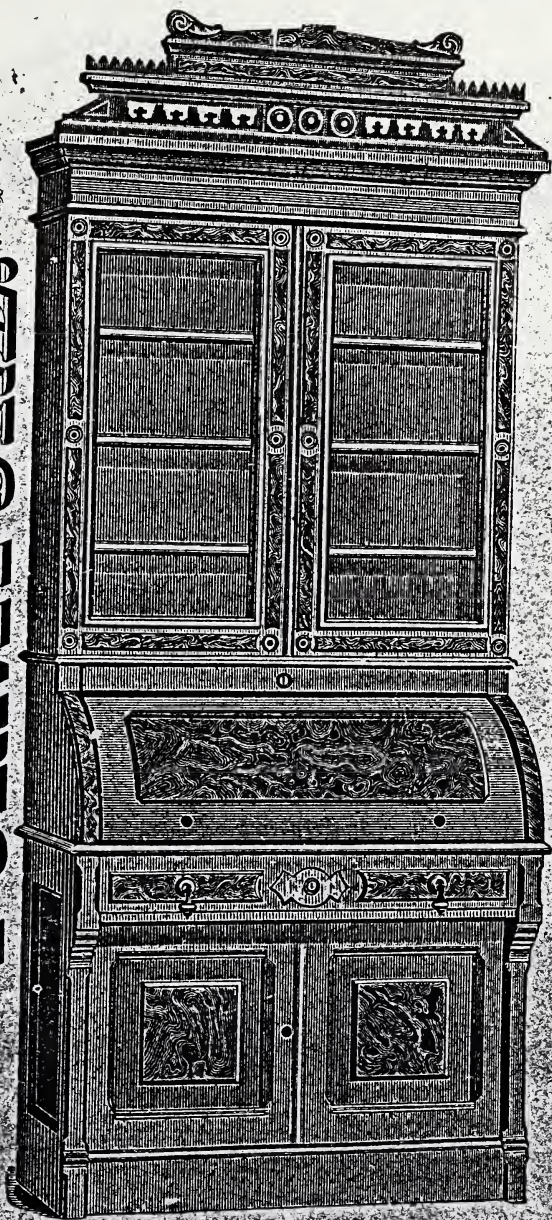

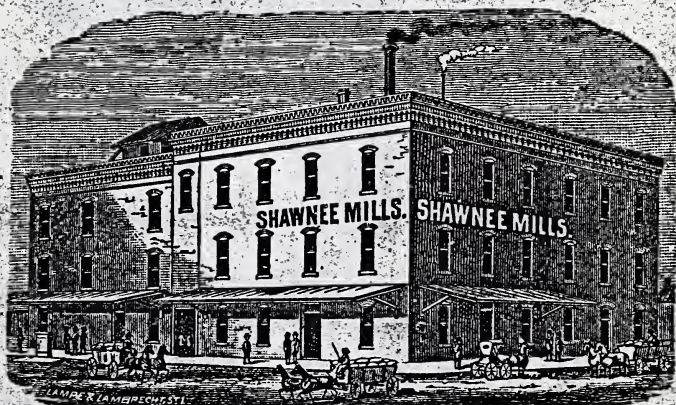

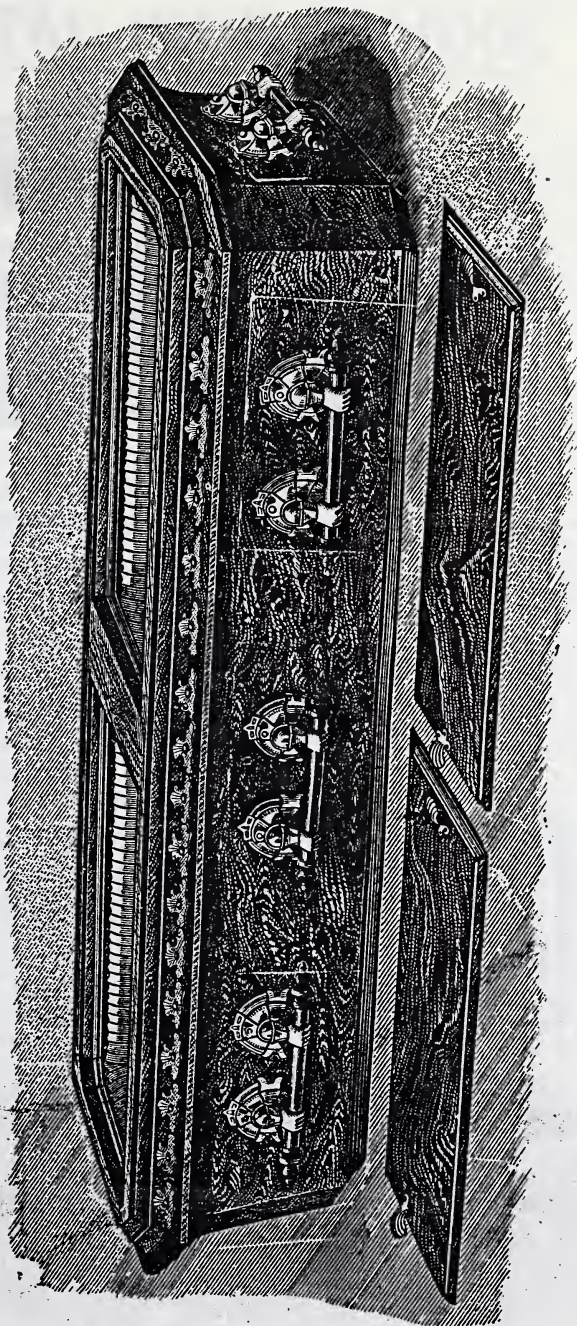

## WHEN AND HOW TO PAY TAXES IN KANSAS.

Taxes become due on November 1st, and the whole or one-half of the same may be paid on or before December 20th, without penalty. One-half of the taxes may be paid on or before December 20th, and the other half on or before June 20th following, without penalty. If the whole tax is paid by December 20th, a rebate of 5 per cent. is deducted on the half that may run over until June 20th. When half payment has not been made by December 20th, the whole becomes delinquent and a penalty of 5 per cent. is added on December 21st. A penalty of 5 per cent. is added on March 31st, and another 5 per cent. on June 21st, on all property on which the first installment was not paid by December 20th.

Warrants for delinquent taxes on personal property will be issued on January 1st and July 1st. Lands delinquent for taxes are advertised July 10th and sold the first Tuesday in September. After the tax sales, the amount of the taxes and costs will be subject to interest at the rate of 50 per cent. per annum. At the end of the third year tax deeds are issued to the purchaser or holder of tax-sale certificates.

