United States, directed to the president of the scale.

The prefident of the fenate shall in the presence of the

and the votes shall then he counted.

The person having the greatest number of votes shall be the prefident, if fuch number be a majority of the whole number of electors appointed; and if there be more than one who have fuch majority, and have an equal number of votes, then the house of representatives shall immediately chuse by ballot one of them for president; and if no person have a majority, then from the five highest on the lift the faid house hall in like manner choose the president. But in choosing the president, the votes shall be taken by flates, the representation from each flate having one vote. A quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or members from two-thirds of the flates, and a majority of all the states shall be necessary to a choice. In every case, after the choice of the prefident, the person having the greatest number of votes of the electors shall be the vice-president. But if there should remain two or more who have edual votes. the fenate shall choose from them by ballot the viceprefident.

The Congress may determine the time of chusing the electors, and the day on which they shall give their votes; which day shall be the same throughout the United States.

No person except a natural born citizen, or a citizen of the United States, at the time of the adoption of this constitution, shall be eligible to the office of president; neither shall any person be eligible to that office who shall not have attained to the age of thirty-five years, and been source years a resident within the United States.

In case of the removal of the president from office, or of his death, resignation, or inability to discharge the powers and duties of the said office, the same shall devolve on the vice-president, and the Congress may by law provide for. the case of removal, death resignation or inability, both of the prefident, and vice-prefident, declaring what officer shall then act as president, and such officers shall act accordingly. until the difability be removed, or a president shall be elefted.

The president shall, at stated times, receive for his fervices, a compensation which shall neither be encreased nor diminished during the period for which he shall have been And he shall not receive within that period any other emolument from the United States or any of them.

Before he enter on the execution of his office, he shall take the following oath or affirmation: " I, do folemnly fwear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the office of prefident of the United States, and will to the best of my ability, preferve, protect and defend the constitution of the United States."

Sea. 2. The president shall be commander in chief of the army and navy of the United States, and of the militia of the feveral States when called into the actual fervice of the United States: he may require the opinion, in writing, of the principal officer in each of the executive departments, upon any subject relating to the duties of their respective offices, and he shall have power to grant reprieves and pardons for offences against the United States, except

in cases of impeachment.

He shall have power, by and with the advice and confent of the senate, to make treaties, provided, two-thirds of the fenators prefent concur; and he shall nominate, and by and with the advice and confent of the fenate shall appoint ambassadors, other public ministers and consuls, judges of the supreme court, and all other officers of the United States, whose appointments are not herein otherwise provided for, and which shall be established by law. But the Congress may by law vest the appointment of such inferior officers as they think proper in the president alone, in the courts of law, or in the heads of departments.

The prefident shall have power to fill up all vacancies that may happen during the recess of the fenate, by granting commissions which shall expire at the end of their next

feffion .

Sect. 3. He shall from time to time give to the Congress information of the state of the union, and recommend to their consideration such measures as he shall judge necessary and expedient: He may, on extraordinary occasions, convene both houses, or either of them, and in case of disagreement between them, with respect to the time of adjournment, he may adjourn them to such time as he shall think proper: He shall receive ambassadors and other public ministers: He shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed, and shall commission all the officers of the United States.

Sect. 4. The president, vice-president and all civil officers of the United States, shall be removed from office on impeachment for, and conviction of treason, bribery, or other high crimes and middemeanors.

III.

Sec. 1. The judicial power of the United States, shall be vested in one supreme court, and in such inserior courts as the congress may from time to time ordain and establish. The judges, both of the supreme and inserior court, shall hold their offices during good behaviour, and shall, at stated times, receive for their services, a compensation, which shall not be diminished during their continuance in lesses.

Sect. 2. The judicial power shall extend to all cases, in law and equity, arising under this constitution, the laws of the United States, and treaties made, or which shall be made, under their authority. To all cases affecting ambassaiors, or other public ministers and consuls. To all cases of admiralty and maritime jurisdiction. To controverses to which the United States shall be a party. To controverses between two or more States; between a state and citizens of another state; between citizens of different states; between citizens of the same state claiming lands under grants of different states, and between a state, or the citizens thereof, and foreign states, citizens or subjects.

In all cases affecting ambassadors, other public miniflers and confuls, and those in which a state shall be a party, the superme court shall have original jurisdiction. In all the other cases before mentioned, the supreme court shall have appellate jurisdiction, both as to law and fact

with such exceptions, and under such regulations as the Congress shall make.

