





THE SALISBURY ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED

Supplementing the brief history of the Association which appeared in the first volume of Collections published in December 1913, it will suffice to say that its chief activities since that date have been as follows:

Successful fairs were held at Salisbury Center on Labor Day, September 7, 1914, and on the afternoon of Saturday, September 4 and Labor Day, September 6, 1915. The cost of conducting the former was \$2,810.78 and of the latter, \$3,161.28. In both cases the receipts earned (including State Aid from appropriation for the encouragement of agricultural fairs) were sufficient to defray expenses, and to increase, by a small amount, the assets of the Association. The 1915 Fair was insured against loss by a contingent Guarantee Fund, pledged by ninety-seven individuals, and amounting to \$1,618.00, not a cent of which was called for.

Plans for the 1916 Fair, to be held September 2 and 4, are now being perfected, and should result in an event of even greater significance than the three similar ones which have preceded it, especially in its educational demonstrations and exhibits. The Guarantee Fund for the coming Fair is already larger, by more than five hundred dollars, than the one raised last year.

In June, 1915, eight hundred shade trees were sprayed with insecticide, at an expense of \$566.25. Of this amount \$330.50 was paid by individuals and associations, chiefly for treatment of privately owned trees. The remainder, \$235.75, drawn from the treasury of the Association, was applied wholly to the treatment of elm trees along the public highways. Another campaign of the same kind, including removal of deadwood, will be conducted by the Association this season.

Under the auspices of the Association, one of the most successful agricultural schools ever held in the East was conducted,



at the Town Hall, Salisbury, February 1-4, 1916, by the Connecticut Agricultural College Extension Service, coöperating with The Litchfield County Farm Bureau. The total enrollment of pupils for the four days was 245,—115 women and 130 men.

On the conclusion of the course, an Alumni Association was formed, for the purpose of periodical conference, and eventually for the comparison of practical results secured by compliance with the instruction given. This "follow-up" plan, manifestly a most sensible one, is unique in that it originated with our local committee.

The great interest aroused by this work has resulted in the establishment of the Farm Bureau Department of this Association, which will also act as the local Advisory Committee of The Litchfield County Farm Bureau. This new department also has in charge the formation of Boys' and Girls' Agricultural Clubs in the towns of Salisbury and Sharon, and a resident organizer and instructor for the entire season of 1916, entered upon his duties on April 5. Instruction in canning fruits and vegetables may also be secured through this Department, working with the State Extension Service, and on May 23 the Bureau organized a Herd Improvement Association among the dairymen of Salisbury.

It was expected that this volume would appear in 1914, but unavoidable delays have prevented its publication until now.

The valuable help given to the compiler by William B. Perry, Jr., in connection with a part of the Land Record Digest, and by I. Kent Fulton in checking back the Vital Record index with the original record, is gratefully acknowledged. Miss Gertrude Miner's accurate typing of copy, and assistance in reading proof, deserve appreciative mention.



6. On page 143, the name of Capt. Samuel Lee should be added to the list of commissioned officers. The facts relating to his service have been fully established since the publication of Vol. I.



PART I

HISTORY OF THE TOWN HALL

The primitive combination log-house and church, built by the Town in 1744 (near the spot now occupied by a log-house of similar dimensions, erected several years ago by Mr. Kent Fulton, west of his home), was soon found to be inadequate to the needs of the growing community, and in 1746 the erection of a larger building was first publicly discussed.

On Feb. 24, 1748, at a town meeting then held,¹ it was voted to build a Meeting House 40 ft. long by 30 ft. wide "at or nere ye Northeasterly corner of Mr. Joseph Lee's House Lot," the selection of the site being subject to the approval of the General Assembly of the Colony. Joseph Lee's house stood where now stands the house occupied by Mr. Anson Williams, opposite the Scoville Library,² and the site selected for the church, and on which it was built, is the same as that occupied by the central portion of the present Town Hall.³

The original Building Committee consisted of Esq. Thos. Chipman, Capt. Samuel Beebe and Ensⁿ Samⁿ Bellowes, who were directed to "improve a carpenter" to hew the timbers and set up the frame and procure plank, boards, shingles and nails. Finally before beginning operations it was decided to increase the size of the building five feet in length and breadth, so that it should be 45 feet long by 35 feet wide.

The work progressed very slowly, undoubtedly due in great measure to the scarcity of money and the difficulty in securing labor, in so new a settlement, where nearly every man was busy with his own clearing and home building.

Nearly a year elapsed, and probably little more had been done in advancing the work, than the preparation of materials. On Jan. 2, 1749, the Committee, above named, was authorized "to carry on the Building of the Meeting House, so far as to cover

it with Plank, Bords and Clabords and Shingles &c, and to procure the Lower floores laid and window frames and sashes made and glass put in and the outside Doors made and hung."

It was not until June 1, 1749, that it was finally voted⁵ "to begin to rais the Meeting House on WednsDay Next." On the same date, and in anticipation of the great event, Ensign Samuel Bellowes was appointed "a Comtee to procure 16 gallons of Rhum half one Hundred weight of Shuger and two pounds of Alspice for raising the Meeting House," and Sergeant Samuel Moore was directed "to procure 8 bushels of wheat and make it into cake" for the same purpose.

Needless confusion has arisen as to the date of the "raising." Judge Church gives it⁶ as March 24th and 25th, 1749, and the Rev. Adam Reid, writing three years later, gives the same date,⁷ which he doubtless took from Church's Address. Hence this date has appeared authoritatively twice in print. The writer of this present sketch, either through error in adopting the date used by his predecessors, or through some other misapprehension of the fact, gave the dates in a former article⁸ as Nov. 24th and 25th, 1749, and having made the mistake once, repeated it in a subsequent paper⁸ on the same subject.

Manifestly all these dates are wrong. The town vote of June 1, 1749, referred to in the preceding paragraph, is perfectly legible and eliminates Church's March date, nor is there found in any of the records of the town, any intimation even, that the raising was delayed until November. It may be said then, and we trust with finality, that this the most important event of the kind, which up to that time had occurred in Salisbury, came off just as planned, and that Messrs. Bellowes and Moore, having duly procured the stipulated liquid and solid refreshments, the structure was "elevated" early in June, 1749, by the united and strenuous efforts of our exhilarated forefathers.