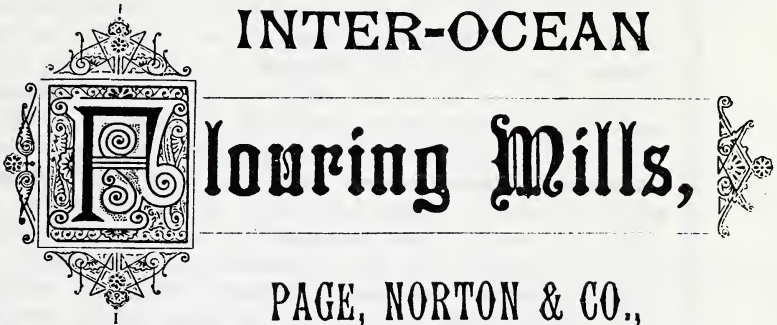

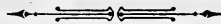

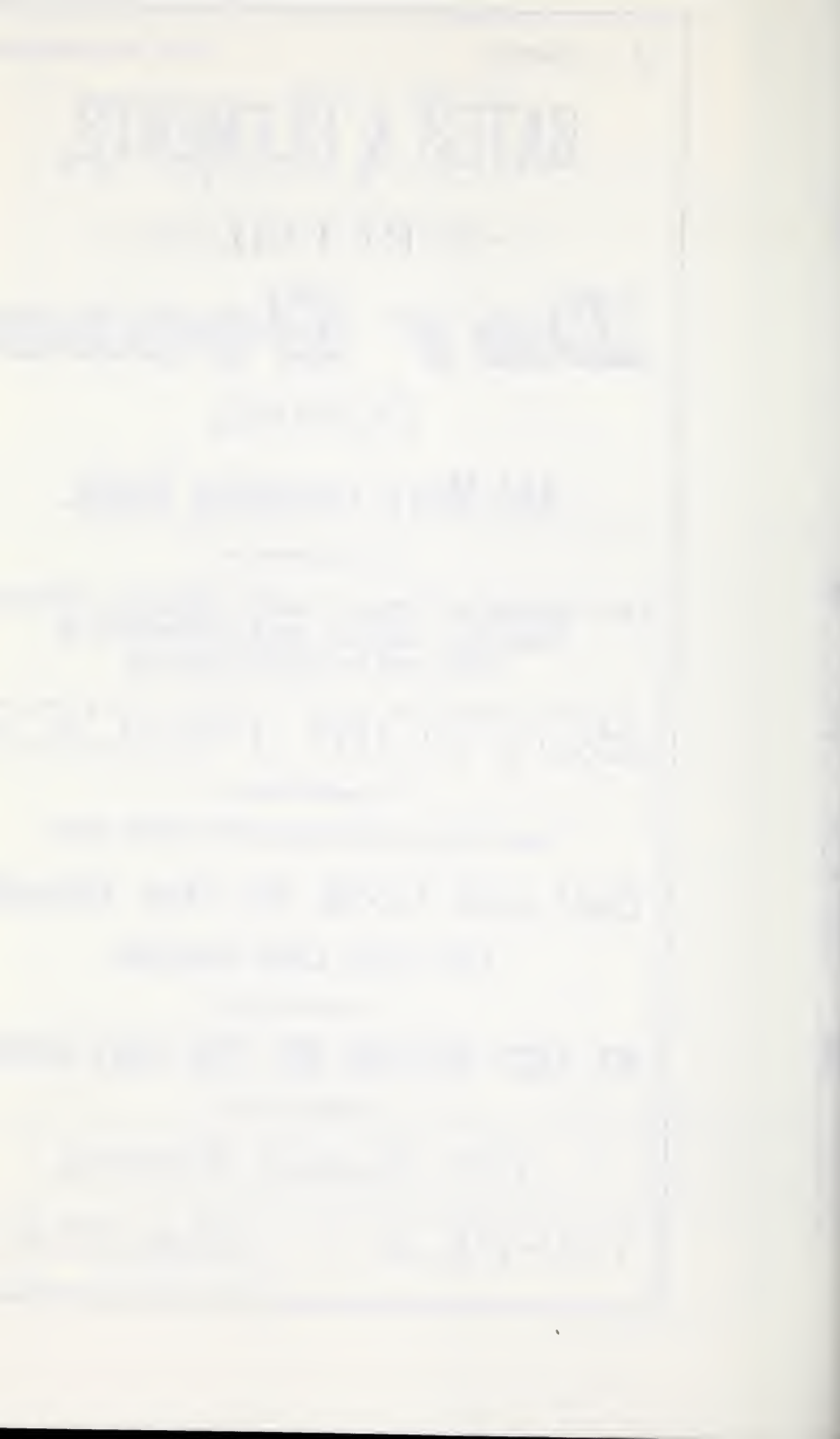

## THE REAL HISTORY OF TOPEKA.

---

BY JOSEPH G. WATERS.

---

Until quite recently we believed away down in our souls, that Topeka was the most cultured, refined and intellectual town ever incorporated as a city of the first class and it is with chagrin and contrition we now admit our error. We weakened on the belief a little when one thousand pockets were picked at the time the State Fair was held here in September 1881, and not a single depredator was caught; but we argued, in the attempt to restore our own confidence, that the unknown malefactors were probably a home production, of whom we ought to feel proud, in view of their successful endeavors, and that it was the ordinary intelligence possessed by all Topekans which enabled them to escape. Even this was a delusion and a snare; further developments, in which we were kindly assisted by the *Commonwealth*, show they were elevator and commission men from Kansas City who took advantage of excursion rates, to come here and visit the State Fair and a live town, and at the same time keep their hand in at the old business. We rather lost our grip on the astheticism of the capital where the most prominent member and officer of our Library Association attended the circus, and accompanied the clown through the entire repertoire of jokes, without a break, from first to last, or rather from Alma to Wamego, of the whole performance, to phrase it in classical Greek. We thought there might be a serious error in our conclusion, when within three and one-half blocks of the best fire department there is in the West, a complete outfit for a city railway was destroyed by fire, among which were twenty-five horses that perished in the flames. The city papers will now have to apologize for all the criticisms they have published about the long and frequent stoppages at crossings and slow time generally heretofore made by the street railway, as they have found







out it was not the horses' fault. If, of all the twenty-five that were cremated, not one had the ability, vitality or desire to go out of a barn door to preserve life, it is not to be wondered at in the peaceful and dull routine of their daily lives, they felt inclined to stop at the corners and hear Climinson discuss Price Raid Scrip, as he did, wonderfully and well. Poor things; they are dead now, and reparation comes too late to do them any good. But all this is merely a prelude; there was just one straw that broke the camel's back and perforce required us to repudiate the claims of this city. It is the hardest matter for us with all our combined erudition, to build a wall in Topeka that will stand; the price of the lots go up and stay there, but the walls placed thereon commence to tumble the very moment they ascertain the scaffolding is taken down, and some of them continue it so often that it becomes as monotonous as the precipitation of the mule through the chimney of the miner's cabin related by M. Twain. We can completely undermine a wall, as they did at the Windsor House, give it a new foundation, then plaster up the twenty or thirty old windows and doors, and cut the same out some where else in the wall and not have a crack in it anywhere; but when it comes to building an entire new one, our art fails us. If it were not that Kansas City had some trouble in the same direction it would accuse us of doing this purposely, to give an air of business to the berg. So, good by, Lotus Clubs and all other organizations that presume on a lofty plane of thought and knowledge. No use of our buying any more Cyclopædias and learnedly discussing the life of Alexander at the first social tea party of the winter, and, as the season progresses, and the numbers keep coming, at last ending with Xerxes on the eve of a wet and backward spring. We have been given away by our own conduct. Oscar Wilde may be read, but it is futile nevertheless to make a silk purse out of a souseer.

"We have fifty thousand souls in the town if we have a single hoof, which is a very gratifying increase for the last year." Such will be the language used in starting the history of Topeka for the tenth edition of this biennial directory, counting this the sixth. As it is, we have over twenty thousand people, and are in a condition to be no longer envious of any other town in the State. And the beauty of it is, we have not attempted to spread ourselves in obtaining more by either advertisement from abroad, or increased personal endeavor at home. Not a man has come to Topeka, the last year, by reason of having bonds voted to aid him in some private enterprise, which probably, Kansas City may say, is







an encouraging decrease from former statistics. We have the best town in the State.

