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

Preface.

SURELY a people whose history in the little world of their parish covers the span of centuries, are well entitled to a record of their existence, and it is but an act of devotion to the dead to offer in such spirit the present contribution.

Twelve years ago this transcript of the Registers of Moulton was commenced, from which time to the present a considerable portion of the leisure of a busy life has been devoted to the work, and a congenial though laborious task has it proved. To-day, however, the first volume is brought to a close, and as the second and third are ready also for press, it is a satisfaction to know that the entire record will ere long be placed beyond the risk of injury by fire or other destructive agency.

For it is proposed to issue in Volumes II. and III. the whole of the Marriages and Burials of the period 1565—1812, together with such monumental inscriptions as exist, or are known to have existed, not only within but without the Church, lists of recovered names (see page 64, note †), and any explanation that may be considered necessary with reference to the preparation of the text.

The three Indexes at the end of this volume, containing nearly 17,000 references, have been compiled and presented to the Parish Register Society by the Editor and Mrs. Madge.

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Introduction to Volume I. of
"Moulton Registers."

F. The Records of Moulton Parish.

The antiquarian wealth of Moulton is so considerable, its variety and extent so surprising, that the wonder grows with advancing years how such a fertile field should remain so long neglected. This is the more to be deplored, because its records are rich in historical interest, and exhibit not only an amplitude of facts and details, but a continuity so remarkable that the imagination is fired with the possibilities open to the future historian; for with scarcely a break or flaw they extend from the Confessor's days to our own, and include, even in the present incomplete state of our knowledge, nearly three hundred rolls and documents of earlier date than the year 1485.

With regard to these ancient records, it is not advisable here to do more than indicate their principal divisions, bearing in mind that each of these consists of a variety of distinct and separate entries, and that the dates attached to documents in the first three sections, whilst representing their initial and final years so far as Moulton is concerned, are occasionally approximate owing to the subject being still under revision. The bulk of the documents in the list of course come from the Courts of Chancery and Exchequer, King's Bench, and Common Pleas. "Feet of fines" and "Assize rolls," however, have not yet been sufficiently searched to place on record in these pages.

iv. COUNTY RECORDS.*

Documents relating to the multifarious business transacted at Quarter Sessions are to be found at Northampton, and notwithstanding that the task is long and perplexing, the books and papers are well worth perusal on account of the information they yield concerning both the personal and parochial history of Moulton. A search has been made for the Award and plan of Moulton Inclosure, but these have disappeared. Fortunately, a copy of the former exists at Moulton, though the map, even here, has vanished. The Sessions Books are interesting, though they do not commence earlier than the reign of Elizabeth. Among County Records which are, or should be, preserved in the office of the Clerk of the Peace at Northampton, mention may be made of the following:—

v. LOCAL RECORDS.

These are very numerous, but with the exception of one of the registers, nothing now remains in the parish of earlier period than the reign of James the First. Between 1890 and 1900 the parish chest was overhauled, and every scrap of paper carefully examined by the writer, with the result that a calendar of documents was completed³ last year which should prove of special value to future generations. As notes have been freely quoted from these papers to illustrate the entries in the present volume, the entire Calendar will be found in a separate section, to which the following summary⁴ will prove a useful guide:—

T. Cave Hall, William Cox.”—“This is also the Book marked 'B' produced by Clark Hillyard one of the Defendants in this Cause, and it is the same Book so marked 'B' as is referred to in the Deposition of the said Clark Hillyard taken before us this 25th day of October 1838. parish. The only confirmation, however, held at Moulton during these years took place on 2 May 1832, when thirty-three local candidates, and 23 others from the parishes of Boughton, Pitsford, Holcot, Holdenby, and Hannington, were confirmed. This register contains also the following important note :—"The Church of SS. Peter and Paul, Moulton, Northamptonshire, had within the last 25 years open wooden seats, a richly carved Rood screen, and parcloes separating the chancel from its North and South chapels, all in good preservation. It is now filled with square deal boxes of the meanest kind. The carpenter who put them up took away all the carved work, and was allowed to cut off the carved portion of the oak corbels on which the side pieces of the roof stand ; these spoils are now in possession of a collector at Northampton. There is less room in the church *now* than when it had open seats, and the clerk knows many individuals among the poor, who used to attend regularly at Church, who were excluded by the introduction of the pews, and became dissenters—*some also have ceased to attend the worship of God altogether.* Many poor men sit on the altar rails in this church, while pews in the neighbourhood are all but empty. The ancient Font was taken as a horse-trough to the Vicarage, and has now disappeared—only two of its five legs remain [*now on either side of Vestry East window*] ; its substitute is a small mortar on a stone baluster [*replaced in 1836 by a font given by Mr. Nethercoat*], stuck in the middle of a square pew, on the door of which is painted 'Font,' in white letters." This is an extract from the *Ecclesiologist* of 1844.