For some time after the raising, the Committee appears to have rested, and it was not until April 9, 1750, that its report was present and accepted. Even this report covered only the erection and enclosing of the structure, and perhaps the laying of the lower floor. The expenditure to this stage of the work was £1214, 5 sh. "money old tenor."

It can be of little interest to us to know that the expense incurred was so much in "pounds," unless we can determine, approximately at least, what that sum represented in modern currency. To permit the reader to infer that the amount named should be computed by the value of the present English pound sterling (\$4.86) would be entirely misleading. Without entering upon a discussion of colonial currency, a subject vaguely and inadequately touched on by most historians, it can be said with certainty that owing to the scarcity of coined money, the Colony of Connecticut was forced to issue paper money as early as 1709,11 in order to pay the public debts. Such issues were infrequent until about 1740 when the Colonial Wars so-called entailed great expense upon the Colony, specie reimbursements for which by the English government were long deferred. This fact coupled with the rapid increase of population, trade and commerce and the consequent necessity for a freely circulating medium of exchange, resulted in the emission of large amounts of paper bills of credit. A considerable part of these issues was loaned to individuals, on what was considered good security, but owing undoubtedly to the excessive issuance of such bills, the lack of any banking system, inability to secure correct information as to the exact value of much of the security accepted, the prevalence of similar issues made by the adjacent colonies, and possibly to other reasons which cannot now be definitely stated, demoralization of credit ensued.

It is hardly necessary to say that depreciation in the value of the paper money followed. In 1748 many of the prominent merchants of New England sent a memorial to the English Lords of the Treasury, which began by reciting "That the Common currency of New England has Consisted of Paper Bills of Credit

for more than thirty years past which by the Uncertainty and Remoteness of their Redemption have lost more than Nine Tenths of their Original Value to the great Distress of the Inhabitants" etc.¹² Note that this was at exactly the time when our people began their building operations, and undoubtedly the prevailing depreciation and its impoverishing effects had much to do with the delays which we have recorded.

Assuming that the memorialists above mentioned stated their case as strongly as they could, and that they may have been unduly influenced by the prevailing financial panic, we are inclined to pass over their implication that a pound in credit bills was not worth over fifty cents in minted money and accept rather the statement of DeForest¹³ that the "old tenor" Connecticut pound was worth in 1754, about one fourth of a pound sterling or say \$1.25. Considering that the Colony, on discovering the bad case its credit was in, attempted to remedy the evil and did actually retire nearly all of its old paper issues by the year 1764,14 it seems reasonable to assume that the depreciation was no greater in 1754 than in 1750, and therefore that the £1214 in question was equivalent to approximately \$1,520 present currency.

When we stop to consider that the Grand List of ratable estates in Salisbury, in 1751, was, in terms of DeForest's valuation of the pound, only about \$14,000, it will be seen how considerable was the sum involved in this building project, representing as it did, the equivalent of over 10% of the taxable property of the town. By supposing, for instance, that we of to-day had committed ourselves to an expenditure of about \$275,000, the equivalent of 10% of our present Grand List, fully intending to raise that amount by taxation within say five years, we can more fully realize the proportionate magnitude of the financial problem which faced the Town Fathers in 1750, and more properly appreciate the courage and fidelity with which they solved it.

After the acceptance of the Committee's report, already mentioned, work on the building seems to have ceased entirely for the

remainder of the year 1750. It is possible that the lower room, unfinished and unfurnished as it was, but at least protected from the weather, was used for church services and other public meetings during that season, but even this is wholly conjectural.

Whether the delay in completing the building was chiefly due to the causes already suggested or partially to the failure of the Town Tax Collector and the Building Committee to coöperate, does not now fully appear, but a greater sum than had been expended had been levied, although not entirely collected, when the first report was made, and the Committee was directed to turn the funds into the Town Treasury, whenever they were received from the Collector.

In this connection we may infer that some differences of opinion had arisen as to ways and means, for on Dec. 25, 1750, 15 about a year and a half after the "raising," a new Committee, consisting of Deacon Hezekiah Camp, Mr. Amos Fuller and Mr. Noah Strong, was appointed and authorized "to go on and finish the lower part of the Meeting House, and stairs, and provide boards for the upper floor." It was also stipulated that the lower part of the building should "be furnished with pews of five and a half feet in width from the wall around the Meeting House, where it is convenient, and that the body of the Meeting House be filled with seats, allowing an alley of four feet wide from the Great Door to the Deacons' Seat, and also an alley of three feet before ye pews." The Committee was also instructed to procure boards for "the Galleries floores."

Nearly another year elapsed without material progress in the work, when at a Town Meeting on Dec. 9, 1751, which is the first one definitely stated to have been held in the new building, another rate (one of 12 pence on the pound, old tenor) was laid on the Grand List, to defray town charges and "toards finishing the Meeting House," and the Committee was again impowered to finish the lower part of the house throughout and furnish it with pulpit, seats, pews, etc., 16 according to the former vote.

During the succeeding six months the work finally appears to have been completed, and we gather from a town vote of July

27, 1752, that all that then remained to be done was the finishing of the galleries.¹⁷ On Sept. 20, 1763, the Selectmen were authorized to procure "stone steps for the Meeting House Doors," and there end the record references to all matters connected with constructing and furnishing the historic edifice.

We have been thus circumstantial in recounting the details of the building of the church-hall, not only for the sake of historical accuracy, but also to show how the work was finally completed in spite of grave difficulties and disheartening delays and because at least a part of the building so laboriously erected still remains incorporated in the central portion of our "new" Town Hall.

From Dec. 9, 1751, nearly one hundred and sixty-five years, the regular business of the town has been transacted on the spot thus dedicated (in part) to its use, with the exception of the presidential elections of 1860 and 1876, during the alterations made in 1877-8,19 and on a few other occasions, all of which are not now recalled. In the winters of 1798, 1801 and 1804, Town Meetings convened in the old building were several times adjourned to "Capt. Jeremiah Bushnell's North Chamber," where undoubtedly a blazing hearth fire and a hot toddy infused a generous warmth into the deliberations of the ancients which was not afforded by the frosty atmosphere of the meeting house.

