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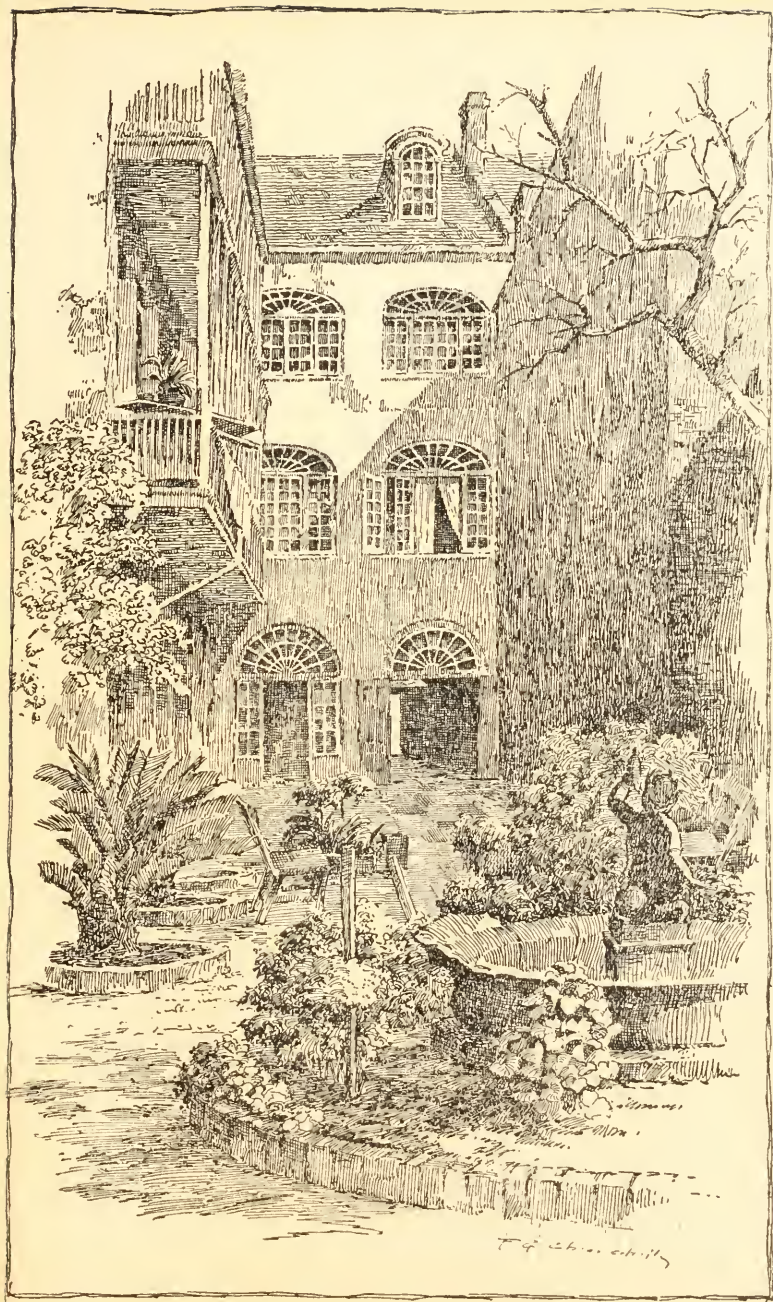