SECTION III.

Lucas, Wm. Reade.*"

SECTION VI.

³² There were no less than ten ways of gaining a Settlement in a parish during the Eighteenth Century. These were:—(1) *By birth* [13 *George II.*, c. 29]: illegitimate or vagrant children, although settled where born, being supported after investigation by their rightful parish; (2) *By parentage*: every new settlement gained by the father being given also to the children, who at 7 or 8 years of age might gain one in their own right; (3) *By apprenticeship*: under the Acts of 13-14 *Charles II.*, 1 *James II.*, 3 *William III.*, and 12 *Anne*; (4) *By service*: usually for a year, but in any case not less than forty days; (5) *By continued residence*: ignoring a notice signed by a justice to remove within forty days [1 *James II.*] one who occupies a tenement under £10 per annum, such notice being given in the Church after service [3 *William III.*]; (6) *By marriage*; (7) *By estate*: residing in a tenement rented at £10 or more, or upon concluding a purchase up to £30 [9 *George I.*], although a "Certificate man" who made such a purchase is held to cease to be such; (8) *By rent*: residence for forty days, with rent of £10 paid either in one name or in two, also joint occupancy of a farm of £52 a year; (9) *By taxation*: paying the land tax and parish levies, but not highway rates, or taxes on windows and houses [21 *George II.*]; (10) *By serving a parish officer*: thus gaining a Settlement without notice or publication [3 *William III.*]. Certificates of Settlement, signed by Churchwardens, Overseers and Magistrates, were conclusive against the parish certifying, although not binding against a subsequent settlement; and whilst the benefits involved were extended to children, and the persons named within were not hindered from gaining a Settlement in any other parish than the one indemnified, an Order of Removal at once cancelled the Certificate. (Newton's "*Whole Duty of Parish Officers*, 1792.")

³³ This is the Certificate of the "inspired cobbler," who became the "Evangelist of India, Professor of Sanscrit in the College of Fort William, and the Father of modern Missions." The following extract from the *Northampton Mercury* of 30 Aug. 1895, has reference to the discovery of this Certificate three days earlier: "I have had the opportunity of seeing a most interesting communication to the Editor of the *Northampton Mercury*, from Mr. Sidney Madge . . . During the progress of compiling a calendar of Moulton Church and parish documents he came across a big bundle of certificates of settlements ranging over a period from 1699 to [1817]. On putting the bundle into order he found a 'certificate of settlement' of *William Carey* and *Dorothy* his wife, at the age of 24. It is dated May 11th 1785, signed by the churchwardens and overseers of Paulerspury, and delivered to those of Moulton; attested by *Edmund Carey* (father), and *Samuel Savage*; and allowed by two Justices of the Peace (*J. Eccles* and *W. Clare*). By that certificate *Wm. Carey* is allowed to reside in Moulton (1785) on the acknowledgment that he belongs to Paulerspury, so that in the event of his becoming a pauper, and requiring relief, he would be at once removed by the constable to Paulerspury, the churchwardens and overseers of that place being answerable for him 'and his issue' [there were three children by this, the first of three marriages], providing for him out of the rates of that parish . . ." The Certificate is given in full in an article entitled "*William Carey, D.D.: His Settlement and Work at Moulton, 1785-89*" (*Mercury*, 7 Sep. 1895). He founded Carey Chapel, Moulton, in 1786, projected the formation of

the Baptist Missionary Society, and published "An enquiry into the obligations of Christians to use means for the conversion of the Heathen." He died at Serampore 9 June 1834, aged 72 years.

SECTION VII.