The trial of all crimes, except in cases of impeachment, shall be by jury; and such trial shall be held in the state where the faid crimes shall have been committed; but when not committed within any state, the trial shall be at such place or places as the Congress may by law have directed.

Sect. 3. Treason against the United States shall consist only in levying war against them, or in adhering to their enemies, giving them aid and comfort. No person shall be convicted of treason unless on the testimony of two witnesses to the fame overt act, or on confession in open court.

The congress shall have power to declare the punishment of treason, but no attainder of treason shall work corruption of blood, or forfeiture, except during the life of the person attainted.

IV.

Sea. 1. Full faith and credit shall be given in each state to the public acts, records, and justicial proceedings of every other state. And the Congress may by general laws prescribe the manner in which such acts, records and proceedings shall be proved, and the effect thereof.

Sell. 2. The citizens of each state shall be entitled to all privileges and immunities of citizens in the feveral

may Sea. 3. New States may be admitted by Congress into theythis union; but no new state shall be formed or er, and withlaw, in the jurisdiction of any other flate; nor any state be form-

Ted by the junction of two or more states, or parts of states, that vithout the confent of the legislatures, of the states coning cerned as well as of the Congress.

The Congress shall have power to dispose of and make all needful rules and regulations respecting the territory or other property belonging to the United States: and nothing in this Constitution shall be so construed as to prejudice any claims of the United States, or of any particular state.

Sea. 4. The United States shall guarantee to every state in this union a Republican form of government, and shall protect each of them against invasion; and on application of the lagislature, or of the executive when the legislature cannot be convened, against domestic violence.

v.

The Congress, whenever two thirds of both houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose amendments to this constitution, or on application of the legislatures of two thirds of the several states, shall call a convention for proposing amendments, which, in either case, shall be valid to all intents and burposes, as part of this constitution, when ratified by the legislatures of three-souths of the several states, or by conventions in three-souths thereof, as the one or the other mode of ratification may be proposed by the Congress: Provided, that no amendment which may be made, prior to the year 1808 shall in any manner effect the first and south clauses in the ninth section of the first article, and that no state without its consent shall be deprived of its equal safes in the senate.

All debts contracted and engagements entered into before the adoption of this Constitution, shall be as valed against the United States under this Constitution as under the

confederation.

This conflitution and the Laws of the United State which shall be made in pursuance thereof; and all treatie made, or which shall be made, under the authority of th United States, shall be the supreme law of the land; an the judges in every state shall be bound thereby, any thin in the constitution or laws of any state to the contrary no with standing.

The fenators and representatives before-mentioned, ar the members of the feveral State legislatures, and all excutive and judicial officers, both of the United States and the feveral States, shall be bound by oath or affirmation, support this constitution; but no religious test shall ever be required as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States.

#### VII.

The ratification of the conventions of nine States, shall be sufficient for the establishment of this constitution between the States so ratifying the same.

PERSONS knowingly buying goods liable to feizure, forfeit double value: goods found on fearch, which have not paid duties, forfeited.

OFFICERS may feize within or without their district. PERSONS giving or offering bribe, forfeit from two

hundred to two thousand dollars.

CAPTAIN or owner making falle oath of entry, suffer fine not exceeding one thousand dollars, and not more than twelve months imprisonment.

COLLECTOR, naval-officer and furveyor, or person specially appointed by either of them for the purpose, may enter any vessel in which they shall have reason to suspend to sure to be conceased, and if they have cause to suspend a concealment in any dwelling-house, store, building, or other place, on application on oath or affirmation, to any justice of peace, have warrant to enter in the day time only, and seize such goods.





Conflitution of the Connecticut Society for the promotion of freedom, and for the relief of persons unlawfully held in bondage.

MPRESSED with a fense of the inestimable worth and value of the excellent Constitution, Laws and Government of this State, and of the United States of America, and anxiously defirous that every description of men, who have obtained a refidence among us, of whatever clime or solour, should quietly enjoy the freedom and happiness. which the beneficent Father of the human race has kindly allotted to us; and having with grief and abhorrence long beheld a confiderable number of our fellow-men groaning under the iron hand of flavery, many of whom are intitled by the wife and humane laws of our country to an exemption from this cruel bondage: And being defirous to cooperare in a systematic way with the several Societies which have been, or that may be hereafter formed in the United States, or elsewhere, for the purpose of promoting the abolition of flavery; -the fubscribers have affociated them's felves under the name and tile of-The Connecticut Society for the promotion of Freedom, and for the relief of persons unlarufully bolden in bondage.

