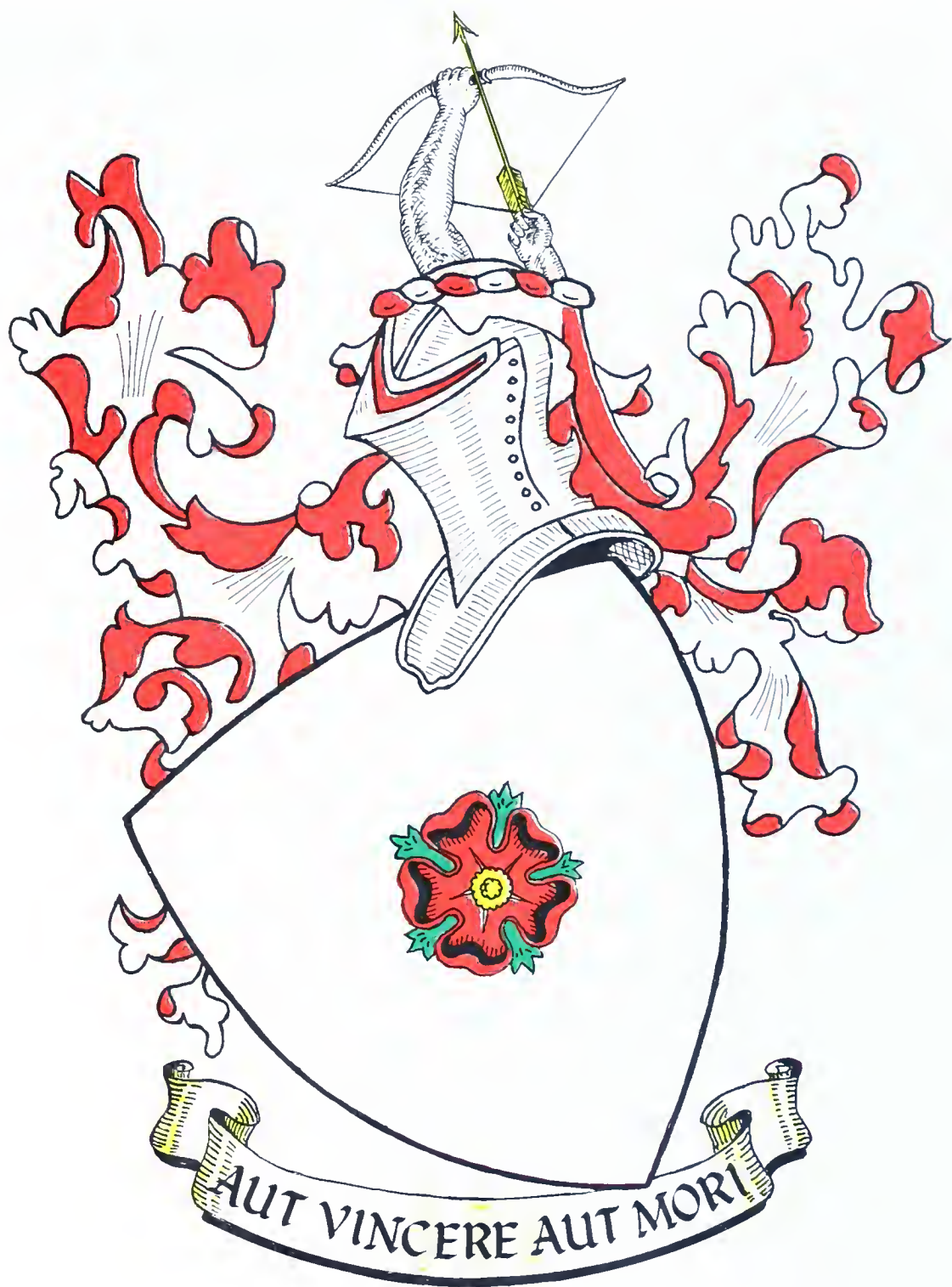

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The arrangement of this genealogy is in two sections. The first part of the book is on the early English and American family of Higginbotham. On the American family I have carried down the lineal descent from the Immigrant Ancestor, John Higginbotham of Virginia, to James Larkin Higginbotham of Noxubee County, Mississippi. Also will be found material on the brothers and sisters of James Larkin Higginbotham.

In the second section will be found a separate chapter on each of the children of James Larkin Higginbotham. Primarily this material is a compilation of facts: names, dates, and places. Most of these family records were collected through correspondence with the families involved.

Reference to source material used will be found following the statement made. All the reference books listed in this manuscript will be found either in the libraries of historical and genealogical societies or in the libraries of all the large American cities.

Source material was consulted such as: federal census records, county and state records such as birth, death, marriage, wills and deeds, military and pension records, land grants, bounty land warrants, the Macon Beacon newspaper, tombstone inscriptions, and family Bibles.

The two numbers with a dash between, appearing in front of a name, stand for the generation from the Immigrant Ancestor and the children in order of their birth; i.e., 5-6 James Larkin Higginbotham, 5th generation from John Higginbotham, the Immigrant Ancestor, and the 6th child of Benjamin Graves Higginbotham. Each generation is indented further in from the left margin of the page.

THE MAGNA CARTA

On June 15, 1215, the barons of England, the yeomen of the countryside and the burghers of the cities formed an army to defy King John and his 60,000 mercenaries who had been ravaging the country.

Organized by Stephen Langton, a Roman Cardinal holding the high office of Archbishop of Canterbury, the army camped in a meadow called Runnymede, close to present day London. Here they met King John to demand of him that he sign a charter we know as the Magna Carta.

This world famous charter was the first major breakthrough in the age old battle for human rights.

Queen Elizabeth II has referred to it as "the cornerstone of our liberties."

John Adams, second president of the United States, cited the Magna Carta in justifying the revolt of the English Colonists against George III.

The rights and freedoms in the Charter were not fully realized for centuries but they laid the foundation that made possible two other Charters, the Petition of Rights in 1628 and the Declaration of Rights in 1688.

The original Magna Carta was altered several times to deal with fast changing conditions, but without loss of the rights and freedoms embodied in the King John version of 1215. The final document was signed in 1225 by Henry III and confirmed by Edward I in 1297.

THE FAMILY OF HIGGINBOTHAM

The Coat of Arms of the English family of Higginbotham is described in heraldic terms as follows:

ARMS "Argent, A rose gules, barbed vert. seeded or."

CREST "A dexter and sinister arm discharging an arrow from a bow, all proper."

MOTTO "Autvincere Aut Mori."

When translated, the Coat of Arms is described as follows:

ARMS A red rose with five green leaves between the petals. Seeds of gold in the center, all on a silver shield.

CREST A right hand and left arm discharging an arrow from a bow all in natural color.

MOTTO By aim and by effort.

(The General Armory of England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales, by Edmund Burke. Fairbanks Book of Crests of the Families of Great Britain and Ireland. Glossary of Terms Used in Heraldry, by Henry Cough and James Parker.)

The surname of Higginbotham is generally believed to be derived from the residence of its first bearers in the neighborhood of Marple and Macclesfield in East Cheshire, England. It is generally agreed that the name was first given to the bottom, or hollow depression in the land, where Higgin or Hickin resided. (A Dictionary of English and Welsh Surnames, by Charles W. Bradsley.)

Some historians, however, maintain that the name is of German origin and a corruption of the name Icken-baum, meaning an Oak tree. (English Magazine, Notes and Queries, 2nd Series, 1856, Volume 1, pages 269 and 417.)

In ancient English and early American records the name appears in the various spellings of Higenbotham, Hickenbotham, Hickinbottom, Hickinbotham, Higginbottom, Higinbotham, Higginbotham,

and innumerable others. Of the ones mentioned, the last is the spelling most often used in America. (A Dictionary of British Surnames, by P. H. Reaney.)

In the American records of John Higginbotham, the progenitor, there appears a double "g" in the spelling of the name. The records of John Higinbotham in Barbados employ a single "g" in the spelling of Higinbotham. Actually there was no standardized spelling in the 18th century. Proper names were subjected to variations in spelling.

In the sixteenth century the name Higginbotham, and variants of the name, was found in several counties of England, especially in Lancashire and Cheshire. Early records of the family include those of Ottywell Higginbotham about 1522; those of Nicholas Heginbotham of Marple, in Cheshire about 1579 and Alice Higginbotham of Marple in 1595. The parish registers of Stockport, Cheshire, England contains 88 references to Higginbothams between the years 1584 and 1620. (William and Mary Quarterly, first series, Volume 26, page 205.)

Among a list of freeholders of Cheshire in 1662 and owners of land in Marple is found the name of Andrew Heginbotham. Then in 1672 the names of Ottiwell Heginbothome, Oliver Heginbotham and Robert Heginbotham are found. (Henry Heginbotham, Stockport: Ancient and Modern, Volume 2, pages 301, 395.)

Members of the Cheshire branch of the Higginbotham family settled at an early date in Barbados, British West Indies. Among the probate acts of the Prerogative Court of Chancery in London, England was found a will of Otwell Higginbotham, dated 17 September 1649, Barbados, being bound in a voyage for England, in which he made bequests to "my father Oliver Higginbotham and Anne my mother," son William Higginbotham; daughter Anne Higginbotham; brothers William, John and Oliver Higginbotham; "to my cosen Captain John Higginbotham in the Barbados," and to cosens John, Joan, Martha, Alice, Sara, Priscilla and Mary, children of Captain John Higginbotham.

