PREFACE.

For copying and printing its early records, the town of Hanover voted one hundred dollars at the annual meeting in March, 1903, and three hundred and fifty dollars at the annual meeting in March, 1904. The selectmen appointed as an editing committee: Professor Herbert D. Foster, Mr. George M. Bridgman, Town Clerk, and Professor Sidney B. Fay.

The committee presents in this printed book an accurate verbatim copy of the volume containing the earliest records of the town meetings and selectmen, from "the first Town Meeting for the Town of Hanover . . . met august 25th 1761," to "the 25th day of April, 1818." The copy was made by Mr. William D. Walker, and reproduces faithfully the original spelling, capitalization and punctuation. The copy and the printed book have been compared with the original, by the committee, word for word, and, where necessary, letter by letter. The index was made by Miss Laura Woolsey Lord.

The volume containing the original records is a parchment bound folio, 8 x 12 3/4 inches, with 338 pages. It appears to have been bought in 1773 or 1774, for 9 s. 6 d. The entries from 1761 to October 4, 1773, were copied into this volume from an earlier record, no longer in existence. These facts are indicated by the following votes: (See pages 14 and 17.)

"Oct" 4th 1773—Voted to allow Edm'd Freeman 8/9 for a Book for the use of the Town.

"Voted that the former Votes passed in this Town be transmitted into s^d Book

"March ye 8th 1774—Voted to allow Edmund Freeman for Town Book 9/6"

These records were entered in the book by the same hand which had kept the original records since 1767, "Edmund

Freeman of Hanover," who was town clerk from 1767 to 1778, and the first actual settler in Hanover, coming here from Mansfield, Connecticut, with his wife and two children, in May, 1765.

The Hanover records contain the customary actions of town meetings at that day, viz.: election of officers, some of them the same as today, some, like the tythingmen, hogreeves and deerriffs, unnecessary now, but important in the colonial life of New England; restrictions on hogs running at large; the calling and difficult dismissal of the minister of the town: the building of meeting house and school house; the support of the ministry and schools; determining of taxes, tax rates and valuation; care of the poor and the sick, in 1788 disapproving of "annoculation of the small pox" (p. 77). The first town meetings were those of the proprietors from 1761 to 1766, all held in Mansfield, Connecticut. The first "Meeting of the Inhabitants of the Town of Hanover" was held in Hanover, July 22, 1767. At this time there were only twenty-six heads of families, and eleven unmarried men, with a total population of ninety-two; but they showed the native capacity of New England settlers for orderly political life, by at once instituting the fully developed and familiar system of town government, electing town officers and making arrangements for "supporting the Gospel."

Items of more than local interest are the actions during the Revolution: adoption of the American Association in 1775, Committee of Safety, 1776, provisions for ammunition and militia (pp. 21, 24, 26ff.); elections of state and national officials; votes for Daniel Webster as representative to congress, in 1812 and 1814 (pp. 271, 283); votes on the state constitution and its revisions; the relations with Dartmouth College; votes regarding the Embargo Act (pp. 246-9), and the War of 1812 (pp. 268-9).

The selectmens' records deal chiefly with licenses to sell "Speretous Liquors" or keep tavern, ten of these being granted in 1794. They also include surveys and alterations of roads, perambulation of town lines, and a warning to certain

persons to depart (pp. 124, 295, 218). No separate record of acts of the selectmen, for this period, has been found, and it is doubtful whether such a record existed.

The records also include some miscellaneous items, like drawing of jurors, constable's warrants and returns, and frequent notices of stray horses and cattle and articles lost and found.

The larger interest of this record lies in its constant suggestion of that sound sense and capacity for self-government which characterized the plain people of New England, and which gives the early history of their towns so significant a a place in the rise of modern democracy.