The town had no title to the land upon which the church was built, but on May 29, 1750, Col. Robert Walker²⁰ of Stratford, one of the original proprietors of the town, actuated by love and

good will, deeded to Jonathan Lee, Thomas Chipman, Samuel Beebe, and the rest of the inhabitants of the town, two pieces of land, one on the west side of the main highway and the other on the east side. Upon the former the church building had been commenced, and the remainder of the tract was given for burial purposes. That upon the east side, upon a part of which the present (1916) Congregational Church stands, was to be used as a parade ground.

The Rev. Adam Reid says of the old meeting-house,—"It was a rude, unfinished, barnlike building, the beams and braces all bare; without plastering or lathing, and with but scanty accommodations for the comfort of the worshippers."²¹ The late Lot Norton, Esq., gives this description of it,²²—"If my memory serves me correctly, the building was ceiled on the inside, as was the custom of building dwelling-houses in those days. Overhead, however, the rafters and roof boards were fully exposed to view. I remember seeing the prints of the foot of a man on the roof boards, which remained there from the period of the building of the house, till the change was made in 1813—evidently made by some person walking on the boards with wet bare feet before the roof was put on."

In 1783 and 1792 some necessary repairs were voted, and in 1793 the advisability of building a new church was first considered in town meeting. Put to a vote, the motion was lost, but eventually in 1797 and 1798 it was voted to build the present Congregational Church, which was constructed in 1799 and completely finished and furnished in 1800. On the completion of the new house, the old one was abandoned as a place of public worship. On Dec. 5, 1803, a motion to appoint a committee "to view the old Meeting House and assertain the probable expence of putting s'd House in Repair for a Town House," failed of passage. It was still considered primarily as church property, and the Ecclesiastical (Cong.) Society which was organized in it, Nov.

12, 1804, "and succeeded in all the property and interests which the town had managed in its ecclesiastical capacity," voted (Sept. 13, 1805) to relinquish its right in it to the town, provided the building should be used for Freemen's meetings, town and school society meetings and for no other purposes.


The old house soon became so dilapidated that according to one authority, it had at that time no doors or windows intact and its complete abandonment was considered. In Nov., 1809, it was voted to sell the house, but apparently no purchaser was at hand. Happily a solution of the increasing difficulty was offered by Simeon Granger, late in 1812, and on Jan. 19, 1813, the property of the town on the west side of the highway, excepting the burying ground and a convenient passway to it and a passway to Roswell Lawrence, his heirs and assigns, to and from his house, was leased to Granger for a period of 999 years from Dec. 28, 1812.

Peter Farnam, Martin Strong and Samuel Church, a special committee of the town, effected the lease,24 the consideration of which consisted of the following conditions which Granger agreed to perform. He was to repair the old meeting house on or before the 1st day of Jan., 1814, so "as to furnish the said Town, the School Society and Ecclesiastical Society in said Town with a neat and convenient room with convenient seats and desk for the presiding officer to do and transact the public business of said Town and Societies, to be under the control and direction of said Town and Societies when wanted for the public business of said Town and Societies and at no other times, and shall also furnish a convenient room to keep and accommodate the Smith and Bingham Libraries in said town, and the proprietors of said Library Companies at the Libraries meetings, free of expence to said town, Societies and Library Companies and shall continue to furnish the said rooms in manner aforesaid" during the term of the lease also to furnish heat, and light said rooms when necessary, free of charge, and also to furnish a convenient room "for teaching a Grammar School for a fair and reasonable price, to be paid by the proprietors of said school." Upon failure to perform all

of these conditions, the property and improvements were to revert to the town.

Complying with these conditions, Granger repaired the building and made some radical changes in it, both inside and out, to render it convenient as a public house.

In the absence of contemporary specifications, it is of course impossible, at this late date, to state exactly what alterations Granger made in the building in 1813, for it is now nearly forty years since these changes were in turn effaced, but information secured from some of our older residents²⁵ who remember the building before its alteration in 1878, is sufficient to afford us the following reasonably accurate description.

It is possible that minor alterations were made from time to time subsequent to Granger's occupancy, but in general it is assumed that the building remained about the same from the time of his original alteration until 1878. In 1813, therefore, it is probable that the two-story piazza or porch was added to the front of the building, as shown in the early accompanying illustration, and that the original church building was lengthened by a 20½ foot addition on the north end. That is to say, the original frontage was 45 feet and it is now (exclusive of the recent north and south additions) 65½ feet, and as it is known that no such increase of frontage was made in 1878, it is assumed that this addition was one of Granger's making.

The principal changes, of course, were interior ones and consisted of converting one barn-like galleried room into a two-storied dwelling. So far as anyone now remembers, the front porch entrance opened into a wide hallway, with stairs at the back leading to the upper floor. The front corner room on the south side of the hallway was the hotel parlor, flanked on the opposite side by the proprietor's living-room, adjoining which on the north front corner was the bar-room, located in the twenty foot addition above referred to. Behind the parlor and living-room were the kitchen and dining-room respectively, and in the rear, attached to the southwest corner of the main building, was a small build-

ing, presumably a combination woodshed, summer-kitchen, etc. The kitchen addition, partially shut off from view by a high board fence, erected around it on the east and south sides, was but a step or two from the southeast corner of the cemetery. The proximity of the rear entrance to the table monument, erected in 1803, to the memory of Joseph Canfield, Esq., lends color to the tradition that this conveniently placed memorial was frequently used as a meat block, by "the minions of the scullery." The tradition is perpetuated here not to call particular attention to the impropriety of the alleged act, but rather to emphasize the subsequent growth of sentiment and the present force of enlightened public opinion, in view of which no such violation of the laws of decency could be committed.

On the second floor the room reserved for the transaction of public business was situated in the south end and the partitions separating the various rooms fronting the street were removable, so that on occasions when a large unobstructed space was required, the whole could be made temporarily into one room. Bed-rooms were ranged along the rear part of this floor. Near the head of the stairway, leading up from the front hall, was a small room or rather closet fitted with shelves whereon were kept the Smith and Bingham Libraries.

Directly to the north of the building, horse sheds and a barn were erected and the premises arranged conveniently for the use of the public.

Granger continued in occupancy under his lease until 1821,²⁶ when he sold the premises to Moses Wells, under the terms of the original lease.²⁷ Granger removed from this town to Pittsford, Vt., and was living there in 1831.

Mr. Wells continued in the same line as his predecessor until March 7, 1840,²⁸ when William Bushnell became owner of the premises on payment of \$2425.