Nicholas Higginbotham of Cheshire, England and Captain John Higginbotham of Barbados, are named as executors of the will which was proved in England, 30 January 1651-52. (William and Mary Quarterly, Volume 26, pages 205, 206.)

Captain John Higginbotham, just named in the previous will, is the son of Anthony Higginbotham of Cheshire, England and the grandson of Nicholas Higginbotham, of Cheshire. (Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, page 290.)

Captain John Higginbotham is mentioned in "A List of names of the inhabitants of Barbados in the year 1638, who then possessed more than ten acres of land." (Memoirs of the First Settlement of Barbados, 1743.)

In a list of "Gentlemen of the country," (Barbados) about the year 1666, is found mentioned: "Lieutenant Colonel Higginbottom, Lieutenant Colonel Richard Bayley and Major William Bates, stout men and fitt for Command." (B.P.R.O. Colonial Papers, Volume 20.)

Captain John Higginbotham, Lieutenant Colonel in his will, lived in the Parish of Saint Philip, Island of Barbados, British West Indies. He was a wealthy and influential planter. His will was dated 13 October 1673 and entered for probate in the Barbados, 27 November 1673. (Barbados Wills, Parish of Saint Philip, Volume 9, page 23. The Higginbotham Family, by William M. Sweeny, pages 3 to 8.)

The will of Lieut.-Colonel John Higginbotham, Sr.

In the Name of God Amen I John Higinbotham of the Island of Barbados and parish of St. Philip Senr being but feeble and weak in body but God be praised of Sound and perfect memory do make this my Last Will and Testament revoking all other and former wills whatsoever proceeding This nineteenth day of September one thousand Six hundred Seventy and two as followeth viz.

Imprimiss I bequeath my Soule into the hands of Almighty God my maker and Redeemer And my body to the earth from whence it came to be decently interred by my wife and children and what estate God hath lent me reall and personall I dispose there of as followeth.

Imprimiss I Give and bequeath unto my Son Capt. John Higinbotham Two thousand pounds of Muscavada Sugar as an addition to such portion I have already given unto him and his heirs forever as stated and Settled him in being about Seventy acres of land in and about the and out parks where of he is already possessed but my Debts being greate and my wife be left to pay same and all Legacys by this my Will bequeathed after my decease I cannot give my said son any more Lands but if his mother my wife Survive to pay all my just debts and Legacies and portions to all the rest of our children and he be dutiful and obedient son unto her she may according to her ability add if she please unto his portion hereby

given him it being in that particular left by me to will and pleasure I also acquitt him and his heirs of all account whatsoever proceedings the day in which I sold unto him and left Samuel Turney the Work and about sixty acres of land therewith either for his Voyage unto Jamaica and New England and charge thereof or any other thing he doing the like unto my executrix and her heirs and assigns and I also give him sixty feet Square of my Land on Carlisle Bay between Mrs. Griffins house and the sea side to him and his heirs for ever.

Item: I give unto Charles Higinbotham my Grandson One thousand pounds of Sugar and to his two sisters namely Jane and Millicent five hundred pounds of Sugar each with said three Sums are to be paid them respectively at the age of fifteen years if they Survive till that age to receive the Same.

Item: I give unto my daughter Joane Waitte two thousand pounds of Sugar to be paid unto her within fourteen months after my decease and to her four children namely Thomas Gibbs, John Gibbs, Higinbotham Gibbs and Jane Gibbs one thousand pounds of Sugar each to be paid them at their Age respectively of Twenty and one years the two sons but the two daughters at the age of fifteen years of age if they live severally to receive the same And I do quit claime unto my said daughter Jane Waite and her heirs of all the plantation whereon she now lives being fifty and odd acres which was near before this alienated to her deceased husband and Thos. Gibbs now herself she giving equall portions unto her fore-named four children or the Survivors of them when they come to twenty and one years respectively only I desire that Thomas Gibbs her eldest son may have to his portion the sume of four thousand pounds of Sugar more than any of her three younger children aforesaid.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Knightly Three thousand pounds of Sugar to be paid her two years after my decease and I give unto her three children namely Shedon Knightly, John Knightly and Martha Knightly all that my plantation in the Thicketts where on their mother and they now live Containing about Twenty and five acres together with all the houseing thereon built with all other profits & advantages thereunto belonging or any way appertaining to be equally divided between them three children or the Survivor of them when the eldest Son namely Shedon Knightly attains to the age of twenty and one years and I also give all the negroes that are at present on the said plantation namely Sampon and his wife Mingo, Wenbar and his child and Pesor unto my said three Grandchildren to be equally divided in the Same manner and at the same time that the

said plantation & appertenances are to be divided amongst them--But it is my will that my said daughter Martha Knightly shall have the sole management and improvement of my said estate namely the plantation and negroes in the meantime for her and her said childrens Livelyhood and maintenance and not other wise or Six thousand pounds of Suger a piece at the discretion of my executors.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter May Townsend wife of Lieut. Richard Townsend the Sume of two thousand pounds of Sugar to be paid unto her two years next after my decease if she live so long to receive the same and to her said husband five hundred pounds of Sugar to be paid to him fifteen months next after my decease and I also give unto my three [grand]children namely Thomas Townsend, Alice Townsend and Jno Townsend five hundred pounds of Sugar each to be paid them respectively at their ages of fifteen years if they live to those ages to receive the same and I also give to the child where with my said Daughter Mary Townsend now goeth the sum of five hundred pounds of Sugar if it live to twelve years of age to receive the same whether it please God it be a son or daughter.

Item: I give unto Nicholas Buckerfield late husband of my deceased God daughter Alice the sum of two hundred pounds of Sugar And I give to his two sons my Grandchildren namely Nicholas and Higinbotham Buckerfield one thousand pounds of Sugar each to be paid them at twelve years of age respectively if they live to the said age Severally to receive the same.

Item: I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Higinbotham and her heirs forever fourteen acres of my land next adjoining unto Mr. Francis Detheckshire and from Exors long gulley Square over to Dr. Thomas Parkins live with this proviso only that all such crops of Vingar cane corn or any provisions that shall be growing or being thereon at the time of my decease. My wife her mother shall have and enjoy the full half part of all crop or crops for one Cropp and Sarah the other also I give her one negro woman called New Judy and one negro wench Ocain and one girl called Black Jane unto her that I formerly gave her one good twined bedsted of Fully tree and Cedar Tester and the sum of four thousand pounds of Muscavado Sugar to be paid unto her by one thousand pounds thereof yearly during the said four years provided my said daughter survive after my decease to be posset in and of the said land, negroes and the rest bequeath her hereby also it is my will that my said daughter Sarah shall have decent

maintenance of clothing diett and Lodging out of my whole estate for the space of one year next after my decease being obedient and dutefull unto her Mother.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Pricilla Long the sum of three thousand pounds of Sugar to be paid unto her by one thousand there of yearly and I give unto her two daughters (viz) Merandila Clenen and Millicent Clenen four hundred pounds of Sugar each when they come respectively to the age of eighteen years.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Jane Beleffe The sum of one thousand pounds of sugar to be paid her when she comes to the age of Twenty and one years if she lives to that age to receive the same And it is my will that she shall have her maintenance and breeding in the meantime or till the day of her marriage if it shall happen before the said time and not be charged for the same or what charge is already past or charged for if my wife her Grandmother my executrix find her dutiful and obedient unto her and deserving thereof or otherwise if her Grandmother see fitt she may charge her therewith But it is my full desire that the said Jane Shall have all her stock of Cattle and Sheep with the increase thereof and be paid by my executrix all such goods of hers that be in my hands or what is fully due and owing her from any other person the particulars thereof are mentioned in and account Kept for her and will appear in my writings I say she is not to be charged for maintenance as afore-said except my executrix please.

Item: I give unto my brother Lt. Thomas Higinbotham Two thousand pounds of Sugar to be paid to him two years next after my decease And to my Sister his wife hundred of like sugar to be paid her at the same time and to Margaret Jones the like sum of five hundred pounds of Sugar to be paid her one year after my decease And I give my brother Thomas Higinbotham his two children namely Nicholas and Elizabeth each five hundred pounds of Sugar to be paid them at the age of Twenty years respectively if they Severally live to receive the Same.

Item: I give unto my nephew Samuel Finny and my nephew Joseph Higinbotham five hundred pounds of Sugar each and to Coz Finneys wife my Coz Mary Finney five hundred pounds of Sugar and to their Son Jeffrey my Grandson five hundred pounds of Sugar to be paid him at the age of Sixteen years.

Item: I give unto my daughter Sarah Higinbotham

the house and land rented to Mrs. Griffin at the bay for which she pays fifty shillings by the year according to lease I say I give it to my said Daughter Sarah and her heires forever.