³⁵ The Orders of Removal in this list extend from 10 William III. to 4 William IV., and concern nearly three hundred men, women and children. In effect, they relate to two classes of people. On the one hand we have Orders respecting persons residing in the parish under a Certificate from a neighbouring township, who by reason of infirmity, or perhaps of domestic concerns, were about to add to the cares and responsibilities of the parochial authorities, and therefore made it desirable that their removal should be speedy across the parish boundaries; on the other hand, many are the Orders relating to former inhabitants, who had been allowed to settle elsewhere on a Certificate from Moulton providing for their return to that parish in more uncertain times—this class being indicated above by the employment of brackets. In a volume by Edward Newton, entitled, "*The Whole Duty of Parish Officers; containing all the Laws now in force, which point out the duty, and regulate the conduct of Churchwardens, Overseers, Constables, Surveyors, and other Parochial Officers of every Denomination*" (London, 1792), it is stated that removals must be effected by the Overseers and Constables within forty days under penalties named [17 George II., c. 5]. Parishes granting a Certificate were compelled to take back such as became paupers in the new place of abode [8-9 William III., c. 30], but an appeal might be made at Quarter Sessions against an Order, reasonable notice of this being given [9 George I., c. 7, s. 8]. The duties of Constables were regulated by the Acts of 13-14 Charles II., and 12 George II.

SECTION VIII.

The Indenture of Wm. Mills, 1742, has also disappeared. The last document preserved is that of John Clifton, in which he agrees to put himself apprentice to Geo. Tipler, to learn his art and with him to dwell for seven years; during which term he will his said master serve, his secrets keep, his lawful commands willingly obey; doing no damage to his master and seeing that none by others to him are done; whose goods he will not embezzle or waste, give away or lend; nor fornication commit, matrimony espouse, nor from the service of his master day or night absent himself, but in all things as an honest and faithful apprentice will demean himself towards his said master and all his family. And Geo. Tipler, in consideration of the sum of £18 "in hand paid by the Churchwardens at or before the sealing and

delivery of these presents (being Charity Money left for the putting out apprentices)," agrees to teach his apprentice "the art Trade or Mystery of a Tailor, to find him good sufficient and wholesome meat, drink, washing, lodging, wearing apparel, tools in trade, and all other necessities, and at the end of the term to give him one new suit of Clothes for Sundays, one good suit for working days, 5 good shirts, 5 pairs of stockings, 2 sheets, 2 pairs of shoes, and 2 neck-handkerchiefs."

SECTION IX.

Three are even mentioned in the Churchwardens' Accounts for 1844, where fines of 5s. each (augmenting for the year the Church revenue), occur in connection with the trials for disorderly conduct of *Wm. Cox* (20 Jan.) *Jos. Fisher* (27 Jan.), and *Jn. Stevenson* (24 Mar.). No. 2 above is the usual notice from the Constable of Spelhoe Hundred with respect to the parish "Quarterage Money." Nos. 4 and 6 are warrants for the arrest of persons connected with the evidence of *Anne Howes* and *Hannah Cooke*, respectively.

SECTION X.

⁴⁸ The last "Examination" preserved at Moulton, that of *Sarah Cox*, single-woman, is to the effect that she is about 20 years of age, being born "as she has heard and believes" at Brixworth, where her parents were legally settled; that about five weeks before Old Michaelmas 1830 Mrs. *Esther Flamwell* of Moulton hired her to go and reside with her three days after Michaelmas; that she remained there until Old Michaelmas 1831 when she received her wages; that about five weeks before Michaelmas 1831 her mistress asked her to stay with her again, and, consenting, she was hired for another year at the advanced wages of ten shillings, and after that for two years more, only leaving the service of the said *Esther Flamwell* a little more than a month ago; that she returned then to her friends at Brixworth, and having been very ill applied for and received relief from the Overseers, and is now actually chargeable to the said parish of Brixworth.

Collateral branches exist in the *Saundersons*, Viscounts *Castleton*, and the family of Bishop *Robert Sanderson*, of Lincoln. Tenth in descent from the aforesaid *Alexander* comes *Lawrence Sanderson*, of Tempsford, Beds., and direct ancestor of the Moulton family, who appears to have acquired this estate about the middle of the sixteenth century. To the original arms borne by the family—Paly of six, Argent and Azure, over all a bend Sable; *Crest*, a talbot dog passant proper—*John Sanderson* on April 7th, 1629 charged the bend with three quatrefoils Or. Many monuments to members of this family exist in the church, and it is recorded that formerly three of the arches had shields of arms impaling the *Saunderson* coat. The following descendants of *Lawrence Sanderson* will be found in *Northants N. & Q.*, i, 113-116:—*John I.* and *Cicely*, *John II.* (died 1672), *Lawrence*, *Theophilus I.* (1631—1683) and *Mary I.* (1638—1712), *Theophilus II.* (died 1676), *John III.* (1664—1687), *Elizabeth* (born 1667, married 1692, died 1694) and *Anthony I.* (died 1737), *John IV.* (born 1693) and *Mary II.* (1711—1778), *John V.* (1730—1825), *Anthony II.* (born 1730—1780?) and *Sarah* (died 1766), *Martha* (born 1755?), *William* (1738—1813), and *Thomas*, only son of the youngest son, and last of the name, dying unmarried in 1855.