## II.

We are helping Atchison to obtain the grain and stock trade that now goes to the mouth of the Kaw. We are building a railroad to Leavenworth. Henry King and George Peck are both stated lecturers of the University at Lawrence. Topeka sends Ryan to Congress, and they send from Washington to obtain our City Attorney for Commissioner of the General Land Office. It speaks well for the City Government. "A prophet is not without honor, save in his own country." At the present term of our court, there appears strung along in a row on the docket, sixty-six divorce cases, or a number approximating that amount, and with all that, within the memory of any of our inhabitants, there is no such a thing as a full grown, well developed scandal, and this, we believe, can be urged as an additional attraction for this city by those seeking new homes in the far west. Topeka is the best town west of the Missouri.

## III.

We have eight daily papers, and we might add in the words of the auctioneer endeavoring to sell a watch, "eight holes is punched for jewels and thar's room for more." Altogether in the city, of dailies, weeklies and monthlies, we publish about thirty. In the above estimate we count the *Whim-Wham*. We have more poets within a radius of five miles of the State House, in point of numbers, than there were in the whole world at any one time during the last century, and had we time we might give a specimen verse from each. Eh? We always allude to this showing with a sort of local pride whenever we hear a Kansas City man boasting of the capacity of the hog packing houses down there. There are people in this city who have writ for the New York papers, and one, we believe, who edited King's *Ague Cure Almanac*; but he is not doing much at it now. There is a limit however, to our peculiarities; not one of our editors ever interviewed the James boys, and none of our citizens ever wrote the life of the Younger brothers as they have done down at the mouth. We have managed to hold the biggest fair ever held in the West without having the amphitheatre burn down, or a band of highwaymen ride off with the premiums for the best horsemanship without ever contesting for the prize. Just think of it; one hundred and ten lawyers in the city of Topeka, however! And weep! for the communi-







ty! We might add right here, before we are sure to forget, that the peace officers have at last run in the ring guilty of the numerous burglaries and thefts perpetrated in the city. The band turns out to be a negro girl, some fourteen years old, and she is now held to await identification and complicity with her many and flagrant crimes. By the time this history gets cold, we will have water works in the city, which is the last city feature lacking with us. The prohibitory law is a success; as it ought to be, for this is the home of our prohibitory Governor. There is not a single, solitary place in the town where you can get anything to drink. And Topeka is the best city west of the Mississippi.

#### IV.

For a series of years Topeka has been on the jump. We build a thousand houses a year. You cannot get half enough carpenters masons or laborers, and the boom,—I am compelled to use the word—has hardly begun. There are several important railway lines in process of completion to Topeka; one from Ottawa, one from Salina, one from Leavenworth, one from Fort Scott, and several others not now in our minds. The road now building from Leavenworth will be built by spring. It will be operated by some road that now has its termini at Leavenworth and Kansas City. It will have the leanage on all the other eastern roads terminating at those points. They will also build to this city. Kansas City will be stranded. A railroad can destroy as a railroad has made her. Topeka will be her successor. The evidence is all that way. We are preparing for it. Manufactories are coming here. We will have wholesale houses, with the ubiquitous drummer stopping over Sunday away from home. We have now a solitary Chinaman, but we will have more. Our own people have organized a Stock Yards Company, and somebody will soon come along and furnish them the money to run it. We have a starch factory, distillery, and a couple of breweries; we will have more. Topeka is just getting to understand the situation. A State with a million of people ought to have a city somewhere in its borders with at least fifty thousand people. In everything that makes a prosperous community we have it here. We are subject to no disease whatever; there is none indigenous to this locality, and even old age comes so slowly that a man is about seventy before he settles down to his gait. We have got the best people that ever settled in a community: level headed, hospitable, and not afraid of taxes. We have schools that are our pride, and







you don't know hardly what that means, until you string them out in a row like this:



- This is Washburn College.
- This is the Theological Institute.
- This is Bethany College.
- " This is the Catholic School.
- " This is Jackson School.
- " This is Lincoln School.
- " This is Harrison School.
- " This is Clay School.
- " This is Quincy School.
- " This is Douglas School.
- " This is Lane School.
- " This is Adams School.
- " This is Polk School.
- " This is Sumner School.
- " This is Madison School.
- " This is Parkdale School.
- " This is the School in Klein's Addition.
- " This is Tennessee Town School.
- " This is Pond's Commercial College.
- " This is Miss Senour's Kindergarten School.

We have thirty saloons where they sell other drinks, and lemonade in its season. We have not got a good cross-walk in the whole city, and will not have until our Street Commissioner is educated to understand the difference between horizontal and perpendicular. We mean the old Street Commissioner, who is not now in office. (We feel better after this explanation.) We have extensive powers as a city of the first class, and have both the ability and desire to give you, if you will come and live with us, any sort of a municipal franchise you may most hanker after. F. P. Baker will soon light the city with electricity, and it is said that he obtains his friction to run it with, from the new daily papers that have recently been started here. We'd like to compare it with our gas when it gets a head on. Topeka is the best town in America.

## V.

Twenty thousand heads of families living in other parts of the State and in the habit of making periodical trips to Topeka, buy their dry goods in this city. We have a first-class Opera House, and we are educating the manager so that he gives us the best character of entertainments. Emma Leland and Humpty Dumpty have both been here and it has not been open six months. Sells Brothers, proprietors of a first-







class circus or two, or more, have selected Topeka as the place of investment for their surplus wealth, and they have put over a hundred thousand dollars in real estate here. This speaks for itself. They have been through your town, and your's, and your's,—we don't care where you live,—and they say by their acts, this has the boss elevation of mercury. We have two hundred, more or less, mining companies, whose aggregate capital is, at least, \$100,000,000; and each one has its general offices here. They have mines of iron, tin, lead, copper, silver and gold, in every mining district and in every territory. They all issue prospectuses, and all have stock for sale. They are responsible, and have valuable properties. Topeka is the head center of mining operations in the West. We have one hundred thousand volumes in the Public Library of this city, counting, of course, pamphlets and agricultural reports. The Topeka Library is now engaged in building a \$25,000 edifice. The main building of the State Capitol has been commenced, which will cost \$3,000,000 when completed. The United States Postoffice is building, and if the present rate of speed is indulged in, it will cost a \$100,000 every Congress to keep up the ordinary wear and tear; but so long as they appropriate, we are not particular about its completion. We have the only genuine State Fair held in the State; all others are adulterated with alum, and all short weight. We had fifty brass bands parading our street in a bunch at the last fair and will have a hundred at the next. We are the best town (of our size) in the Western Hemisphere.

## VI.

The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad Company is pre-eminently a Kansas railroad. It has three thousand miles of railroad already built, and has a force of men larger than the United States army still building. It runs into Missouri, all over Kansas, through Colorado, New Mexico and Arizona, and into Old Mexico and California. Its headquarters for everything is in Topeka, and it is the Mecca toward which or from where, all its employes journey. Its machine shops are here, and it has commenced an enlargement of them at a cost of not less than \$250,000. It will then manufacture and build here, everything from a nut to a complete locomotive. The pay-roll for Topeka is now over \$1,200,000 per year, and will continue to increase for all time. The company stands in with the city and State in every public enterprise. The big coal interests of the State center here, and to put it in plain print, look at the following bill of fare Topeka sets for you:

## APPENDIX.

Our gifted historian has concluded his work, but his history is not complete without handing down to posterity the usual amount of official statistics to substantiate some of the claims made in the preceeding pages, and we add the following as an appendix:

This Directory, at its birth, will cause the death of its predecessor; but before the latter is buried out of sight, or the former received into favor, it is both becoming and interesting to refresh the recollection and historically note the marvelous growth this city has had in the past few years. And, like prudent merchants and tradesmen, who balance their books and estimate their profits and losses, we have spread the official records before us and copy the following true status of the city to show its rapid progress, and prosperity.

