## HISTORICAL SKETCH, &c. OF THE CITY OF HARTFORD.

ENTERED, according to Act of Congress in the year 1857, by  
ELIHU GEER,  
in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United  
States for the District of Connecticut.

THE first settlement by the English, of Hartford, was commenced in 1635, by persons from Newton, now Cambridge, in Massachusetts. The principal part of the settlers did not start until 1636. Dr. Trumbull says, "About the beginning of June, Mr. Stone, and about one hundred men, women and children, took their departure from Cambridge, and traveled more than a hundred miles, through a hideous and trackless wilderness, to Hartford. They had no guide but their compass, and made their way over mountains, through swamps, thickets and rivers, which were not passable but with great difficulty. They had no cover but the heavens, nor any lodgings but those that simple nature afforded them. They drove with them a hundred and sixty head of cattle, and by the way subsisted on the milk of their cows. Mrs. Hooker was borne through the wilderness upon a litter. The people carried their parks, arms, and some utensils. They were nearly a fortnight on their journey." "This adventure was the more remarkable, as many of this company were persons of figure, who had lived in England, in honor, affluence and delicacy, and were entire strangers to fatigue and danger." The Indian name of Hartford was *Suck-quag*. A deed appears to have been given by *Suck-quag*, the sachem of the place, about 1636, to Samuel Stone and William Goodwin, who appear to have acted as chiefs of the first settlers.

In 1633 the Dutch sailed up the Connecticut river, and located a fort at the junction of the Connecticut and Little rivers, on a point of land known as Dutch point. They maintained a distinct and independent government, with difficulties often with the English, until 1651, when they were treated as declared enemies of the English, and driven off.



Hartford City is covered with a strong clay soil, but near the river is of a rich black mold. The city was incorporated May 29, 1784. It is one and a half miles in length, by about one in breadth. It is located on the west side of Connecticut river, at the head of steamboat navigation, and 50 miles from its mouth, in latitude  $41^{\circ} 45'$ , and longitude  $4^{\circ} 15'$  east from Washington. By railroad it is 111 miles north east from New York, and 124 miles west by south west from Boston, and 126 miles south east from Albany, 90 miles west of Providence. The Legislature of the State meets in this city every odd year. The city is divided by the Little river, which is spanned by three freestone bridges—two of three arches each, and the one on Main street is of a single arch, on rock foundation, and is 100 feet wide, 7 feet in thickness at the base, and 3 feet 3 inches at the center—the chord or span of which is 104 feet, and is 30 feet 9 inches elevation from the bed of the river to the top of the arch. The Great Bridge across the Connecticut River, is more than 1000 feet in length and has cost about \$125,000. The Charter Oak tree, in whose trunk was the cavity in which was concealed the Charter of Connecticut Oct. 31, 1687, and which was resumed May 9, 1689, was blown down in a severe storm, at 10 minutes before 1 o'clock, A. M. Aug. 20, 1856. This tree stood on lot No. 29 Charter Oak avenue. This Charter which was concealed therein was granted to the colonists by Charles II. King of England, April 23d, 1682. And by order of James II. King of England the unsuccessful attempt to wrest the same from the State, was made by Sir Edmund Andross, Oct. 31, 1687. This Charter was superseded by the adoption of our present Constitution Oct. 5th, 1818. The original Charter is in the Hall of Secretary of State, framed in wood from the tree that concealed it from the marauders of 1687.

THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TAXES range from 1 to 4 per cent. Adding the average of the School Tax the total taxes of the city would be 21 cents, which would make our taxes this year 63 cents on the \$100. Last year there were extraordinary taxes for Sewers and incidental expenses to Water Works which swelled them, for that year only, much above the the average. But "our taxes this year are very much lower than those of Providence, or of almost any city of the size of Hartford in New England, where they have the conveniences that we have. We also have the prospect of a handsome income from our water works in future."

THE CITY TAX for this year of 11 cents, will raise \$55,000.

