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

SOLAR AND LUNAR ECLIPSES,
IN THE YEAR 1827.

There will be four eclipses this year, in the following order, viz :

I. The first will be of the Sun, April 25, at 10h. 15m. afternoon, consequently invisible to us : but in latitude 87deg. 31m. N. ; long. 124deg. 59m. E. the sun will be centrally eclipsed on the meridian.

II. The second will be of the moon, May 11, visible by calculation, as follows :

Beginning at	2h. 0m.	
Middle, . . .	3 33	{ Apparent time
Eclipse, . . .	3 33	{ in the morning.
End of the Eclipse,	5 6	

Digits eclipsed 11deg. 47m. on the moon's southward limb, or from the north side of the earth's shadow. The moon will set 7 minutes before the eclipse ends.

III. The third will be of the Sun, October 20th, at 11h. in the forenoon, to us invisible, by reason of the moon's south latitude, but in lat. 69deg. 40m. S. : long. 65deg. 14m. W. the sun will be centrally eclipsed, on the meridian.

IV. The fourth will be of the Moon, November 3d, at 0h. 26m. in the afternoon, to us invisible.

*A TABLE, showing the difference of High Water,
at several places from New London.*

The sixth column of each monthly page shows the time of high water at New London, New York, Elizabethtown Point, Tarpaulin Cove, Cape Henlopen, Cockspur in Georgia, and Brunswick in N. Carolina—to which if you add and subtract as in the annexed table, you will have the time of high water at the following places. A shows that the annexed quantities of time must be added, S subtracted—H stands for hours; M for minutes.

EXPLANATORY REMARKS.

It will be perceived, that to the rates of duty imposed on goods, wares and merchsndize, imported in vessels of the United States, and in foreign vessels placed on an equality with vessels of the United States, by treaty stipulations, or special act of Congress, an addition of ten per cent. has been made in the case of importations in other foreign vessels, except to the rates on teas from China, the law in that instance making a specific and a greater discrimination than ten per cent.

By "other foreign vessels," are not to be understood French vessels, when importing articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of France. the duties on which are to be regulated by the treaty with that country signed the 24th of June 1822; according to which, such articles,

thus imported, are at present liable to an additional duty, not exceeding \$375-100 per ton of merchandize, over and above the rates on similar articles, when imported in vessels of the United States. But importations in French vessels, of articles, not the growth, produce, or manufacture of France, are liable to the usual discriminating duty often per cent. between importations in foreign and importations in American vessels.

Regulations respecting Drawbacks.

In every case, the duties must amount to \$50 or more. And in every case of entry of merchandize for drawback, and the same regularly shipped under the inspection of an officer, and guaged, weighed or measured, as the case may require, 20 days from the clearance of the vessel is allowed by law, for signing bonds, to produce certificates of landing out of the United States. Merchandize, to be entitled to benefit of drawback, must be shipped within twelve calendar months from the date of importation.

Merchandize for drawback, cannot be imported to the dominions of any foreign state, immediately adjoining the United States.

All goods must be exported in the original package, without any change whatever, except liquor in casks, coffee in casks or other packages, and cocoa in casks or other packages, which may be filled up from other packages of the same importation, or be put into new packages corresponding therewith, and marked and numbered as the original one; and in case the original package shall, in the opinion of the officer appointed to examine the same, be so injured as to be rendered unfit for exportation, and in no other case, And all this must be done under the inspection of a proper officer appointed by the collector, and naval officer, &c.

Drawback not allowed on goods imported in vessels from the dominions of a power to which the vessels of the United States are not permitted to trade.

Nor of duties for the amount of the additional duty on merchandize imported in vessels of the United States.

Drawback not allowed on foreign dried and pickled fish, and salted provisions. Nor of fish, oil, or playing cards.

Allowance of Drawback—on spirits, 2 cents per gallon, and three per cent. on the amount of duty. On other merchandize 2 1-2 per cent.

Drawback on domestic distilled spirits, not below first proof. From molasses. 10 cents per gall. other materials. 6 cents do.

Provided the quantity exported shall be 150 gallons, and in vessels not less than 30 tons burthen.

Sect. 4th of Act passed 20th of April, 1818.—And be it further enacted that no drawback shall be allowed of the duties paid on any wines or spirits which shall be imported into the United States after the first day of June, 1818, unless such wines or spirits shall have been deposited in public or other stores, under the provisions of the act, and there kept, from their landing to their shipment.

On coffee in bags 2 per cent, in bales 3 per cent, in casks 12 per cent; on sugar other than loaf, in casks 12 per cent, in boxes 5 per cent, in bags or mats 5 per cent; on cocoa in casks 10 per cent, in bags 1 per cent; on cheese in hampers or baskets 10 per cent, in boxes 20 per cent; candles in boxes 8 per cent; on chocolate in boxes 10 per cent, on cotton in bales 2 per cent, in eeroons 6 per cent; indigo in barrels 12 per cent, in other casks 15 per cent, in eeroons 10 per cent, in bags or mats 3 per cent; on nails in casks 8 per cent: pepper in casks 12 per cent, in bales 5 per cent, in bags 2 per cent: sugar candy in boxes 10 do. soap in boxes 10 per cent; shot in casks, 3 per cent;

twine in casks 12 per cent. in bales 3 per cent. All other goods according to invoice or actual weight.