"Wells'" became "Bushnell Tavern" and remained such under the management of Capt. Bushnell himself and several tenant landlords, until Oct. 7, 1864,²⁹ when John H. Coffing of

Great Barrington and George Coffing of Salisbury purchased the property, and a small piece of land adjoining it on the south and west, for \$4,100.

Very little is definitely remembered now of the various tenants who "ran the hotel" after Capt. Bushnell retired from active business, but inquiry here and there has elicited as much information as will probably ever be secured. About 1850 a man named Holcomb was the landlord and died during his tenancy. death is not recorded on the town records and if he was buried here, no monument to him now appears. He was succeeded by Albert T. Jones who married a sister of Martin and Harlo P. Harris and whose son Albert T. Jones is still living at Hyde Park, N. Y. The occupancy of Holcomb and Jones must have been very brief, for as early as 1853, Hercules Western Thorp, familiarly known as "Wet" Thorp, was the proprietor and so continued until about 1857, when he leased Caul's Hotel at Falls Village. He was succeeded by "Len" Chase who was in occupancy in 1859 (so says Mr. Charles Day of Lakeville) and possibly later. The last landlord was Noah H. Wheeler (who married Sarah Woodbridge, an adopted daughter of Capt. Bushnell) who was occupying the place in Oct., 1864, when the Messrs. Coffing purchased it.

After 1864 the building was used for town purposes and parts of it were rented to individuals for dwellings. It became more and more dilapidated until it was found necessary either to abandon or renovate it, and the latter course was pursued in 1878, of which more hereafter.

Many were the activities, besides those of a purely civic nature, which centered in the old hotel-hall between 1813-1878. Here came those of inquiring minds to draw books from the library foundations of Richard Smith, the English Ironmaster, and Caleb Bingham, the Boston Schoolmaster. Here met the worthies who composed the "Society for the Promotion of Good Morals," to deliberate on questions of social improvement. Here in the palmy tavern days of Granger and Wells gathered the youth and beauty of the countryside to hold their singing schools and dancing classes, and more formal "Assemblies." Independence Days and General Trainings were celebrated here, perhaps in



somewhat boisterous fashion. Here the opposing factions of the Masons and Antimasons matched their strength by argument and ballot, and from 1814 to 1824 and from 1827 to 1829 here was the regular meeting place of Montgomery Lodge, F. & A. M.³⁰

John Whittlesey Walton, a Chapinville boy, now resident in Cleveland, in recently written reminiscences of the decade 1850-60, recalls that at the hours of departure and arrival of the daily stages to and from Canaan, Winsted and Hartford, the Tavern was the center of attraction. Referring to the hotel itself, he gives this descriptive bit,—"The hotel office in the north wing, likewise contains the bar, over which is a printed motto, flyblown and yellow with age, displaying the advice, sage at least from the view point of mine host,—

New Receipt for Health, Drink light, but often."


"The Connecticut Western News," which was published in Salisbury from its commencement number, July 14, 1871, until Mr. Pease, 31 the editor, moved to Canaan in Oct., 1876, was first issued in the old building, where its office was located until the fall of 1874, when it was moved across the street to the Academy building. Plate II in this volume shows the "News" sign over the front piazzas, and Editor Pease himself, standing on the doorstep.

The arrangements entered into in 1814 for the accommodation of the public business of the town seem to have given satisfaction for many years, but the time naturally came when some improvement in them seemed desirable. To what extent the Town Records themselves were kept in the old building is not positively known, but it is not unlikely that the respective Town Clerks kept at least the current volumes and possibly the older ones, in their own homes. At any rate the importance of a safe repository for the records was brought to the attention of the people in 1849; one of the sections of the call for the annual meeting to be held

on Oct. 9th of that year read,—"To take into consideration the propriety and expediency of erecting a fire proof office, for the Town Records." No immediate action was taken in this matter but it and better accommodations in general were undoubtedly discussed from time to time and culminated in a town meeting held June 5, 1858,32 for the purpose of determining if the town would purchase a part, or the whole of a lot in Salisbury Center, owned by Mrs. Eliza Peet, on the east side of the highway leading from the Congregational Church to the Episcopal Church. on which to erect a public building, to contain a hall and other rooms and a vault for the safe keeping of the Town and Probate Records. At this same meeting it was actually voted to erect such a building and Alex. H. Holley, Wm. H. Walton, Donald J. Warner, Daniel S. Clapp and Robert Bostwick were appointed a committee to submit a plan, building specifications, etc. subsequent report from this committee is on record and it is inferred that the unsettled political conditions of that period, followed shortly after by the outbreak of the Civil War, caused the temporary abandonment of the plan.

In July, 1870, the matter was revived by the appointment³³ of another committee of investigation, consisting of A. H. Holley, D. J. Warner, S. B. Moore, J. W. Parks and Wm. H. Barnum, acting with Selectmen Henry Woodworth. Erastus D. Goodwin and Andrew J. Spurr. This committee received from the Messrs. Coffing an offer to convey to the town all their interest in the Hotel property. The Committee reported that some legal questions appeared to exist which would interfere with the acceptance of the offer, but it was voted that the town gratefully accept it, provided the "difficulties" could be surmounted.

Another delay ensued and on Oct. 7, 1872, A. H. Holley and S. B. Moore acting with Selectmen John P. Walton, Chas. H. Bissell and Dwight Allyn, were authorized to consider a new location for the Town Hall, secure building estimates, etc.

To put the matter plainly, the reason for these various delays and conferences was the contention on the part of some of the people, that the terms of the lease had not been complied with, and that the owners of the building should be obliged to put it in

good repair and so maintain it. This argument weighed with those who were opposed to having the town make new expenditures, but hoped rather that the burden of maintenance would continue to rest with the owners and that accommodations would be provided for the town as in the past. The Coffings, on the other hand, apparently believed that they had fulfilled the terms of the lease as well as their predecessors had done, and though disposed to relinquish their right to the town voluntarily, they declined to be forced to repair and maintain the building, or to allow it to revert to the town on what they considered insufficient grounds.³⁴

Finally on Oct. 7, 1873, Messrs. Moore, Walton, Bissell and Allyn presented a report in which they recommended continuance on the old site and remarked at some length upon the rights of the town in the property itself. They further recommended that the Selectmen should notify John H. Coffing for himself and as administrator of the estate of George Coffing (who died Nov. 21, 1872) to repair the building, and on his failure to do so within a reasonable time that they should take possession for the town. These recommendations of the Committee were formally adopted and developments were anxiously awaited. Mr. Coffing declined to make the repairs during the winter season which was approaching, and further discussion developed an opinion in many minds that the repairs in question were not absolutely necessary anyway, and the "upshot" of it all was that no formal action of ejectment was taken by the town.