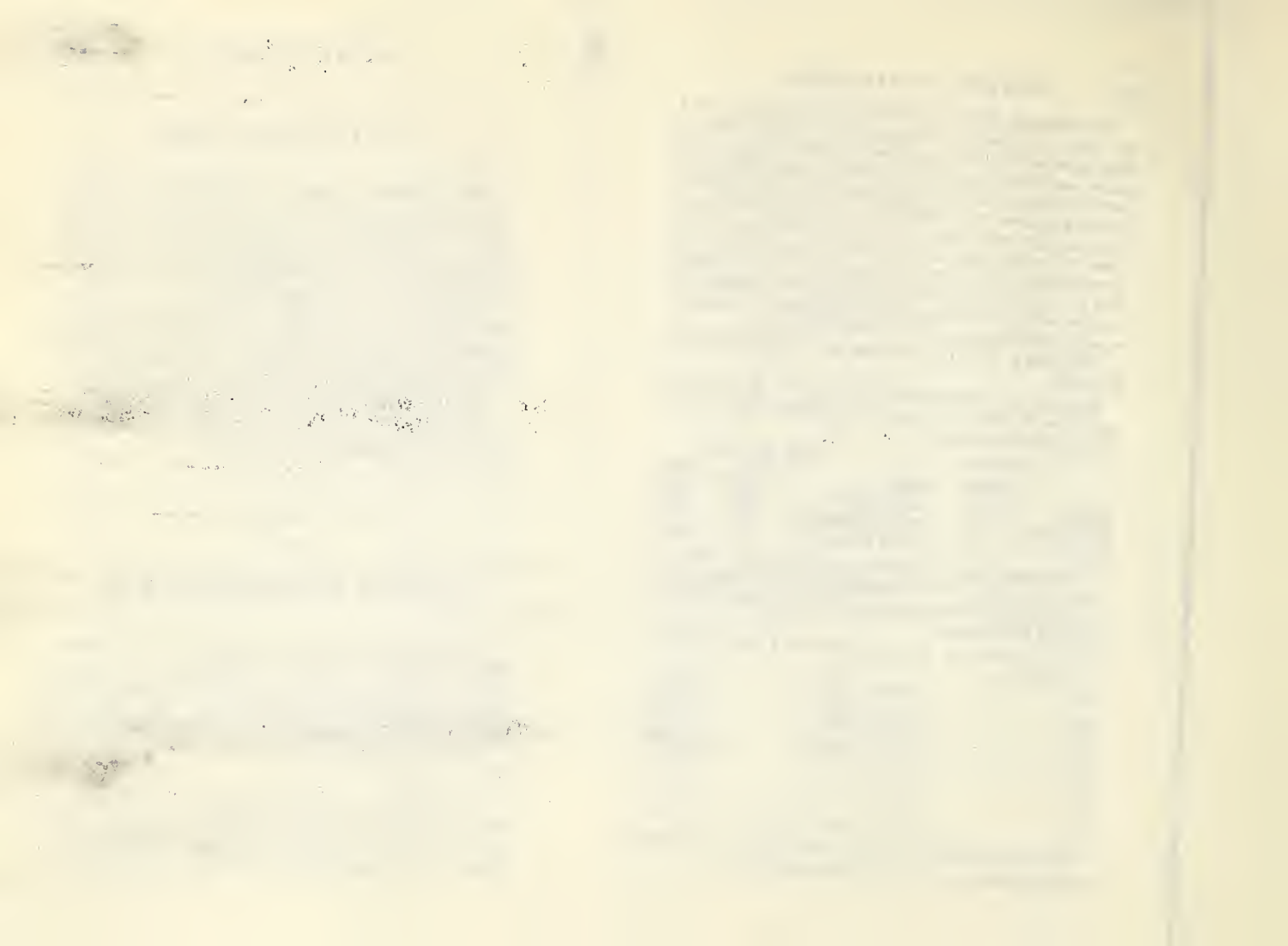

In our Business Directory this year, we show more than 200 kinds of business carried on in this city by more than 1200 different persons, firms, and corporations. There have been 185 new firms the past year.





In the year 1838 our Map of the City, as it then was, showed 48 streets, to which annual additions have been made until the city numbers now 140 streets and avenues.

In the year 1838 there was only 17 pages of miscellaneous information—which has annually been on the increase until now there are 128 such pages.