N. B.—Notwithstanding the above tares are designated by law, it is lawful at the time of making an entry, for the importer, collector, and naval officer, where there is one, if they see fit, to estimate the tare according to the invoice, but if not determined at the time of making entry, then the above tares shall be taken.

In addition to the tares, the following drafts shall be made, viz.

On any quantity of 1 cwt. 1 lb. On any quantity above 1 cwt. and not exceeding 2 cwt. 2 lbs. On any quantity above 2 and not exceeding 3 cwt. 3 lbs. On any quantity above 6 and not exceeding 10 cwt. 4 lbs. On any quantity above 10 cwt. and not exceeding 18 cwt. 7 lbs. On any quantity above 18 cwt. 9 lbs. An allowance of 2 per cent. from the gauge for leakage, and 10 per cent. on all beer, ale, and porter, in bottles, and 5 per cent. on all other liquor in bottles, to be deducted from the invoice quantity in lieu of breakage—or it shall be lawful to compute the duties on the actual quantity, to be ascertained by sale, at the option of the importer, to be made at the time of entry.

N. B.—In calculation of the ad *valorem* duties, to the cost at the place whence imported, if from the Cape of Good Hope or beyond it, 20 per cent. is added thereto, and in like manner 10 per cent. from all other places, including all charges, except insurance.

Terms of Credit on Duties.

When on a single importation, the duties amount to £50 or upwards, they are payable as follows:

On Merchandise from Europe (other than salt and wines) 1-3d in 8, 1-3d in 10, and the remaining 1-3d in 12 months.

On Salt, from any part of the world, 9 months

On Wines, 12 months.

On Merchandise, the produce of foreign places or islands, situated on the eastern shores of America, north of the equator or its adjacent seas, bays and gulphs, (salt excepted,) 1-2 in 6, and the remaining half in 9 months.

On Merchandise, other than wine, salt and tea, imported from any other place than Europe and the West-Indies, 1·3d in 8, 1·3d in 10, and the remaining 1·3d in 18 months.

By an Act passed 2d of March, 1823—Collectors are empowered to direct goods to be appraised, whenever there are just grounds to suspect that they are invoiced below their true value—and if their appraised value shall exceed 25 per cent. the invoice prices, then to the ad valorem duty, shall be added a further duty of 50 per cent. on the appraised value, out which aggregate amount the duties shall be estimated.

And where appraised value does not exceed 25 per cent. the invoice value, appraised value shall be considered the true value—but in no case shall the value be estimated on an amount less than the invoice value.

Collectors shall cause one package out of every invoice to be opened and examined, and if the same does not agree with invoice, a full inspection of the goods shall be made and appraised, subject to the penalties before mentioned. If a package contains any article not invoiced, the whole to be forfeited.

Secretary of the Treasury is authorised to remit penalties, in the absence of fraud.

PUBLIC DEBT, &c.

The aggregate of the Public Debt, of the United States, on the first of October 1826, was \$75,923,151 47 On the 1st of January 1827, the sum of \$2,002,806 71 will be paid—leaving at that time, an aggregate of \$73,920,844 76. Of this debt 13,296,247 70, being the remnant of the debt of the Revolution, and 7,000,000 subscribed to the Bank of the United States—a total of \$20,296,247 70 are redeemable at the pleasure of the Government. The Revolutionary Debt bears an interest of 3 per cent. the remaining 55,626,903 77 become due at the following periods: 1st 11,254,197 46, at six per cent. in 1826—2d, 13,096,542 90, at six per cent. in 1827—3d, 9,490,099 10, at 6 per cent. in 1828—4th, 769,668 08, at 4 1-2 per cent. in 1829—5th, 769,668 08 at 4 1-2 per cent. in 1830—6th, 18,901 59, at 5 per cent. in 1831—7th, 18,901 59 at 5 per cent. in 1832—8th, 10,000,000 at 4 1-2 per cent. in 1832—9th, 999,999 13, at 5 percent. in 1832—10th, 18,901 59, at 5 per cent. in 1833—11th, 2,227,363 97, at 4 1-2 per cent. in 1833—12th, 2,227,363 98, at 4 1-2 per cent. 1834—and 13th 4,735,296 30, at 5 per cent. in 1835.

Above thirteen millions of the debt will become payable within little more than 12 months, all of which bears an interest of 6 per cent. It is proposed to defray a moiety of this amount, by raising a new loan, at an interest of 5 per cent. payable in 1829—30—31. By this operation, a saving will be effected to the public in the reduction of interest, of \$90,000. The portion of debt, the redemption of which is now charged on the years 1829—30—31, scarcely exceeds a million and a half.

The whole Revenue for 1827, is estimated at 23,150,000 dollars, and the expenditures at 20,702,954 dollars, viz. civil and diplomatic department, 1,826,549 dollars, military, 5,646,144 dollars, naval, 3,230,260 dollars, and the public debt, 10,000,000 dol-