The matter dragged along until Oct. 4, 1875, when Wm. H. Barnum, A. H. Holley and Robert Little were appointed a com-

mittee to review the situation and confer again with the owners. Their findings, if they made any, are not of record.

At length on Sept. 22, 1877, a special town meeting was held at which Mr. Coffing was present by invitation. He again offered his interest in the property to the town and agreed to procure a like conveyance from the heirs of his brother George upon the payment to them of an appraisal price to be determined by Frederick Miles, Lorenzo Tupper and Silas Wells. This offer was accepted by the town and a vote of thanks passed to Mr. Coffing. The town at once took nominal possession of the property, and laid a tax to meet the expense of repairs and alterations in the building. We say "nominal" possession, for it was not until Feb. 11, 1888, that the executor of the Estate of John H. Coffing (who died Aug. 14, 1882) actually conveyed his interest to the town, by deed,—the interest in the George Coffing portion having passed to the town in December and January preceding, for the consideration of \$1,200, which was the appraisal finally agreed upon.35

At the Town Meeting held Sept. 22, 1877, already referred to, it was voted to raise a sum not to exceed \$5,000, with which to repair the Town Hall, and install in it a vault for the records. Robert Little, Dr. H. M. Knight and Martin Harris were appointed a Building Committee, and by Oct. 1st the work of alteration was commenced.³⁶ How it progressed cannot be better told than by the following quotations from the contemporary columns of the "Connecticut Western News":—"Active operations on the town hall are suspended for the present. The exterior of the building is nearly finished and with its fresh coat of white paint presents an imposing appearance, which adds greatly to the attractiveness of our main street." [Issue of Dec. 21, 1877.]

"Work was resumed on the Town Hall on Tuesday last under the supervision of Martin Harris, and will be vigorously prosecuted to a finish." [Issue of Feb. 21, 1878.]

"The new Town Hall is now completed and ready for occupancy. The unsightly outbuildings adjoining the Town Hall were sold for \$26.50 on Saturday, and the work of demolition begun." [Issue of June 27, 1878.]

At a Town Meeting held April 13, 1878, the Building Committee's report was accepted, an additional \$700 was voted for finishing the work and a vote of thanks to the Committee was passed "for the energy, fidelity and economy in the manner in which they have done the work placed in their hands." It was also voted to expend not over \$600. in grading the grounds, building fences, heating and lighting the building, and for necessary furniture. In Oct., 1879, Mr. Little presented a claim for \$160. which he had advanced "over and above the appropriations," in connection with his work as Committeeman, which was allowed. The several appropriations, together with Mr. Little's claim, total \$6,460, as the sum expended by the town in making this civic improvement.

As noted in one of the preceding quotations, the renovated building was "ready for occupancy" in June, 1878. This statement may have been a bit premature. "The News" gives the date of the first meeting of the Selectmen held in their new quarters as Aug. 5, '78, and in the same month Martin B. Strong commenced his duties as janitor.³⁷

On Aug. 10, 1878, a meeting was held of which the following is the press report:—38

"Pursuant to a call signed by many citizens, a meeting was held at Academy hall on Saturday afternoon last, to make arrangements for dedicating the new town hall. M. L. Graham was chosen chairman, and Daniel Pratt secretary of the meeting. The following proceedings are transcribed from the official record of the clerk. Voted—Ist, that the town hall be properly dedicated. 2d, that the dedicatory exercises be held at a special town meeting, legally warned. 3d, that Lot Norton Esq., be invited to act as historian, and chronicler for the occasion. 4th, that a committee of two from each post-office district be appointed as a committee

of arrangements. 5th, that the third day of September, at 2 P. M. be the time for dedicating said hall. It was also voted, that all expenses incurred, should be defrayed by voluntary contributions. The committee appointed were instructed to notify the selectmen of the proceedings at this meeting, and to request them to call a town meeting at the date named above, (signed) Daniel Pratt, clerk. It is expected to make this occasion a gala day for the whole town. * * * The exercises in the afternoon will probably comprise remarks from old residents, together with an historial address commemorative of the glories of the ancient edifice. In the evening, Terpsichore will reign supreme. Good music and a feast of bounteous proportions provided by the ladies, will aid the devotees of the benign Goddess in doing proper homage to her memory."

Curiously enough nothing in the town records indicates that a special town meeting for dedicatory purposes was ever called or held. The press is also silent on the subject, although the issues of "The News" down to the summer of 1879 have been carefully searched. The only allusions to the matter are,—that on account of a temperance mass-meeting which was held at Lakeville Sept. 5, 1878,30 the dedication of the Town Hall, set for Sept. 3d, had been postponed, and that a dance was given in the Town Hall about Thanksgiving time40 which was the "first entertainment of the kind held in the new hall."

We are again indebted to the columns of "The News" (issue of Aug. 8, 1878) for the following detailed account of the appearance of the Town Hall, on the completion of the changes which had been recently made:—