Northampton: Printed by T. Dicey and Co. No date appears on the title page, but page iii. ("An address to the Teachers of Youth of both sexes") is signed "W^m Chown, Moulton, February 16th, 1788." The existence of this little book (22 pages, 12 mo) had been forgotten until the Museum acquired a copy on April 27th, 1866. Its present press-mark is "12982.AA.50." In 1818, he published a widely-known work entitled "*Original Miscellaneous Poems, On Moral, Religious, and Entertaining Subjects.*" Northampton: Printed by F. Cordeaux." (Crown 8vo, 98 pages, and 63 poems; the Subscribers' List containing the names of 43 Moulton residents, and 202 others).

including 77 set apart for roads) took place during 1772, but it was not until 1 Aug. 1773 that the "Award" of the Commissioners was enrolled at Northampton. This bulky record, consisting of huge skins of parchment, is numbered "D. 6" in the "*Calendar of Documents preserved at Moulton*." Membranes 1 to 23 contain 93 allotments, divided among 70 proprietors; m. 24-25, list of eleven public roads, each 60 feet wide; m. 25-27, thirteen private "carriage and drift ways," 20 to 40 feet in width; m. 27-28, eleven public foot ways or "ancient tracks," each of the breadth of 4 feet; m. 28-31, springs, drains, rivalets, trees, acreage, expenses (£1,745 4s. 6½d.), and Commissioners' Oaths. Two Schedules are given—the first, of "Premises not exonerated from Annual Payments to the Vicar"; the second (a copy of which was entered about 1800 in the Vestry Book), of Payments to be made by "an equal pound rate" on the annual values of lands allotted. Ward) specifies a charge of 20s. 8d. for "Drawing and Ingrossing Articles between the Inhabitants of Moulton not to make any fresh Settlements, &c." (11 Feb. 1793); 26s. for "Articles between the Proprietors and Occupiers of Lands at Moulton to prosecute Robbers," and "advertizements for Rewards &c., and fair Copies to be stuck up" (1 March 1790.)

One of these, in Latin and badly mutilated, is a Court-Roll of the second half of the year 1697, to the following effect:—The jurors present on oath that from time immemorial there has been in the parish of Moulton in the County of Northampton, a certain Common Pasture known by the name of “Moulton Comon,” for the pasturing of the cattle, pigs, horses, and sheep of all freeholders and tenants in the parish of Moulton aforesaid, at all times of the year, and that *Francis Craddock* of Moulton, miller, on 1 Sep. 1697, made an encroachment on the said Common, enclosing twenty yards with a wall and occupying it for his own private use to the great injury of the tenants and contrary to custom.—*Martin Pell, Jones Worley, Jones Watts, Paulus Dawson.* (*Calendar, D. 3*).—The second document is a bond for £20 in the name of the aforesaid *Francis Craddock*, with reference to the apprenticeship of “on[e] *Rachel Williamson*, daughter of *William Williamson*, late of Moulton deceased” (bur. 29 Aug. 1695), who has “fallen to the care of the ouerseers of the parrish.” He agrees to take her for six years, to find “all nessesary meat, drink, washing, & Lodging,” also “all needful apparell befitting such an apprentice,” she at the end of the first four years being “well cloathed & fitted with double apparill of wollen and Linnen, according to the Custom & mode of the Countrey,” and receiving during the last two years “the yearly wages of thirty shillings by the year, for the finding her sett Cloths in that remaining time of her Service.” (*H. 1*; 11 June 1702).

Dove* and her son." The cost of the Settlement (which includes journeys to Odell Lodge, and Loddington, and a "Letter to Mr. *Ward* of Pisford") came to £3 12s. 8d., with 8s. "spent at the same time" (for liquor!). An additional charge of 7s. appears in *Thos. Ward's* bill (O. 6). Under date 11 Feb. 1793, for "Carriage from Mr. *Hodson* of Abstract of *Jn. Smith's* Title relative to *Dove's* Settlement some time since," and "Perusing same by Desire in Behalf of Parish of Moulton and advising thereon."