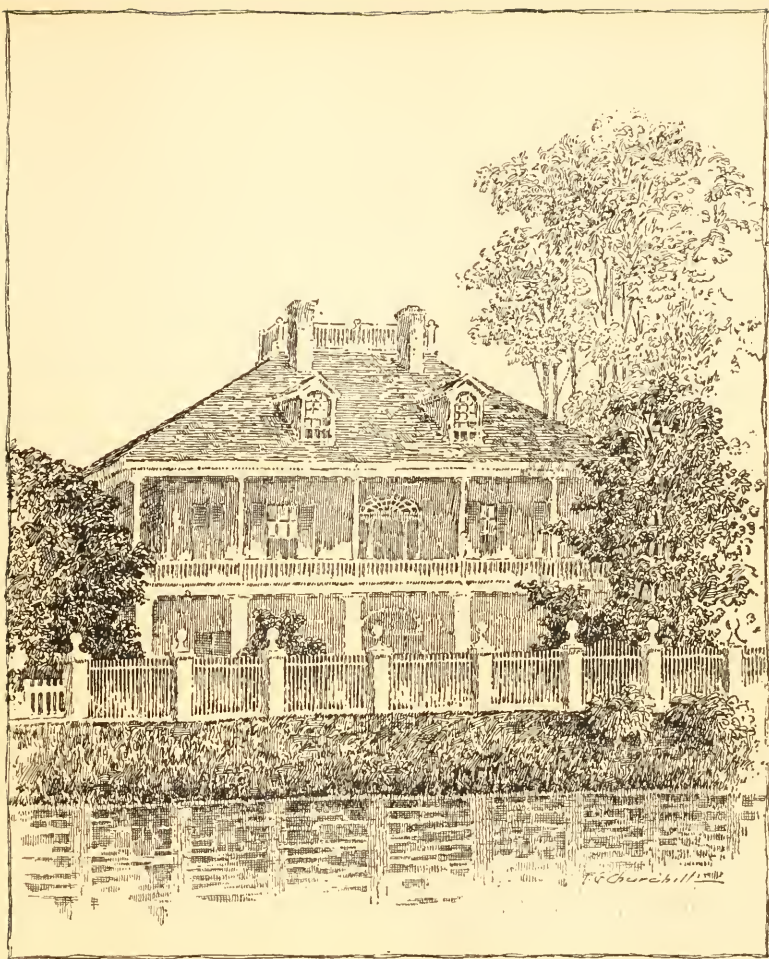


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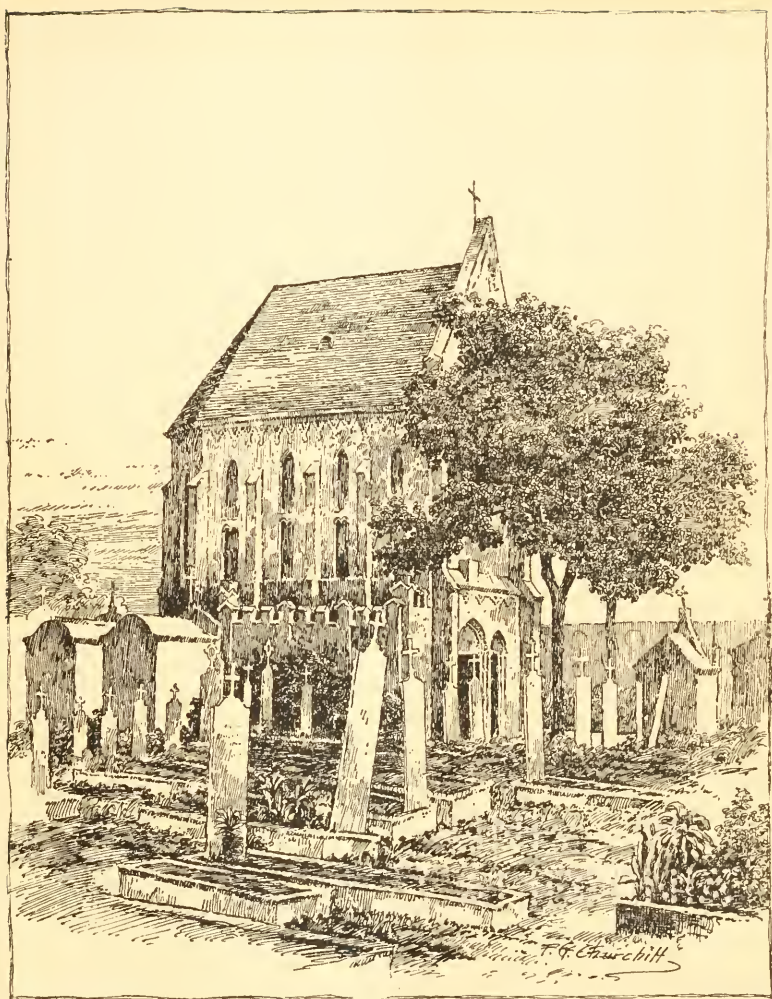
Corner of the yard of the St. Louis Cathedral,