The United States census in 1870 made the population of Topeka less than 6,000; in 1880 the same authority made it over 15,000, and to-day it is not less than 21,000, an increase of fully 5,000 in about eighteen months.

The official vote of the city cast at the November elections from 1862 to 1881 shows an increase much larger than what we claim above. On the very lowest basis on which approximations are usually made of the inhabitants of a city from the number of votes polled at such elections, using the same standard that Chicago, Kansas City, and other cities use, Topeka has to-day a population of over Twenty-five Thousand, but our claims to a "Metropolis" are young and we are consequently yet modest; but the time is not far off when we shall challenge our neighbor at Kawsmouth to show cause, why we are not entitled to the bakery.

In June of the present year there were 6,176 improved lots in the city, and 3,300 unimproved, and the average value of lots was assessed at \$282.54. The value of personal property listed by the assessor was \$608,230, and the total valuation of all property in the city is placed at \$3,410,434.82. The above figures are based on a valuation of about 40 per cent. of the real value as provided by law.

For the year ending October 14, 1880, one thousand building permits were issued, the estimated cost therefor being \$667,207. Of this number 672 were for residences, 36 for shops and manufactories, 95 business and warehouses, 12 hotels and public buildings, churches and schools, and 185 other buildings. During this time a very large number of buildings were completed which were contracted for and in process of erection before the permit law took effect.

We might record more voluminous authorities to corroborate our claim to the "Metropolis" of Kansas, but it is now generally conceded by all fair minded people that Topeka has a just right to be proud of her rapid and almost wonderful growth, of her magnificent and substantial business houses, her pleasant and luxurious homes, her model colleges and schools, her numerous elegant and costly churches, her magnificent public buildings, and her beautiful wide streets. With an intelligent population imbued with that spirit of enterprise and progress attested by the above facts, it is no over-estimation to predict that within a few years the entire country west of the Mississippi River will rejoice and refer with just pride to this city as one of the grandest evidences of western thrift and business enterprise.

enterprise, climbed over the mountains at Raton Pass and pushed its way into the very heart of that country, still rich in evidences of the Aztec civilization and of Spanish rule. It was of this country that Chief Justice Prince spoke when he said: "I don't think I am over enthusiastic about these matters, and yet I believe New Mexico contains more gold than California and more silver than Colorado." While it is true that Colorado "carries the flag" as the silver producing State, it will appear that Justice Prince has not over stated the case when the mines of New Mexico are as well developed as those of Colorado. But the silver deposits of New Mexico, though wonderful in extent and richness, constitute only a small part of her wealth. Gold, as well as silver, is found all the way from Santa Fe to where the territory corners with Arizona and Chihuahua, while to the west of the mountains lie the wonderful placer regions of the upper Rio Grande and its tributaries, the discovery of which has been pronounced by Professor Silliman the most important since the discovery of gold in Australia. 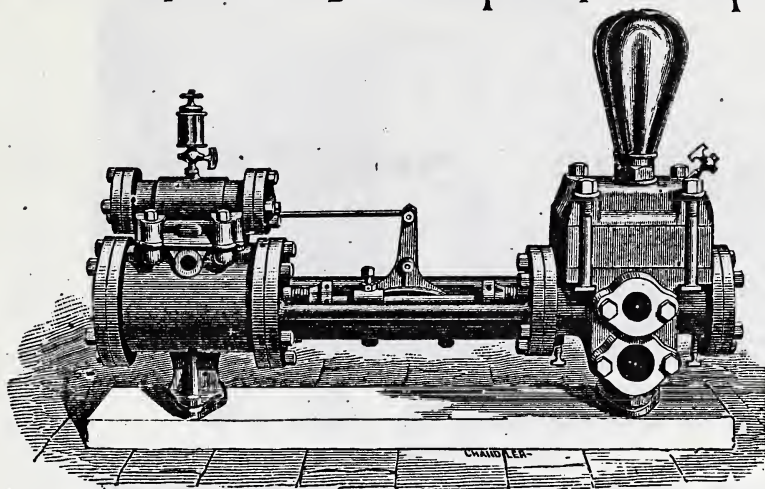

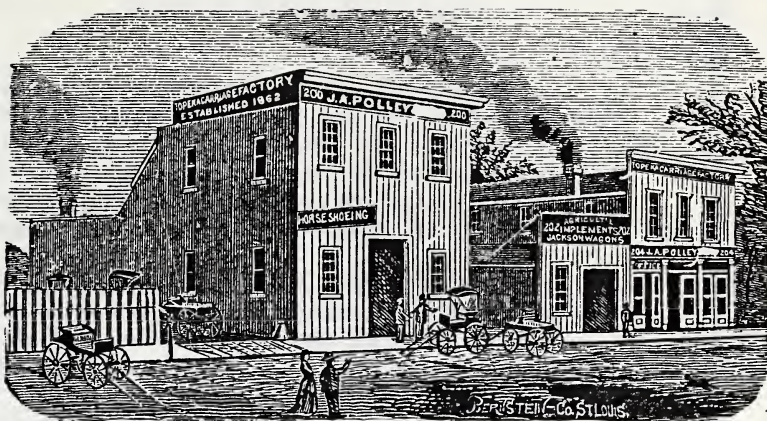

## THE STATE OF KANSAS.

The Territory of Kansas remained unorganized and almost unpeopled until the 30th day of May, 1854, when President Pierce signed the famous Kansas-Nebraska Bill, organizing the Territories of Kansas and Nebraska. In July, 1859, the Constitutional Convention met in Wyandotte and on the 29th day of July signed the "Wyandotte Constitution." This was ratified by the people in October of the same year, but it was not, however, until January 29, 1861, that President Buchanan signed the act of Congress admitting Kansas, under the Wyandotte Constitution, and that her existence as a State legally began.

Charles Robinson had been elected Governor in 1859, and remained in office until January, 1863, when he was succeeded by Thomas Carney, until 1865. Samuel J. Crawford was elected in 1865, and re-elected in 1867, giving way in 1869 to James M. Harvey, who held the office for four years. In 1873 Thomas A. Osborn was elected and re-elected in 1875, and George T. Anthony succeeded him in 1877. In 1879 the present incumbent, Hon. John P. St. John, was elected, and re-elected in November, 1880.

The State of Kansas includes an area of 80,000 square miles, or 52,042,520 acres, and is larger than the whole of the New England States, equal to North and South Carolina combined, and is twice as large as Ohio. According to the United States census taken in 1880, it has a population of 995,355 people.

Elections are held on the first Tuesday following the first







Monday in November, and biennial sessions of the Legislature are held at the State capital.

The Governor, Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, Attorney General, Superintendent of Public Instruction and members of the House of Representatives, are elected for a term of two years. State Senators are elected every four years. The State Printer is elected for two years by a joint ballot of the Legislature, and the Superintendent of Insurance is appointed by the Governor.

The next protracted effort to do a permanent work, was made January 1st, 1881, by the call of Dr. S. T. Dodd, formerly of Virginia, who gathered the willing workers into the Y. M. C. A. hall, regularly every week for work and worship, until the 30th day of June, 1881, when the enrollment of fifty-six members had been completed and an organization was effected by the pastor, with Hon. Willard Davis as Moderator and W. D. Stone as Secretary.