Blissard for her medicine, etc., £1 14s. 8d. (O. 15; 24 July 1795); (4) Robert Abbey’s bill “touching the Settlement of Jane Stafford” (O. 16), being an account of his charges between April and October 1795, in the case of “Moulton v. ‘A New Peal of Six Bells, will be opened at Moulton, near Northampton, in the Feast-Week, cast by Mr. *Edward Arnold*, of Leicester. The Particulars will be given in next Week’s Paper.’ [Oct. 31, 1795].

‘To Ringers.—On Monday and Tuesday next, will be Rung for at Moulton, near Northampton, Six Hat’s each Day—Six-bell Peals.—To meet in the Church-Yard each Day at Nine o’clock in the morning.

N.B.—There will be an Ordinary provided each Day at all the Public Houses.—Moulton, Nov. 7, 1795.’ [Nov. 7, 1795].

“Then here is the news paragraph announcing the accomplishment of the opening:—

“On Monday the 9th instant was opened, at the parish church of Moulton in this County, a new peal of Six bells, cast by Mr. *Edward Arnold*, of Leicester; they are allowed to be of a most musical and harmonious tone, and gave the greatest satisfaction to the numerous hearers assembled upon the occasion.” [Nov. 21, 1795].

Blunt's man" had fled)—came to £52 6s. 10d., towards which sum eighteen persons paid a guinea and forty-six half a guinea, or £43 1s. in all. "It is worth of remark, that under the special direction of Parliament, in 1801, an exact account was taken of the Population of each Parish throughout the Kingdom, in order, as it is supposed, to ascertain, more minutely how far the produce of the Country was able to answer the consumption of its Inhabitants, under the alarm lately sustained of want and security, & how far an Importation of Corn & Flour was necessary to counteract so formidable an evil. This was shortly after followed by an Order from Government to make an accurate return, what Quantity of Acres was in cultivation in each Parish respectively as to the several Articles of Wheat, Rye, Barley, Oats, Beans or Peas, Turnips, Colesud and Potatoes. The return for this Parish was to the amount of nearly 400 acres collectively. And as to the Population, it appeared that the number of Houses inhabited was 194, by 192 Families; & the number of Persons found within the limits of this Parish was of Males 427 & of Females 406 making a Total of 833. The same exactness was likewise required as to the number of Persons employed in Agriculture, Trade, Manufacture, or Handicraft, when it was ascertained, that those employed in Agriculture were 191 [181], in Trade, Manufactures, etc., 81—all others 3.

"In the course of this year also, a general Inoculation took place in the Parish under the management & care of Mr. Thomas, Surgeon at Northampton to the amount of 200 Persons, which was attended with the greatest success.—The Premium was 12 Guineas!" [His bill for 1823 (O. 29) is preserved, in which £18 is charged for "vaccinating the Parish (180 persons)," and £11 11s. as "Yearly Salary from 10th Nov^r 1823 to Nov^r 10th 1824."]

(2) Lease of a Plot of Ground (C. 16; July 11) consisting of 40 acres 26 poles (together with "the grass and herbage of a certain Lane called Scaldwell Lane") in the occupation of *Wm. Drage*, also a Close in the parish of Holcot, to *William Lowick*, for the term of 14 years at a rent of £85 per annum. (3) Lease of a Close (C. 17; July 11) consisting of 2 acres, in the occupation of *Thos. Marriott*, to Messrs. *Marriott* and *Lowick*, for 14 years, at £6 10s. per annum. (4) Lease of a Close of 1 acre (C. 18; July 11) in the occupation of *Thos. Marsh*, to *Jn. Laundon* and *Jn. Bond* for 14 years, at £4 per annum. (5) Survey by *Wm. Chown* (O. 22; Oct. 29) of Moulton Charity Land, consisting of *Wm. Barber's* Close (40a. 26p.) and *Wm. Drage's* Holcot Close (2a. 1r. 13p.).—The next batch of Charity Deeds bears the date 1819. One is an assessment of the Land Tax for 1818 upon *Edward's* Nortoft Close of 2 acres, occupied by *Wm. Darker* (C. 19; June 9). Another, an assessment upon *William Line's* Charity Estate (C. 20; June 10) consisting of (1) *Mary Marriott's* messuage and close of pasture, (2) *Wm. Taylor's* cottage and close of pasture, (3) "that building now used as a workhouse," (4) "a messuage and close of land adjoining thereto in the occupation of *Joseph Pickford*," (5) three messuages occupied by *Jn. Lanspeary*, *Lawson Barber* and *Benjamin Dickens*, (6) "a little close adjoining, in the occupation of *Wm. Taylor*," (7) two messuages occupied by *Roger Cox* and *Thos. Earl*. (8) "all that messuage or tenement formerly called the Herdsman's House, late in the occupation of *Wm. Luck*," and (9) *Wm. Lowick's* "Close or inclosed ground" (33a. 3r. 33p.). A third document shows an assessment upon *Wm. Lowick's* Holcot Close (C. 21; June 11); a fourth, the Certificate of Exoneration of *Line's* Charity Estate (C. 22), dated Aug. 25th, registered Sep. 28th, but exonerated from 24 June 1819; whilst the fifth document is a similar exoneration with respect to *Sarah Edward's* Charity (C. 23; 25 Aug. 1819).