quaint, wide-galleried homes

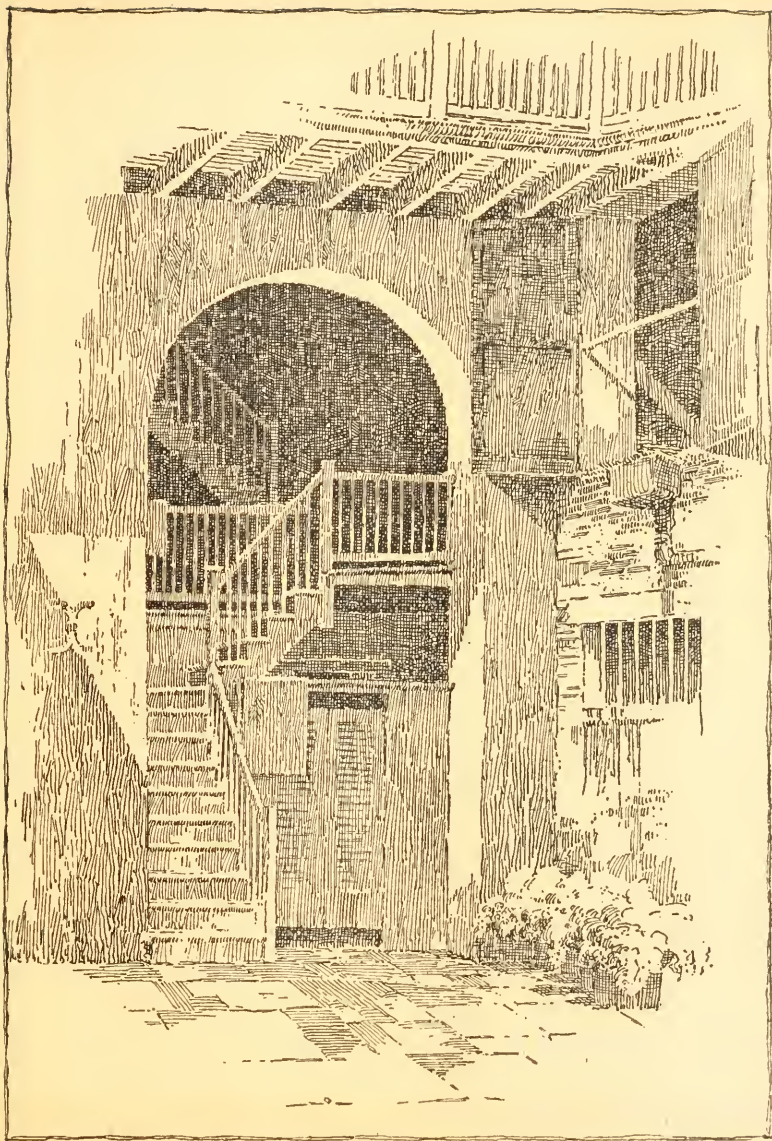

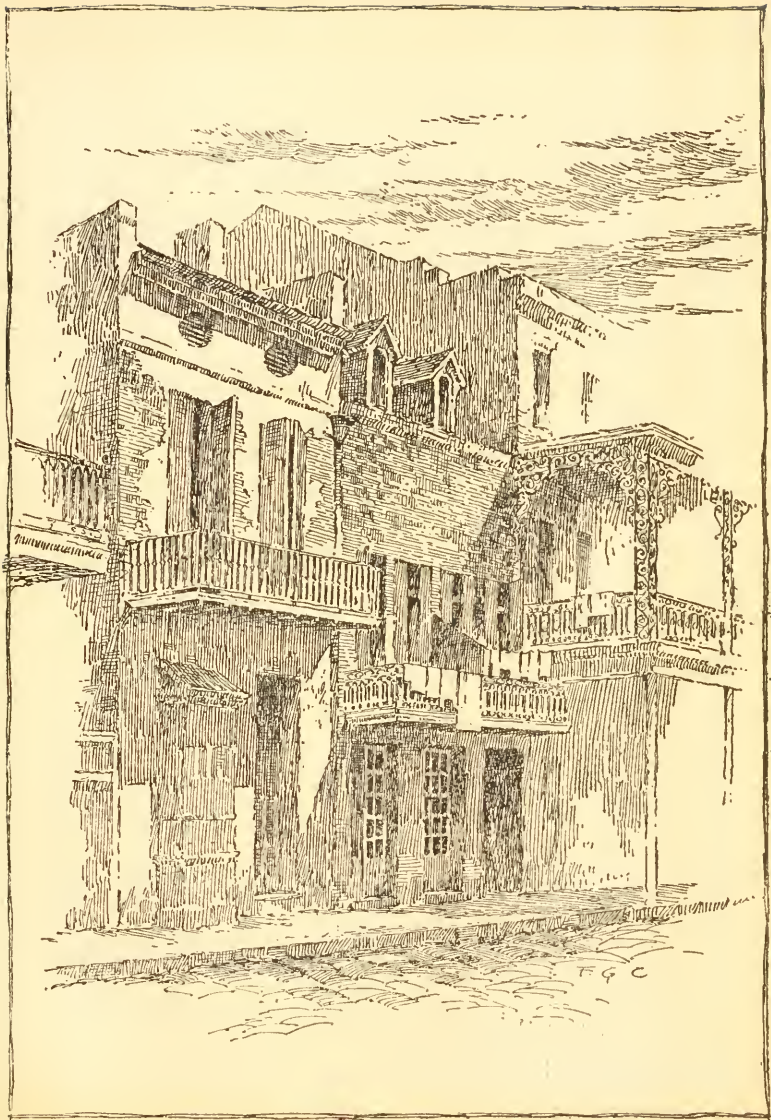