For effecting these purposes they have adopted the following Constitution:

The fociety shall meet annually at New-Haven, on the day succeeding the public Commencement of Yale-College. At which meeting there shall be chosen a President, Vice-President, Secretary and a Treasurer for the year ensuing.

2. The Prefident, or in his absence the Vice-Prefident shall preside in all the meetings, and subscribe all the acts of the society. The President, or in his absence the Vice-President, shall also have the power of calling a special Meeting of the society whenever he shall judge proper.—A special meeting of the society shall likewise be called at any time when four members of the society shall concur in requesting it.

3. The Secretary shall keep the records of the proceed-

ings of the fociety.

4. The Treasurer shall keep all the monies which shall

belong to the society; and shall pay all orders signed by the President or Vice-President; which orders shall be his

vouchers for his expenditures.

5. At the faid annual meeting, the fociety shall also choose a Committee of Correspondence, confisting of the Secretary and five members, whose duty and business it shall be to correspond with such persons and societies as may be necessary to promote the views of the society. They shall also be empowered to transact such other business as shall occur in the recess of the society, and report the same to each quarterly meeting.

6. There shall also be chosen at the annual meeting a committee of eight members, to solicit such donations, from persons who are well affected to the design of the institution, as may be necessary to promote the views of the society, which contributions shall be paid into the hands

of the Treasurer from time to time at his request.

7. The fociety shall meet four times in the year, at such

time and place as a majority shall appoint.

8. New members shall be admitted, and all questions decided by a majority of votes. In any case where the members are equally divided, the presiding officer shall have a casting vote.

At a meeting of the Connecticut Society for the promotion of freedom, and for the relief of persons unlawfully holden in bondage, holden at New-Haven on the 9th day of Sept. 1790.—A number of gentlemen from different parts of the State subscribed the Constitution, and were admitted members, and the following officers were chosen, viz.

Committee to folicit and receive Donations in their respective counties.

At the above meeting the following Vote was passed: VOTED, That the members of this society in the several towns to which they respectively belong, do by themselves or a committee of their choice, enroll the names, ages and possessions of such persons as have been born since the rst of March, 1784, and who by law will be entitled to their freedom at the age of 25 years; to examine whether the births of such persons have been recorded according to law—to enquire whether any persons are illegally holden in bondage—also whether the other laws of State relative to the gradual abolition of slavery are duly observed—and to look into the character and conduct of free Negroes and Mulattees with respect to morality, industry and economy, and report to the society, or their standing committee.

DISCOVERY OF NORTH-AMERICA.

LTHO' Columbus was the first discoverer of America, and ought to have had the honor of giving it his name, yet one Americus Vesputius, a native of Florence, who made a voyage thither some years after Columbus, gave name to this vast continent. Columbus confined his discoveries chiefly to the West-India islands, the gulph of Mexico, and the southern continent.

Some years after Columbus's first voyage, North-America was explored by Sebastian Cabot, from England, in 1497, who obtained a commission from Henry seventh, for discovering, settling, and possessing heathen countries. The

first land he made was Nova-Scotia.

Sir Humphry Gilbert took postession of Newfoundland and St. Lawrence in 1583, and began the fishing trade.

The first settlement of Canada was made by Monsieus du Mont, a Frenchman, in 1606. Quebec was taken in 1629, by some English adventurers; but was resigned again

to the French, by treaty, in 1632, and continued in their possession till it was taken by the English, under the command of General Wolfe. 1758.

Before the fettlement of Virginia or New-York, Capt. Goffold had, in 1602, explored Pifquataqua river, the eastern flore of New-England; likewife difcovered and gave name to Elizabeth's iflands and Martha's Vineyard.

When King James, in 1606, divided Virginia, by his letters patent, the territory between the 38th and 45th deal

grees of lattitude, was called North-Virginia.

Several years afterwards, viz. in 1620, he incorporated a number of perfons by the name of the 'Council eftablished at Plymouth.' To this Company he made an abformation of all the lands in America, between the 40th and 48th degrees of north latitude, throughout the main land, from fea to fea; excepting only fuch lands as were at that time actually possessed by fome other christian brince or flate.

Lift of Governors of the late Colony of Plymouth, from the first Settlement of New-England, in 1620, till they

were included in the Massachusetts Charter.

During the space of 71 years, they had no more than the above named fix persons for Governors. Mr. Carver died the first year after their arrival, Mr. Bradford succeeded him, and was chosen annually from 1621, until he died in 1657, except in 1633, 1636, and 1644, when Mr. Winslow succeeded, and continued till he died in 1680, he was succeeded by Mr. Hinkley, who held the place, except in the interruption by Governor Andros, until the junction with the Massachusetts in 1692.

