ENFIELD .-) he industrious and peaceable society of Shakers is located in the north-east part of Enfield. There are 262 persons included in five families, who own and improve about 4000 acres of land, ten acres of which is cultivated as a garden. In addition to this the society own 1 Grist Mill, (recently erected) 1 Tannery, 1 Triphammer Shop, in which is a machine for drawing lead acqueducts, 1 Carding Machine, a machine for jointing staves for pails. arried by water, a Saw Mill and 3 Cider Mills, one of which is on the new principle of a cylendar.

The society keep about 70 cows, 12 or 14 yoke of oxen, 12 horses and a large number of sheep and young cattle .-As their land is better adapted to grain than grazing, they do not keep so large a dairy as some other societies.

They have a Church iu which they perform public worship, 70 feet by 50, two stories high.

KENT .- There are in this town three blast Furnaces, which turn out weekly between 60 and 70 tons of Pig Iron; four blooming and refining forges, and one card Factory. Many excellent mill scats on the Ousatonic, a never failing stream, remain unoccupied in Kent.

SOUTHBURY. This town has been pronounced the richest in minerals of any in the country. It has atcracted the attention of Mineralogists who have taken specimens of petrefaction, rose quartz, &c. in large greatifies to various parts of the world.







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