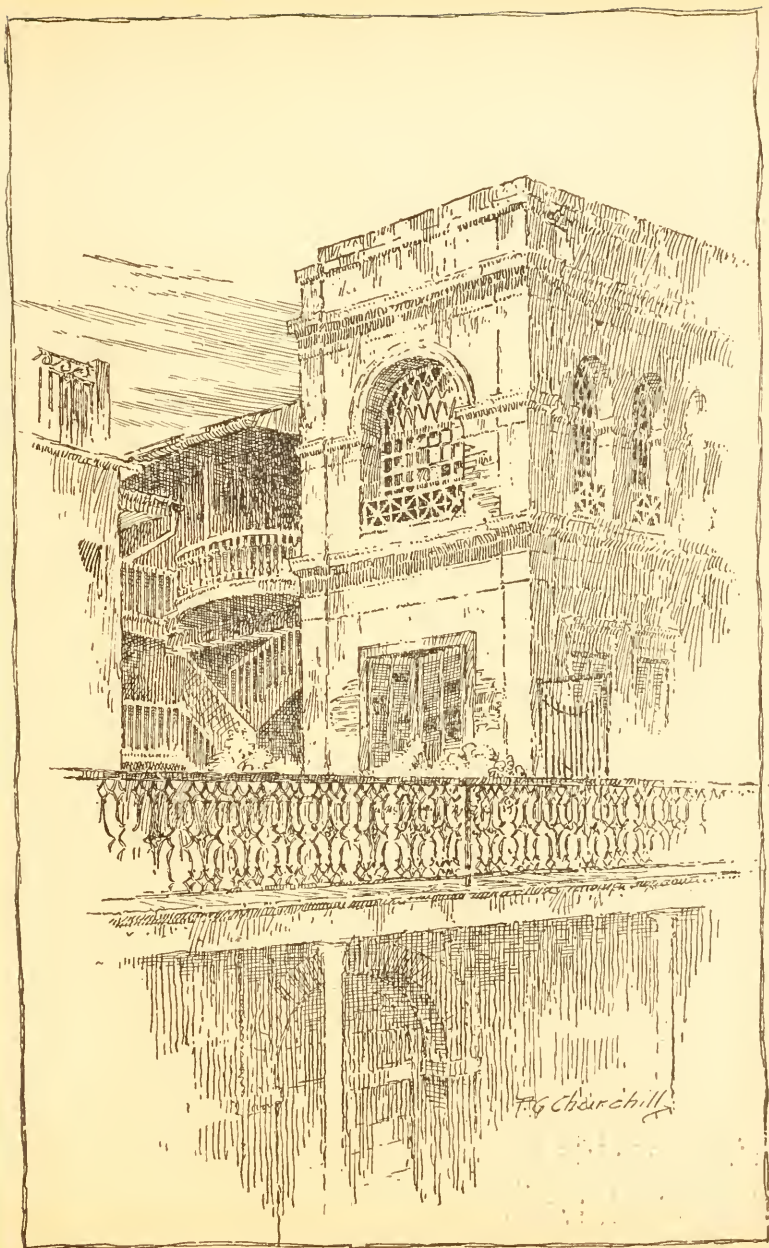
The charming irregularity

Chartres Street