"The good old town of Salisbury, organized in 1741, with all her good deeds in the past, in patriotism, in the many 'good men and true,' she has sent out into the world, in her industries, her wealth, and so on to the end of the chapter, has gone a step in advance, again, and probably shows the finest town building of any rural community in this commonwealth. It is just now ready for occupancy, and one who a year ago, looked upon its dilapidated walls, sunken floors, and weather-beaten gables, and



beholds to-day a structure, pleasing to the eye, both in architectural taste and mechanical skill, arranged for the business transacted there, can hardly restrain an exclamation of delight, that so soon the transformation has taken place. A News reporter had the pleasure of being shown through the building the other day, through the courtesy of Town Clerk Pratt and Selectman Hubbard, and we need not add that these gentlemen take great delight in the prospect of better quarters for the transaction of their business, and the convenience of all the residents of the town. * * * Outside, the appearance is very pleasing. The old unsightly sheds have been removed, and the ground graded. levelled off and put in proper order. A tower has been built on the west corner, adding much to the beauty of the structure, in which is a broad, winding stairway leading to the hall above; a private stairway is also in the east end. The exterior is painted a light drab, with dark trimmings, and is very pretty indeed, giving it a cheerful appearance. A wide hallway on the first floor runs the whole width of the building. To the left, as you enter, is the selectmen's room, 35 x 15, and a very convenient, roomy place it is. The floors are of yellow pine, the ceilings ash, oiled and shellaced, with dark trimmings. Large windows give plenty of light, and high ceilings make it exceedingly well ventilated. The room has a number of chairs, a large table and other conveniences for the business in that department. Across the hall, fronting the street, is the probate room, and here our friend Col. Tupper will find the snuggest quarters imaginable for holding his courts. Just in the rear is the vault, large enough for the convenient storage of the papers and records of the office. The ceilings are like those in the selectmen's room. Back of the probate room is the town clerk's office, where that veteran scribe and town functionary, Daniel Pratt, feels guite elated over the fact that the remainder of his official years can be passed in such cozy rooms, despite the fact that his windows open on to the solemn grave-yard in the rear. The vault also has ample room for records, and an interesting hour we spent looking over the account of the first meeting, in 1741, when the inhabitants voted to form themselves into a town.

On the second floor, access to which is had up the broad stair-







way in the tower, is the town hall proper. Its dimensions are 35 x 60, with high walls—and large windows afford splendid light. The floors are yellow pine, finished in oil; the ceilings are ash. and there are some handsome specimens of graining here noticeable, the handiwork of a German who happened to drop along to Salisbury just in time to secure the contract. Some little difficulty is experienced in hearing distinctly in the back part of the room, but this defect will be remedied soon. A large stage, 18 x 20, is in the east end, giving ample conveniences for dramatic entertainments and the like. The hall has a seating capacity of 300, and the old-time benches have given place to Morse's patent folding settees. They are movable, and so arranged as to fold up and be taken away, clearing the floor for dancing parties. Three large chandeliers have been ordered, and the stage also has side-lights. The doors swing both ways, and are covered with green rep. The walls throughout the building are all hardfinished, and in fact all the materials entering into the construction of the building, are of the best quality. The work was all done by local mechanics, by the day, so there is no slighting in that particular. It is no wonder that Salisbury has a public hall in which the citizens all take pride, not only as an ornament, but as a credit to their enterprise."

During the thirty-five years that elapsed after the alteration in 1878, no changes were made in the building, and as had been anticipated, it proved adequate to the needs of the public for a long time.

In 1913 it became evident that quite extensive repairs and renovation were necessary, and although the finances of the town did not warrant a large expenditure, it was determined to spend an amount sufficient to do the work most obviously needed. At this juncture Robert Scoville came forward with a proposition to make a complete renovation and extensive enlargement of the building, all expense incurred in excess of the amount voted by the Town, to be paid by him personally.

At a special Town Meeting held May 24, 1913,⁴¹ it was "Resolved that the town grant to Mr. Robert Scoville permission to alter and enlarge the Town Hall in accordance with his proposi-

tion and that the thanks of the town be and hereby are extended to him for his public-spirited and extremely generous offer.

Resolved that the sum of \$500. be and hereby is appropriated toward the payment of such alterations."

Plans and specifications prepared by Arthur C. Jackson, an architect of New York City, were accepted and the construction contract was secured by Horace S. Kelsey of Salisbury. On June 28, 1913, ground was broken for the south addition and work by the carpenters was commenced on Aug. 16th. The entire work, with the exception of "odd jobs" and painting, 42 was completed on Feb. 28, 1914, and the building was, in a sense, rededicated to public use by the Memorial Day exercises held in it on May 30th of that year.

The changes made in altering the old Town Hall into the new one, dignified and impressive in appearance and commodious in all its appointments, necessitated the expenditure of a trifle less than \$17,500, and the Town may well be appreciative of the spirit of philanthropy and civic pride which actuated one man to do so much for the benefit of many.

The frontispiece of this volume so well presents the exterior appearance of the "New Town Hall" that description is unnecessary, further than to say that the frontage of the central portion is 65½ feet and of the wings 25 feet each, making a total frontage of 115½ feet. The pillars upholding the portico are 21 feet high and are based upon a concrete platform 7 feet 2 inches wide by 34½ feet long.

In the old hall the stairway to the second floor was in the tower on the south end, but this tower was, of course, removed to make room for the new addition and the stairway is now directly to the left of the front entrance. At the head of the stairway the doorway on the left opens into the second story of the south wing, a handsomely furnished room 25 x 34 feet, which is occupied jointly by the Salisbury Grange and the Knights of Pythias. Two anterooms and a short corridor lie between this room and the main auditorium. The dimensions of the latter are practically the same

as they were formerly, as the south end of it was partitioned off into anterooms, a loss of space compensated for by placing the stage in the second story of the new north wing.

The lower floor of the south wing affords a spacious room for the use of the Selectmen and other town officials and removable booths are set up in it on election days. It has an exit on the south end, so that voters passing into the booths from the hallway entrance, can deposit their ballots and pass directly out of the building. On the north side of the front entrance, the Town Clerk's office and the Probate Court room, which were formerly separated by a partition, are now thrown together into one room, with south and east side entrances from the lobby, the record vaults opening upon the north side, as formerly. On the west side of the central building, between this room and the south wing are situated a conveniently arranged and well equipped kitchen, and closets and lavatory with modern plumbing. The remaining floor space in the central part is utilized as a lobby or entrance hall, excepting the room behind the Clerk's office, formerly the kitchen, which is now a store-room for the use of the School Committee, etc. The lower floor of the north wing, with a wide doorway opening to the north, accommodates the heating plant, and the apparatus of the Salisbury Fire Department. Another entrance on the north side of the north wing opens into a private stairway which leads to the east side of the stage, on the second floor.

The grounds north, east and south of the building, unfortunately but necessarily restricted in area, are now graded lawns, and at the south end, Judge Warner has caused to be set up as an historic relic, one of the heavy trip hammers and its anvil base, formerly used in the iron works on Mt. Riga.