* Owing to the mutilated condition of this register, no record exists to show the ravages committed by the plague thirteen years later, when it visited Northampton in June and spread with frightful consequences to neighbouring villages during the months that followed. At Holcot the effect was seen in the rise of burials from an average of seven in previous years, to sixty in 1638. The plague of 1603 cost London one-sixth of its population; that of 1625, to which allusion is made on page 55, removed 41,000 persons.

Among the more interesting items of information contained in the Parish Registers, mention may be made of a list of Briefs read in the church during the years 1692 to 1730, the enumeration of which occupies nine folio pages, and shows a collection of nearly £32. Briefs to the number of two hundred and thirty-four are here recorded, but were it not for the destruction of part of a page and the loss of the entries for 1716—1719, the number would be much greater. Fortunately, the "Cowkeeper's Breif" of the year 1715, and the one in connection with the "Palatines," dated 1709, are inserted at length, and as the names and contributions of some forty residents in the parish are given in each of these, they are of considerable value.

It is interesting to observe that although this list of Briefs ends with the year 1730, subsequent entries occur in the Churchwardens' Accounts, chiefly in connection with Visitation payments, for the following years:—

II. Charity Accounts,*

1711-1724.

Two or three pages in the first register are devoted to receipts and payments in connection with the Charities. These have been collected together, and will be found below. One of the notes refers to the bread-charity of Robert Mills, concerning which the following passage from "*St. Stephen's Day at Moulton*"†—quoting a document which, prior to 1895, was in the parish chest—contains some definite information:—

"An interesting paper was discovered July 28th, 1891, among a number of miscellaneous bundles at the bottom of the parish chest‡; indeed it became a task of no small difficulty to decipher the musty manuscript, so torn and faded was its condition. However, patience and perseverance accomplish most things, and here is the result:

"The document§ is endorsed—

'Mr Robert Mills, his gift, 1704. Y^e abstract of it set down in y^e beginning of y^e Parish Register. Proved in the prerogative Court of London, the sixth day december in y^e yeare of our Lord 1704. Stephen Mills, Administrator.'

"But the real interest centres in the will itself, and turning over we find the following account—

'June y^e 25th 1707, An abstract of the will of Robert Mills Late of Moulton. Soe far as it concerns the Minister & the Poor of Moulton.

'Item. I give and bequeth Twentey shillings P^r anum for Ever to be Payd. . . Distributed in Bread to and amongst 20 Poore widoes of Moulton aforesaid for the time Being whoe shall be Churchwomen, that is to say, to Eache poore wido A 12^d Loafe of wheaten Bread Upon Every S^t Stevens day yearely for Ever, the Same to be Deliverd and Distributed upon St. Stevens Day yeareley In the

III. Meetings of the Vestry,

1737—1799.

Although the records of the Vestry are neither of great antiquity nor of unusual importance, they possess, at any rate, sufficient interest to justify their preservation here; for with the exception of a single year,* the minutes of meetings extending over a century and a half are in existence, and until the year 1800 they are inscribed in the parish registers.

In the first entry,† mention is made of certain proposed alterations within the Church, including the erection of a new Gallery. Now, it fortunately happens that one of the documents‡ in the parish chest relates to this very matter, so that the transcript given below will prove of additional interest:—

“Robert, by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Peterborough, To all to whom these presents shall come, or shall or may in any wise concerne and more especially to the parishioners and inhabitants of the parish of Moulton in the County of Northampton and Our Diocese of Peterborough, Sendeth Greeting in our Lord God Everlasting.

