HARPSWELL.

THIS TOWN was incorporated January 20, 1758. The town is bounded on the north by Brunswick, on the east by New Meadows River and on the south and west by Casco Bay. The acreage of the Neck is 4,570 acres, according to measurements made in 1731. It consists of a Peninsula called Harpswell or Merriconeag Neck, which extends southwest from Brunswick. The word in full would be




SURF SCENE, SOUTH HARPSWELL.

Merrucooneag, from Merru (swift quick) and oongan (portage), meaning the quick carrying place. To enumerate the attractions offered the summer visitors here would be an endless task. Harpswell is recognized by all to be one of the favored spots of Casco Bay. Few places offer such fine roads for driving or bicycling, some twenty miles of unsurpassed scenery, which well repay seeing. The advantages offered for yachting, boating and deep sea fishing are equal to any on the Maine coast. Among the historical places of interest may be seen the old Church at Harpswell Center, which was erected about 1758, and is now used as the Town building. North Harpswell offers to view the residence of the late author and story writer, Rev. Elijah Kellogg. Here he resided the greater part of his life. Without doubt no writer of the past century was so dearly loved by the young people as this celebrated author and preacher. The Congragational Church, where he preached for

over fifty years, is another of the many points of interest. The Congregational Church was built 1843. On April 25, 1844, an invitation was extended Rev. Elijah Kellogg to settle as their pastor.

It will be with a feeling of satisfaction for pleasures spent, that the summer visitor to Harpswell will take his leave.

CHURCHES.

The Methodist Church was erected in 1854-5; work upon the building commenced in October, '54. The Church was dedicated May 17, 1855. Rev. W. B. Eldridge is the pastor this year.

The Baptist Church was erected in 1836 and rebuilt in 1890. The officers at present are Deacon, Wm. F. Clark; Clerk, Mrs. A. C. Stover; Treasurer, Mrs. John Toothaker; Trustees, Isaac Clark, Mrs. Louis J. Stover and Daniel R. Stover. Superintendent of Sunday-school, D. R. Stover.

The Union Church was built in 1841, and was dedicated the same year by the Universalist society. It is situated near the Academy, at North Harpswell.

SCHOOLS.

The Harpswell Academy was finished in 1859. The first term commenced Monday, September 5, 1859. The school was kept up for several years, but finally failed for want of adequate support and management. There are at present eight school-houses on the Neck, where a Spring, Fall and Winter term is kept during the year. Frost P. Bailey is the Superintendent of Schools in this town.

MAIL ROUTES.

The first mail was thought to have commenced here in 1810. The first post-office was established in 1842 at West Harpswell, Washington Garcelon, Postmaster. The last Post-office at North Harpswell was kept by Capt. P. C. Merriman; at the Center, John A. Curtis P. M.; West Harpswell, Mrs. Eleanora F. Webber, P. M.; at South Harpswell, E. G. Pinkham, Jr., who is also the Postmaster this year. The Free Rural Delivery Route was established here May, 1, 1898, from Brunswick.

CENTENNIAL HALL.

Centennial Hall was built in the year of 1876 by individuals. The present officers are Herbert C. Merriman, Eli M. Alexander and Wm. Randall, Trustees; H. C. Merriman, Treasurer.



and along the Southern side can be had no finer view of the broad Atlantic as far as the eye can see, and to watch the breakers here is a sight that will always linger in the memory of one who loves nature in all its glory. North end of the island is what is called Water Cove, which makes a fine harbor, and where one can see every day fishing vessels at their anchors On the eastern side of the bank one may visit Giant Steps, a very curious freak of nature, these steps being some forty feet in length, and having the appearance of being built by man. They set back in a recess of perpendicular ledge, and are of iron stone, the ledge being of a soft nature. There is another curious rock formation near at hand, called Thunder Hole, which is a cave in the ledge, where the water rushing in and out makes a noise that sounds like distant thunder, hence the name Thunder Hole. No finer place can be imagined for those who wish an afternoon's rest, surrounded by beautiful trees and the restless sea.

On the Western side is Mackerel Cove, one of the most beautiful harbors on the coast of Maine. This cove, fifteen hundred feet in length, the mouth being very narrow, has a depth of water sufficient to accommodate vessels of heavy tonnage. Here lovers of sea bathing will find all they would desire, and every day during the summer season the beach is spotted with bathers enjoying their delightful pastime.