The "New Town Hall" was not rededicated by any formal action of the Town, but by a public gathering held on June 19, 1914. To quote the Lakeville Journal of June 25, 1914,—"The members of Salisbury Grange and the Knights of Pythias took possession of their quarters in the newly renovated Town Hall, last Friday evening. The occasion was marked by a joint entertainment and dance. * * *

The principal speakers of the evening were Hon. D. T. Warner,



Hon. H. F. Landon, Rev. John Calvin Goddard, Rev. Charles B. Carpenter and Mr. William E. Pettee.

Although the threatening weather conditions kept many people away, about three hundred were present.

Many enthusiastic comments on the beauty and conveniences of the new building were heard, and the members [of the several organizations] as well as the general public are to be congratulated upon having one of the finest meeting places in the state."

PART II

VITAL RECORDS OF SALISBURY TOWN

Circa 1768-1800



INTRODUCTION

The vital records of Salisbury which were published in the first volume of "Collections" comprehended approximately the period 1730-1767 and were taken from Vol. I Land Records and the First Book of Town Meeting Records, etc. The instalment in this volume takes up the work where it was left in the last issue and carries it through the second volume of Town Meeting Records and Births, Marriages and Deaths, to what is approximately the year 1800.

Owing to the family group method of recording (see Vol. I Coll's. p. 26) each original record book does not completely cover an exact period of time, as the clerk in grouping his entries would frequently carry a current date back to a book already supposed to be closed, or would, at the instance of interested persons, enter prior dates in his current record. For this reason the previous instalment, though it nominally covered the period ending in 1767, contained some entries of a later period, and this present part, though it nominally begins with the year 1768, contains a number of entries of earlier date, the earliest being 1746. In like manner the Third Book of Births, Marriages and Deaths which will furnish the vital record section for the "Collections," Vol. III, though it begins nominally in 1800, will contain many entries prior to that date.

Had it been possible to publish in one volume all Salisbury Vital Records, from the earliest period to say 1848, our alphabetical arrangement would have eliminated these various "overlappings," but since it has been necessary to adopt the instalment plan, it is only proper to explain why some date which the searcher would naturally expect to find in this issue, and has failed to find, may perchance appear in the next one.

In any event this is certain, that with a publication of one more part of the vital records, every item of that sort, to be found upon the official records of the town prior to 1848, will be in print.



The record volume from which the following entries are taken contains 92 pages of manuscript. Pages 1-3 comprise a mutilated index, pages 4-6 inclusive, 53-92 inclusive, contain Town Votes 1767-1784, and pages 7-51 inclusive are devoted to the vital records. The volume was rebound by the Emery silk process in 1898, and re-indexed the same year, but some of the margins were worn past preservation, and half of one leaf (pp. 47-8) of the vital records is missing. Most fortunately for us the late Frank E. Randall of New York City, who devoted much of his leisure to genealogy, made a fair copy of these vital records about 1895, when the leaf mentioned was still whole, and from his transcript the records of eight marriages on p. 47, and twentyeight deaths on p. 48 have been restored, as well as occasional marginal data, which are now lost in the original. Certain other portions of the record, as indicated by brackets in the following list, had become either mutilated or illegible, before Mr. Randall made his copy, and these can never be wholly supplied from any source.

In arranging the following data for publication, the spelling of surnames, baptismal and place names has been retained as in the original record, and every item of actual information has been included, but the order of the original has necessarily been changed by the alphabetical arrangement, and words that are either obsolete or unnecessary to the sense have been omitted.

The Randall transcript was transferred to a card index, which was then typed and checked back with the original record, and the utmost care exercised in proof-reading. This compilation is believed, therefore, to be as accurate as it is possible to make it.





PART III

Inscriptions in the Old Part of the "New" Cemetery at Salisbury Center



SALISBURY "NEW" CEMETERY

At a Town Meeting held October 2, 1826, the Selectmen of Salisbury were directed either to enlarge the limits of the burying ground (presumably the old yard behind the Town Hall) or to purchase land elsewhere for a new cemetery. The alternative was adopted and on September 7, 1830 (Land Records Vol. 19, p. 40) the Town purchased 1 acre and 158 rods of land of Alexander Lamb, for \$200. This lot lay "on the east side of the highway leading from the Meeting House to David Lyman's dwelling house, being the same land laid out for a burying yard."

Judge Church, speaking in 1841, of the various burial places in Salisbury town, says (Address, p. 71), "but one burying place has been located [since 1803]—the new burying yard north of the center village. This was purchased and the south half of it laid into lots, in the year 1830. Deacon Mylo Lee was the first person buried in it. A map of this burying place is lodged in the Town Clerk's Office." This statement accords with the purchase date above mentioned, and with a town vote of October 4, 1830, to "lay out the burying ground into suitable lots and expose them to sale."

There would seem to have been some agreement with Lamb, tantamount to a purchase, for several years prior to 1830. Deacon Mylo Lee died April 29, 1829, nearly a year and a half before the purchase date. There are two stones of earlier date than Lee's,—those of Hannah M. Sterling who died February 23, 1828, and Emma M. Lathrop who died January 29, 1829, so that Church's statement that Deacon Lee was the first there buried, may be questioned. There are also four 1830 inscriptions all dated prior to September 7 of that year.

When this yard was opened, five other cemeteries in the town were in use, and it was not until 1871 that it became necessary to enlarge it. On August 21 of that year, Daniel and Rachel L. Pratt (for \$1,700) sold to the town 5 $_{1000}^{670}$ acres of land for a cemetery, (Land Records Vol. 30, p. 485). This tract was "situate in the Center Village on the South and East sides of



the present burying yard." By a town vote a few days later (August 26) this purchase was incorporated with the original yard and the whole laid out into 886 lots, with allowance for driveways or "Avenues" and footpaths or "Alleys." Of the land included in the Pratt purchase, a portion, "not to exceed one-third" was to be used for "free burials" and the remainder to be lots subject to sale by the Selectmen.

The next addition to the cemetery, 53 square rods of land, was made on December 2, 1901 (Land Records, Vol. 39, pp. 247-50) as a gift to the town from George C., Milton J., Percy D. and Elizabeth Warner and Fanny E. Coffing. This land joins the former layout on the east side of the north end, and the donors reserved a little over half of it for their family plot.