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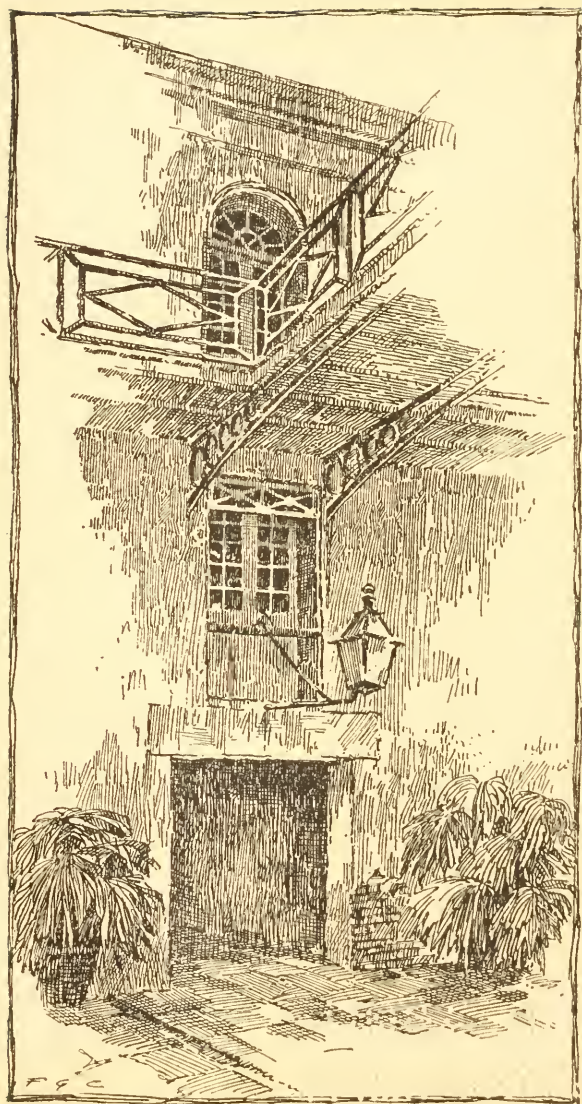
The Haunted House



