A history of the Adamson family of America is being prepared for publication so that the genealogy of this important clan may be preserved as a permanent record.

Although years of labor have been spent upon this task the work is still incomplete because of the lack of necessary data concerning certain branches of the family. In many cases the dates of births and deaths are missing and in some cases even the names of children and their connections by marriage are not available.

In order that the history may be complete, every member of the family should take a deep interest in making sure that all the facts are included. To stimulate a more active interest in the subject, this brief pamphlet is being distributed among members of the family with the request that they supply missing data and make corrections in names, dates, or degree of relationship.

It is especially desired that those who bear the Adamson name should furnish information regarding their family on the maternal side for as long a period in the past as such facts are obtainable. Unfortunately, this information has not been given fully except in the family of Nathaniel Coates Adamson.

The record given here contains only about 2,000 names. It does not relate the early beginnings of the family in this country, but starts with John Baldwin Adamson, of Maryland.

Nearly all the Adamsons of the United States are descended from the Maryland family of that name.

JOHN BALDWIN ADAMSON.

Most of them are the descendants of John Baldwin Adamson, who lived on a tract of land known as "Adamson's Choice," conveyed to him by a patent granted to him by Lord Baltimore, proprietor of the Province of Maryland, under date of July 2, 1726. "Adamson's Choice" was then in Prince George County, later Frederick County, and now Montgomery County, in a district known as Scotland, on Captain John's Creek, about three and one-half miles from Rockville.

Adamson of Prince Georges County in our said province of Maryland hath due unto him one hundred acres of land within our said province by virtue of a warrant for that quantity granted him the twenty-second day of July, Seventeen hundred and twenty-six as appears in our Land Office and upon such conditions of plantation of our Province bearing date the fifth day of April, Sixteen hundred and eighty-four and remaining upon record in our said province together with such alterations as in them is made by our further conditions bearing date the fourth day of December, Sixteen hundred and ninety-six, Together also with ye alterations made by our instructions bearing date at London the twelfth day of September, Seventeen hundred and twelve and registered in our Secretary's Office.

We do therefore hereby grant unto him the said John Baldwin Adamson all that tract or parcel of land called "Adamson's Choice" lying in Prince Georges County near Capt. Johns.

Beginning at the end of the first line of a tract of land called Constant Friendship, running thence south two hundred and ten perches west eighty perches north nineteen degrees west one hundred perches, North thirty degrees east forty perches, then with a straight line to ye beginning.

Containing now laid out for one hundred acres of land, more or less, according to the certificate of survey thereof taken and returned into

our Land Office bearing date the tenth day of January, Seventeen hundred and twenty-six and there remaining, Together with all rights profits benefits and privileges thereunto belonging, (Royal Mines Excepted).

To Have and To Hold the same unto him ye said John Baldwin Adamson his heirs and assigns forever, To be holden of us and our heirs as of our Manor of Calverton in free and common soccage by fealty only for all manner of services yielding and paying therefore yearly unto us and our heirs at our Receipt at the City of St. Maries at the two most usual feasts in the year, viz. The feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Michael the Arch Angel by even and equal portions the rent of four shillings sterling in silver or gold and for a fine upon every alienation of ye said land or any part or parcel thereof one while years rent in silver or gold or the full value thereof in such commodities as we and our heirs or such officer or officers that shall be appointed by us ^{www.genealogy-books.com} and our heirs from time to time to collect and receive the same shall accept in discharge thereof at ye choice of us and our heirs or such officer or officers aforesaid, Provided that if the said sum for a fine for alienation shall not be paid unto us and our heirs or such officer aforesaid before such alienation and the said alienation shall be entered upon record either in the Provincial Court or County Court where ye same parcel or land lyeth within one month next after such alienation then ye said alienation shall be void and of no effect.

Given under our Great Seal at Armes this twelfth day of November, Seventeen hundred and twenty-nine. Witness our Dear Brother Benedict Leonard Calvert, Esq. Gov. and Commander in Chief in and over our said Province of Maryland, Chancellor and Keeper of the Great Seal thereof.

The original record of the grant of this patent by the Lord Proprietor is now on record in the Land Office at Annapolis, Maryland.

A certified copy of this patent as signed and sealed by Benedict Leonard Calvert, Lord Baltimore's brother, is as follows:

John Baldwin Adamson and his wife Lucy Adamson, settled on "Adamson's Choice" immediately after the grant of the patent.

