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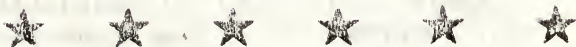
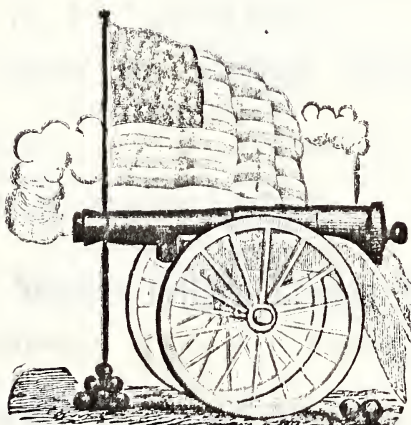
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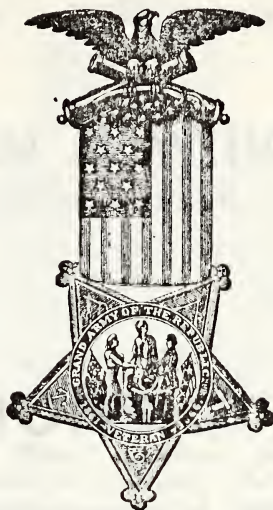
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FIG. 1. Dorsal view of the butterfly.

 Charles the Second.

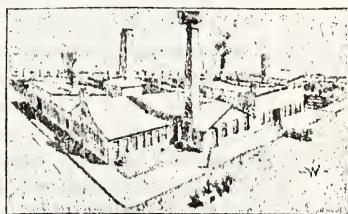
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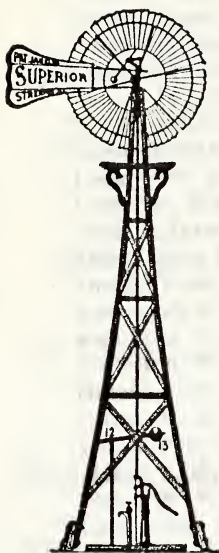
