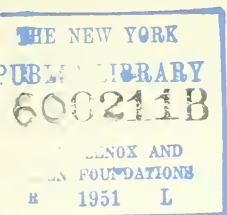

JOHN HENRY

JOHN HENRY, the second child of Robert and Mary Henry, was born in Derry County, Ireland, in March, 1763. His mother's maiden name was Woodburn. He came to America in 1788, landing at Philadelphia, near where he remained about three years, working most of the time on a farm in Chester County. At this time he concluded to return to Ireland, and hoping to add something to his scanty means he decided to invest his earnings in flax seed. With this merchandise he sailed for Ireland to join his family, but on the coast of that island, in sight of his home, the vessel was wrecked and his flax seed went to the bottom of the ocean. By this accident he lost nearly all the fortune he possessed. After remaining there about two years he again sailed for Philadelphia bringing with him his wife and youngest son Matthew, leaving his eldest son, John, with his father. John remained in Ireland until he grew to manhood when he came to Nova Scotia and there engaged in farming. As no communication between him and the rest of the family has taken place for many years, it is not known what became of him.

Mr. Henry, after arriving in America the second time, settled in Chester County, Penna, and remained there until 1801, when he came to Washington County, Ohio. Here he rented a farm in Newport Township and remained on it about five years, when he bought a farm on the Ohio River, five miles below Harmar, now West Marietta, to which he at once removed and spent a number of years improving. He had, when a young man, learned the trade of a wheelwright, and after he came to Ohio was able to turn his knowledge to profitable account, there being a good demand for flax-wheels among the early settlers, where almost every family used one for the manufacture of its own cloth, and by industry, he could make two wheels a week, which were worth four dollars each. The high water in the Ohio River in 1815 decided him to sell his farm, having already bought section 33 in what is now Bern Township, Athens County, Ohio.

John Henry with two sons Matthew and Robert and two daughters Janette and Nancy came from the Ohio River farm in February, 1817, to what is now the farm of Carlos D. Henry and made sugar molasses, and April 17, 1817,

he moved the family to his new home in Bern Township. Here he lived until the time of his death which occurred February 27th, 1854, aged 90 years, 11 months and 7 days. During his long life he was a continuous example of industry and economy. He was twice married, his first wife was Rachel Henry, whom he married in Ireland in 1787. She died in 1809. He in 1811 married Margaret McNutt, who died April 12th, 1857. His children by the first wife were five sons and four daughters, and by the last, four sons and

six daughters, in all nineteen children; one daughter died in infancy, but the remaining eighteen Mr. Henry lived to see grow to manhood and womanhood. At the time of his death he had nearly 60 grand children and ten great grandchildren living.

The Will of John Henry

I, John Henry, of Bern Township, Athens County and State of Ohio, do make and publish this my last will and testament—

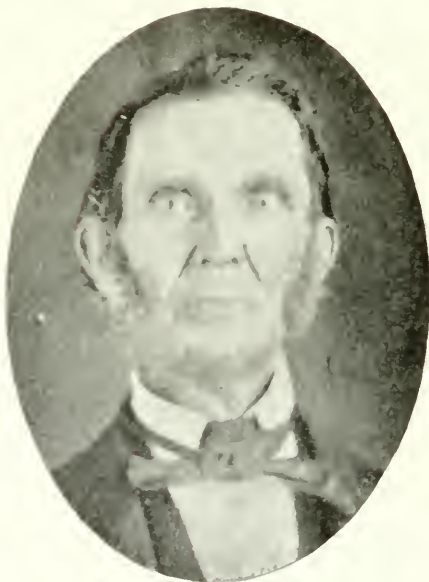
Item 1st—I give and bequeath to my wife, Margaret, all of the goods and chattles that are in the house to be disposed of as she may think proper, and also the East part of the house as long as she please to occupy it.

Item 2nd—I give to my son Charles all the land that I now own and possess together with all the horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, grain, farming utensils, tools and other property that may be on the farm at my decease, said Charles is hereby bound to give to his Mother in lieu of her dower a good and ample support during her natural life on the farm and if my said wife shall choose to leave the premises and reside elsewhere, the said Charles shall pay her in stead of her sup-

was born in Danvers, Essex County, Mass., April 13, 1795, and died on the farm near Amesville, Ohio, Nov. 23, 1882, aged 87 years.