Item: I give my Daughter Priscilla Long my Tenement at the Carlisle Bay where in one Mr. William Hampton lives and hath lease there of for a terme and payes fifty shillings a year rent I say to her my said daughter Pricilla and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item: I give to my son Capt. John Higinbotham my Tenement on Carlisle Bay now rented to Mr. Robert Gibson for a term as please And this I give him in lieu of fifty feet Square formerly mentioned in this my will and the said Sixty feet square formerly mentioned for my son Capt. Jno. Higinbotham I do give and bequeath unto my two Daughters namely Joane Waite and Martha Knightly to them and their heires forever to be equally divided between them.

Item: I freely give and bequeath unto my truly loving Wife Alice Higinbotham and her heires forever all the rest of my whole estate reall and personall whatsoever of right doth belong unto me in this world whether lands not herein bequeathed to others or negroes, chattels, woods and she paying all my just debts and Legacies and I do by this my last will and testament appoint Constitute and leave her sole executrix of this my last will and Testament and desire Almighty God to assist her in the true equally just and proceedings there in and if providence so order and dispose that she marry with any other person after my decease I desire her to be very lawfull before the doing thereof onici I have freely settled my estate reall and Personall or such person thereof as is before mentioned. That she make over firmly by good advice unto her children or such of them as she shall think fitt and best deserve the same or have most need thereof some considerable parts thereof accordingly as her motherly and tender Love and care hath ever been over and unto them in their tender years And so I doubt not of her future and further manifestation in the particular.

A. Codicill or addition and Continued essentiall part of my foregoing will and Testament That if my wife sole executrix of my will should be prevented by Suddaine death or any other ways should to settle the estate reall and personall by a firme will under hands and Seales. Then and in that case I declare and publish That it is my desire that the ordinary for the time being will appoint some persons of trust to make an equall partition of

all the Lands houses and all other estate whatsoever the death possest of between my son John Higinbotham and my five daughters namely Jeane Waite, Martha Knightly, Mary Townsend, Sarah Higinbotham & Pricilla Long to them respectively and their heires forever. They paying the debts and Legacies at that time owing personall amongst them so that I do forbid and declare that whether my Son John Higinbotham nor any of my said daughters do or shall on any pretense whatsoever inter as heir upon the Said estate may although the Law (if the proviso were not) would all it. Witness my hand and seale the twenty first day of February one thousand Six hundred and Seventy two.

This 13th day of October 1673 Doctor Thomas Parkins, David Evans and Thomas Wormbaton appeared before me and made oath on the Holy Evangelists that they did see Lt Coll John Higinbotham Seale and publish the above writing contayned in three sheets of paper to be his last will and Testament together with the Codecill hereunto annexed and that he was at his so doing of sound and disposing mind and memory. Entered the 27th day of November 1673.

Captain John Higinbotham, son of Lieutenant Colonel John Higinbotham, whose will you just read, was a Captain in the Barbados. For business reasons he returned to England where he was engaged in trade with Jamaica and New England.

In February 1683, Charles Codrington leased to him two plantations in the Parish of Saint John, Barbados, called Didmartons and Consetts, together 750 acres, at the annual rent of 2,200 pounds sterling. (Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, pages 291-295.)

Captain John Higinbotham was the testator of the following

will, dated 4 September 1713 and proved 23 October 1714 in Salford, Lancaster, England. (Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, pages 291-295.)

Last Will of Capt. John Higinbotham, of Salford, Lancaster, Merchant. Proved 23rd October 1714; Henricus Bancroft, Carolus Alexander, Jacobus Taylor, Gulielmus Oates, Executors; Testimoni morati fidem ficit de cu mon Juris format con me. Tho: Wainwright.

In the name of God Amen. I, John Higinbotham of Salford in the County of Lancaster, Merchant, being weak and infirm but through mercy of good and perfect memory do make, publish and declare my Last Will and Testament in manner following:

And First--I will that the charges of my Burial and my just debts (if any shall be owing by me at time of my death) shall be duly paid out of my Estate leaving the expenses of my Burial the discretion of my Executors herein after named with this advice only that the same be decent but not extravagant.

Item--I give unto my beloved wife Anne Higinbotham, One Thousand Pounds, one standing bed, one feather bed, one bolster, two pillows, two pair of sheets, one pair Blankets, one Vuggon quilt, with hangings and all other usual furniture for beds all to be taken out of my goods as her own then also I give and bequeath unto my said wife 6 bowere bound with blue and usually standing in the chamber where I lodge. One looking glasse, one small table likewise I give unto her one wooden chest used for putting cloaths, four pewter dishes, one dozen pewter plates, Two table cloths, one dozen napkins, one half dozen towells and to be used by my wife as afore-said. And I Will that all the said goods shall be delivered to my said wife upon her first demand there-after my decease and further give and bequeath and appoint unto my said wife the sum of Twenty Pounds to be paid in the manner following: That is to say I Will that mine Executors or some of them shall pay my said wife within 20 days after my decease the sum of six pounds then and thence forwards continue so long as she shall live and the Allowance for my said wife in manner aforesaid. I will appoint and declare in full satisfaction of Power and all claymes whatsoever which she would or might have in my Estate or any part Thereof upon and pretense whatever.

Item--I give and bequeath unto my son, Charles Higinbotham of and in the Barbados the sum of Twenty Pounds and during his lifetime to be paid by two Small portions in said year according as by my letters I have

heretofore given him to order to draw Bills. And I will that such his Bills as may or shall come after my death be duly paid by mine Executors same not regarding Twenty Pounds Sterling in said year aforesaid but if Son Charles Higinbotham shall desire and choose to have and retain Two Hundred Pounds in one entire payment rather than these yearly payments sums of Twenty Pounds after my decease and accept of Two Hundred Pounds in lieu or instead thereof then for his satisfaction through and also for easing mine Executors from the trouble of returning the yearly payments I give and bequeath unto him my sd. son Charles Higinbotham the sum of Two Hundred Pounds. And I will order that mine Executors some short time after my death notify and advise sd. Son Charles Higinbotham that he may draw Bills of Exchange upon them being accepted and paid shall fully absolve thereof discharge to mine Executors of and from this said annuity or yearly payment (which I intend only to continue until my son accept the said Two Hundred Pounds) and also for said Two Hundred Pounds. And I give unto my sd. Son Charles Higinbotham no more than the said annuity and said Two Hundred Pounds in lieu and instead thereof having heretofore given to and paid for him largeley. But I give and bequeath unto my seven Grandsons and one Granddaughter, children of my sd. Son Charles Higinbotham namely, John, Charles, Thomas, William, Joseph, Benjamin, Clever and Millicent each of them to receive One Hundred Pounds Sterling to be paid them respectively as they shall attain the age of one and twenty years. And I do further Will Order and Appoint that the interest and improvement of the said sums of money given to my Grandchildren so soon any can be made thereof shall be employed for and towards the Maintenance and Education of my said Grandchildren until they or such of them as shall live to the aforesaid age in such a case I Appoint what is given to such of them as shall be underage aforesaid or younger child or children as my sd. Son Charles Higinbotham hath or hereafter may have and for want to such to goe and be equally divided unto and amongst the survivors to and of those above named: John, Charles, Thomas, William, Joseph, Benjamin, Clever, Millicent. And whereas the distance is great betwixt the said Islands of Barbados and this place and some of my Grandchildren very young and the Interest of money there being almost double to what it is here and it being reasonable to think mine Executors may desire to be quit of this troublesome conversion will allow from which consideration I take to be fit accordingly do hereby Will and Appoint that this Eight Hundred Pounds Sterling herein I give as aforesaid to my said Grandchildren

shall be paid by mine Executors within the space of one year right after my decease unto their hands or Order of my said Son Charles Higinbotham or if he be dead then to the order of his Executor or some other person or persons as shall have the Guardianship or Management of my said Grandchildren to be Improved, Employed, dispose and paid to and for their several ages in manner aforesaid. And that I request that mine Executor will not fail giving notice by the first opportunity after my decease to my sd. Son Charles Higinbotham if living or if dead to his Executor or such person or persons interested with or for my said Grandchildren of this my Gift. And hereby will to them and give leave and advice to draw Bills for the said Eight Hundred Pounds upon the said Executors with caution of allowing sufficient time because most of the sum will be in from such persons as are indebted to me which cannot always be done on a suddain. And I will that such Bill or Bills as charged by such person or persons as aforesaid shall at all time be a full Acquittance, Release and Discharge to my said Executors and under Specific duty of their respective Executor and Administration against all and every claim Demands and of my said Grandchildren or any of them or other person or persons for or on their behalf of them or every one of them.

Item--I give and appoint unto my daughter, Millicent Alexander, Widdow, the use of Four Hundred Pounds to be mine Executor kept continued at Interest and the said Interest to be paid and delivered in to her hands and to so continue as long as my daughter shall live solo and not remarry. And I give and appoint the said Four Hundred Pounds at the decease of my daughter Millicent Alexander or her marriage again whether shall first happen unto or equally her four young children, Charles, Joseph, Millicent, Mary Alexander at their respective ages of one and twenty. And I Will, Give and Appoint that the interest of the said Four Hundred Pounds after the marriage or decease of my said daughter Millicent shall be divided between Charles and Joseph and Mary and Millicent Alexander my Grandchildren. And if any of them shall depart this life before he or she attains full age of one and twenty years then the part of him or her or them so dying shall go to be divided equally amongst the survivors, share and share alike.

