





REMARKS: I often heard of DOCT. TAYLOR as being in the Territorial Service in 1840. He was not embraced on any Roll of my mustering unless he be found on Col. W. J. BAILEY'S of Nov. 23, 1840. VERDIER was on that roll by order of the Adjt. Gen'l but I think TAYLOR was not. And I instructed COL. BAILEY now to embrace DOCT. T. in his remarks for the whole time of his supposed service that he may be paid.

BERRY'S service is not shown by the face of this roll - It consisted in the payments mentioned in his evidence and he was not thereby called from home but was attending to his private business as a merchant. He says much of the time from Feb. 20 to May 20 was occupied in making the payments. I recommend that the time be limited to one month for pay and allowance to him as Paymaster and that his payments be examined to ascertain whether they were correctly calculated and rec. also whether W. H. MICHAEL was embraced in the Quarter Master's Department (COLLINS) for the time he was paid by B.
