GENEALOGY COLLECTION

In this Chart (which has been prepared from authentic sources, and in many instances collated with manuscript and other authorities kindly offered by the Nobility and Gentry, and which embraces upwards of twelve hundred individuals,) the Descents, Alliances, and Issue of the Royal Dynasties of Wales are clearly and accurately shewn, and the principal historical events and dates connected with the life of each person are recorded. The connexion of the different noble Tribes and Families with the Royal Lines is exhibited, and the present representatives of the ancient pedigrees are named, whilst, by a novel and interesting arrangement, the rank of every individual is known at a glance, and the usually heavy and monotonous appearance of a Genealogical Table is avoided.

On the whole, it is hoped that this work (the result of the labour of many months), will be accepted as a useful and correct record of some of the ancient glories of the Principality; at the same time that from the high style of its execution and finish, it will become an ornamental appendage to the Hall, Library, and Parlour of the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, and Inhabitants of Wales and the neighbouring English Counties.