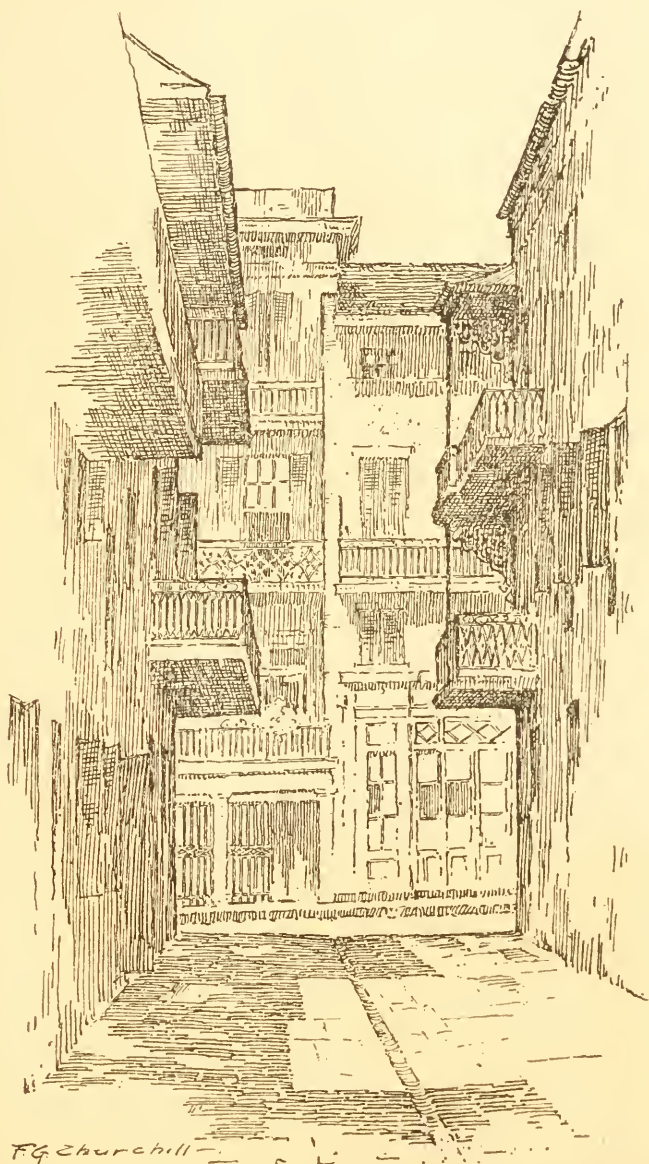
In St. Louis Street, looking towards Chartres, can be seen the house built as a residence for Napoleon by his devoted followers in the old French colony

State Museum

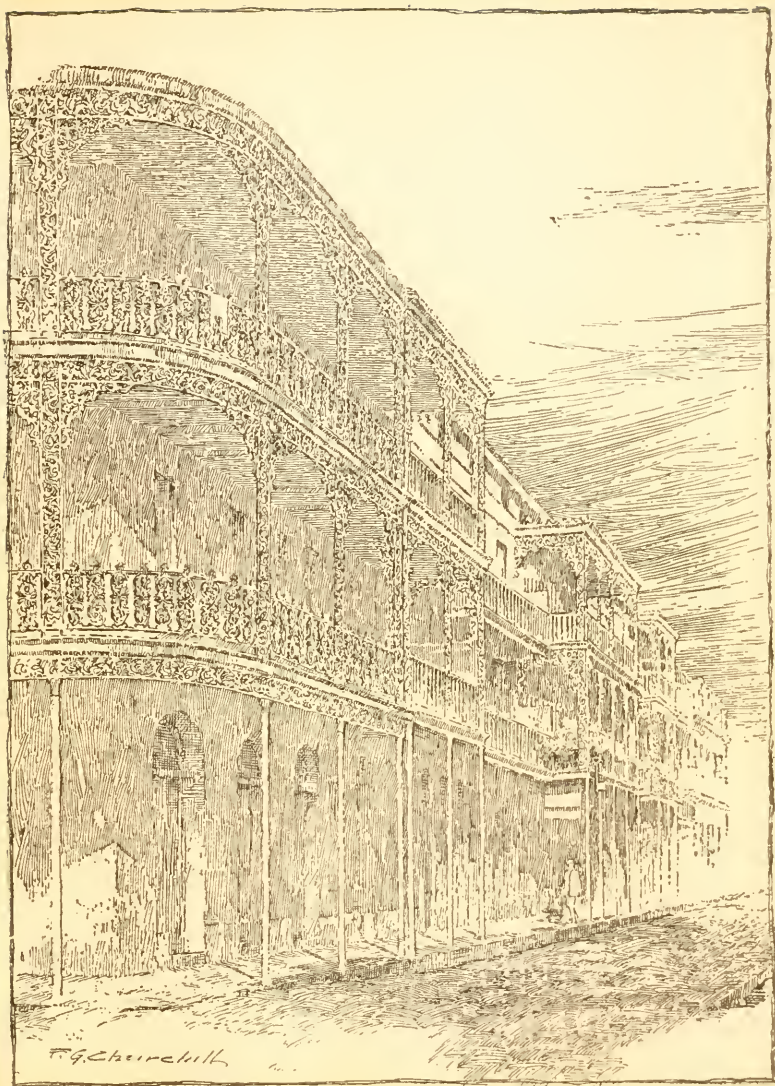


The overhanging balconies of Exchange

Street with St. Anthony's Alley)