# of CONNECTICUT.

IN the year 1631, Robert earl of Warwick, prefident of he Council of Plymouth, granted to lord Say and Seal, to prd Brook and others, a tract of land extending from Naraganfet river, 40 leagues on the fea coast; and thence trough the main land, from the Western Ocean to the outh Sea. This was the first grant to Connecticut. Smaller

grants, from the first patentees, were afterwards made to particular people; in consequence of which many settlements were made.

New-Haven and Connecticut were separate governments till the reign of Charles the second; when by agreement they were both incorporated, by the name of 'the Governor and Company of Connecticut.' The charter by which they were united still continues to be the basis of their government.

The trade of Connecticut is principally to the West-India islands, and is carried on in vessels from 60 to 150 tons. The exports consist of horses, mules, oxen, staves, hoops, pine boards, oak-plank, corn, beef, pork, &c. They also have a considerable number of coasting vessels employed in carrying the produce of the state to other states, consisting of wheat, rye, corn, oats, butter, cheefe, cyder, slax, hemp, &c. The soil is well calculated for pasture and mowing.

Connecticut is 82 miles in length, and 57 in breadth, and contains upwards of 200,000 inhabitants. They enjoy a fertile foil, and are truly republican, pursuing their interest in promoting manusactures, commerce, agriculture

and the sciences.

Connecticut has been highly diftinguished by its having a fuccession of Governors, eminent both for their religious and political accomplishments. The following is a list of their venerable names.

#### STATES.

Treasury Department, Sept. 20, 1790. TT is hereby made known, that the following arrangement has been adopted towards carrying into execution the Act, making provision for the debt of the United

States, viz.

Loan-Office Certificates, and those iffued by the Commissioners for the adjustment of accounts in the several States, will be receivable only at the Treafury and by the respective commissioners of Loans within the States in which they were respectively issued. The Certificates issued by the Register of the Treasury, by the Pay-Master General and commissioner of Army Accounts, by the Commissioners for the adjustment of the Accounts of the Quarter-Master's, Commissary's, Hospital. Cloathing, and Marine Departments, Indents on Interest, and Bills of old Emission, will be receivable indifcriminately at the Treasury and by the Commissioners of all the States. The fituation of the Checks has dictated this arrangement for the greater fecurity of the public against impositions by forged or counterfeit paper, and the details which have been adopted from the same confideration for the execution of the business are fuch, that it will give facility and dispatch, if applications from the holders of Certificates of the Register of the Treasury and of the Paymaster General, and Commissioner of Army Accounts, and of the Commissioner of the five Departments above mentioned, are made in the first instance at the Treasury; and if applications from the Holders of Loan Office Certificates; and Certificates issued by the Commissioners for the adjustment of Accounts in the respective States, are made in like manner to the Commissioners of Loans within the States in which they were iffued. Transfers can afterwards be made to any office that the Proprietors of these Certificates may desire.

Treasury Department, Sept. 28, 1790.

THE following regulations, which have been adopted towards carrying into execution the act, making provision for the debt of the United States, are announced for the information of the public creditors.

WHEN a transfer is to be made from one person to another, the certificate or certificates of the debt to be transferred, must be produced at the proper office, in order that the same may be cancelled, and a new one, or new ones

iffue, as the cafe shall require.

When a transfer is defired from one office to another, application must in the first instance be made to the office where the credit exists, whereupen the certificate or certificates of the debt to be transferred will be cancelled, and a special one granted, as a voucher to the Secretary of the Treasury; upon the production and delivery of which to him a warrant will issue to the office, to which the debt is to be transferred, where the business will be completed. The form (A) at foot hereof, has been adopted for letters of attorney, to make transfers, which, and the directions for completing it, it is expected will be carefully observed.

In every case of a transfer of the subscribed or funded debt, the new certificate will bear interest, only from the first day of the quarter, in which the transfer is made. The unpaid interest which may have accrued prior to that quarter, will be paid only to the person, who was stockholder at the time it accrued, or to his special assignee.