The latest addition was a tract of about two and a half acres, which the Cemetery Association received by deed of gift from Robert Scoville on September 16, 1907 (Land Records Vol. 40, p. 214). This addition lies directly east of the last-mentioned piece, extends to the road leading from Salisbury to Canaan, and raises the total area of the cemetery to a trifle more than nine and a half acres.

Interments in the older and smaller yards of the town are now infrequent, and at the present time nearly all burials (except such as are made in the Roman Catholic Cemetery at Salisbury and in the beautifully kept cemetery at Lime Rock) are made in this large central yard at Salisbury.

A few years ago the upkeep of this "New" cemetery became a matter of public concern, and on March 30, 1899, the Salisbury Cemetery Association was chartered, without capital stock, to take up the improvement and maintenance of this cemetery. Since then much has been done in the way of grading, fencing and beautification. The officers of the Association, all of whom have served it since its organization, are George H. Clark, President, James R. Harrison, Secretary, and Howard F. Landon, Treasurer. Frank D. Spurr has served most efficiently as sexton for thirty years past and his hearty coöperation with the management is fully shown by the appearance of the cemetery.

The Association has accumulated interest-bearing trust funds amounting to \$2,388.57. It also receives an annual income of about \$130. from the permanent Scoville and Spurr Funds, and



since October 1, 1900, it has acted as the town's agent in administering the following trust funds bequeathed to the town for specific use, either in whole or in part, in the new cemetery:

Maria Barnett Cemetery Fund, \$100. Irene J. Church Fund, \$485.

John H. Hinman Fund, \$500.

Mary Ann Kelsey Lindsey Fund, \$475.

The town also appropriates \$150. per annum to be used in connection with the income derived from the other sources mentioned. One-half the proceeds of sales of lots in the last addition also goes into the permanent maintenance fund.

The revenues of the Association have been sufficient, therefore, to keep the newer portions of the cemetery in fine condition and to admit of the gradual improvement of the older portions, which, owing to the dispersal of families, would not otherwise be well cared for. The increasing interest of families in the perpetual upkeep of their lots is to be commended and encouraged, and if the Association continues to receive assistance of this kind it will eventually be able to keep the entire yard in proper order.

A mortuary chapel should be erected upon the cemetery grounds, but funds have not been available for this work. The need is especially great, on account of the severity of our winters and the matter is here brought to public attention in the hope that the suggestion may result in bequests or donations for so worthy a purpose.

The scope of this volume of Collections admitted of the inclusion of only a part of the inscriptions found in this large yard, hence the following 805 inscriptions which are found in the northwest or first used part of it have been transcribed. This part, in the terms of the map, before mentioned, is bounded on the north by lands of D. M. Ashman (late S. W. Elliott's), on the south by Alley F, on the east by Alley Q and on the west by the highway, called the Under Mountain Road. Expressed in terms of lots the transcript covers lots 592-602 inclusive and 625-886 inclusive—in area about one-fourth of the cemetery, as it was prior to the latest addition. The central part of this area is the oldest part and will not be used further for burials, but the northern part of it is still used to some extent.



There are in other parts of the cemetery, not included in this transcript, many inscriptions from about the year 1850 on, but it seemed best to cover the ground exhaustively by sections, rather than to collect all inscriptions prior to some fixed date.

In the next volume of Collections it is proposed to complete the transcription of all data in this cemetery down to the year 1900, to include all inscriptions in the Roman Catholic Cemetery down to the same year, and all in Lime Rock Cemetery between the years 1800 and 1900. When this has been done, all the records of this kind, extant in the entire town of Salisbury, from their earliest appearance in 1750 to the year 1900,—a century and a half, will be in print.

In this compilation, as in the former volume, it will be noted that surnames and baptismal names have been arranged alphabetically, and for that reason are not included in the general index. Formulæ and versification not necessary to the sense, have been omitted, but every item of biographical value found, is here noted.

The lists have been made by the card index method and after being arranged and typed have been carefully verified by a second reading of the original inscriptions.





PART IV

An Historical Digest of the First Volume of Salisbury

Land Records



INTRODUCTION

The following digest may be exactly described as an attempted handy reference compilation of the miscellaneous bits of information of a purely historical, topographical and personal nature, disclosed by a careful reading of the Land Records text. It is, therefore, properly speaking a digest of such data, and such only. For the details of the various transactions mentioned, as well as of a great many others not mentioned, because of their lack of "local color," recourse must be had to the original records. The digest does not include the twenty-seven pages of Town Votes, mentioned below, which together with other records of that class will be taken up in later issues.

The completeness of any compendium of this kind is wholly dependent upon the selective sense of the compiler, and it is possible that some references, which another might consider of value, have been omitted. The researcher may be assured, however, that a conscientious effort has been made to note here all references to places of residence other than Salisbury, statements of relationships, mention of local place-names, early dwellings and industries, etc., etc.,—in short to everything which adds to our knowledge of the town and its inhabitants.

Titles to real estate in Salisbury are derived from one source in three ways,—grants made to individuals by the Colony, prior to the sale of the town in May 1738, compensatory grants made by the Colony to those who had purchased lands of the Indians, and had been obliged to relinquish them to the Colony, which claimed the sole right of preëmption, and thirdly, in the purchases of the "Original Proprietors," who bought their rights at public sale in Hartford on the date above named.

It should be borne in mind that the Original Proprietors' allotment and layout records, although they too are "land records," are distinct from the series beginning with the volume covered by this digest, and continued through forty-five volumes, to the present time.

Vol. I, Land Records is a book of 373 pages (size 7" x 111/4") bound in sheepskin covers and entitled "Salisbury First Book of R[] begun Nov. 9, 1741." Upon the first leaf appears a copy of the act incorporating the town in 1741. Pages 1-27 inclusive, record Town Votes from November, 1741-April, 1745. Pages 28-31 inclusive, 37-349 inclusive, page 356 and pages 358-366 inclusive, contain land conveyances. Pages 32-36 inclusive, give the "Grand Lists" of ratable property for the years 1742-44 inclusive. Pages 350-355 inclusive, give records of births and page 357 gives both birth and marriage records, all of which vital records were published in Vol. I, "Collections." Pages 367-373 give lists of "ear-marks,"-crude designs assigned to individuals for marking their livestock. As there was but little fencing of land in the early days, "beef critters" and other stock habitually ranged the Commons and highways and permanent marks of this kind were necessary for purposes of identification