Matthew Henry when about 6 months of age, came with his parents from Ireland to the United States and con-

tinued to be with his father until the year 1817, when he settled on a part of the tract of land previously purchased by his father, where he set to work clearing his land and improving his home. He followed the avocation of a farmer until his death and was highly successful. Although he never aspired to publicity, he accepted the proffered suffrage of his friends and was elected to many local offices of trust and responsibility, having served as Township Trustee 1837, 1838 and 1839, and Justice of the Peace, 1831-1834.

Matthew Henry and his wife were active members of Presbyterian Church, having joined at the time of its organization at Amesville, in 1832.

Janet Henry came from Chester County, Penna., with her parents to near Warren, Washington County, Ohio, when she was six years of age. At this early date (1801) the methods of travel were primitive and while the father moved the household goods in a wagon, the mother and children came as far as Pittsburg (Fort Pitt) on horseback. The mother rode one horse and carried the baby (Nancy) in her arms while Matthew, the eight year old son rode a horse across whose back a sack was placed with Janet in one end and Robert, four years old, in the other. The pair of cramped legs during this journey was one of the memories of her life time.

When Janet was 14 years old and there were nine children, the mother died leaving the care of the younger sisters and brothers a heavy burden upon her frail shoulders. Her opportunities for further education were cut off and her physical growth stopped, so she was always very small. In 1817 on April 17th, the family moved to Athens County and settled in Bern Township, where she lived for 3 years prior to her marriage. Then she moved to a farm in Ames Township. Janet (Henry) Glazier was a charter member of the Amesville Presbyterian Church in 1832 and her whole life was consistently devoted to the services of others and to the honor of her Master. She was peculiarly gentle and unassuming and was beloved by all who knew her.

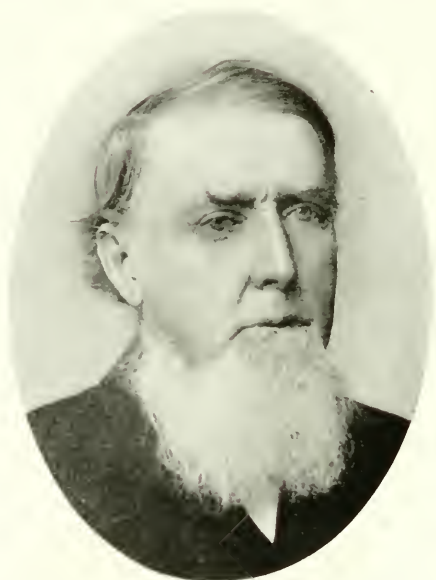

Robert Henry came from Chester County, Penn., with his parents in 1801 to a farm near Newport, Washington County, Ohio. When he was three years of age, in 1806, he moved again with his parents to a farm they had purchased five miles below Harmar, now West Marietta, Ohio, where he spent eleven years, when the family moved to Bern Township, Athens County, Ohio, April 17, 1817. Here he assisted his father in clearing his land and opening up their frontier home. Having by this time more than an ordinary education, he engaged in the winter in teaching school and working on the farm in the summer. In 1826 immediately after his marriage, he settled on his own farm adjoining his father's where he resided until his death, a period of over 54 years.

He was progressive to a degree, when the steel plow share began to be used, he decided to have one for his plow, so he walked to Marietta, Ohio, and purchased a plow share and a crane for the fire place, returning the same day, a distance of 60 miles, and carrying a load of nearly 30 lbs. During his life he held several local offices of trust and responsibility. In 1826 he was commissioned by Governor Jeremiah Morrow, Captain of the Second Light Infantry Co., First Brigade, Third Division, Militia of Ohio, which office he held until 1830 when he resigned his com-

mission. In the fall of 1829 he received the appointment as postmaster at Amesville, Ohio, being the second Postmaster in that Township.