The congregation at this date, November 30, 1881, numbers one hundred members, and continues to meet in the Y. M. C. A. hall, on Kansas avenue, near Seventh street. The present officers are Dr. S. T. Dodd, pastor; Willard Davis, clerk; W. D. Wiliver, Alfred Ennis and W. D. Stone, elders;







J. A. Mullen, W. M. Hess and J. O. Leary, deacons; Ira Miller, David Eckert, William Nicum, E. H. Rodibush and G. W. Fought, trustees, and Buel Shuler and A. A. Stewart, ushers.

The Church has a live Sunday school of one hundred and twenty-five members, which meets each Lord's day at 9:30 a. m. They have preaching at 11 a. m., communion at 12 m., and preaching at 7:30 p. m.; also prayer and choir meeting every Thursday evening.

All bills are paid monthly in advance, and now that as a body they are reaching considerable strength, they have decided to procure lots and proceed to the erection of a house of worship. Connected with this congregation is a most efficient working "Ladies' Auxiliary Missionary Society." A unanimous call has lately been extended to their present pastor to continue his relationship with the Church during the year 1882.

#### THE FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

Rev L. Blakesley, *Pastor*.

Is situated at the corner of Seventh and Harrison streets. It was organized October 14, 1855, in the cabin of Mr. James Cowles. Rev. Lewis Bodwell was pastor from October, 1856, until his resignation in the spring of 1860. Rev. Peter McVicar succeeded to the pastorate, and continued from October, 1860, until July, 1866. He was followed by Rev. Mr. Bodwell, who served the church the second time, from September, 1866, until June, 1869. Rev. James G. Merrill then became pastor. After remaining one year he was appointed to the superintendency of Home Missions for Kansas, and was succeeded in September, 1870, by Rev. Linus Blakesley, the present incumbent.

The first edifice was erected on the present site at a cost of \$7,000, and was dedicated early in 1861. The present edifice was completed and dedicated the first Sunday in January, 1881. The cost was \$21,000. It is a model in its convenience of arrangement. The form of the main auditorium is amphitheatorial, the pews being curved and the sides descending and centering towards the platform. In the rear of the pulpit is a spacious choir, in which is a beautiful pipe organ, built by Hoox, Hastings & Co., of Boston, and purchased for the church by the "Monday Club," an organization of the young people of the Church and the congregation. Adjoining the auditorium is the spacious lecture room, which, by lowering the large stained glass windows between, can be used to increase the seating capacity of the church.

The present membership of the Church is about three hundred. The amount raised for current expenses during the year ending November 1, 1881, was \$3,265. Benevolent con-







tributions, \$622. Average attendance at Sunday school during the year, was 224.

The officers are as follows: Pastor, Rev. L. Blakesley; Deacons, Peter Fisher, A. A. Ripley, James Seery and A. B. Perine; Trustees, James Seery, E. H. Blake, Geo. M. Stearns and T. E. Bowman; Clerk and *ex officio* Trustee, Jas. F. Griffin.

#### CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF NORTH TOPEKA.

Rev. Samuel P. Dunlap, *Pastor*.

Located on the corner of Laurent and Jackson streets, in North Topeka. Regular services are held by the pastor. The Church was organized in July, 1869, under the pastorate of Rev. Rodney Payne. The church building was dedicated August 13, 1871, and cost about \$4,000. It is free from debt and has a Sunday School.

#### EPISCOPAL PROTESTANT CHURCH, NORTH TOPEKA.

Rev. A. Brown, *Pastor*.

Hold regular services in their church, in North Topeka. (History not furnished.)

#### GRACE (EPISCOPAL) CATHEDRAL.

Rev. Richard Ellerby, *Rector and Dean*.

A mission was inaugurated in the year 1857, by Rev. Chas. Callaway, and in 1860 a parish was organized under the name of Grace Church, with about twelve communicants. Rev. N. O. Preston had charge of the parish three years, during which time a church edifice was erected. Rev. I. N. Lee became rector in June, 1865, and continued until June, 1869, when he resigned and was succeeded by Rev. Charles Stewart, who severed his connection with the parish in March, 1871, when Rev. John Bakewell, D. D., was called to the rectorship which he held until June, 1875, when impaired health induced him to resign. During his rectorship the church edifice was so remodeled, enlarged and improved as to constitute it virtually a new church. Rev. Henry Loring presided over the parish from January, 1875, until December, 1878. At the Diocesan Convention in June, 1879, Grace Church was adopted by the convention as the Cathedral of the Diocese. The Rev. J. W. Walker commenced his labors a rector and dean October 1st, 1879, and his untimely death occurred soon after, on February 20th, 1880. The present rector and dean, Rev. Richard Ellerby, entered upon his charge August 1st, 1880.

#### CHURCH OF THE ASSUMPTION.

Rev. F. Cunningham, *Pastor*.

This congregation own the oldest church structure in the







city. It was built by Rev. James H. Defouri in August, 1862, near the corner of Eighth avenue and Jackson street. A large and more commodious edifice is now being erected near the old church, which will be completed during the year, at a cost of about \$25,000. A school is also connected with this church, which is under the auspices of the Sisters of Charity, numbering about one hundred and fifty pupils.

#### LUTHERAN CHURCH (GERMAN).

Rev. Thomas F. Dornblaser, *Pastor*.

Located on the corner of Second and Van Buren streets. Regular services are held by the pastor.

#### LUTHERAN CHURCH (SWEDISH).

Rev. ———, *Pastor*.

This church is situated on the west side of Tyler street, between Second and Third streets, where regular services are held weekly.

#### FIRST METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH.

Rev. O. J. Cowles, *Pastor*.

The first society was organized in Topeka, March 21st, 1855, composed of a small number of men and woman, with Rev. A. Still, presiding elder, and Rev. J. S. Griffin, pastor. J. Case, class-leader, H. H. Wentworth, Sunday school sup't.

## MOUNT OLIVET METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH (Col'd).

Hold regular services in their church building, on the corner of Fourteenth and Van Buren streets.

## AFRICAN METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH.

Rev. J. W. Braxton, *Pastor*.

On Monroe street, between First avenue and Second street. Has a large congregation and is the oldest church owned by colored people in the city. Regular services are held by the pastor morning and evening of every Sabbath.

## WESLYAN METHODIST CHURCH.

Rev. Mr. McIntosh, *Pastor*.

A new chapel is now owned by the society, on the east side of Jefferson street, between Third and Fourth streets, which was erected in 1878. Services are held therein Sabbath mornings at 10:30 o'clock, and evenings at 7:30, to which an invitation is extend to all.

## NEW JERUSALEM CHURCH (SWEEDENBORGEN).

Rev. H. R. Dunham, *Pastor*.

Within the past year this society has erected a very handsome church building, on the southeast corner of Sixth and Harrison street, where services are regularly held on Sundays as per announcement.

## FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

Rev. F. S. McCabe, D. D., *Pastor*.

The First Presbyterian Church of Topeka, on Eighth avenue east, near Kansas avenue, occupies a central and eligible location. It has a substantial stone house of worship, recently enlarged and refitted, and furnishing comfortable accommodations for the congregation.







The first pastor of the church was Rev. John A. Steele, whose charge began early in the year 1860, and who died October 12, 1864.

The present pastor began his work January 1, 1869, the membership consisting of thirty persons. Since that date members have been received into the church as follows; On profession of faith, 196; by certificate from other churches, 465; total, 661. The congregation has raised and paid out for expenses and benevolent objects, \$40,500.