ORR'S ISLAND

HIRTY YEARS ago when the pioneer steamboats of the Harpswell Steamboat Company made their first trips down towards the eastern part of Casco Bay, landings at Orr's Island were

made by means of dories, there being then no wharf where the present one stands, except possibly one or two so-called tide wharves, at which small vessels could make landings at high tide only. A few years later, when the first steamboat wharf was built, this island was the most eastern landing within the limits of the Bay. This distinction has since been given over to Cundy's Harbor and Small Point to the MacDonald Steamboat Line, Orr's Island being the

terminus of the Harpswell boats. Geographically the island is similar to the other large islands of the bay, being very irregular in coast line, deeply indented with gulfs and coves, with alternating sandy beaches and bold, rocky cliffs. The surface is also uneven, presenting a contrast of heavy pine and fir growth, with open fields and meadows, the forest growth in most places reaching to the extreme edge of the shore. A direct road is had to the mainland by means of the romantic Orr's Island Bridge. to Great Island, and from that island to the mainland by the picturesque Gurnet Bridge.

The road on Orr's Island runs for the most part on a high ridge



from which glimpses of the sea can be seen at intervals. It has an extreme length of about five miles, and a varying width of from oneeighth mile to two miles. Ready communication is had with Portland and the outer world by means of the transportation lines already mentioned and the sail to the city of twenty miles is made in a surprisingly short time on express trips. There are in summer, as is the rule on most of the islands, two mails each way every day, thus giving summer visitors the same privlege in this respect as is enjoyed in most of the free delivery cities.

The stores here are fully equal to those existing in many large cities to-day, and are completely stocked with every line usually

found in a first-class general store.

Orr's Island was first brought to the notice of the outside public through Mrs. Stowe's book, "The Pearl of Orr's Island," and still counts among its patrons some of the earlier visitors of years ago.



GREAT ISLAND

In consequence of the large size of this Island and close connection with Brunswick by the well-known Gurnet Bridge, it seems but natural to suppose it to be a portion of the mainland. Its steep, wild shores, sung of in prose and poetry, are an endless succession of sharp points, cosy coves and sandy shores, from which slope up the green fields and tilled land of the farmers, these fields in turn having for a back ground the dark forests.

Since the establishment of steamboat connection with Portland, parts of this island have been much sought by seekers for recreation on the Maine shores, and al-

though not so well known as some of the other islands, the fact is apparent to the visitor that here is a place that is bound to grow in popularity, the demand for select building locations being even now quite active. The free rural delivery of mail having done away with the necessity of the local offices, there is now only the office at Cundy's Harbor, where is located the centre of population and summer business. It is only a question of a few years when this will be one of the most frequented places in the bay, its charms of scenery alone being sufficient to bring it to the most favored notice of the traveling public. The summer visitor of Casco Bay will do well to consider Cundy's Harbor and Great Island as one of the spots where he can most profitably spend his vacation. Another very attractive and picturesque spot is Gun Point, which can be reached by boat landing from steamers of the MacDonald Line at Card's Cove, and also by carriage from Orr's Island.







In some of the pavilions connected with the leading hotels, dances are held twice a week through the entire summer, while for a



day's amusement, a visitor can make choice of all the active sports which make a vacation at Casco Bay one round of enjoyment. In this connection it may be said, however, that on Long Island is the finest surf-bathing beach in this vicinity. The long rollers and combers from the ocean here break and foam on as fine and hard sand as could be desired. The beach being in the form of a crescent and very evenly graded, surf bathing can be enjoyed at any time of tide. On the north and west shores are clam beaches, where a plentiful supply of these bivalves can be had for the digging.

One of the principal attractions to those who wish for shaded walks and drives, are the fine groves, thick with the balsam-laden pines, which are a feature of this portion of the Maine coast. The roads are excellent; there are several well stocked stores carrying a general supply of everything needful; a post-office, two mails each day in summer, and quick communication with Portland by two steamboat lines.

CLIFF ISLAND.

Cliff Island is perhaps the least known of any of the more important islands of Casco Bay, and hence has even a better opportunity for growth than many of the larger islands whose attractions to the summer set are more widely known. There are reasons why Cliff, or Crotch Island, as it was formerly called, presents to the better class of summer travel a strong claim for patronage. The first and most important point is that it is one of the outside islands, out in the blue deep, where the waters of old ocean are clear as crystal, and the restless changing sea is ever wearing away the serrated rocks which are the foundation of the island. In bold contrast to the scene of surf and granite on its coast, is the magnificent pine and fir growth which now covers about four fifths of the surface.


The island is a part of the city of Portland, although it has no city airs withal There are several boats a day to and from Portland and to the lower islands. The class of cottages here are modern built and of handsome designs, being occupied by some of our best non-residents, and as the steamer lands at the pier in summer, the

scene is one of life and enjoyment.

There are several boarding houses and all enjoy an excellent patronage. The Island is not one of the largest in point of size but fully makes up in its natural beauties for any lack in this respect. From its southern side can be seen the picturesque Jewell's Island, only a half mile distant, and beyond: the open sea.

In point of churches and schools, Cliff Island has both; also an excellent grocery

and general store, post-office with two mails a day in summer, etc., etc.