Fourteen days before the expiration of each quarter, the books of each office will be closed; fo that no transfers will be made, nor except at the Treasury, will any subscriptions be received, or old certificates exchanged for new ones, on the application of non-subscribers, during that period. Those intending to become subscribers to the proposed Loan, who do not subscribe, prior to the commencement of any such period—or those intending not to subscribe, who do not present their old certificates to be exchanged, or is holders of certificates of the Treasury, who do not notify to the Treasury their intention not to subscribe, prior to such commencement of such period, will not receive the interest, which may have accrued antecedently, 'till the end of the quarter in

which their subscriptions are made, or in which their certificates are exchanged, or in which they shall so notify their intention not to subscribe. This, the proper diffribution of the funds, and the prefervation of order render

indifnenfable.

On the subscribed or funded debt, interest as it becomes due will be paid without production of the certificates if feed for the fame. On the unsubscribed debt, if any there shall be, the production of the certificates will be necessary, in order to the receipt of the interest, and an indorsement of the payment of it upon the certificates. however, in confideration of the rifk and inconvenience of transmission, will not be required of those who hold certificates of the Register of the Treasury, and reside out of the United States. The form (B) at foot hereof, of a letter of attorney for receiving interest, and the directions therewith, it is expected will be carefully purfued. (A)

ALL Masters of vessels from foreign ports are, within 24 hours after their arrival, to make report at the nearest Custom-house office, and within 48 hours, a further report to the Collector, of the name, burthen and lading of his vessel, whether stowed loose or in packages, the marks, numbers and contents of each, the place and person to whom configned, and the place where taken in, of what country built, from what place she last sailed, and who was and is master: At the time of delivering the manifest, the master is to declare to the truth thereof, and that no part of her lading, since her departure from the place she last sailed, has been landed, unladed or otherwise removed from on board her; and surther, that in case he shall afterwards know of any goods, other than reported, he will forthwith make report to the Collector.

Masters of vessels neglecting to report, delivering their manifests, or taking the oath, are liable, for every offence,

to forfeit the fum of 1000 dollars.

Veffels of war, and public packets carrying dispatches,

are exempt from making report.

No Goods to be unloaded but in open day, or without a Permit, under penalty of 400 dollars, difability from holding office for the term of feven years, and being advertised in gazette, and forfeiture of goods, and if above the fum of 400 dollars, of veffel, &c.

If any part of the cargo shall be unladen, for any purpose whatever (except in distress) the commander on board for feits 1000 dollars, with the goods remaining on board.

Goods to be unladen in fifteen days, or delivered to the Collector, except falt or coal, which may be continued longer, on the mafter or owner paying inspectors.

Goods not agreeing with manifest, or manifest with de-

livery, the mafter to forfeit 500 dollars.

No Goods of foreign growth or manufacture to be bro't into the U. S. unless by sea, and not in vessels under 30 tons, on forseiture of goods and vessel (except within the

district of Louisville.)

Vessels in distress to report in 48 hours from arrival, to protest before a Notary-Public or Justice, in 24 hours, and if it appears necessary to the Collector, he may permit to unload, on payment of the duties on goods necessary to payexpences; necessity to be made appear to wardens, or others for the purpose authorized.

Duties to be paid before permit, unless they exceed 50 dollars, in which case, they may be secured by bond with one or more sureties, payable for West-India goods in four months, Madeira wines in twelve months, other goods in fix months; or the importer may deposit double the value of the duties in goods to secure the payment of duties, which, on failure of payment, are to be fold.

Goods ad walerem to be valued by adding 20 per cent. to the actual coft, if from the Cape of Good Hope or beyond, and 10 per ct. if from any other place, exclusive of charges.

Goods damaged, or without invoice, to be valued on oath or affirmation, by two persons, one chosen by the Collector, and the other by the party.

No person whose bond for duties is due and unpaid, to be allowed credit for duties.

Bonds for duties, when due, to be profecuted; and in gafe of infolvency, to have preference.

Goods removed before weighed or gauged, without confent of the Collector, or other proper officer, are forfeited.

Perfons knowingly buying goods liable to feizure, forfeit double value; goods found on fearch, which have not paid

duties, forfeited.

Drawback allowed at the place of entry only, on all goods exported to any country without the United States in the original packages, and within fix months after payment made, or fecurity given, for duties, retaining one per cent. of duties paid, and excepting where duties do not amount to 20 dollars at the leaft.

Bonds with one or more fureties to be given, that fuch

goods shall not be re-landed within the United States.

Goods not entitled to drawback until after 6 months, & until the exporter produce certificate in writing of two respectable merchants at the foreign port or place where landed, together with the oath of the mafter and mate of the veffel, certifying the delivery thereof.

Officers may seize within or without their district.

Persons giving or offering bribe, forfeit from 200 to 2000 dollars.

Captain or owner making false oath of entry, suffers a

months imprisonment.

