The Thirteenth Regiment, N. G. of Pa., was organized in October, 1878, at the time of the general re-organization of the State Militia, upon the foundation offered by the Battalion of the Scranton City Guard. The four Companies composing the S. C. G., now Companies A, B, C and D, Thirteenth Regiment, were the outgrowth of the brave and historic "Citizens' Corps," recruited upon the call of Mayor McKune for the preservation of law and order at the time of the labor troubles in the summer of 1877, forty of whose members hastily assembled at a moment's notice and dispersed the mob which had attacked the Mayor. At that time the necessity for an efficient military organization impressed itself so forcibly upon the minds of the people that a large subscription was raised for the equipment of the Scranton City Guard, by means of which these four companies were not only fully uniformed, but a plot of ground on Adams avenue was purchased, and supplemented by a loan a substantial and commodious Armory of brick was built for them. The

BUSINESS DIRECTORY.

Armory contains two headquarters rooms, four company rooms, a drill room 75x90 feet, a janitor's room and store room. The building committee was composed of Messrs. Jas. Archbald, Wm. Cornell and N. A. Schoonmaker, on the part of the citizens, and Major H. M. Boies, Capt. A. Bryson, Jr., and Lieut. Wm. Kellow, three of the Guard. The corner-stone was laid by the Masonic Fraternity in the presence of a large concourse and with appropriate ceremonies, November 14, 1877, and it was opened for use by a grand military ball January 31, 1878. The Scranton City Guard had the honor of receiving and escorting the President of the United States upon the occasion of his visit to the Wyoming Centennial, July 3, 1878, and was highly complimented for their discipline and drill the next day in Wilkesbarre. In August of that year, the Honesdale Guard (Co. E), and the Guards of Carbondale (Co. F), were recruited and added to the Battalion, which was subsequently organized as a Regiment by the addition of the Zouaves, of Susqueĥanna (Co. G), and Captain Boone's Company of the old Ninth Regiment, from Pleasant Valley (Co. H), and now enjoys the reputation of being one of the crack regiments of the State, composed as it is of the representative men of Lackawanna county and the

counties adjoining.