The pastor of this church has gathered and organized several churches in Shawnee county outside of the city of Topeka, and two churches in Topeka, viz: Bethel Church, seven miles southeast of Topeka, organized May 28, 1871; Pleasant Ridge Church, nine miles northwest of Topeka, organized July 16, 1876; Wakarusa Church, twelve miles south of Topeka, organized December 5, 1877; North Topeka Church, organized September 15, 1878; Third Presbyterian Church, Topeka, organized December 12, 1880; Mission Centre Church, six miles west of Topeka, organized January 16, 1881.

All of these churches, except that at Wakarusa, received a valuable portion of their original membership from the First Presbyterian Church of this city; all of them have regular services, and all but two have good houses of worship, finished and dedicated without debt, the total cost of the buildings being about \$9,500. The Third Presbyterian Church is building a house of worship in the eastern part of the city.

The officers of the First Presbyterian Church are: Rev. F. S. McCabe, D. D., pastor; John Brier, J. T. Clark, David Shellabarger and John W. Day, board of elders; A. M. Callahan, R. B. Gemmell and H. R. Hilton, board of deacons; William Tweeddale, Bradford Miller and T. L. Ross, board of trustees; G. F. Parmelee, treasurer; R. B. Gemmell, superintendent of the Sabbath school; W. G. Dickinson, ass't superintendent.

The present number of communicants is 300. The Sabbath school has a membership of about 250.

#### PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH, NORTH TOPEKA.

Rev. J. C. Miller, *Pastor*.

This church was organized by Rev. Dr. F. S. McCabe September 15, 1878, with twenty-six members. Present membership is sixty-six.

December 12, 1878, Rev. J. C. Miller became their pastor, which relation still exists.

On November 16, 1879, the present house of worship, stone, forty by sixty feet, costing \$3,100, was dedicated free from

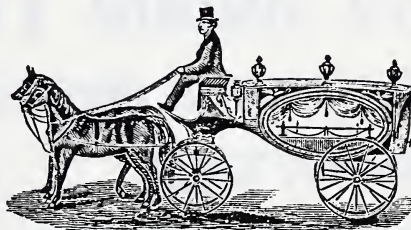

## SOCIETIES, CLUBS, ETC.

### TOPEKA LIBRARY.

The pride of Topeka was established in 1870, by a number of ladies organized for the purpose, who gave a number of entertainments, lectures, etc., to raise funds for the purchase of the first instalment of books and periodicals. For a number of years it received sufficient and substantial encouragement from all classes of citizens as a circulating library; later it became associated with a lottery given in its behalf, from which it realized several thousand dollars which was used in extending its usefulness. As it increased in size and importance it also became proud, and deserted, one by one, the ladies who so kindly, carefully and tenderly cared for and cherished it during its infancy. Retribution overtook it after a







time and it had to be fostered by the city, which supplied its necessities for one year, after which time a spirit of cheap economy overtook the council, who refused further to provide for its maintenance to the amount necessary to conduct it as a free institution, which came near sacrificing its usefulness for the future. The deficiency was, however, raised by public subscription, and the Library was again reopened after a brief suspension. During the fall of 1880 the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railroad Company and the Union Pacific Railroad Company, donated to the Library \$25,000, for the purpose of erecting a magnificent building for its use, on condition that the building be erected on the State House grounds.

The proposition was submitted to the Legislature at its last session, who adopted it, and the foundation is now being laid for the new edifice on the corner of the public grounds facing Eighth avenue and Jackson street. The Library is now located in a spacious hall on the corner of Kansas avenue and Seventh street, directly opposite the new Hotel Windsor, and is provided with about six thousand volumes of carefully selected books, etc., and a handsome reading room containing files of newspapers and periodicals, to which strangers are cordially invited. The Library is also free to all residents of Topeka, under certain rules and regulations adopted to govern it, and is kept open daily (Sundays excepted) until nine o'clock p. m.

#### SWEDISH LIBRARY ASSOCIATION.

Was organized in October, 1879, for the purpose of collecting Swedish, American and German literature, and to be conducted as a circulating library. The association is in a prosperous condition and are adding new books constantly to supply the wants of its fast increasing membership. The library is located at 147 Kansas avenue, Alex. Rudolph, Pres't; Andrew Johnson, Treasurer, and John Watts, Librarian.

#### STATE LIBRARY.

As its name implies, belongs to the State and is located in the capitol building, under the supervision of a Librarian appointed by the Governor. No books are permitted to be taken away except by special permission, but free access is allowed to all to inspect or read them in the rooms belonging to the library.

#### BOARD OF TRADE.

Organized in the spring of 1880, for the purpose of protecting and extending the commerce and business interests of the city. The present officers are, C. K. Holliday, President;







M. Bosworth, Vice President; J. G. Slonecker, Secretary; Willis Norton, Treasurer.

#### TOPEKA STOCK YARD COMPANY.

Incorporated under the laws of Kansas in 1881, but not yet fully organized for business purposes.

#### CITIZEN'S BUILDING AND SAVINGS INSTITUTION.

Is about winding up its affairs after a successful career of over five years. No further assessments are made, the association having ample funds to redeem their stock in full and declare a handsome dividend to the stockholders.

#### MUSICAL UNION.

This organization dates back to January 16, 1869, when it was organized for the cultivation and faithful rendering of the better class of musical composition. The success of the society has, by earnest work, been very marked, and is deservedly appreciated and encouraged by large audiences at their varied entertainments and concerts, given from time to time, which are of a character that would be creditable to any city. Musical Union Hall, located at 199 Kansas avenue, is leased by this society, where regular meetings for rehearsal are held every Wednesday evening.

The present officers are, Henry Worrall, President; James F. Griffin, Secretary and Treasurer; J. S. Slie, Musical Conductor; Executive Committee, Henry Worrall, Dr. S. E. Martin and Frank Drummond.

#### TOPEKA CHORAL SOCIETY.

Was organized in June, 1880, and has now a membership of thirty-six persons. The object of the society is the attainment of a higher degree of musical culture through the study and rendition of the works of the best authors, both ancient and modern. Officers: H. V. Hinckley, President; Mrs. J. Brown, Vice President; C. G. Leeper, Secretary and Treasurer; Henry Worrall, Pianist; Carl Von Weller, Musical Director.

#### MUSICAL UNION JUNIOR.

Organized in January, 1878, for the cultivation of the voice, both in singing and elocution. The members comprise the best singers in the public schools of the city, who meet on Tuesday evening of each week at the Temperance headquarters, 174 Kansas avenue.

#### THE AVON CLUB.

Was organized in 1870. Its object is the cultivation of literary and social qualities of its members. It is the oldest







club in the city, and has won an enviable position in the literary and social circles of the capital. It meets twice a month from October to April, closing its season with an annual banquet on the 23d of April—celebrating the birth of Shakespeare, its favorite bard.

#### LINCOLN LITERARY SOCIETY.

Ever since the organization of the Topeka High School, the scholars have, under different organizations and at different times, carried on a literary society. The present society, or Lincoln Literary Society, was organized early in the year of 1879. It adjourned in the spring of '79 to meet at the call of its officers. The object of the society is the general cultivation of the mind. The exercises consist of debate, recitation, essays, select readings and the reading of a weekly paper.

#### MONDAY CLUB.

An auxiliary society of the First Congregational Church. Officers: Joseph G. Pangborn, President; Frank Drummond, Secretary and Treasurer; Executive Committee, A. E. Sexton, J. S. Slie and F. M. Strong.