The records for the fifty-seven years covered in the first volume, 1761–1818, were kept, with a few exceptions of clerks pro tempore (noted in the complete list under "clerk" in index), by the following eight town clerks, five of them being of the Freeman family, prominent in the settlement and early history of the town:

- 1. "Edmund Freeman Jun" "of Mansfield, Conn., August, 1761-March, 1767.
- 2. "Edmund Freeman of Hanover," March, 1767-March, 1778.
 - 3. Jonathan Freeman, March, 1778-March, 1787.
 - 4. Russell Freeman, March, 1787-March, 1789. 5. William Chandler, March, 1789-March, 1794.
- 6. "Doct^r Joel Brown," March, 1794-March, 1802; March, 1804-March, 1809.
 - 7. Dyer Willis, March, 1802-March, 1804.
- 8. Jonathan Freeman, 2d, March, 1809—March, 1832; March, 1833—March, 1836; March, 1838—March, 1848.

The charter of the town, printed in the Appendix (p. 306), is a verbatim reprint of the copy in the possession of the Secretary of State at Concord. The supplementary grant of 1775, also given in the appendix, is reprinted from the copy in the New Hampshire State Papers, Vol. XXV, pp. 82-85, where there will also be found sketch plans of the boundaries of the town. On page 77 of the same volume is a list of books and articles bearing on the history of the town and college; and on pages 85-90 the "Grant to Dartmouth College and Eleazar

Wheelock, 1771" (with plan), and the "Dartmouth College Ferry, 1772."

The original Hanover Proprietors' Records (1761–1807), and the first volume of births, marriages, and deaths (1762–1846), are of great interest and value. They would complete the records of the town for its first half century, and deserve to be printed. With these records all in print, and with the invaluable "History of Dartmouth College and the Town of Hanover," by the late Judge Frederick Chase (to be continued in a second volume by Professor John King Lord), the town will be provided with unusually valuable material on its early history.

Resolved 1st That it is the duty and unalienable right of the Citizens of this State, especially in times of public danger and

distrefs, to assemble in an orderly and peaceable manner and "consult upon the common good."

2nd That the present crisis is distressing and alarming and imperiously calls for the unanimity, vigilance, firmness, and patriotism of all the real friends of our Country.

3rd That in former years the sober habits, the persevereing industry, and enterprise of our fellow citizens, under the fostering care of government and the smiles of Providence were crowned with success; and by the blessings of Providence on our industry the year past, our harvests have been abundant, no pestilence hath raged—no war hath desolated—and yet our fellow citizens are now impoverished and distressed and the national resources are rapidly diminishing.—

4th That in our opinion the Act laying an embargo on our ships and vessels passed at the last session of Congress and the several acts supplementary thereto have in their operation occasioned our present distresses—for which we have no consolation of a patriotic nature. If we view them as measures of coercion they seem to operate almost wholly on ourselves—and as respects the two great belligerents, one of those nations gives it her unqualified approbation, and the other treats it with perfect contempt If we consider them as measures of precaution and preservation, being in their terms perpetual and implying [264] an abandonment of our rights on the ocean, they are too humiliating to comport with the spirit and dignity of a great, free and independent nation—and too dis tressing and expensive to consist with the vital interest of our Country.

5th. That we consider the late acts of Congress to enforce and render more effectual the several acts before refered to as fraught with ills still more alarming being repugnant to a just construction of many of the most sacred articles in our bill of rights and constitution of government and to our apprehension should it be carried into effect its continuance will forbode a train of calamities to our Country—which may Heaven avert! among others that which excited so much "anxious solicitude" in the mind of our revered Washington—"a separation of the States" An event we should as deeply deprecate

as any next to a deprivation of our constitutional rights. This act we are with reluctance compelled to view as impolitic, arbitrary, and unconstitutional in its most striking and alarming traits which are the following—It attempts to transfer legislative and Judicial powers to the Executive, and Judicial to the military—It would subject our property and possessions to unreasonable searches and seizures and without legal warrant from the civil magistrate—It substitutes the secret orders and instructions of the President in the place of good and wholesome laws publicly and deliberately passed by the Legislature, and attempts to give them the same solemnity and effect-It attempts to preclude the citizens from the benefit of a trial by jury in certain controversies concerning property—Its execution will violate the eighth [265] article of the amendments to the constitution of the United States which declares that "excefsive bail shall not be required"—nor excefsive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted,.-