In 1834 he was elected Justice of Peace which office he

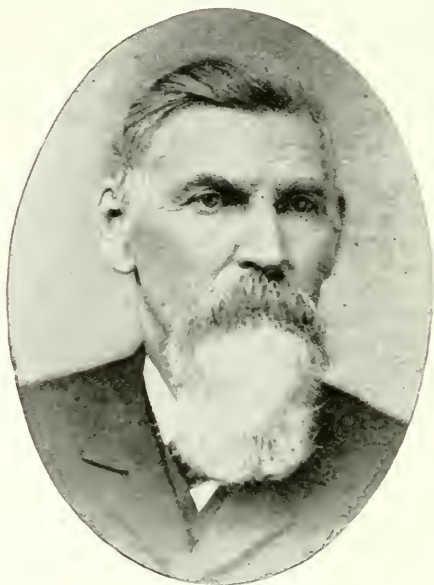

CHARLES O. HENRY, Kankakee, Illinois.

(Master Engineer, Senior Grade) Enlisted April 16, 1917, in Indiana Engineers Corps. Mustered into service August 5, 1917, went to Camp Shelby for training and was there until August, 1918, then sent to Camp Mills embarkation camp, landed at Brest, France, August 28, 1918. Sent to Latracey, from there assigned to First Army for duty on the front. In December he rejoined his Regiment and was stationed at Greves, Germany. Returned to the United States on the "Great Northern," and discharged at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio, June 28, 1919.

HAVEN A. HENRY, Galion, Ohio

(Aero Gunner) Enlisted April 6, 1917 in the United States Marine Corps, stationed at Paris Island and trained in the 13th Co. H. 5th Regiment. Transferred October, 1917, to the Aviation Section of the Marine Corps, stationed at Pensacola, Florida, and qualified as Aero-Gunner of Marine Section. Discharged March 15, 1919.

GEORGE D. HENRY, Amesville, Ohio

(Private) Inducted at the Ohio University Unit of the Students Army Training Corps October 1, 1918. Discharged December 1, 1918.

HAROLD M. HENRY, Amesville, Ohio

(Private) Enlisted in the Army of Occupation April 1, 1919. Was overseas, returned and discharged in October, 1920.

Z. L. HENRY, Amesville, Ohio

(Lieutenant Colonel) Commissioned a 1st Lieutenant, Medical Reserve Corps, September 30, 1908, and ordered to active duty October 13, 1908. Re-commissioned as 1st Lieutenant Medical Section Officers Reserve Corps, March 24, 1917. Commissioned as Captain Medical Section Officers Reserve Corps, August 21, 1917. Commissioned as Major, Medical Section Officers Reserve Corps, November 19, 1917. Commissioned as Lieutenant Colonel Medical Corps, October 25, 1918. Service as follows: October 1908 to December 1909, Fort Thomas, Kentucky; January, 1910 to December 1911, Philippine Islands; January 1912 to November 1913, Fort Sill, Oklahoma; January 1914 to December 1915, Philippine Islands; January 1916 to May 1917, Monterey, California; Douglas, Arizona, and various points near Douglas, on Mexican Border. (Private) Enlisted July 1918, in U. S. Marine Corps, trained at Paris Island, South Carolina, and at Quantico, Virginia. Arrived in France in October, 1918, and was assigned to Co. C., 11 Regiment U. S. Marines, which regiment was in reserve during the Meuse-Argonne Offensive. After the armistice was signed on November 11, 1918, this regiment did guard duty at Mehun and Jievres, France. Returned to the United States in August, 1919, and was discharged at Hampton Roads, Virginia, August 11, 1919.

HAROLD L. HENRY, Amesville, Ohio

(Private) Enlisted in December 1917, at Athens, Ohio, was assigned to the 10th Field Artillery, and joined the Regiment at Douglas, Arizona, December 15, 1917. Landed in Europe March 10, 1918. Service in Europe: Training period, March 10 to July 6, 1918, Camp Coctquidan, France. Champagne-Marne Offensive, July 15 to August 2, 1918, Chateau Thierry Sectors. Training period Gondrecourt Area August 19 to September 4, 1918, Dainville, France. St. Mehil Offensive—September 12 to 16, 1918, St. Mehil Sector. Meuse-Argonne Offensive September 26 to November 11, 1918, Verdun Sector. Other Engagements: July 9 to 15, 1918, Chateau Thierry Sector. Army of Occupation, December 1, 1918 to July 31, 1919. Cited for bravery on the battle field, by his Brigade Commander. Entitled to wear a Silver Star in addition to 4 Bronze Stars. Particular Duties in Organization—Runner, Radio Operator. Arrived in the U. S., August 23, 1919. Discharged August 29, 1919, at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio.

