

At the end of Orleans Street may be seen the rear pediment and slender spires of the St. Louis Cathedral



















In St. Louis Street, looking towards Chartres, can be seen the house built as a residence for Napoleon by his devoted followers in the old French colony











The overhanging balconies of Exchange Passage which connects St. Peter Street with St. Anthony's Alley





















Wrought iron gates leading from the carriage entrance of an old home in Royal Street to the vestibule, from which winds a graceful curved stairway