#### MODOC CLUB.

A company of choristers and jubilee singers, without whom no social, political or religious entertainment is complete. It is under the musical direction of Major T. J. Anderson, and occupies a higher rank in their specialties than has yet been attained here by an amateur club. (This notice is gratuitous.)

#### MACINAW GLEE CLUB.

The wonderful success that this club enjoyed here for some time, in being earnestly invited to sing somewhere else, induced the management to establish a branch society at Clay Center, under the name of the "Stuffed Club," and the double-heroed Walton as its representative. The object of the auxiliary department is to compete with the coyotes and prairie wolves of the northwest in making night hideous with their howling, and if successful will go into training as members of the next Legislature.

#### PIONEER SOCIETY OF TOPEKA.

Of the inhabitants of this city who located here previous to the flood (1857) this society is composed. Although it is the oldest yet it is the smallest, in point of numbers, of any organization in the place; for the reason that few of its original members will admit that they are as old as the society itself. A triennial banquet is given by the society (they try to get one







up annually lately), on the fifth day of December, in commemoration of the location of Topeka, in 1854, when new officers are elected and ancient times are discussed. Fry W. Giles, President; Enoch Chase, Vice President; A. J. Hickey, Secretary, and Franklin L. Crane, Treasurer.

#### KANSAS STATE FAIR ASSOCIATION.

Was organized in November, 1879, for the purpose of promoting the agricultural interests of the State, and the holding of a fair at the city of Topeka in the fall of each year. The first fair was held during September, 1881, on the grounds controlled by the Shawnee County Agricultural Society, supplemented by an additional twenty-four acres owned by the association. Extensive and valuable improvements have been added to the grounds, and the track made by far the best in the west, and \$20,000 more will be expended by the managers previous to the holding of the next fair, the dates for which having been claimed for the week including the 11th to the 16th of September, 1882.

#### SHAWNEE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.

#### TOPEKA DRIVING PARK ASSOCIATION.

The association meet on the second Monday in February of each year, for the election of officers, etc. They have adopted the rules of the National Association, and work in the interest of the State Fair Association. J. W. Hartzell, Sec'y.

#### BACHELORS' CLUB.

A dozen years have elapsed since the brotherhood of bachelors erected their stronghold in Topeka, to protect themselves against the powerful influence of widows and spinsters. Recently, however, Cupid stormed their castle and shot his matrimonial arrows into the hearts of some of their oldest and most respected members. The brotherhood is doomed. Let the good work go on. John G. Searle, Spencer P. Wade,







James P. Rowley, Fifth Ave. Terry, W. M. Hazen, Cliff C. Baker, A. E. Barnes, Willis Norton, Ed. Downard, T. P. Rodgers, and others, including Sam Radges who is engaged to be married in 1902, are not beyond redemption. Erect a slab over the bachelors' den and inscribe it "*Multum in parvo.*"

#### ORPHAN ASYLUM.

This city has two auxiliary societies of the asylum which is located at Leavenworth. One of which is located in North Topeka. Funds are raised annually by the ladies connected with the institution, by giving balls and sociable through the winter months, and supplies of all kinds are collected as contributions to the asylum.

#### WOMAN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION.

An organization of ladies for the purpose of supplying homes and relief to helpless and self supporting woman. The present officers are, Mrs. J. P. St. John, President; Mrs. S. E. Sheldon, Vice President; Mrs. A. L. Griffith, Recording Secretary; Mrs. E. W. Bowman, Treasurer; Miss. O. P. Bury, Corresponding Secretary; Mrs. S. A. Thurston, Auditor.

#### TOPEKA TURNVEREIN

was organized under charter, February 10, 1867. It is composed of German citizens who own a substantial hall and handsome garden on the south bank of the river and Harrison street. Regular meetings are there held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month.

#### THE BOHEMIAN CLUB.

This was an assembly of literary gentlemen who gathered all the knowledge they required in their respective vocations in a short time and disbanded. A handsome sign bearing the name of the club still adorns the outer wall of their former den, which entitles them to this notice among the numerous institutions of the city.

#### THE SKIDMORE GUARDS.

Neither soldiers, citizens or reputable persons, judging from their unearthy demonstrations when they turn loose on this community.

#### COROANDO CLUB.

A society of the young bloods of the city, whose object is to provide fun, amusement and dancing for themselves, a few select friends and strangers generally, who may desire to indulge in any of the recreations that this society furnishes







throughout the winter months, including *bal masque* parties. Their rooms are on the corner of Eighth and Kansas avenues at present, but they hope to be able by next spring to erect a handsome temple in which to give their future entertainments.

#### KNIGHTS ERRANT BRIGADE

was founded in March, 1878, while digging a cellar under Rowley Bro's. drug store, and can still be found there. The membership is limited to eight in number, who hold their midnight conclaves only after certain atmospheric changes. Their diabolical proceedings are private, and their public demonstrations hideous.

#### ATHENAEUM DRAMATIC SOCIETY.

Organized from ladies and gentlemen of the city having a dramatic talent. The entertainments given by this society are for the benefit of charitable institutions, and the membership is confined to twenty-five persons. The officers are: Prof. Nadal, President; S. Gardenhire, Vice President; W. C. Berkley, Secretary and Treasurer; E. G. Dick, business manager; John G. Searle, stage manager, and Prof. Swain Bach, musical director.

#### TOPEKA MINING BOARD.

A mining stock exchange, organized in 1878, hold their council at 189 Kansas avenue every evening after legitimate business is suspended for the day. All the members are wealthy in their minds and make *heavy* purchases of stocks and mining interests that fluctuate mostly in the market. All curb-stone brokers are debarred membership in the board. John Guthrie is President and theoretical miner; Theodore Terry acts as Vice President, and is not a minor; and John M. Clugston, the Secretary, is minus several thousand dollars through adverse investments. The directory of the board are A. B. Tinkham, J. M. Davies, D. C. Metsker, Charles Foster, T. L. Ross, W. W. Stilson and J. M. Spencer.

#### GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC.

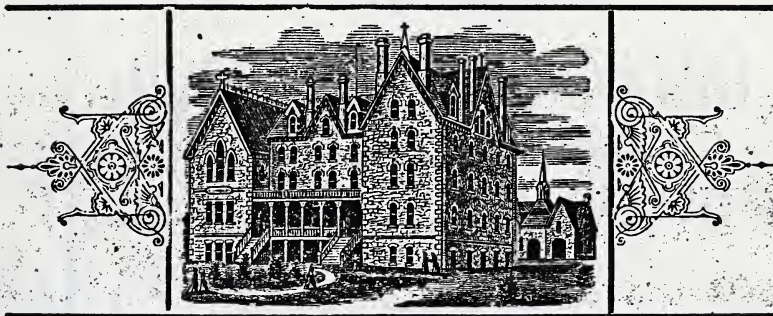

## DEPARTMENT DUTIES.

### DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

The Secretary of State is charged, under the direction of the President, with the duties appertaining to correspondence with the public ministers and consuls of the United States, and with the representatives of foreign powers accredited to







the United States; and to negotiations of whatever character relating to the foreign affairs of the United States. He is also the medium of correspondence between the President and the chief executive of the several States of the United States; he has the custody of the great seal of the United States, and countersigns and affixes such seal to all executive proclamations, to various commissions, and to warrants for pardon, and the extradition of fugitives from justice. He is regarded as the first in rank among the members of the Cabinet. He is also the custodian of the treaties made with foreign States, and of the laws of the United States. He grants and issues passports, and exequaturs to foreign consuls in the United States are issued through his office. He publishes the laws and resolutions of Congress, amendments to the Constitution, and proclamations declaring the admission of new States into the Union. He is also charged with certain annual reports to Congress relating to commercial information received from diplomatic and consular officers of the United States.