RAY HENRY, U. S. Army, Hotel Belmont, Belmont, Ark.

(Captain) Enlisted at Indianapolis, Indiana, September 27, 1904 and served as Private, Corporal, Sergeant, Metrological Observer, 1st Class Gunner Coast Artillery Corps at Key West, Florida, three years, discharged with character "Very Good" September 26, 1907. Re-enlisted at Fort Slocum, N. Y., November 27, 1908, sent to Co. L 13th Infantry at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and served as Private, Corporal and Sergeant in Companies "L" and "E" 13th Infantry, three years, being discharged with character "Excellent" November 26, 1911. Re-enlisted in Army Service Schools, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and served as Private, Corporal and Sergeant from November 27, 1911 until November 26, 1914. Discharged with character "Excellent." Served three years in the Philippine Islands. Entered First Officers Training Camp, Fort Riley, Kansas, May 8, 1917. Served three months as Assistant Instructor, being commissioned as Captain of Infantry on August 15, 1917. Commanding the 14th Company 2nd Officers Training Camp, at Fort Sheridan, Illinois from August 27, 1917 to November 27, 1917. Trained and commissioned 115 officers out of a class of 132 students. Transferred to Camp Hancock, Augusta, Georgia, duty as Supply Officer for Brigade of Motor Mechanics, Aviation Section, Signal Corps, to January 31, 1918. Commandant of Cadets, University of Cincinnati, Cincinnati, Ohio, from January 31, 1918 to July 30, 1918. Sent to Camp Pike, Arkansas, July 30, 1918 and assigned to duty as Commanding Officer Company H. 4th Regiment Replacements, trained and sent to France an average of 200 men per month until December, 1918. Transferred and placed in command of Co. H. 2nd Regiment Replacements January 1, 1919. Placed on duty as Assistant Demobilization Officer of Camp Pike, Arkansas on February 1, 1919. To duty as Chief of Demobilization, Camp Pike on March 1, 1919. Relieved from this duty on June 1, 1919 and detailed for duty as Receiving Officer, Demobilization Group, Camp Pike, Arkansas, on which duty I am at present serving. Total service as an enlisted man, 9 years. Total service as an officer, 2 years. (August 13, 1919.)

MARION B. HENRY, Ranger, Texas

(Private) Spent his time of service at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio, part of the time being very ill in the Hospital.

WM. H. HENRY, Hamden, Ohio

(Major) Entered the service July 15, 1917, and served in various capacities up until July, 1918, most of the time being spent at Camp Custer, Michigan, as Regimental Surgeon of the 310th Regiment Engineers. Started for overseas service in July, 1918, and arrived in Liverpool, England, on August 4, 1918. Here one Regiment of Infantry and one-half of his Regiment of Engineers was chosen to go to Russia. They spent three weeks in England being equipped for Russian service, and sailed from Newcastle, England, for Archangel, Russia, September 4, 1918. On the voyage to Archangel, the Influenza epidemic broke out and they had 300 men sick, when they arrived at Archangel they buried nearly 100 men in two weeks. The city being practically destitute, and conditions very bad however the men were sent immediately to the front and some of them were fighting the next day. Fighting kept up continuously from that time until the 27th of June, 1919. Major Wm. H. Henry's work was almost entirely in the hospitals. He was for the first three months in charge of American sick in a large English hospital and after that time up until he left he was in charge of The American Red Cross Hospital, which was the only hospital that the Americans had with the exception of a Field Hospital up near the front lines.

H. G. HENRY, Amesville, Ohio

(Corporal) Enlisted at Athens, Ohio, September 17, 1917, in Company L 7th Regiment Ohio National Guard. Transferred October 28, 1917 to Battery A 136th Field Artillery. Served remainder of time with this organization. Promotions: Private 1st class to Corporal, November 18, 1918. Service: Marbache, Meuse Argonne and Puvencelle sectors. Oversea 9 months. Discharged at Camp Sherman, Ohio, April 10, 1919.

CLARENCE HOWARD, Cary, Ohio

Enlisted in April, 1918. Assigned to Chemical Warfare Gas Division. Discharged December, 1918.