The Agents of the Executive, under his orders, may upon the impulse of suspicion and belief, pronounce this meeting illegal, enter into this assembly interrupt our deliberations and forcibly disperse us—It submits to the command of the Executive and his agents the land and naval forces and the militia of the United States to enforce some of its dangerous provisions—and in fact attempts to place our Country—in this time of peace under a kind of military law which is repugnant to the principles of Republican freedom, and has ever been a direct step towards despotism.—

6th. That those members of Congress who have so ably opposed the passage of these laws, and so nobly encountered the various difficulties of a personal and public nature which have so closely invested them have displayed that wisdom and enlightened zeal, that patriotic fortitude and patience which the importance of the subject required and which highly merits the notice respect and acknowledgements of all their fellow citizens—

7th. That the early application of a constitutional remedy for the grievances of which we thus complan, is highly necessary and which [while] we freely and we believe justly animadvert upon the measures of government, we ought not to pass without just reprehension the inexcusable delinquencies of ourselves and fellow citizens in the exercise of the right of suffrage—We have important duties to perform in a iniform and promt attendance at the poll and in an honest and wise bestowment of [266] offices—On this depends the welfare of our Country—By these means are existing evils to be remedied—

8th That we will support the constitution of this State and the United States—and are ready with our lives and fortunes to aid in any constitutional measure of the general government tending to the security honor and prosperity of our Country—But while we would inculcate and practice respect for just laws and discountenance irregular opposition to those that are grievous, we shall at all times esteem it our duty to guard our constitutional rights in a manner becoming freemen as well as against domestic as foreign violence and agression—

Resolved.—That we view the private Meetings of Members of Congress, at the seat of the general government, commonly called Congressional Caucuses, convened expressly for the purpose of imposing on the nation candidates for President & Vice President, as [290] highly pernicious, and even fatal in their tendency; as calculated, in an eminent degree, to undermine what, in a free Country, is the palladium of its citizens—The freedom of Elections.—

Resolved.—As the sense of this meeting, that the principle attempted to be established, by which the Militia are detached from their superior Officers and placed under the command of those of the General Government, is a principle, which under existing circumstances, is not only unconstitutional, but dangerous in a high degree, and in its tendency subversive of State Sovereignty,—and—that Governors Strong and Griswold, for their dignified and Constitutional vindication of the rights of their respective States, merit our unequivocal approbation.

COPY OF THE CHARTER OF HANOVER, NEW HAMPSHIRE, GRANTED BY GOVERNOR BENNING WENTWORTH, JULY 4, 1761, AS RECORDED IN THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE AT CONCORD.

PROVINCE OF NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

GEORGE THE THIRD.

By the Grace of God, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c.

To all Perfons to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

Know ye, that We, of Our special Grace, certain Knowledge, and meer Motion, for the due Encouragement of fettling a New Plantation within our faid Province, by and with the Advice of our Trufty and Well-beloved Benning Wentworth. Efq: Our Governor and Commander in Chief of Our faid Province of NEW-HAMPSHIRE in New-England, and of our Council of the faid Province; Have upon the Conditions and Refervations herein after made, given and granted, and by thefe Prefents, for us, our Heirs, and Succeffors, do give and grant in equal Shares, unto Our loving Subjects, Inhabitants of Our faid Province of New-Hampfhire, and Our other Governments, and to their Heirs and Assigns for ever, whose names are entred on this Grant, to be divided to and amongst them into Sixty Eight equal Shares, all that Tract or Parcel of Land fituate, lying and being within our faid Province of New-Hampfhire, containing by Admeasurement, Twenty two thousand four hundred Acres, which Tract is to contain five Miles & five six of six Miles square, and no more; out of which an Allowance is to be made for High Ways and unimprovable Lands by