Item--I give and appoint this Interest of Four Hundred Pounds unto the sole use of my daughter Beulah Higinbotham for and during the term of her natural life and Will and Order mine Executors to pay the same unto my daughter Beulah Higinbotham. And I

 declare it is my mind and will that my Son-in-law Henry Higinbotham shall not have or employ the said Interest of the said Four Hundred Pounds unless it is for the sole and separate use of my said daughter Beulah Higinbotham and that no part allowed in any wise my son-in-law Henry Higinbotham to grant or assign or any other disposal but shall govern or be paid into and for the sole and separate use of my said daughter Beulah Higinbotham. And if my daughter Beulah Higinbotham shall leave no children I Will and Appoint the last mentioned Four Hundred Pounds to be divided amongst the children of my daughter Elizabeth Bancroft or so many of them as shall be living.

Item--I Will, Give and Appoint unto my daughter, Elizabeth Bancroft the Interest of Four Hundred Pounds Sterling so long as my said daughter Elizabeth Bancroft shall live and after her decease I Will that the said Four Hundred Pounds shall go and be equally divided unto and amongst her sons and daughters namely: Benjamin, Thomas, Mary, Elizabeth, Ann Bancroft share and share alike and if any dye before attaining one and twenty years. And if they all die without leaving heirs for want of such amongst my last named Grandchildren I Give and bequeath unto Charles and Joseph Alexander and to my granddaughters Millicent and Mary Alexander four of the children of my daughter Millicent and to such of them four Two Hundred Pounds to be paid severally as they attain the age of one and twenty years and in the meantime the yearly Interest and Improvement of the said money to go for their Maintenance and Education as their Mother and mine Executors shall think fit.

Item--I Give, Will and bequeath my grandsons Benjamin and Thomas Bancroft, my granddaughters Mary, Elizabeth and Ann children of my before mentioned daughter Two Hundred Pounds Sterling each to be paid to them respectively as they reach the age of one and twenty years. In the meantime the yearly Interest and Improvement thereof I will and Appoint to go for their Maintenance and Education in such a manner aforesaid and Mother and either Executor shall decide and shall be their keep until their respective legacies do fall or become due and are actually paid.

I Will and bequeath Executors Twenty Pounds Sterling each and all the remainder of the Estate Whatsoever besides and what shall be over and above when before and through my Will or Otherwise be over what mentioned before through and in my Will I Order and Appoint to be equally divided amongst my Grandchildren the sons and said daughters of my daughter

Millicent Alexander, Beulah Higinbotham and Elizabeth Bancroft which shall be living at the time of my decease and shall share and share alike provided Always Annuities to my said wife and my son Charles Higinbotham respectively and all the legacies to my Grandchildren, sons and daughters of my son Charles Higinbotham namely: John, Charles, Thomas, William, Joseph, Benjamin, Clever, Millicent.--Also leaving to my son Charles Higinbotham the liberty of choosing the Two Hundred Pounds Sterling instead of the Annuity payable to him gift during life shall not be deemed a part of any relation whatever except only wife, son Charles and his children and my said daughter Beulah Higinbotham.--And lastly I appoint and ordain my son-in-law Henry Bancroft, my Grandson Charles Alexander, Thomas Taylor of Manchester Hinds and William Oates of Thorn and John Chapman Executors of My Will, trusting their Administration and Exectorship accordingly to this my last Will, September Fourth day in the Twelfth year of Our Gracious Lady Ann, by the Grace of God, Queen of England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland. [1713] (9. B.)

John Higinbotham (Seal--Tudor Rose)

Sealed and signed by the within named John Higinbotham Testator for and as his last Will being written on three sheets of paper (4th September 1713). Witnessed by John Chapman and Hugh Parr.

Charles Higinbotham, the son of Captain John Higinbotham, of Barbados and Salfor, Lancaster, England, was named in his father's will, which you just read.

This Charles Higinbotham lived in Barbados and his will, dated 17 August 1732, proved in Barbados 20 May 1734; names wife Ann, sons Cleaver Higinbotham and John Higinbotham; granddaughters Ann Reddin, Hopizbah Higinbotham and Ann Higinbotham. (Barbados Wills, Volume 24, page 92. Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, page 290.)

Mrs. Ann Higinbotham, the widow of Charles Higinbotham, in her will, dated 29 March 1740, proved in the Barbados, 28 August 1740, names her sons John, Charles, Thomas, Joseph and Clever Higinbotham; grandson John Reddin; granddaughter Ann Reddin. (Barbados Wills, Volume 32, page 285. Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, page 290.)

John Higginbotham, son of Charles and Ann Higginbotham, of the Barbados, whose wills have just been referred to, was also named as a legatee in the will of his grandfather, Captain John Higginbotham.

There is found in the Boston Massachusetts Registry Department, Report 29, page 238, this record:

July 11 "Vessels Entered in the month of July 1716
Benjamin Evans ye sloop Betty from Barbados
John Higinbotham a Planter."

Thus it is that we find John Higinbotham, evidently at the time he received the legacy directed by the will of his grandfather, leaving the Barbados and arriving in Boston. It is believed he stayed some years in Maryland and then went to Virginia where he died between the years 1741 and 1744, leaving a widow Frances and six sons and a daughter. (Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, page 291.)

The identification of John Higginbotham, of Virginia, who died between 1741 and 1744, with John Higginbotham, the son of Charles and Ann Higginbotham, of the Barbados, and grandson of Captain John Higginbotham, of the Barbados and Salford, Lancaster, England is strengthened by the following fact.

In an old trunk of papers belonging to Colonel James Higginbotham, of Amherst County, Virginia, son of John and Frances (Riley) Higginbotham, was found a book entitled "Action Upon the Case for Slander," by W. Sheppard Esquire, London 1662. On the fly leaf of this book appears part of the signature of a Nicholas Higginbotham. This has been identified as seventeenth century handwriting. On another page of this same book appears the entry "Joseph Higginbotham died April 17th 1742." This Joseph Higginbotham seems most probably to have been Joseph, son of Charles Higginbotham, of Barbados, and younger brother of John Higginbotham of the Barbados, Boston, Massachusetts, and at last of Virginia. (Magazine of History and Biography, Volume 52, page 291.)

In the office of the Land Register at Richmond, Virginia, are recorded patents to Higginbothams for about 20,000 acres of land in Albemarle and Amherst Counties between the years 1749 and 1800.

We find from the records of Albemarle County that Moses Higginbotham, who was apparently the eldest son of John Higginbotham, under dates of April 23 and 24, 1745, purchased from George Braxton, Jr. of King and Queen County, two parcels of land consisting of 1,000 and 1,430 acres respectively. This land was located on the Buffalo River.

Then between April 30 and May 11, 1751, Moses conveyed 2,024 acres of this property to his brothers and to William Morrison, who had married his sister, Rachel Higginbotham.

All parties to the transaction, except George Braxton, Jr., were of Albemarle County. The consideration named was the nominal sum of five shillings, "current money of Virginia," for each parcel of land, as follows:

To Aaron Higginbotham	204 acres
To Benjamin Higginbotham	204 acres
To John Higginbotham	200 and 204 acres
To Joseph Higginbotham	200 and 204 acres
To James Higginbotham	200 and 204 acres
To William Morrison	200 and 204 acres

It is believed that this was a division of the estate left by John Higginbotham, deceased, to be divided between his children after the death of their mother.

According to the census returns and tax lists the following heads of families of the name were living in Amherst County, Virginia towards the close of the eighteenth century:

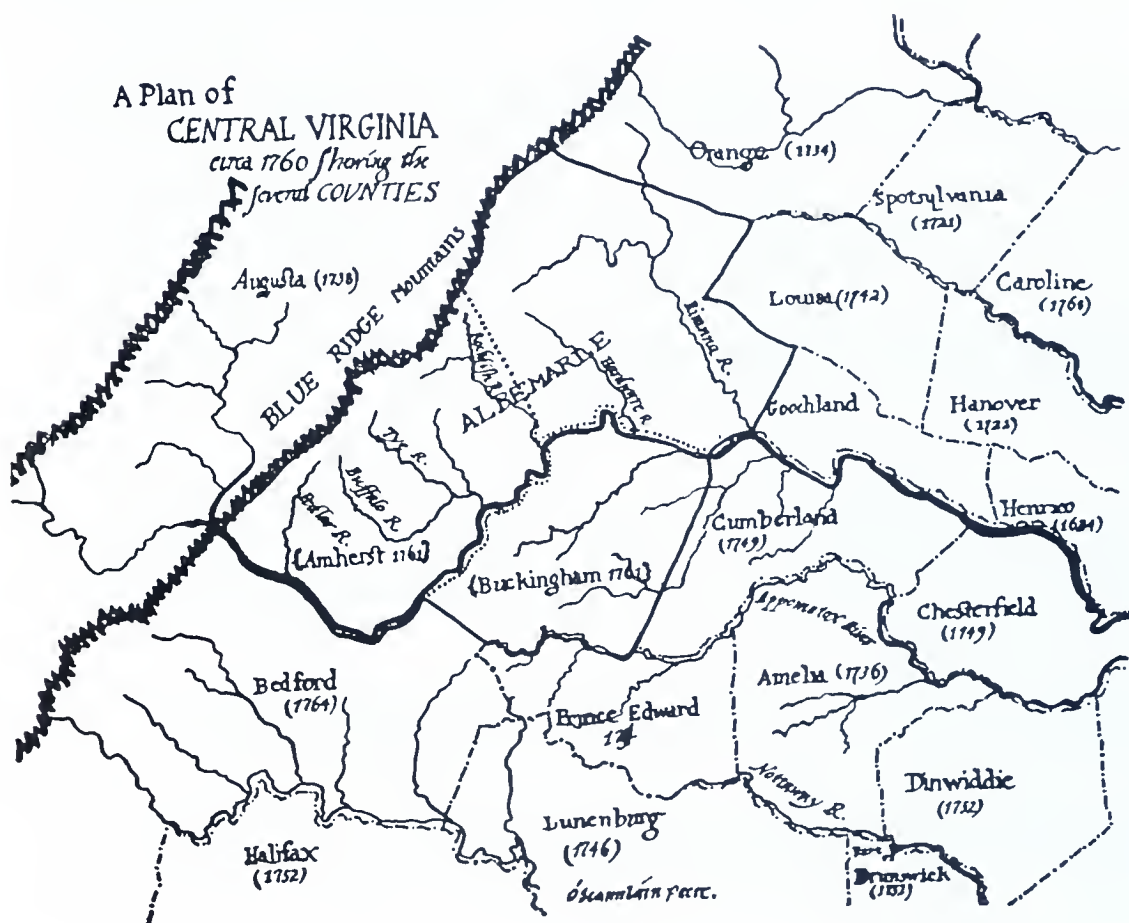

* These Higginbothams migrated to Elbert County, Georgia. (William and Mary Quarterly, Volume 26, 1917-1918, pages 208-210.)

The members of the Higginbotham family occupied a prominent position and took an active part in political and religious matters--serving on juries, acting as surveyors and filling those places that intelligent and respected citizens usually are called upon to fill in the place where they have made their home.

They were very patriotic and loyal as shown by the numbers who have fought in the wars.

They were hardy pioneers who faced and overcame the dangers and hardships inherent to carving out new frontiers. In the great migrations which surged westward after the Revolutionary War, they were in the vanguard.



JOHN HIGGINBOTHAM, IMMIGRANT ANCESTOR

John¹ Higginbotham (Charles, Captain John, Lieutenant Colonel John, Anthony, Nicholas) was the Immigrant Ancestor and the son of Charles and Ann Higginbotham. He was born 10 June 1695 in the Parish of Saint Philip, Barbados, British West Indies and baptised 31 July 1695 at the Saint Philip Parish Church. (Volume 22, page 62, Saint Philip Parish records.) It is generally believed that he died in Virginia between the years 1741 and 1744.

The marriage date of John Higginbotham to Frances Riley is not known. He could have married while visiting relations in Maryland and lived there for a while before moving to Virginia. There was a John Ryley living in Brittaines Bay, Saint Mary's County, Maryland, whose will was dated 3 April 1707 and recorded 23 April 1709. In the will he gives, "To son, executive, dwelling plantation Green Hill at head of Brittaines Bay; he dying without issue to pass to five daughters; Frances and Winifred share of estate equal to those already given daughters Mary Bright, Elizabeth Peake and Margaret Tomson." (Maryland Calendar of Wills.)

John and Frances Higginbotham settled in Virginia in the early seventeen hundreds. They settled first in Goochland County in the section that became Albemarle County in 1744 and later became Amherst County in 1761. They made their home in the southwest part at the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains on the Buffalo River. (Higginbotham Family, by William M. Sweeny and Land Deeds.)

Frances Higginbotham, the widow of John Higginbotham, survived her husband many years. It is believed she died about 1751 in Albemarle County, Virginia. Extracts from the Diary of Reverend Robert Rose, Rector of Saint Ann's Parish, Albemarle County, Virginia, between the years 1747-1751, gives valuable information on the life of Mrs. Higginbotham and her family:

27 October 1747.

Dined at Mrs. Higginbothams christened her Grandchild and got at Night to Rose Isle cold.

20 June 1748.

Preached at Mrs. Higginbothams and lodged at Rose Isle.

23 June 1748.

Went out to finish our Survey and look at the Top of our circumventor which we could not find called and lodged at Mrs. Higginbothams.

20 March 1749.

A fair morning rode with three of the Higginbothams to their Mothers dined went to James Williamsons took an inventory of Mr. Walkers Effects very warm for the season.

12 April 1749.

The same weather heard by the Higginbothams of some of my Tobacco being carried down by the River from the Seven Islands.

23 May 1749.

Left Mrs. Heggins on at 7 a.m. crossed at Finlays ferry at 8 and got Home after calling at Mrs. Higginbothams about one P.M. a thunder storm this evening.

4 September 1749.

Rode to Captain Downs dined to Mrs. Marshalls and Lodged at John Marrs with Benjamin Higginbotham.

11 September 1749.

At Home Benjamin Higginbotham came up without the Wag-gons brought us papers with the News of W. Goochs return on the Death of John Robinson Esq. and of the Appointment of Thomas Lee Esq. president.

27 November 1749.

Bought Hoggs of Ambrose Jones rode to the Widow Higginbothams married William Morrison to her Daughter and returned at Night being very rainy weather.

21 February 1750.

Married Benjamin Higginbotham and Elizabeth Graves got home at night were found one George Dunavel with his child born to be christened.

28 February 1750.

Clear sky to northward rode to Warrens Mines by Ambrose Porters and Aaron Higginbothams returned over Buffalo below Rocky Run very deep.

14 May 1750.

Rode to the Mines stayed till Evening came home at Night with Moses Higginbotham very warm and windy.

31 July 1750.

Rode to William Morrisons.

19 August 1750.

Left this morning Rode by Mrs. Higginbothams to Findleys Ferry thence to Megginson and preached. the wind about dyed away a pleasant evening married Moses Higginbotham and Frances Kyle.

12 May 1751.

This morning rain planted more cellery Thomas Higginbotham gave me a deed for 570 acres of land in consideration of L45 rode to the Mines and home again at night.

Reverend Robert Rose died in Richmond, Virginia, 30 June 1751. His Diary is found in the Brock Collection, Huntington Library, San Marino, California. A photostat copy is in the Archives Department of the State Library, Richmond, Virginia.

All the sons of John Higginbotham either served, furnished supplies or helped in other ways during the Revolutionary War.

The Revolutionary War had left many Virginians penniless and restless of spirit. How to improve their condition was a grave question. In this crisis, Georgia held out the best choice of land. This land could be obtained without any cost except the expense of surveying. A large number of emigrants, chiefly from Virginia, North and South Carolina, availed themselves of this opportunity to get themselves valuable homes. Several of the Higginbotham families, along with neighbors, made this move from Amherst County, Virginia, to Wilkes County, Georgia, around the year 1784.

BENJAMIN HIGGINBOTHAM

Benjamin² Higginbotham (John¹) was the son of John and Frances (Riley) Higginbotham. The date of his birth is not known but it is believed to be between 1725 and 1730. He died in the summer of 1791, Elbert County, Georgia and left a will dated 9 February 1790. This will was probated 25 July 1791. (Elbert County, Georgia Will Book A, 1791-1803, pages 8, 9, 10)

Benjamin Higginbotham was married on 21 February 1750, in Albemarle County, Virginia, to Elizabeth Graves. She was the daughter of Francis, Jr. and Ann Graves, granddaughter of Francis Graves and great-granddaughter of Thomas Graves, the Immigrant Ancestor. (Marriage date: Diary of Reverend Robert Rose, page 101. Diary in Brock Collection, Henry E. Huntington Library, San Marino, California. Photostat copy in the Archives Department, State Library, Richmond, Virginia.)

Elizabeth (Graves) Higginbotham was born about 1733 in Virginia and died after 1790, probably in Georgia.

Between the years 1749 and 1784, Benjamin Higginbotham received over 1,000 acres in Virginia Land Grants. (Land Register Office, Richmond, Virginia.)

The following deed and miscellaneous court records are found in the name of Benjamin Higginbotham in Virginia.

14 May 1751.

Moses Higginbotham of Saint Ann's Parish County of Albemarle to Benjamin Higginbotham of the same Parish and County. Conveys 204 acres of land, "now in the possession of Benjamin Higginbotham," and located on the branches of the Buffalo River, Albemarle County being part of a tract of 1,430 acres conveyed to Moses Higginbotham by George Braxton, the younger, etc. Consideration 5 shillings. (Albemarle County, Virginia, Deed Book 1, page 300.)

2 May 1761.

Benjamin Higginbotham of the County and Parish of Amherst, to Richard Davis. Conveys 204 acres of land on Buffalo River, being a tract of 204 acres granted to Benjamin Higginbotham by Moses Higginbotham by a deed dated 14 May 1751, which was duly recorded in Albemarle Court. Consideration 60 pounds. (Amherst County, Virginia, Deed Book A, page 20.)

1766.

Benjamin Higginbotham and Joseph Higginbotham were appointed by the Court to view certain land. (Amherst County, Virginia, Order Book 1766-1769, page 5.)