CLYDE HOWARD, Cary, Ohio

Enlisted in Co. I 166th Infantry, O. N. G. Went to France with the Rainbow Division November 1917. Took part in six of the twelve big offensives. Discharged May 28, 1919.

FRED MARTIN, Chicago, Illinois

Enlisted in the Aviation branch in April, 1918, assigned to Minola Aviation Field in New York. Discharged March, 1919.

BRAINARD MORRIS, Marietta, Ohio

Enlisted in April, 1918 in the 34th Engineers Corps, was stationed at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind. Left Fort Benjamin Harrison for Camp Upton, Long Island, New York, August 6, 1918, and sailed for overseas August 15, 1918, landing at Liverpool, England, August 28, 1918. Landed at La Havre, France, September 3, 1918, and after more than eleven months service in France returned to the U. S., landing at Norfolk, Virginia, August 5, 1919. Discharged at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio, August 12, 1919.

FRED L. MORROW

(2nd Lieutenant) Enlisted and was sent to the First Officers Training Camp at Fort Benjamin Harrison. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant in Field Artillery. Served with the 323rd Field Artillery from September 15, 1918 to February 28, 1919. Took part in the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, and was in Germany with the Army of Occupation. Oversea one year. Discharged August, 1919.

LYLE S. MORROW

(2nd Lieutenant) Enlisted in the fourth Officers Training Camp at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio. Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant in Infantry August, 1918. Was ready to sail for France when the Armistice was signed. Discharged December, 1918.

DANA RUSSELL OWEN, Parkersburg, W. Va.

(Private) Enlisted May 15, 1918, and was sent to Richmond, Virginia, to a mechanical training school. Transferred July 13, 1918 to Co. F. 28th Engineers Corps at Camp Bally McElroy, Woodbridge, Virginia, leaving there for overseas duty on August 27, 1918, landing at Brest, France, September 12, 1918. Thirteen days after landing

he detrained at Clairmon en Argonne under shell fire and the following day (Sept. 27) he went with his company to repair the roads between the Artillery and Infantry lines; he spent 47 days in the Meuse-Argonne offensive. After the armistice was signed he joined a show troupe to help entertain the soldiers until their turn to go home. He sailed for home June 24, 1919. Discharged at Camp Meade, Maryland, July 11, 1919.

AUSTIN OWEN, Springfield, Ohio

(Private) Entered the service June 1, 1918. Was stationed at Vancouver Barracks, Vancouver, Washington; Agate Beach, Oregon; and Angeles, Washington. Discharged February 5, 1919.

DRAPER ORR, Alamosa, Colo.

(Private) Member of the Colorado National Guards on Duty at Fort Garden. (No record supplied.)

HARRY M. RAMBO

(Lieutenant) Was in the U. S. Navy. (No record supplied.)

GEO. RAYMOND SMITH, Detroit, Michigan

(Yeoman 1st Class) Enlisted in the U. S. Navy at Detroit, Michigan, and was sent to the River Rouge Naval Station, near Detroit, for destroyer duty overseas. Was placed in the Pay Masters Office at the Naval Station and remained there throughout the war, released from active duty December 20, 1918.

WILBER A. STEWART, Cincinnati, Ohio

(1st Lieutenant) Enlisted late in the summer of 1917 in the Signal Corps Department, commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant March, 1918, and sailed for France in September, 1918, as 1st Lieutenant, served in France until July 1919.

HAROLD C. STEWART, Cincinnati, Ohio

(Sergeant) Entered the service July 1918, in the Artillery Dept., and was soon transferred to the Signal Corps. Sailed for France, September, 1918. Served in France until July 1919.

HENRY D. WHITAKER, Cincinnati, Ohio

(Ensign) Enlisted April 9, 1917, for Coast Defense. Transferred to Department of Naval Aviation October 29, 1917. Awarded Pilots License February 17, 1918 from Princeton Aviation Club. Technical Training acquired at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Air Station, graduating April 27; Hydroplane and Advanced Training at Key West and Miami, Florida, May 1 to July 13. Commissioned Ensign July 13, 1918. Sailed for France, August 6, 1918, via Paris to Moutchic near Bordeaux; August 20 to October 1, training in Bombing. Transferred to St. Ingelvert near Calais for active duty under the Northern Bombing Group, October 1 to November 29. Returned to America December 18. Discharged at Newport News, Virginia, January 8, 1919.