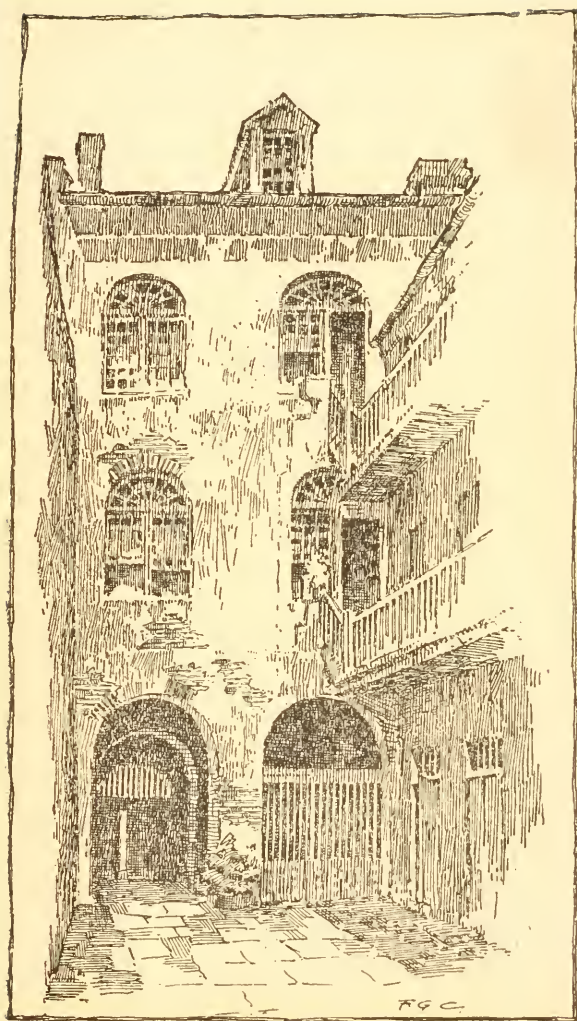

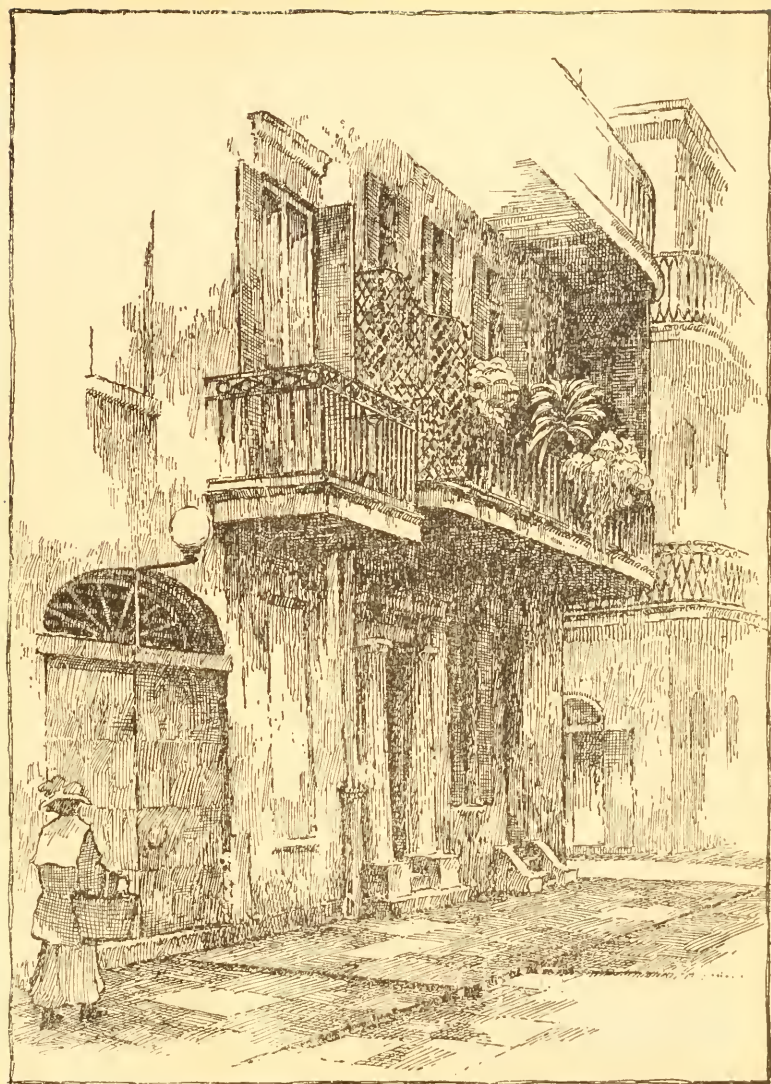
Balustrades of lace-like iron work