In this number we show what rapid advances this city has made the past year, as well as during the past twenty years. We add upwards of 1860 new names this year. We found more than 1620 removals, &c. the past year. The changes in the list of Churches, Corporations, Societies, Schools, Banks, &c., have been over 2500. The copy in which the corrections are made; also a file of our Directory for twenty years with Directories for 1837 from many cities can be seen at No. 16 State st.

The first number of this Directory was issued in the year 1838, and numbered 72 pages, and contained 1625 names.

RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATIONS IN CITY OF HARTFORD.

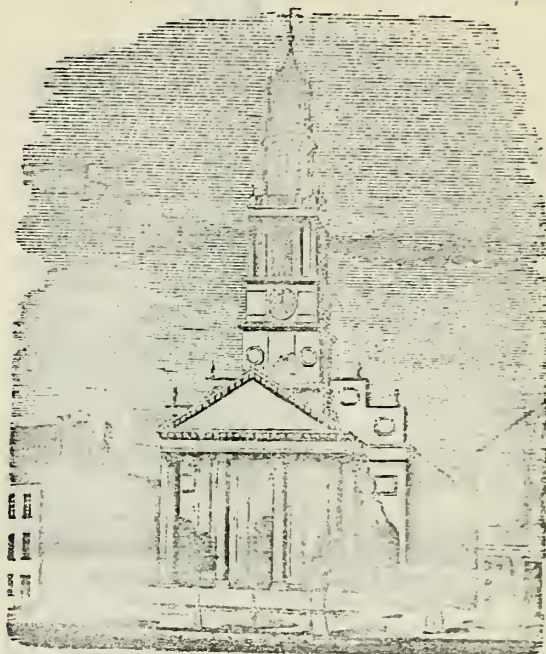
The first Church organization in Hartford was originally gathered in Newtown, (now Cambridge,) Mass., and was duly organized by the Installation of THOMAS HOOKER as pastor, and SAMUEL STONE as teacher, October 11th, 1633.

In June, 1636, Messrs. Hooker and Stone, with about one hundred of their people, removed to this place, being the first Church established in Connecticut. This Church embraced the territory now occupied by the Churches of the City; of East Hartford; and of West Hartford.

THE SECOND OF SOUTH CHURCH IN HARTFORD, was organized Feb. 12, 1669. The Church in EAST HARTFORD was also set off from the FIRST or CENTER CHURCH, and received a separate organization in May, 1702; and that in WEST HARTFORD, Feb. 1713; Colonies have also gone out from this church to assist in starting the North, Fourth, and Pearl street churches.