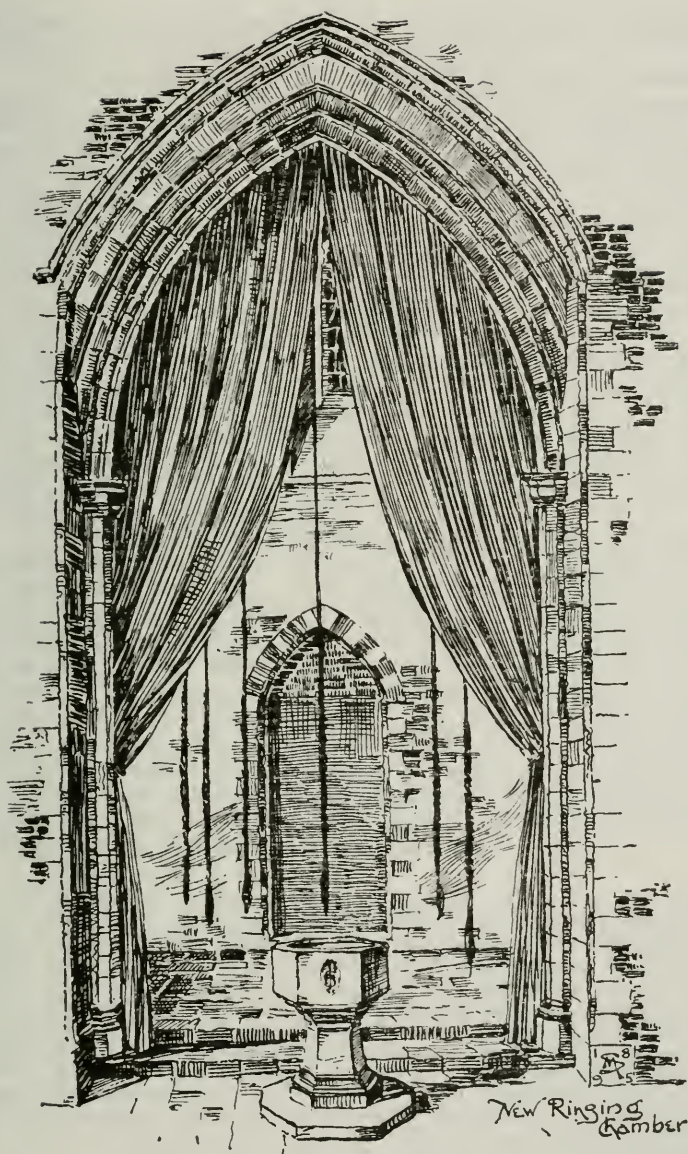
“Whereas it hath been set forth and alledged before the Rev. George Reynolds, Doctor of Law, Our Vicar General, Commissary General and official principal in Spiritual matters lawfully appointed, on the part and behalf of Chapman Barber and John Manning, Churchwardens of Moulton aforesaid, that the parish Church of Moulton aforesaid is through the increase of the Inhabitants of the said Parish become incapable of containing the parishioners belonging thereto and that several of the said parishioners having no seats in the said Church either for themselves or their families are forced to absent themselves from Divine Service on that very account.

“And Whereas the said Chapman Barber and John Manning have humbly prayed and Requested us to grant unto them Our Licence or Faculty to erect and build a Gallery at the West end of the Middle Space or Isle of the said Church next and adjoining to the Belfrey—to containe in heighte (to the floor) eight feet, in length twenty feet, and in width ten feet or thereabouts, and to make convenient stairs thereto, and to divide the same into convenient seats for the use of the parishioners and Inhabitants of the

said parish to sit, kneel and hear Divine Service therein, in order to remedy the said inconveniency as much as may be.*

“And Whereas our said Vicar General rightly and duly proceeding did at this petition of the Proctor of the said Chapman Barber and John Manning decree the Reverend William Stanton, Clerk, Vicar of Moulton aforesaid, and all and singular the parishioners and Inhabitants of the said parish in Special and all others in General to be cited to appear before him or his Surrogate or some other Competent Judge in this behalf at a certain time and place, then and there to show cause if they or any of them had or knew any cause why a Licence or Faculty should not be granted to the said Chapman Barber and John Manning, to erect and build a Gallery in the place of the dimensions and for the use aforesaid with Intimation that if they did not appear at the said time and place or appearing did not show good and sufficient cause to the contrary, he our said Vicar General or his Surrogate or some other Competent Judge in his behalf did intend and would proceed to grant unto them the said Chapman Barber and John Manning such Licence or Faculty, the absence or rather contumacy of them so cited or Intimated as aforesaid in any wise notwithstanding.