#### THE TREASURY DEPARTMENT.

The Secretary of the Treasury has charge of the national finances. He digests and prepares plans for the improvement and management of the revenue and support of the public credit; he superintends the collection of the revenue, and prescribes the forms of keeping and rendering all public accounts, and making returns; grants all warrants for money to be issued from the Treasury in pursuance of appropriations by law; makes reports and gives information to either branch of Congress, as may be required, respecting all matters referred to him by the Senate or House of Representatives, and generally performs all such services relative to the finances as he is directed to perform; controls the erection of public buildings, the coinage and printing of money, the collection of commercial statistics, the marine hospitals, the revenue-cutter service, the life-saving service. Under his superintendence the Light-House Board discharges the duties relative to the construction, illumination, inspection, and superintendence of light-houses, light-vessels, beacons, buoys, sea-marks, and their appendages; makes provision for the payment of the public debt under enactments of Congress, and publishes statements concerning it, and submits to Congress, at the commencement of each session, estimates of the probable receipts, and of the required expenditures, for the ensuing fiscal year.

The routine work of the Secretary's office is transacted in the following offices: Division of Appointments; Division of Warrants, Estimates, and Appropriations; Division of Public Moneys; Division of Customs; Division of Internal Revenue







and Navigation; Division of Loans and Currency; Division of Life-Saving Service and Revenue Marine; Division of Stationery, Printing, and Blanks; Division of Special Agents; and two disbursing-clerks pay the salaries and compensation of the officers and employes of the Department, and disburse, upon the orders of the Secretary, such moneys as have been appropriated to be expended under the direction of the Department.

---

## THE WAR DEPARTMENT.

### THE SECRETARY OF WAR.

The Secretary of War performs such duties as the President of the United States, who is Commander-in-Chief, may enjoin upon him concerning the military service, and has the superintendence of the purchase of Army supplies, transportation, &c.

### THE NAVY DEPARTMENT.

The Secretary of the Navy performs such duties as the President of the United States, who is Commander-in-Chief, may assign him, and has the general superintendence of construction, manning, armament equipment, and employment of vessels of war.

### THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR.

The Secretary of the Interior is charged with the supervision of public business relating to patents for inventions, pensions and bounty lands, the public lands, including mines, the Indians, education, the census, when directed by law the custody and distribution of public documents, and certain hospitals and Eleemosynary institutions in the District of Columbia. He also exercises certain powers and duties in relation to the Territories of the United States.

### THE POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT.

The Postmaster-General has the direction and management of the Post Office Department. He appoints all officers and employes of the Department, except the three Assistant Postmasters-General, who are appointed by the President by and with the advice and consent of the Senate; appoints all postmasters whose compensation does not exceed one thousand dollars; makes postal treaties with foreign governments, by and with the advice and consent of the President; awards and executes contracts, and directs the management of the domestic and foreign mail service.







## DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

*The Attorney-General*—The Attorney-General is the head of the Department of Justice and the chief law officer of the government. He represents the United States in matters involving legal questions; he gives his advice and opinion on questions of law when they are required by the President, or by the heads of the other Executive Departments on questions of law arising upon the administration of their respective Departments; he exercises a general superintendence and direction over United States Attorneys and Marshals in all judicial districts in the States and Territories; and he provides special counsel for the United States whenever required by any department of the government.

## THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

*The Commissioner of Agriculture*—The Commissioner of Agriculture is required to collect and diffuse useful information on subjects connected with agriculture. He is to acquire and preserve in his office all information he can obtain concerning agriculture by means of books and correspondence, and by practical and scientific experiments, the collection of statistics and other appropriate means; to collect new and valuable seeds and plants; to learn by actual cultivation such of them as may require such tests; to propagate such as may be worthy of propagation, and to distribute them among agriculturists.

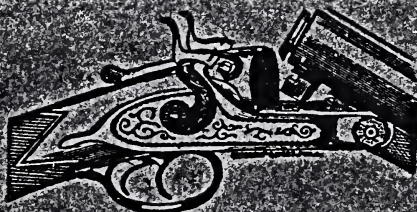

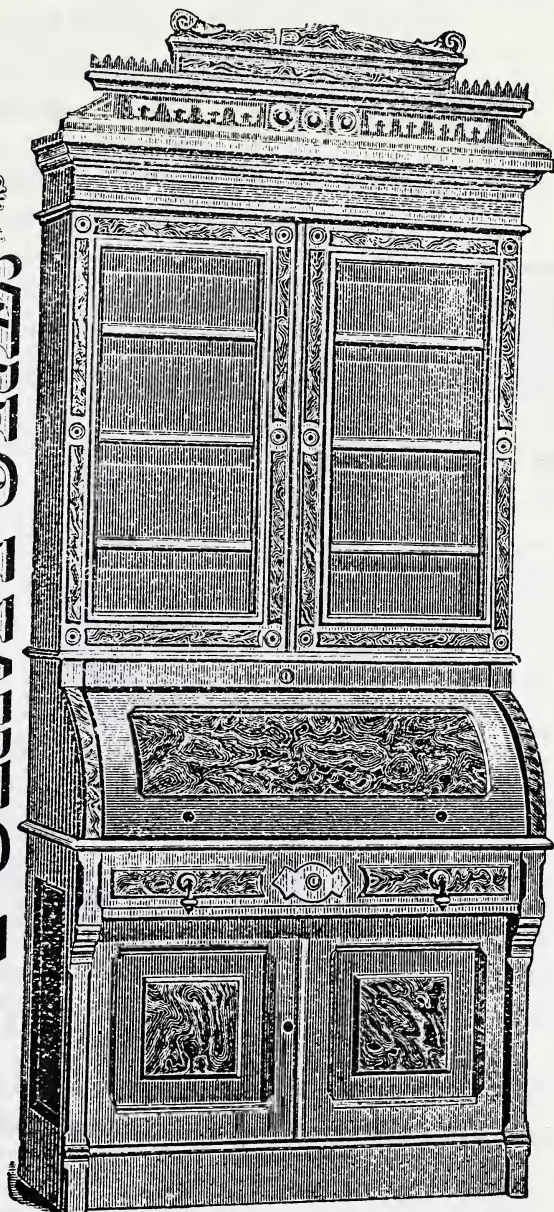

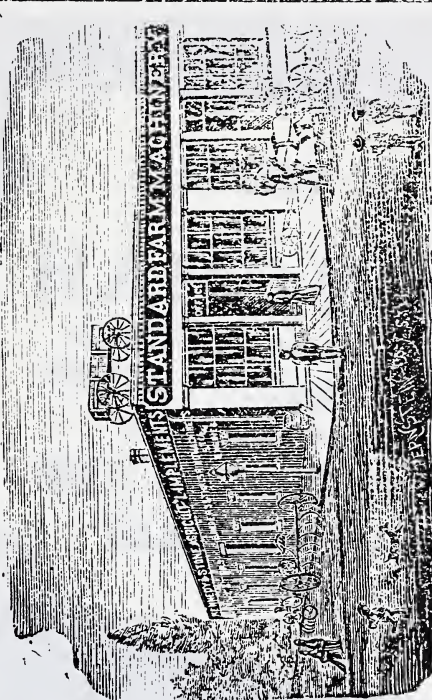