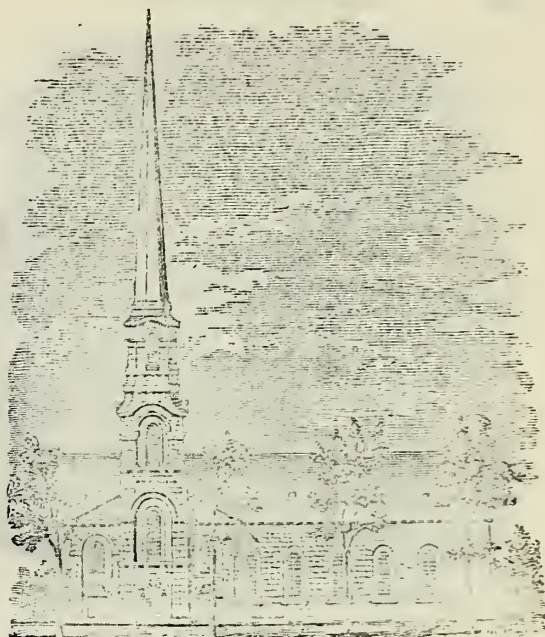


FOURTH CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

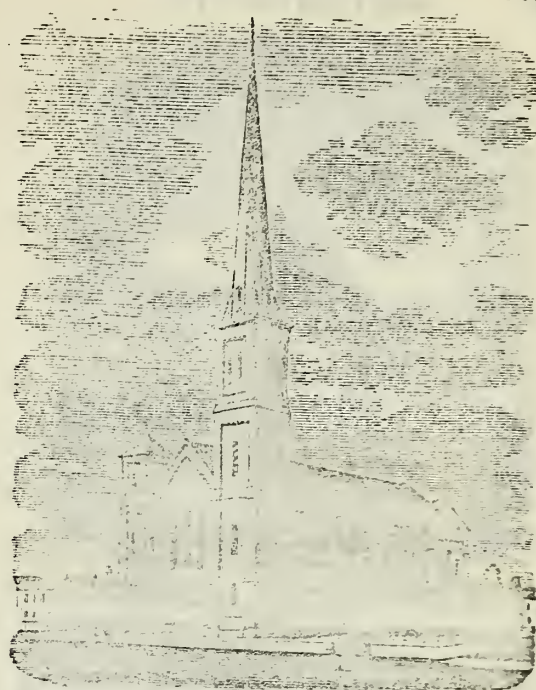


FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, 450 MAIN STREET.

WADSWORTH ATHENEUM,

206 Main Street, opposite to Mulberry Street,

Is a granite building of 100 feet in length, on Main street, and 80 feet in depth in center wings, and 70 feet in depth in outside wings, and is appropriated to four distinct Societies. Its architectural style is of the castelated structure, with central towers 70 feet in height, and corner buttresses 56 feet in height. The stone, which is a species of gneiss, was procured from the east part of Glastenbury, about nine miles South East of this city.

The North division, first story 13 feet high, second story 24 feet high, and both 65 feet long by 30 feet wide, is occupied by the YOUNG MEN'S INSTITUTE, for a reading room, quarterly and other meetings, and by their Library, of 10,000 volumes.

The South division is of the same dimensions as the North. The CONNECTICUT HISTORICAL SOCIETY use this.

The NATURAL HISTORY SOCIETY occupy a large room in the first story of the South division of the Athenaeum.

The central division of similar dimensions with the others, is used as a gallery of very valuable PAINTINGS and STATUARY.

The building was erected by voluntary contributions of citizens, and, with the land and fence, cost \$52,055.35.

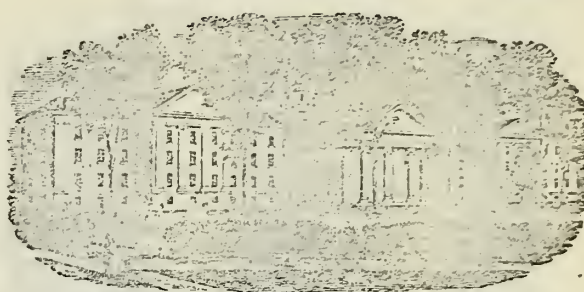

BOUNDARY LINES OF HARTFORD SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

ARSENAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, commencing at a point on the west bank of the Connecticut River due east of the center of the eastern termination of Avon street, and running from thence westerly and southerly by the line of the 2d North School District to the crossing of Edwards street, from thence west through the center of Walnut street to Brick-kiln brook, and from thence northerly by the course of the brook to the present northern boundary, and from thence by the present northern boundary due east to the river, and from thence by said river southerly to the place of beginning.

"CENTER DISTRICT," beginning at a point on the west bank of the Connecticut River, due east from the center of the east end of Pleasant street, and running westerly and southerly by the line of the Second North District to the point where the Brick-kiln brook crosses Asylum street, then southerly by said brook to Little River, thence easterly and northerly by Little River and Connecticut River to the place of beginning.

THE SECOND NORTH MIDDLE DISTRICT, sometimes called the **NORTH MIDDLE DISTRICT** in this town, embraces all the land lying within the following boundaries, viz. commencing on the west bank of the Connecticut River, due east of the eastern termination of Avon street, running thence west to Avon street, and through the center of said street to Main street, (formerly called Wind-or-road,) thence across the street east aforesaid to Belden street, thence westerly through the center of Belden street to Albany street, thence across Albany street to Ewarls street, thence south through the center of Edwards street to Walnut street, thence east through the center of Walnut street to the main track of the Hartford and New Haven Railroad, thence south by said track to Brick-kiln brook, and thence by the course of said brook to the center of Asylum street, thence east through the center of Asylum street to Ann street, thence north through the center of Ann street to Church street, thence east through the center of Church street to Franklin street, thence north through the center of Franklin street to Main street, down north side Main street to Village street, all west of the center of Village street to Pleasant street, thence east through the center of the said street to Front street, thence east to the Connecticut River, and thence northerly by the river to the place of beginning.