This John Baldwin Adamson should not be confused with Captain John Adamson, a relative, whose wife also was named Lucy.

Captain John Adamson was a very wealthy land owner who lived in the same section, but no Adamson in the United States descended from him. He left three children, Sarah, who married _____ Johnson; Rachel, who married William Tannehill, and Rebecca, who married Richard Beall, son of Ninian Beall, Jr., of the famous Ninian Beall family of Maryland.

Captain John Adamson died in 1782. His will is on record both in Annapolis and at Frederick, Maryland. Other records are on file at the same places and in Rockville, Montgomery Co., Maryland, and Upper Marlboro in Prince Georges Co., Maryland.

A grandson of Captain John Adamson was Adamson Tannehill, who was a Captain in the Revolutionary war, and later a Congressman from Pennsylvania.

John Baldwin Adamson and his wife Lucy, had three children, Basil, Jeremiah and Lucy.

John Baldwin Adamson died in 1744. The inventory of his personal estate is on record in Annapolis. He was survived by his wife Lucy, and the three young children, of whom Basil was the eldest.

BASIL ADAMSON.

Basil Adamson was born at Adamson's Choice in 1728. He was sixteen years old at the time of his father's death. He and the other members of his family lived at "Adamson's Choice" until several years after Basil became of age.

On January 13, 1759, Basil Adamson sold "Adamson's Choice" to William Williams. The deed of sale is on record in Frederick Co., Maryland. In the deed Basil Adamson is described as a planter.

Basil Adamson married in 1747 when he was only 19 years old. His wife was Nancy Spiers, a daughter of Benjamin Spiers. They had ten children, the first of whom was John, who was born in 1748.

After the sale of "Adamson's Choice" Basil Adamson and his brother became builders. They had contracts with Frederick Co. for building bridges and for other public work.

The Georgia branch of the family is descended from Basil Adamson, chiefly through one son, Greenberry Adamson.

Basil Adamson's other children were John, Elisha, William, Washington, Frederick, Lloyd, Elizabeth, Keziah and Barbara. Greenberry was next to the youngest son. John, the oldest, served in the Revolutionary War. He died in Maryland in 1828 at the age of 80 years.

Elisha went to North Carolina, Washington to Virginia, and Frederick at first to Virginia, but later to Ohio. William settled in Kentucky. Lloyd remained in Maryland. Greenberry and his three sisters moved to Washington, Wilkes Co., Ga., in 1789, four years after the death of his father, Basil.

Barbara died soon after coming to Georgia. Elizabeth married — Cornwall; and Keziah — Beebe or West.

The history of other branches of the Basil Adamson family will be given later, but as the majority of the family in Georgia descended from Greenberry, his family will be given first place.

GREENBERRY ADAMSON.

Greenberry Adamson was named for a relative of the family to which Col. Nicholas Greenberry, at one time Deputy Governor of Maryland belonged.

Greenberry Adamson was born Oct. 29, 1770, and died March 31, 1831.

Soon after he moved to Georgia in 1789 Greenberry Adamson met Sarah Coates, daughter of Nathaniel Coates and Martha Lamar Coates. He married Sarah Coates Dec. 26, 1793.

Sarah Coates was born Feb. 20, 1774. She died Nov. 8, 1849.

Her father, Nathaniel Coates, was from a Virginia family that had emigrated to Wilkes Co., Georgia, where Nathaniel Coates became High Sheriff. His wife, Martha Lamar, belonged to the celebrated Lamar family of Georgia.

The father of Nathaniel Coates was Henry Coates, at one time of Richmond, Va., who was married to Sarah Young, whose father was a man of great wealth in Scotland. It was that way that the surname Young came to be a given name in the Adamson family.

Greenberry Adamson married Sarah Coates, daughter of Nathaniel Coates, at one time sheriff of Wilkes County. The mother of Sarah Coates was Martha Lamar Coates, of the Lamar family of Georgia.

The children of Greenberry and Sarah Coates Adamson were: John Coates, William Coates, George Washington, Augustus Young, James Jefferson, Martha Lamar, Nathaniel Coates and Mary Amanda.

In 1812 Greenberry Adamson moved to Madison, Morgan County, Ga. He lived there until 1822, when he moved to Henry County and settled in that section which is now Clayton County on the property now owned by Moses Fielder. Greenberry Adamson and Sarah Coates Adamson lived there until their death. They are buried in the family burying place, a short distance from their old home.