7 September 1767.

Benjamin Higginbotham of Amherst County, Power of Attorney for James Colbert Blair, conveys to Alexander Baggs, of Augusta County, 160 acres of land on the Pedlar River, Amherst County. Consideration 30 pounds. (Amherst County, Virginia, Deed Book B, page 249.)

2 May 1768.

Joseph Higginbotham, foreman, Benjamin Higginbotham, John Spears, William Spencer, Dudley Gatewood, Samuel Ayres, Joseph Mays, Joseph Ballinger, Ambrose Porter, John Loving, Samuel Staples, William Martin, for the body of this County, and having received their charge retired from the bar, to consult of their verdict. (Amherst County, Virginia, Order Book, 1766-1769, pages 304-05.)

6 July 1768.

Certificate from John Phillips, Constable, that he had weighed 171 pounds of hemp for Benjamin Higginbotham. (Amherst County, Virginia, Order Book, 1766-1769, page 342.)

4 July 1774.

Benjamin Higginbotham of Amherst County, to James Higginbotham, of Amherst County. Conveys 75 acres of land on the north branches of the South Fork of the Buffalo River, granted by a Patent to Benjamin Higginbotham at Williamsburg on 14 July 1769. Lines were Benjamin Higginbotham; Aaron Higginbotham; Pounding Mill Creek; and James Higginbotham. Consideration 20 pounds. (Amherst County, Virginia, Deed Book D, page 168.)

4 December 1775.

Benjamin Higginbotham and wife, Elizabeth, of Amherst County, to Caleb Higginbotham, of Amherst County. Conveys 355 acres of land beginning at a white oak, corner of Braxton and Company's land, Amherst County. Consideration 5 shillings. (Amherst County, Virginia, Deed Book D, page 328.)

3 March 1777.

Benjamin Higginbotham was one of the Appraisers of the Estate of Neill Campbell, Deceased. (Amherst County, Virginia, in the Revolution Including Extracts from the "Lost Order Book," 1773-1782, page 78, by Lenora Higginbotham Sweeny.)

14 January 1781.

Benjamin Higginbotham is listed on a Pay Role of Captain William Tucker's Company of Militia from Amherst County in the State of Virginia. He joined the army the 14th day of

January 1781 and was discharged the 26th day of March 1781. Seventy two days in all. (Miscellaneous papers "K 3" Archives Division, Virginia State Library.)

1782.

Benjamin Higginbotham is listed as having 536 acres of taxable land in Amherst County, Virginia, in 1782. (Tax lists of Amherst County, Virginia.)

2 April 1782.

Benjamin Higginbotham is listed as a claimant for Property impressed or taken for public service during the Revolutionary War. His claim was for "driving publick beevers" on 10 August 1781, 2 pounds, 8 shillings and 9 pence and on 30 August 1781, 1 pound and 15 shillings. He received a certificate for the same. He appeared at the Amherst Court house on the 2nd day of April 1782 and the payment for supplies was allowed. (Amherst County, Virginia, Order Book 1773-1782, page 492.)

May court 1783.

Benjamin Higginbotham put in a second claim for property impressed or taken for public service during the Revolutionary War. His claim was for 675 pounds of beef. (Amherst County, Virginia, Order Book 1782-1784, page 121.)

Benjamin Higginbotham and family left Virginia and moved to Georgia in 1784-1785. He was listed as a resident of Amherst County in the 1783 census of Virginia and in the Wilkes County, Georgia, court records there is a deed dated 28 November 1786 in the name of Benjamin Higginbotham.

Benjamin Higginbotham settled in the northeast section of the State of Georgia, east of the Broad River on Coldwater Creek in Wilkes County. This section of Wilkes County became Elbert County on 10 December 1790.

The following records are found in the name of Benjamin Higginbotham in the State of Georgia.

1787.

Benjamin Higginbotham was granted a headright grant of 200 acres in Wilkes County, Georgia. (Georgia State Archives.)

1790.

Benjamin Higginbotham is listed in Colonel John Cunningham's Battalion and in Captain Joseph Blackwell's District in a 1790 census of Elbert County, Georgia, compiled by Frank Parker Hudson from original Wilkes County Tax Digests for Colonel Cunningham's Battalion consisting of 11 Militia Districts made into Elbert County by Act of Legislature 10 December 1790. (Page 6.)

His wife, Elizabeth, was the executrix and his sons, William, Benjamin, Joseph, and Francis, were the executors of his will dated 9 February 1790 and proved before Middleton Woods, Esquire, clerk of the County of Elbert, Georgia, and recorded in his office on 25 July 1791. (Book A of mixed records, 1791-1803, pages 8-10.)

WILL OF BENJAMIN HIGGINBOTHAM, SR.

July 21, 1791. Benjamin Higginbotham will proven before Middleton Woods, Esquire, clerk of the county of Elbert and recorded in my office July 25, 1791.

In the name of God, amen. February 9, 1790, I Benjamin Higginbotham, of Wilkes County and state of Georgia being in a low and weak state of body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it was appointed for all men once to die, I recommend my soul into the hands of god that gave it and my body to earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubted but at the general resurrection that I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless you in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Impremis I lend to my beloved wife, Elizabeth Higginbotham four negroes, namely, Joe, Will, Anne and Jude and increase of Anne and Jude and the Household furniture that I don't dispose of otherwise in my will and my stock of cattle and hogs and the crop that is then on hand. During her natural life making no waste or spoil of the same and her death to be equally divided amongst my children to them and their heirs forever.

Item: I give to my daughter, Ann Higginbotham, one negro

wench named Lucy and her increase to her heirs forever, also one negro named Hunptry to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son, Caleb Higginbotham, one negro named Jack to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son, Benjamin Higginbotham, one negro wench named Charity her and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my son, Joseph Higginbotham, one negro wench named Phillis her and her increase to him and his heirs forever. Also the land that I hold now to be equally divided between son Joseph and Francis, if my son Joseph should decease without an heir lawfully begotten then what I have left to him be equally divided amongst his brothers and sister.

Item: I give to my son Francis Higginbotham, one negro wench named Rachel her and her increase to him and his heirs forever, also the land that I now own to be equally divided between my sons Francis and Joseph.

My sons William, Benjamin, Joseph, and Francis, I make and ordain with my beloved wife Elizabeth Higginbotham, my sole executors and executrix of this my last will and testament, and I hereby revoke and disanul all and every other former testament, wills, requests, and executors by me in any wise before this time named. Ratifying this and no other to be my last will and testament.

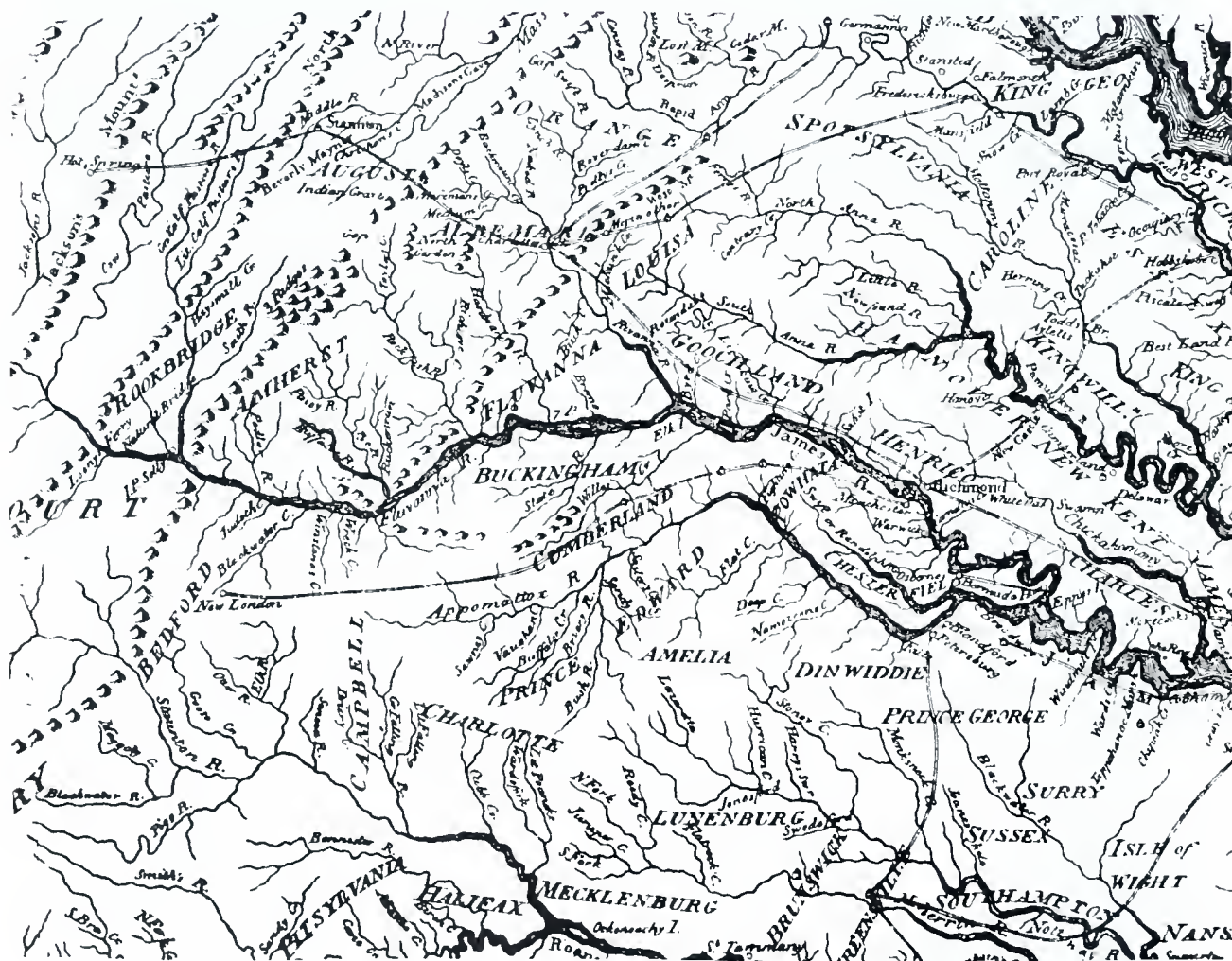

BENJAMIN HIGGINBOTHAM, JR.