For the benefit of the descendants of John Henry, if any should wish to make the "Henry Genealogy" more complete the Author takes pleasure in publishing the following brief sketch of Robert Henry Jr., and his family, the third child of Robert and Mary Henry of Flower Hill, County Derry, Ireland.

Robert Jr. was the next younger than John Henry, and was born in County Derry, Ireland, in 1772, he came to Canada and settled at Mono-Center, Dufferin County, Ontario, Canada, sixty miles north of Toronto, and ten miles east of Orangeville where he lived until his death March 14, 1861, aged 89 years. His wife, Sarah Henry, preceeded him by 13 years, having died in 1848, aged 76 years, their remains are at rest in the old Mono Cemetery, four miles east of Orangeville, Ontario. Andrew was the father of nine children: Maggie, Elizabeth, Charlotte, Robert, William A., A. Edmond, Richard, Florence, Earl Heber.

Alexander was the father of seven children: Robert James, Maggie, Esther, Agnes, Mallissa, Edith and Maude.

The Author has had the privilege of visiting the family of Andrew on three occasions and by correspondence has been enabled to keep in touch with them more closely than the other branches of the family.

Elizabeth (Henry) Cobean was born in 1859 and resides at 373 Wellesley St., Toronto, Ontario, Canada.

Charlotte (Henry) Falconer resides in Sarnia, Ont., Canada.

Robert Henry resides in Calarney, Manitoba, Canada.

William A. Henry resides at Orangeville, R. F. D. No. 1, Ontario, Canada. He lives on the farm where he was born in 1868.

Andrew Edmond Henry resides in Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada.

Florence (Henry) Island resides at 373 Wellesley St., Toronto, Canada.

Maggie and Richard died a few years back.

William A. and Jessie Henry are the parents of five children: Norma A., born in 1898; Andrew C., born in 1901; Jean, born in 1903; Kenneth, born in 1907, and Wallace, born in 1914.

REMINISCENCES OF MATHEW HENRY

Amesville, Ohio, August 5, 1915.

I feel this a great privilege to meet with our friends and cousins once more, though there has been many changes since we last met at the reunion with our cousin Carlos D. Henry and later on with cousin Millie and Jasper Brown. Now I don't know what to say of the John Henry family that has not been said, so I will talk of my father Mathew Henry, the second son of John Henry, was born in Ireland, and at the early age of 6 months came with his father's family to this country and then became one of the early settlers of this part of Ohio, and as years rolled on, Mathew Henry married Lavinia Proctor. She was born in Danvers, Essex County, Massachusetts, April 17, 1795. In September of the same year her father started with his family for the Northwest Territory, but after being on the road some six weeks the weather became so severe they were compelled to stop until the following spring, when they resumed their journey. After many hardships they landed at Marietta, Washington County, Ohio, May, 1796, and lived in a "Blockhouse" at that place with several other families. Mathew Henry and Lavinia Proctor were married August 16, 1817 and settled on a farm in Bern Township, near Amesville, Ohio, where they spent all their days. My parents had a family of eight children, five girls and three boys. I, the youngest of the family am permitted to meet with you today at the age of 77 years and 4 months. Now the change in my childhood, home, father, mother, brothers and sisters have all passed away and I am still left, and I want to live so I may meet all the loved ones.

REMINISCENCES OF WILLIAM HENRY

William Henry was born in 1804 at Newport, Ohio, 8 miles above Marietta, Ohio. In 1809 his mother died, he being only 5 years of age, and there being six older and two younger children. He was the seventh child in a family of nine. When quite young, on account of exposure from a flood in the Ohio river he came near dying.

In an early date he bought a farm near Haydenville, Ohio, but did not move onto it, the canal being located there he thought it would not be a healthy place to live, so he sold the farm at a good margin and bought the William Stewart farm eight miles east of Athens, Ohio. This farm was the birthplace of five of we children, two older brothers being born in Bern Township. My father always had a good word for all of his brothers and sisters, and was always glad to have them come on a visit, as one of the family said he always came out clapping his hands and expressing joy at their coming. Father was a good man, loved and respected by all of his neighbors. At his funeral were all classes of people, the poorest and the wealthiest of the county. Brother Pilcher said of him that he was the most generous giver and never failed when asked for charity.