Collector, Naval Officer & Surveyor, or person specially appointed by either of them for the purpose, may enter any vessel in which they have reason to suspect goods subject to duty are concealed, and if they have cause to suspect concealment in any dwelling-house, store, or other place, on application on oath or affirmation, to any justice of peace, have warrant to enter, in the day time only, and seize.

All penalties, fines and forseitures, are to be one moiety to the United States, the other to be paid in equal parts to the Collector, Naval-Officer and Surveyor of the port where the same had occurred; in districts where there is one Officer, he has the whole moiety. If the forseiture is recovered by information given by any other than a Custom House officer, one half of said moiety to be given to the informer, the remainder to be disposed of as aforesaid.

In case of vessel cast away, or other accident, to produce a protest in due form, and in case such protest cannot be

had, the oath or affirmation of the exporter, or other proof to the fatisfaction of the collector.

Goods exported for drawback, and re-landed, subject to seizure, together with the veffel, beats, &c. and persons

concerned to fuffer fix months imprisonment.

In order to secure the collection of these duties, boats or cutters are to be equipped, not exceeding ten, to be employed for the protection of the revenue, the expence not to exceed 10,000 dollars, to be paid out of the duties and tonnage on veffels. Each of faid boats or cutters to have one Master, and not more than three Mates, four Mariners and two boys; the Master to be allowed 30 Dollars per month, 1st Mate 20, 2d Mate 16, 3d Mate 14, each Mariner 8, and each boy 4 dollars. The Officers of these boats or cutters to be Officers of the customs, with authority to go on board any veffel within 4 leagues of the coasts of the United States. Small open row or fail boats, with a requisite number of persons, are also to be provided for the use of the Surveyors and Inspectors in going on board ves fels, for the better detection of frauds.

Substance of the Coasting Ad.

ALL veffels to be intitled to the benefits of American veffels, must be registered or enrolled, & have their names and the names of the places to which they belong, painted on their sterns, on a black ground with white letters, at least three inches in length, on forseiture of paying foreign tonnage.

Registers to he granted to none but American built versels, owned wholly by citizens thereof—or owned by citizens on and fince 16th May 1789, and commanded by citzens of the United States. The Surveyor having first certified their exact tonnage. Bonds to be given for pre-

fervation of Registers.

All vessels built in the United States for foreigners, to

be recorded in the Collectors Office, on oath.

American veffels (of the above description) of less than 20 tons, and not less than 5 tons (qualified as before) shall annually procure a licence, which will exempt them from entering or clearing for one year. Masters or owners to give bond, that such veffels shall not be concerned in any illicit trade. And before they can renew such licence, must make oath that they have not been concerned in any illicit trade.

Masters and owners of American coasting vessels of 20 tons or upwards, shall have licence to trade or fish for one year, tonnage being first paid, and bond given that the vessels. shall not be employed in any illicit trade—on failure to procure a licence must pay foreign tonnage.

Mafters bound to foreign ports, to deliver a Manifest of the cargo, on oath, before cleared out. Commander or owner forfeits 200 dollars, for failing without clearance.

Mafters of American coasting vessels having on board foreign goods, &c. of 200 dollars value, or 400 gallons of rum, and bound from one district to another, must deliver duplicate regular Manisests of whole cargo, on oath (one of which manisests shall be return deertified to the master) before permit can be obtained to depart. If not having foreign goods or rum on board, no manisests are required, but they may proceed to any district in the same state or next adjoining state.

American coasting vessels, if bound to any other than adjoining state or district in the same state, and if having American goods or produce on board, must deliver duplicate regular manifests on oath, (one of which will be returned certified) before permit to proceed can be obtained.

Coafting vessels (as before described) from same, or adjoining state, before permission to land the cargo can be obtained, must deliver a manifest thereof on oath, within

24 hours after arrival, Sundays excepted.

In all cases masters of coasting vessels, must within 24 hours after arrival, Sundays excepted, deliver the manifest which was received from the Collector, authenticated, be-

fore permit to land goods can be obtained.

If a master of any vessel having goods, &c. on board of 200 dellars value, fails without certified manisest and permit, he forfeits 400 dollars and goods: Vessels bound to a district in same, or adjoining state, and having on board Awerican goods, &c. rum, or other ardent spirits, excepted.

Licenced veffels, if bound to a foreign port, must deliver up their licence—and in case of neglect, the master forseits

100 dollars.

Vessels not intitled to Register or Enrollment, and frau-

dulently using either, are forfeited.
