



Publisher's Note.

THE list of Warren Births, Marriages and Deaths comprised in this volume includes all that were found in the Town Books covering the period from the earliest date there recorded to the end of the year 1849. Some additions have been made from other sources, and these are indicated in each instance by proper reference.

All of the records are condensed in print as much as is consistent with intelligibility, accuracy, and completeness of information. Differences in duplicates, and explanatory or other matter which seemed necessary or desirable, appear in brackets.

Marriages and intentions of marriage are printed under the names of both parties, but the full information concerning each person is given only under his or her name. An asterisk after a marriage indicates that the intention is not found recorded, and in many cases this is accounted for by the fact that neither party belonged in Warren, and consequently publication was made elsewhere.

When places other than Warren and Massachusetts are named in the original records, they are given in the printed copy.

STOICHIOMETRY

The study of the quantitative relationships between the reactants and products in a chemical reaction is known as stoichiometry. It is based on the law of conservation of mass, which states that matter is neither created nor destroyed in a chemical reaction. This means that the total mass of the reactants must be equal to the total mass of the products.

Stoichiometry is used to determine the amount of a substance that will react with a given amount of another substance, or to determine the amount of a substance that will be produced from a given amount of another substance. It is also used to determine the limiting reactant in a chemical reaction, which is the reactant that is completely consumed and thus limits the amount of product that can be formed.



LECTURE 10: THE HARMONIC OSCILLATOR

1. The harmonic oscillator is a fundamental system in quantum mechanics.

2. The potential energy is given by $V(x) = \frac{1}{2}kx^2$.

3. The Hamiltonian operator is $H = \frac{p^2}{2m} + \frac{1}{2}kx^2$.

4. The energy eigenvalues are $E_n = \hbar\omega \left(n + \frac{1}{2}\right)$.

5. The energy eigenfunctions are Hermite polynomials.

6. The ground state energy is $E_0 = \frac{1}{2}\hbar\omega$.

7. The wavefunction for the ground state is $\psi_0(x) = \left(\frac{m\omega}{\pi\hbar}\right)^{1/4} e^{-\frac{m\omega}{2\hbar}x^2}$.

8. The probability density is $|\psi_0(x)|^2 = \left(\frac{m\omega}{\pi\hbar}\right)^{1/2} e^{-\frac{m\omega}{\hbar}x^2}$.

9. The expectation value of position is $\langle x \rangle = 0$.

10. The expectation value of momentum is $\langle p \rangle = 0$.

11. The expectation value of energy is $\langle E \rangle = \frac{1}{2}\hbar\omega$.

12. The uncertainty in position is $\Delta x = \sqrt{\frac{\hbar}{2m\omega}}$.

13. The uncertainty in momentum is $\Delta p = \sqrt{\frac{\hbar m\omega}{2}}$.

ROYAL SOCIETY OF LONDON