Father was very brave and fearless. One time he rafted a bunch of logs and floated down the river to find a better hitching place, he then threw the chain around a sapling and in so doing he caught his finger and came near being dragged off the raft into the river, but instead he pulled his finger off at the first joint and went home alone with it in his hand. Another time he was caught on the south side of the Hocking river and a sudden rise came, and he was obliged to swim his horse to get home. Mr. Halbirt told him he could not ford, but in a little while he called back, "I am over." Mr. Halbirt told me he was the most venturesome man he ever saw.

In an early day he worked for some of his neighbors with four yoke of oxen for \$1.00 per day.

He often killed squirrels with a club as they swam across the Ohio river. He wore a long linen coat in the pocket of which he carried a twelve and one-half cent piece for luck. He died in August 1882, in his 78th year. On being told that he would not get well, he said that he had lived with the view that he would have to die. We laid him to rest on the old home farm to await the resurrection of the just.

REMINISCENCES OF JOHN HENRY

Being only 2 years and 26 days old when my grandfather (John Henry) died, I have no recollection of him whatever, and only remember seeing my grandmother but once. I distinctly remember my mother so often speaking how strictly my grandfather adhered to the old Presbyterian Faith and how especially strict he was on the Sabbath day. No playing for the children, and no unnecessary work whatever was allowed done, not even grinding coffee. If the coffee was not ground on Saturday there was no coffee Sunday. No beds made, nor anything whatever done that could be dispensed with. At one time my grandfather thought he was loosing corn. His crib being made of timbers split from large trees, there were openings where one could reach through and get corn. He placed a large bear trap inside, and the next morning when he went to the door a man was standing by the crib—a neighbor. Grandfather said, "Good morning John, come in." Of course the man stood still, and after a short time he released him, filled the sack with corn, took him in the house and gave him his breakfast, and allowed him to go home, but he never took any more corn there. I remember of mother telling what grandfather told of his trip back to Ireland after having been in America three years. When they went to their first meal after he had gotten back to Ireland, they began with potatoes, peeling them by pinching the end off and placing in the left hand between the thumb and forefinger (which were brought together in a circle). Then they would hit the potato with the other hand. They said to him, "John have a 'procrather.'" He said "Naw, I'll not have none of 'em." He had been eating with knives and forks and felt very much up in the world. I remember mother telling of one morning he got up and found a bear in his pig pen, and called for his gun, but the bear left too soon.

REMINISCENCES AND EARLY HISTORY OF THE SETTLEMENT OF AMES AND BERN TWPS.

We have heard much of great interest to us concerning the Henry family who, in 1817, moved to their new home on Federal Creek, and I wish to add a few facts concerning the early settlement of the Township to which they came—Ames Township as it was until 1828* when Bern Township became a separate organization. The first settle-

ment was upon lands of the Ohio Company's Purchase and owned by Ephraim Cutler, whose father Rev. Manasseh Cutler, for fifty two years pastor of a Congregational church in Hamilton, Mass., was the negotiator with Congress in the year 1787 for the purchase of a million and a half acres of land called the Ohio Company's Purchase, by means of which the settlement of Ohio was effected. In 1788 a band of forty-eight migrated from New England under General Rufus Putnam and upon arriving at Marietta, April 7th, Jervis Cutler, a son of Dr. Manasseh Cutler, was the first to leap on shore and later claimed the honor of having cut the first tree. The work of surveying was long delayed by Indian hostilities, and the first settlement at Athens was only about a year previous to that in Ames Township. In the summer of 1797, Ephraim Cutler finding that a considerable portion of his lands lay on the waters of Federal Creek and wanting to visit them and fix their location, explored a way and cut out a pack-horse path twenty miles through the wilderness from Waterford on the Muskingum river to what is now Ames Township; he was accompanied and assisted by Captain George Ewing who with his family had come from Western Virginia to the Ohio Company's Purchase in 1794 and had lived in one of the block-houses of the Waterford settlement. Later in the season they made a second trip and a more thorough exploration of Mr. Cutler's lands and this time were accompanied by Captain Benjamin Brown who had recently arrived from Massachusetts. Ewing and Brown each owned a hundred acres in the Company's donation tract on the Muskingum which they exchanged with Mr. Cutler for land on Federal Creek, agreeing to assist him in forming a settlement. Mr. Ewing brought his family out in March, 1798 and settled on what is now known as the Thomas Gardiner farm, now owned by T. M. Fleming, and nearly a year later Judge Cutler and Capt. Brown moved from Waterford, their household goods in canoes and in charge of Captain Brown down the Muskingum and Ohio rivers to the mouth of Hocking and up that stream to Federal Creek, a distance of eighty miles; while Mr. Cutler with four horses took the women and children through the woods to their new home. Mr. Cutler and Capt. Brown settled on the farm now known as the Daniel Fleming farm owned by his son G. L. Fleming, one mile north of Amesville. Cutler removed from Ames Township in 1806 and settled on the Ohio river near the old John Henry home and from him and his family they heard most of the advantages and opportunities in the Federal Valley. Captain Ewing moved to Indiana in 1818 and about the same time Captain Brown went to live with his son (Gen-