SOUTH SCHOOL DISTRICT.—Bounded on the north by Little River, east by Connecticut River, south by Wethersfield, and west by the hollow which is a little west of Wethersfield road, crossing Maple avenue north of the first house north of south burying ground to the west end of house No. 39 Retreat avenue, thence northerly and westerly to 50 Washington street, thence westerly to West Hartford line.

SOUTH WEST DISTRICT, north and east by Washington District, south by Wethersfield and west by West Hartford.

WASHINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT, north and east by South School District, south by Wethersfield and west by the east slope of Rocky Hill stone pits.

WEST MIDDLE DISTRICT, commencing on the Little River at the mouth of the Brick-kiln brook, and running thence northerly and westerly by the line of the 3d North District to the crossing of Edwards and Walnut street, and thence through the center of Walnut street to Brick-kiln brook, and thence by said brook to the point where the northern boundary strikes the said brook, and thence westerly, southerly and easterly by the present northern, western and southern boundaries and Little River, to the place of beginning.

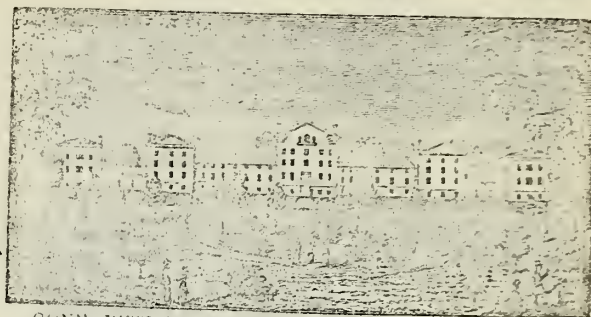

Of these, there have been 2926 discharged, of whom 1536 have recovered, and 1066 were more or less improved. At this date, May 1st, 1857, there are 209 patients in the Institution. This is the full number the house can accommodate. Valuable additions have lately been made to its conveniences, and others are now in progress, and two buildings, with all the modern improvements, have also been erected for Lodges. The Retreat must depend chiefly for its means of usefulness, on the liberality of individuals who can appreciate the high benevolent objects it aims to accomplish. THIRD WARD.

Beginning at the point of intersection of the eastern line of said city and the center line of Mill river, and running thence westerly through the center of said river to the western boundary of said city—thence southerly on said boundary to its intersection with the center line of a road in continuation of Park street—thence easterly through the center of said road to Washington street—thence northerly on the center line of Washington street to Buckleham street—thence easterly through the center of Buckleham street to its intersection with the center line of Main street—thence southerly on the center line of Main street to its intersection with the center line of Church street—thence on the center line of Church street to its intersection with the southern boundary line of said city as it existed before the passage of the Act of 1853, entitled "An Act extending the limits of the City of Hartford"—thence on said old boundary line to its intersection with the eastern boundary line of said city—thence on said eastern boundary line to the place of beginning.

FOURTH WARD.

Beginning at the intersection of the eastern line of said city

with the southern line of said city as it existed previous to the passage of the Act of 1853 aforesaid, and running thence westerly on said southern line to its intersection with the center line of Church street—thence on the center line of Church street to its intersection with the center line of Main street—thence on the center line of Main street to its intersection with the center line of Buckleham street—thence on the center line of Buckleham street to its intersection with the center line of Washington street—thence southerly on the center line of Washington street to its intersection with the center line of a road and alley of Park street—thence westerly on the center line of said road to the western boundary line of the city—thence southerly on said boundary line to the southern boundary line of the city—thence easterly on said southern boundary line to the eastern boundary line of the city, and thence northerly on said eastern boundary line to the place of beginning.

FIFTH WARD.