“And Whereas on the due Execution and Returne of the said Citation with intimation and calling all persons as well in Special as in General so cited to appear, there appeared Richard Gaudern one of the principal Land holders in the parish of Moulton aforesaid and alledged, that he contributed largely to the Rates made for the Repairs of the said Church, and that he living at Earls Barton in the said County of Northampton doth not frequent Divine Service in the parish Church of Moulton aforesaid, and that the building such gallery as aforesaid would be of no benefit or advantage to him, and therefore prayed that no Licence or Faculty might be granted to erect and build a Gallery as aforesaid, unless the said Chapman Barber and John Manning would agree to excuse him the said Richard Gaudern and the Estate in his possession lying in the parish

* The writer's recollection of this Gallery goes back to the year 1879, when it was divided into two sections by woodwork extending from the centre of the Tower arch to the front row of seats. It was then used by the Sunday School children, the boys ascending by the South staircase, and the girls by that on the North. Projecting into the Nave from the front of this Gallery was a curiously twisted iron rod, from which hung an oil lamp. In his Report on the Church drawn up in Jan. 1884 (*Calendar, M. 16*), Mr. E. Law says:—“A beautiful feature in the Nave of your Church, the handsome Western Arch opening into the Tower is, as you are aware, now obliterated by the hideous Gallery existing across the West end of the Nave. I propose to clear away this Gallery, and the lath and plaster partition now filling up this Arch, and thus throw the Tower open to the Nave. This will necessitate the clearing away of the present ringing floor, and the bringing down of the ropes of the bells to the ground floor, and for this, arrangements will be made in the work of the rehanging of the bells now in progress. The stone-work to the jambs and arch will require considerable attention.” These alterations were carried out during 1885.

"And Whereas on calling all other persons so cited as aforesaid and none of them appearing, Our said Vicar General did pronounce them to be in Contempt, and on paine of such their Contumacy did decree a Licence or Faculty to be granted to the said Chapman Barber and John Manning to erect and build a Gallery in the place of the demensions and for the use and purposes aforesaid (Justice is requiring) as in and by the proceedings had in and concerning the premisses now remaining in Our Registry it doth and may more fully appear.

"We Therefore the Bishop aforesaid well weighing and considering the premisses do hereby by virtue of Our Authority Ordinary and Episcopal as far as by the Eccclal Laws of this Realm and temporal Laws of the same we may or can Ratify and Confirm whatsoever Our said Vicar General hath done or caused to be done in or concerning the premisses.

"And We do hereby give and grant unto the said Chapman Barber and John Manning Our Licence or Faculty to erect and build a Gallery at the West end of the Middle Space or Isle of the parish Church of Moulton in the manner and of the demensions aforesaid and to make Convenient Stairs thereto and to divide the same into Convenient Seats for the use of the parishioners and Inhabitants of the said parish to sit kneel and hear Divine Service therein according to their petition. Provided the said Richard Gaudern nor the estate in his possession lying within the parish of Moulton aforesaid be no ways charged in the Rates or Levys made or to be made in the said parish for the building the said Gallery.

"In Witness whereof We have caused the Seal of Our said Vicar General (which we use in this behalf) to be hereunto affixed.

"Dated the 3rd day of May in the year of Our Lord 1738.

"This agrees with the Acts of Court.

Marsh, John Tressler, Junr."

IV. Parish Officers.

(i) CHURCHWARDENS, 1495—1902.

This list is compiled from many sources, but owing to the loss of all the vestry books of earlier date than 1737, it is not possible to make it complete, while as regards the names of Churchwardens elected between 1741 and 1799, since these occur in a preceding section* there is no necessity to repeat them here. It only remains to add that in each entry the Vicar's warden is placed first and the parish warden next; also that the spelling of the surnames has throughout been faithfully copied.

* Concerning the Constable and his office much might be written, but here it is only necessary to place on record the following remarks:—(1) *Staff*: This is a heavy weapon, about 18 inches long, with the royal arms painted upon a black ground, and the word "MOULTON" above; undated, but procured about 1832, and well used since. (2) *Handcuffs*: Marked "N.C.P." for County Police, and made by *T. & A. Longmore*; size, when closed, from 2 to 2½ inches wide, the key being 2½ inches long, and the connecting links 3½ ins. (4) *Pound*: In what was formerly called "Pound Lane," opposite the present "Telegraph Inn."