and Royal Streets



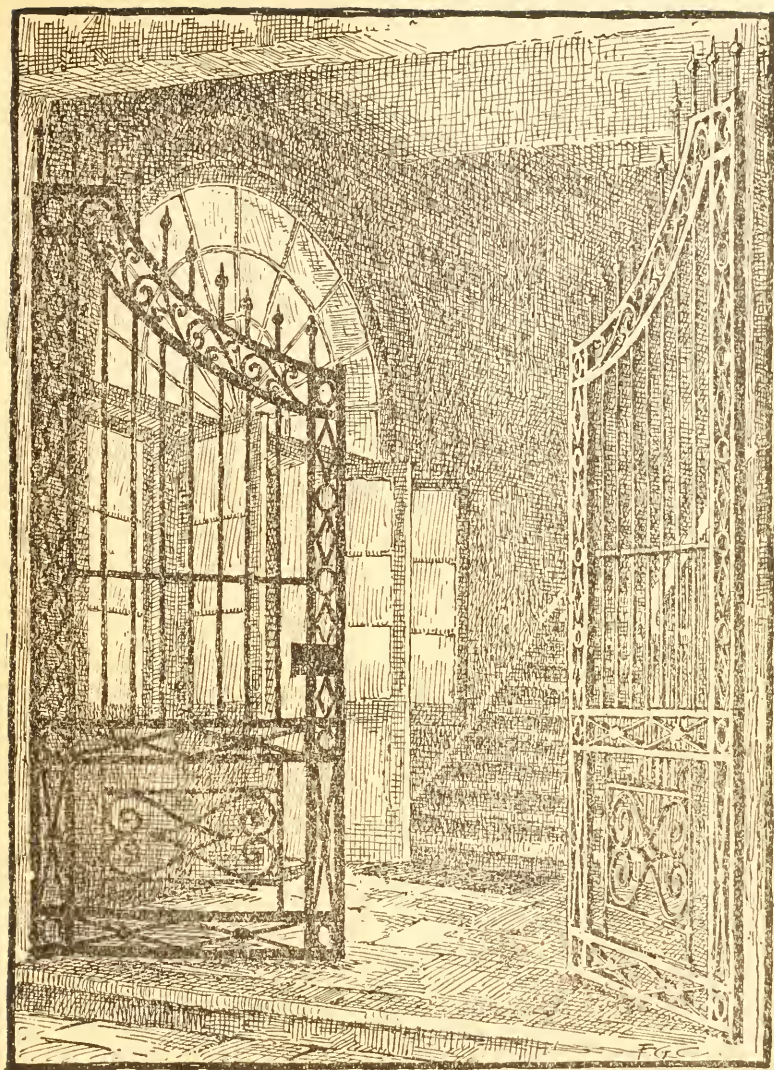
In a Royal Street courtyard looking through