Beginning at the point of intersection of the east line of said city and the center line of Kilbourn street, and running thence westerly on said center line to its intersection with the center line of Front street—thence northerly on the center line of Front street to its intersection with the center line of Temple street—thence westerly on the center line of Temple street to its intersection with the center line of Main street—thence southerly on the center line of Main street to its intersection with the center line of Mill river—thence easterly on the center line of Mill river to the eastern boundary line of the city, and thence northerly on said boundary line to the place of beginning.

SIXTH WARD.

Beginning at the point of intersection of the center line of Kilbourn street and the eastern boundary line of the city, and running thence northerly on said boundary line to its intersection with the northern boundary line of the city—thence westerly on said northern boundary line to its intersection with the center line of the main part of the H. & N. H. R. R. bridge—thence westerly on the center line of said bridge to its intersection with the northern boundary line of the city, as it existed previous to the passage of the Act of 1853, entitled "An Act extending the limits of the City of Hartford"—thence on said old boundary line to its intersection with the center line of Main street—thence westerly on the center line of Main street to its intersection with the center line of Temple street—thence easterly on the center line of Temple street to its intersection with the center line of Front street—thence easterly on the center line of Front street to its intersection with the center line of Kilbourn street—thence easterly on the center line of Kilbourn street to the place of beginning.

HARTFORD WATER WORKS.

For engraving of Pump House, &c., located at No. 2 Water street, see p. 275. Surveys were commenced Oct., 1853, ground broke June, 1854, and first pumping of water Oct. 23d, 1855. The stone pier in the river, to protect the receiving pipe, is where, at low water, there is 12 feet in depth, and the pipe is six feet from the bottom, thus receiving a supply of the purest water that flows in the Connecticut, and is many rods above any drainage from the gutters of the city. The pumps are connected with the river by 149 ft. of 24 inch diam. iron pipe.

The MACHINERY for pumping is different in principle from anything heretofore used for this purpose.—Four double pumps of simple construction are employed, and these are so actuated by cams as to produce a constant and uniform flow of water; A highly finished Condensing Beam Engine supplies the power, and between it and the pumps, gearing is introduced, by means of which they are driven at a speed much less than that at which the engine runs. The machinery is noiseless in its operation while delivering one million gallons of water in twelve hours at the reservoir, which is at an elevation of 125 feet above the river, and one and one-third miles distant from it, and it is satisfactory to know that this result of native enterprise is producing economic results better than those of any other pumping machine in the country.

The ENGINE and PUMPS, as the Com'm's and Engineer report, "prove themselves fully adequate to their task. They have performed their duty highly satisfactory to all parties interested, much surpassing in point of economy the best duty of any Cornish Engine. The complete success of the new Engine and Pumps manufactured by the Woodruff and Beach Iron Works, is very gratifying to this Board, and should be a matter of local pride to all of our citizens. The pumps keep a continuous stream of water running through the rising main, without any of the noise and jar attending the working of the Cornish Engine; and the manufacturers of this machinery are entitled to much credit for their enterprise in bringing this experiment to a successful result." The load upon the Engine at low water, and with a full Reservoir, is 11,934 pounds.

The RESERVOIR is located on Garden street, at the head of Myrtle, and is connected by 6,579 feet of 16 inch iron pipe, with the Pumps on Water st. The banks are thirty-two feet in height, designed to be filled to the height of thirty feet, which is one hundred and twenty-five feet above low water mark at the river, and will hold eight millions six hundred thousand gallons. When the Reservoir is filled to its maximum height, the head at various points is as follows:—

Trin's building, erected by the Hartford, New Haven and Springfield, and the Hartford, Providence and Fishkill Railroad Companies, is built of Portland stone, of the Italian Campanile style of Architecture, at an expense of \$60,000. Its length from North to South is 360 feet. The front faces to the South on Asylum street, and is 94 feet in width; the corner towers thereto are 23 feet square, and 76 feet in height; the smaller towers on the South are 8 feet square and 44 feet in height; the center over the arch is 32 feet wide on each side, 42 feet high, the span of the arches being 25 feet 5 inches and the height of the arches from the track, 29 feet. The second and third stories of the front portion of the building are finished off into offices for the use of the several officers of these respective companies. The center of the first stories on both sides are handsomely fitted up into Passenger Saloons. The second story into two refectories 20 by 84 feet.