BENJAMIN³ HIGGINBOTHAM, JR. (Benjamin², John¹) son of Benjamin and Elizabeth (Graves) Higginbotham was born about 1760 in Albemarle County, Virginia. He died in the year 1810, Elbert County, Georgia. His will was dated 20th day of May 1809 and probated 3rd day of September 1810. His son Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and John Upshaw, Jr. were the executors of his will. (Elbert County, Georgia Will Book, 1809-1812, pages 94 to 96.)

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. was married on 21 January 1782, in Amherst County, Virginia, to Mary Gatewood. She was the daughter of Larkin and Catherine (Penn) Gatewood of Amherst County, Virginia. She was the granddaughter of Henry Gatewood and the great-granddaughter of John Gatewood, the Immigrant Ancestor. (Marriage Bonds and Other Marriage Records of Amherst County, Virginia, 1763-1800, page 39, by William M. Sweeny.)

Mary (Gatewood) Higginbotham was born about 1762 in Amherst County, Virginia, and died prior to 1809, as there is no mention made of her in her husband's will.

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. is listed as a Revolutionary soldier in the 8th Annual Report of The Virginia State Library, 1910-1911. (Journal of the House of Delegates, October 1778, page 115.)

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. was part of 279 non-commissioned officers and privates ordered into service from Amherst County by Colonel Daniel Gaines of the Militia on June 21, 1781. They were "to march to join the Army commanded by the honorable Major General, Marquis de la Fayette." (William and Mary College Library, Cabell Papers, Uncataloged 4, Box 1.)

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. served at the Siege of York. (McAllister, List of Revolutionary Soldiers of Virginia.)

In an application for a pension submitted by William Turner from Amherst County, Virginia on August 21, 1832, he stated that he "served under Captain Benjamin Higginbotham on the line of march to Yorktown." He and Captain Benjamin Higginbotham were discharged as supernumerary officers a few days before the capitulation of Yorktown. (Lenora Higginbotham Sweeny, Amherst County, Virginia In the Revolution, Including Extracts from the "Lost Order Book," 1773-1782, pages 173-174.)

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. is listed on a roll of

Revolutionary Soldiers from Amherst County, Virginia compiled by Alexander Brown for Hardesty's Historical and Geographical Encyclopedia. (A Special Virginia Edition, page 410.)

In 1782 Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. is listed on a Tax List as owning 130 acres of taxable land in Amherst County, Virginia.

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. moved from Virginia to Georgia, probably in 1784 and at the same time as his father and brother Francis. His name does not appear in the Amherst County, Virginia census records after 1783.

In an early Georgia Tax Digest he is listed as having one slave and 950 acres of land. His father and brother, Francis, was also listed on the same Tax Digest. (Early Records of Georgia, by Grace Gillan Davidson, Volume 2, page 52.)

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. was granted the following head-right grants in Georgia. (Georgia State Archives.)

200 acres in Wilkes County - Grant Book LLL, page 335
 239 acres in Elbert County - Grant Book KKKK, page 767
 800 acres in Elbert County - Grant Book EEEEE, page 986

In 1790 Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. is listed in Colonel John Cunningham's Battalion of the Wilkes County, Georgia Militia. (Wilkes County Tax Digests for Colonel Cunningham's Battalion, page 7.)

1802. Will of Larkin Gatewood.

In the 1805 Georgia Land Lottery Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. is listed in Captain Thomas Oliver's Company and in Major Richardson Hunt's Battalion. He drew two draws but they were both blanks. (Historical Collections of the Georgia Chapters Daughters of the American Revolution, Volume 3, page 238.)

20 May 1809.

Benjamin Higginbotham, Jr. wrote his will. He appointed his son Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and John Upshaw, Jr., the executors of his will. (Elbert County, Georgia Will Book, 1809-1812, pages 94 to 96.)

In the name of God Amen, I Benjamin Higginbotham of Elbert County and State of Georgia being in Sound Mind and Memory Thank be to God for the Same and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I have made and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows Vizt:

Imprimis My Will and Desire is that all my just and lawfull debts be first paid.

Item: I give to my daughter Sarah one negro girl named Daufney one feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs which she is now possessed with and One horse kind to be worth seventy dollars for her to receive after my decease.

Item: I give to my daughter Anny One Negro girl named Milley One feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs and One horse kind worth seventy dollars.

Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth One Negro girl named Lethy One feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs which she is now possessed with and One horse kind to be worth seventy dollars.

Item: I give to my son Benjamin Graves One Negro named Daniel One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs One feather bed and furniture and One Mare valued to seventy dollars which he is now possessed with and nothing else but the Mare.

Item: I give to my son Peter One Negro boy named Jacob One feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs One Horse kind worth seventy dollars.

Item: I give to my daughter Mary One Negro girl named Rhody One feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and

Pigs One horse kind worth seventy dollars One Saddle and Bridle to be worth twenty dollars and One hundred dollars cash.

Item: I give to my son Larkin One Negro named Lindsay One feather bed and furniture One Cow and Calf One Sow and Pigs One horse kind worth seventy dollars and One hundred dollars cash to be raised out of my Estate and the balance of my Estate my Desire is to be equally divided between the whole of my children.

I constitute and appoint my son Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and John Upshaw Junior my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament disanuling and revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twentyeth day of May One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine.

BENJAMIN GRAVES HIGGINBOTHAM

BENJAMIN GRAVES⁴ HIGGINBOTHAM (Benjamin³, Benjamin², John¹) was the son of Benjamin and Mary (Gatewood) Higginbotham. He was born on 17 February 1788 in Wilkes County, Georgia. He died on 23 April 1862 in Noxubee County, Mississippi and is buried in the Lloyd Cemetery [now known as Butler Cemetery]. (Birth date, Graves Bible record. Death date, wife's Pension application. Burial place, letter dated 29 July 1944 from P. G. Whitehead to Mr. E. A. Limmer of Houston, Texas. The Bible record was in possession of P. G. Whitehead in 1944. Photo copy of Bible record and letter in my file.)

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham was married on 2 January 1812, in Elbert County, Georgia, to Mary Foster Lawless, daughter of John and Tabitha (Rowzee) Lawless and granddaughter of Thomas Lawless. (Marriage date, Elbert County, Georgia Will Book and Mixed records, 1809-1812, page 325 and Bible record.)

MARY FOSTER (LAWLESS) HIGGINBOTHAM was born on 24 November 1795, in Elbert County, Georgia. She died between the years 1875 and 1877 either in Kemper, Winston or Noxubee Counties, Mississippi. She is buried in the Lloyd Cemetery. She was listed on the 1870 census for Kemper County, Mississippi but not found in the 1880 census for Kemper, Neshoba, Winston or Noxubee Counties. (Birth date and burial place same reference as above.)

The following items pertaining to Benjamin Graves Higginbotham are found in the Elbert County, Georgia Records and in the states of Alabama and Mississippi.

20 May 1809.

Benjamin G. Higginbotham was named as executor in his father's will. (Elbert County, Georgia Will Book, 1809-1812, pages 94-96.)

3 September 1810.

Received 3 September 1810 of Benjamin G. Higginbotham Four dollars and Fifty Cents for fees in the probate of Benjamin Higginbotham's Will.

John S. Higginbotham, guardian for Larkin Higginbotham. Returns for 1812 shows note on Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and Francis Satterwhite. Benjamin G. Higginbotham, Security. (Administrators and Guardians Bonds, Elbert County, Georgia Will Book "K", 1812-1816, page 39.)

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham's name is on a list of soldiers for Georgia Militia for the War of 1812. (Historical Collections of Georgia Chapters National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, Volume 3, page 149.)

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham was a First Lieutenant in the Company Commanded by Captain Charles Carter in the Regiment of Volunteers of Georgia Militia commanded by General Floyd in the War of 1812. He volunteered at the Elbert County Courthouse on the 1st day of August 1813 for the term of six months and continued in actual service in the war for the term of three months and was then honorably discharged at Camp Hope on the 1st day of November 1813. He was employed chiefly in the building of forts. (His petition for bounty land and wife's Widow pension application number 11529, both found in the National Archives, Washington, D.C.)

1815.

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham was listed on an 1815 tax list of Elbert County, Georgia. He was in Captain Christian's District. (Georgia State Archives.)