Rocks, Ponds, Mountains and Rivers, One Thoufand and Forty Acres free, according to a Plan and Survey thereof, made by Our faid Governor's Order, and returned into the Secretary's Office, and hereunto annexed, butted and bounded as follows, Viz. Begining at a Hemlock Tree marked which is the North West Corner of Labanon from thence South Sixty four Degrees East Seven Miles by the North Line of Labanon to the Corner thereof from thence North forty five degrees East Six Miles from thence North Sixty four West Six Miles & Three Quarters to a white Pine Tree marked Standing on the Bank of the river Connecticut from thence down the river to the first Bounds mentioned—And that the fame be, and hereby is Incorporated into a Township by the Name of Hannover And the Inhabitants that do or thall hereafter inhabit the faid Township, are hereby declared to be Enfranchized with and Intitled to all and every the Priviledges and Immunities that other Towns within Our Province by Law Exercise and Enjoy: And further, that the faid Town as foon as there fhall be Fifty Families refident and fettled thereon, shall have the Liberty of holding Two Fairs, one of which shall be held on the

And the other on the annually, which fairs are not to continue longer than the respective

following the faid and that as foon as the faid Town shall confist of Fifty Families, a Market may be opened and kept one or more Days in each Week, as may be thought most advantageous to the Inhabitants. Also, that the first Meeting for the Choice of Town Officers, agreable to the Laws of our faid Province, shall be held on the Last Tuesday of August next which faid Meeting thall be Notified by Mr Edmond Freeman who is hereby also appointed the Moderator of the faid first Meeting, which he is to Notify and Govern agreable to the Laws and Cuftoms of Our faid Province; and that the annual Meeting for ever hereafter for the Choice of fuch Officers for the faid Town, fhall be on the Second Tuesday of March annually, To HAVE, and to HOLD the said Tract of Land as above expressed, together with all Privileges and Appurtenances, to them and their respective Heirs and Assigns forever, upon the following Conditions, viz.

I. That every Grantee, his Heirs or Affigns shall plant and cultivate five Acres of Land within the Term of five Years for every fifty Acres contained in his or their Share or Proportion of Land in faid Township, and continue to improve and settle the same by additional Cultivations, on Penalty of the Forseiture of his Grant or Share in the faid Township, and of its reverting to Us, our Heirs and Successors, to be by Us or them, Re-granted to such of our Subjects as shall effectually settle and cultivate the same.

II. That all white and other Pine Trees within the faid Township, fit for Masting Our Royal Navy, be carefully preferved for that Use, and none to be cut or felled without Our special Licence for so doing first had and obtained, upon the Penalty of the Forseiture of the Right of such Grantee, his Heirs and Assigns, to Us, our Heirs and Successors, as well as being subject to the Penalty of any Act or Acts of Parliament that now are, or hereaster shall be Enacted.

III. That before any Divifion of the Land be made to and among the Grantees, a Tract of Land as near the Centre of the faid Townfhip as the Land will admit of, fhall be referved and marked out for Town Lots, one of which fhall be allotted to each Grantee of the Contents of one Acre.

IV. Yielding and paying therefor to Us, our Heirs and Succeffors for the Space of ten Years, to be computed from the Date hereof, the Rent of one Ear of Indian Corn only, on the twenty-fifth Day of *December* annually, if lawfully demanded, the first payment to be made on the twenty-fifth day of *December*. 1762

V. Every Proprietor, Settler or Inhabitant, fhall yield and pay unto Us, our Heirs and Succeffors yearly, and every Year forever, from and after the Expiration of ten Years from the abovefaid twenty-fifth Day of *December*, namely on the twenty-fifth Day of *December*, which will be in the Year of our Lord 1772 One fhilling Proclamation Money for every Hundred Acres he fo owns, fettles or possesses, and so in Proportion for a greater or lesser Tract of the said Land; which Money shall be paid by the respective Persons abovesaid, their Heirs or Assigns, in our Council Chamber in Portsmouth, or to such Officer or

Officers as fhall be appointed to receive the fame; and this to be in Lieu of all other Rents and Services whatfoever.