eral John Brown) in Athens where he died in October, 1821. One great grandson of his is yet with us, James Abel Henry whose mother was Lavina Glazier and her mother Sallie Brown. Among the families who had settled in Ames Township before the coming of the Henry family and who were neighbors, in spirit at least, we note in the order of their coming that of Judge Silvanus Ames on what we now know as the John J. Beasley farm, owned by Frank J. Beasley; Colonel Absalom Boyles who lived for sixty-two years on the farm known as the Ed Curtis farm now owned by O. D. Jones; Joshua Wyatt where William E. Potter now lives; the McCune families, Samuel, John and Thomas; John Brown a nephew of Capt. Brown who lived many years on what we know as the Elisha Johnson farm; the Jason and Sabinus Rice families; the Judge Walker family where Loring Hill now lives; Abel Glazier who in 1804 bought of his father-in-law (Captain Brown) the Fleming farm and very near, Dr. Ezra Walker the first resident physician in the township when country practice was not easy, there were very few roads and evidently none from the John Henry farm toward Amesville but across the hills to the upper, or Cutler settlement as it was long known. There were the families of Isaac Linscott and of David Rathburn a little farther north and farther up the stream on the east were the families of Capt. Thomas Lovell and his brother Russell who settled on adjoining farms in 1814.

My recollection of the moving of the Henry family from Warren, Washington County, to the farm on Federal Creek as told me by my grandmother Jane (Jinet) Henry Glazier is that very early in the spring of 1817 the father and older sons, Matthew and Robert, and two daughters, Nancy and Mary (Polly) came to open the sugar camp and begin the erection of the home. The trip at that time of the year (February) could not have been an easy or speedy one, but they had tired of the destruction wrought by frequent high water upon their river farm and not only the land but their house and even the furniture had been damaged by the muddy water. A bureau that I prize because given me by my grandmother many years ago, and one of her girlhood treasures, shows yet the effect of the damaging waters of the "Beautiful River."

One bear story I will remember as an occurrence of the first summer in the new home, when one warm evening as they were at supper, a squealing pig brought out the family in time to see a bear hurrying off with a pig in his arms. The dogs gave chase and to escape with his life "Bruin" dropped the pig, but not until he had squeezed it to death.

One thing of which I have often heard occurred while the home was yet in Washington County, when my mother's (Sarah Ann, daughter of Matthew and Mary Park Henry) grandfather, a comparatively new arrival from Ireland, came one evening to the home of John Henry and to the inquiry "Who is there?" replied "A stranger." The voice was immediately recognized, and with the "Come in Robert, come in," the warmest welcome was assured, and as grandmother always added, "Those two old men did not go to bed at all that night," they were so happy in talking over old friends and old times in Ireland. Though both families were Henrys and they had been friends in Ireland, yet it is not known that they are related, but many of their descendants are.

* March 3, 1828, the county commissioners (George Walker, Harry Henshaw and Justus Reynolds) resolved "that the original surveyed township No. 7 in Range 12 in Athens County, at present a part of Ames Township, be set off, and that a township by the name of Bern be established as above described." The electors were directed to meet at the house of John Henry on the first Monday of April, at 9 o'clock A. M., to elect township officers. (The following officers were elected: Trustees—John Henry, James Dickey and John Wickham. Justices of the Peace—Thaddeus Crippen and Wm. T. Brown.)

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