1820.

He is not found in the Georgia Census for 1820, but could have been in one of the counties whose records are lost.

1822-1833.

The last child born in Georgia was in 1822. The next

three children were born in Alabama in 1825, 1828 and 1833. We know he was living in Green County, Alabama, in 1828 when his son, James Larkin was born. (Bible record of Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and Bible record of his grandson, George Washington Higginbotham.)

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham was living in Dallas County, Alabama, in the year 1830 where he is found listed on the census for that County.

1835.

About the year 1835, Benjamin Graves Higginbotham and his family moved from Alabama to Mississippi where they settled in the hill country in the south west part of Noxubee County. This was only a few years after the county had been formed from the Choctaw Purchase. I quote from the unpublished History of Noxubee County, Mississippi, by John Anderson Tyson and published in the Macon Beacon in 1926-1927.

"Mr. Halbert states that Mr. J. L. Higginbotham, who had lived near the treaty ground since 1835, has repeatedly pointed out to him the place described as the spot where the treaty of Dancing Rabbit was made and signed, the information of Mr. Higginbotham resting upon the statements of two pioneer settlers of Noxubee County, both of whom were present during the negotiations at Dancing Rabbit and were eye witnesses to the signing of the treaty, Viz; Mr. Hilcar Burwell, who was one of the first settlers of Mashulaville, and Mr. G. W. Campbell, who died at his residence near Shuqualak in 1888. Mr. Higginbotham stated that these two men had frequently pointed the place out to him. Mr. Higginbotham made the additional statement that his brother-in-law, Lorenzo Thomas, in 1849, built a split log cabin with a chimney to the south on the very spot where the treaty was made. This cabin has long since disappeared, but, if by close search, some traces of the old chimney site could be discovered, it will give almost the exact spot of signing the treaty." (Chapter on Indians, page 26. History found in the Noxubee County Court House and Library, Macon, Mississippi and in the Mississippi State Archives, Jackson, Mississippi.)

1838.

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham made his home in the Fleetwood Mountains, where there was an abundance of springs, game and timber supply. It was here his last child was born in 1838.

1840.

He is listed on the 1840 United States Census for Noxubee County, Mississippi.

1850.

On the 1850 census for Noxubee County he gives his occupation as a Planter. His wife, Polly; son John Lawless; daughter, Mary Gatewood Higginbotham; and their youngest

child, Tabitha, was also listed.

1860.

On the 1860 Noxubee County census he is listed as Graves Higginbotham and his occupation as a farmer. Listed in his household was his wife, Polly; daughter, Tabitha; and married daughter, Mary Green, and her son, James. Summerville is given as his place of residence.

The records of the former General Land Office, now in the National Archives in Washington, D.C., shows that Benjamin Graves Higginbotham on 16 May 1851, applied for a Bounty Land Warrant for 80 acres to which he was entitled to under the Act passed 28 September 1850, granting bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who had been engaged in military service of the United States. I am typing the following two letters as they are handwritten and very hard to read. The signatures on these two letters are taken from the original copies. The rest of the letters and documents will be in their original form.

State of Mississippi
County of Noxubee

On the 16th day of May A.M. One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty One, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State afore said, Benjamin G. Higginbotham age sixty three years a resident of Noxubee County in the State of Mississippi, who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical Benjamin G. Higginbotham who was a Lieutenant in the Company commanded by Captain Charles Carter in the Regiment Number (not recollected) of Georgia Militia Commanded by General Floyd in the War with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812 that he volunteered at Elbert Court House on the 1st day of August A.D. 1813 for the term of six months and continued in actual service in the war for the term of three months and was honorably discharged at Camp Hope on the 1st day of November A.D. 1813 as will appear by the Muster Rolls of said Company, the original having been lost or mislaid, he makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which he may be entitled to under the Act granting Bounty Land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States, passed September 28th, A.D. 1850.

Benjamin Graves received his Bounty Land Warrant, number 31,924 for 80 acres in March of 1852 then he legally disposed of it.

On the 26th day of July 1855 he sent the following letter asking for additional bounty land he was now entitled under the new Act of 3 March 1855.

Before March of 1857, Graves Higginbotham received notice that his claim for bounty land, warrant No. 46,765 for 80 acres, had been suspended because there had been two applications by two Benjamin G. Higginbothams, both in Captain Carter's Company of Georgia Militia, War of 1812.

On 20 March 1857, Benjamin Graves Higginbotham had J. C. Holmes make and send an affidavit to the Land Office stating that the notice of suspension of the claim had been sent to Macon, a distance of 18 to 20 miles from where he lived and consequently did not get it until recently.

Mr. J. C. Holmes then states that he had corresponded with the attorney of the other Higginbotham, who lived near Oxford, Lafayette County, Mississippi, and was informed that he had obtained the bounty for him by his merely making out an affidavit to the effect, that there were two Higginbothams in Captain Carter's Company.

This evidently wasn't enough proof as there were a number of letters sent to and received from the Land Office through the years 1857 and 1858.

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham had not received his warrant by May 1st 1858 when he appeared before a Justice of the Peace in Winston County, Mississippi making a declaration to this effect and appointed Tucker Lloyd of Washington, D.C., his attorney to prosecute his claim and procure his warrant. At this time, Graves Higginbotham was 70 years of age.

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham finally received his bounty land warrant, number 46,765, and then assigned the warrant "for value received" to a William Cook.

Benjamin Graves Higginbotham died in Noxubee County, Mississippi on 23 April 1862. He was buried in the Lloyd Graveyard, now known as the Butler Cemetery.

Polly Higginbotham was listed in the 1870 census for Kemper County, Mississippi. Her occupation was given as keeping house and her Post Office as Kelly's Store. Living in the same household was her daughter, Tabitha Higginbotham, age 32, Ann Higginbotham, age 15, and Sophia Seal, age 4.

Polly Higginbotham applied for a Widow's Pension, under the Act of 14 February 1871, in the Justices Court, District Number 4, Noxubee County, Mississippi, on 7 April 1875. At this time she was 79 years of age. She gave her address as Hashuqua, Mississippi.

This pension claim, number 11529, was filed in Washington, D.C. on 15 July 1875, by her attorney, Horatio King.

On 1 August 1877, her pension claim was rejected by reason of abandonment. This was most likely because of her death.

JAMES LARKIN⁵ HIGGINBOTHAM (Benjamin Graves⁴, Benjamin³, Benjamin², John¹) sixth child of Benjamin Graves and Mary "Polly" Foster (Lawless) Higginbotham. He was born on 10 October 1828, Green County, Alabama. He died on 31 May 1913, Noxubee Co., Ms. and is buried in the White Cemetery. (Son George Washington's Bible, tombstone inscription and death certificate.)

James Larkin Higginbotham was married on 19 May 1850, Noxubee Co., Ms. to MARGARETT ELIZABETH THOMAS. She was the daughter of Isaac and Elizabeth () Thomas. Both were born in South Carolina. (Noxubee Co. marriage records, Book A, page 283.)

Margarett Elizabeth (Thomas) Higginbotham was born on 14 May 1829, Green County, Georgia. She died on 21 October 1898, Noxubee Co., Ms. and is buried beside her husband in the White Cemetery. (Bible and tombstone inscription.)

James Larkin Higginbotham is found living a short distance from his father and next to his brother, Benjamin Toliver Higginbotham in the 1850 Noxubee Co., Ms. census. His occupation is listed as a Planter.

In the 1860 census for Noxubee County, Larkin's occupation is given as a farmer and his place of residence as Mashulaville. His wife, Margarett, and four children, Benjamin Wiley, Isaac Thomas, Mary Elizabeth and Commodore Columbus are listed in his household.

The 1870 Noxubee census has him living in Shuqualak, Ms. Listed in his household are his wife, Margarett and children, Benjamin, Thomas, Elizabeth, Comodore C., George W., Andrew J. and Joseph E. Higginbotham. His occupation was a farmer.

In the 1880 Noxubee census there is just his wife and sons George and Joseph listed in his household. His residence is given as being in the west half of beat number 4 and his occupation a farmer.

James Larkin Higginbotham lived all his life, except the first seven years and the years he was gone during the War Between the States, in Noxubee Co., Ms. He was considered one of the best marksmen and hunters in that part of the country.

Larkin Higginbotham served as a private in the War Between the States. He was enlisted by Lieutenant Miller in Company "H", 14th Regiment Mississippi Infantry, on 13 September 1862 at Enterprise, Mississippi. He enlisted for the period of three years. This Company was known as the Meridian Invincibles of Lauderdale County, Mississippi.

His Commander was Colonel William Doss and his Captain was Captain Crumpton. He served from 13 September 1862, until December of 1864, when he was wounded in a battle at Franklin, Tennessee. He was in the St. Mary's Hospital at La Grange, Georgia for a while and then given a furlough. He was at home recovering from his wound when the war ended. (Confederate Military Records on file in the Department of Archives and History, Jackson, Mississippi and at the National Archives, Washington, D.C.)

In his application for a soldier's pension in 1910, he stated he had been wounded in his left arm and that a piece of shell had torn his arm open from the wrist to the elbow. (Pension application, Noxubee County Courthouse, Macon, Mississippi.)