The descendants of Greenberry Adamson are recorded here with numbers showing the generation to which they belong, dating from Greenberry as the first:

2. John Coates Adamson, oldest son of Greenberry and Sarah Adamson, was born in Wilkes County, Georgia, Oct. 27, 1794. He enlisted in the war of 1812-1815 in Capt. Philips' Company of the 4th Georgia Reserves in Nov., 1814, and was discharged May, 1815, and later settled near Wetumpka, Ala. On Feb. 6, 1819, he married Nancy

R. Pennington of Autauga County, Alabama, and settled in Tallapoosa County, where he raised a large family of eight boys and four girls. He is said to have been a man of great courage. His wife died in 18.. and he died Aug. 14, 1871. The following are his descendants:

WILLIAM COATES ADAMSON.

2. William Coates, son of Greenberry and Sarah Adamson, was born in Wilkes County, Ga., Feb. 9, 1797; married Elizabeth Crowley of Morgan County, Ga., Dec. 10, 1818, by Robert Benson, Esq. He moved to Henry County in 1822. In 1853 he moved to Randolph County, Ala. His wife died during the war of the sixties. He later settled in Carroll County, Ga., where he died July 13, 1879, aged 82 years. He was a man possessed of a fine intellect; was always posted on current events. While he lived in Henry County he held the office of Justice of the Peace for several years. The following is the genealogy of his family:

2. George Washington Adamson, third son of Greenberry and Sarah Adamson, was born Feb. 22, 1799, in Wilkes County, Ga. Married Mary Gomer of Henry County 1828, by Henry Pope, Esq. He was strictly honest and upright in all his dealings. Although he had little or no education, he generally kept well posted upon current events. He was industrious and never went in debt. It is said he was hardly ever known to buy anything on a credit and was always among the first to meet the tax officers when they came around. He was the father of fifteen children; two died in infancy. He had six sons in the Confederate Army and only one returned at the close. His wife died March 21, 1877. He died in Clayton, Ia., March 19, 1878, aged 79 years. The following is the genealogy of his family:

NATHANIEL COATES ADAMSON.

2. Nathaniel Coates Adamson, son of Greenberry and Sarah Coates Adamson, was born in Washington, Wilkes County, May 22, 1810. He was married to Nancy Bibb McDaniel Sept. 4, 1842.

Nancy Bibb McDaniel was descended from a family closely connected with prominent families of Virginia, South Carolina and Georgia. One of her ancestors was a cousin of George Washington. This was Miss Wyatt, of Prince Edward County, Va., who married John Baldwin, whose father was an Englishman. They had a daughter named Mary Anne Baldwin, who married Henry Terry, a Methodist minister.

The children of Henry Terry and Mary Anne Terry were Nancy Bibb, Sarah Ivy and Henry. After Henry Terry's death his widow and the three children moved from Virginia to take up 2,500 acres of land near Greenville, S. C., which Henry Terry had taken up before his death. Mrs. Terry decided to settle in Petersburg, S. C., where she had a relative, William Bibb, a brother of Henry Terry's mother, Catherine, known as Kitty Bibb. William Bibb was the father of Thomas and William Wyatt Bibb, one of whom was United States Senator from Georgia, and both of whom were later Governors of Alabama, being respectively the first and second Governors of that state. The Bibbs, Terrys and Wyatts were connected with the Clarks, Torrences, Ashmores, Champes and Pembertons.

It was at Petersburg, S. C., that the Terrys met the McDaniels.

Henry McDaniel moved from Amherst County, Va., to Pendleton's District, S. C. His wife was a Gough. The name is now spelled Goff. He lived at Pendleton on a tract of 800 acres of land overlooking the Seneca River.

Henry McDaniel had fourteen children. One daughter married a Boylston of Charleston, and another married Joseph Raines, of Florida.

Philip McDaniel was the youngest of the fourteen children. He was a small boy when his father moved to Pendleton.

Philip married Nancy Bibb Terry. Nancy Bibb was the favorite granddaughter of John Baldwin, and on that account he willed her an extra negro.

Philip's brother, John McDaniel, married Sarah Ivy Terry, making a double union between the two families.

The children of Philip and Nancy Bibb McDaniel were Ira Oliver, one of the founders of Mercer University; Henry

Terry, Philip Edwin, Sarah, who married George Key; Mary, who married A. Weldon Mitchell; Jane, who married Pendleton Cheek; Miriam, who married Lee Adair; Augusta, who married Judge John L. Harris, of Brunswick, and Nancy Bibb, who married Nathaniel Coates Adamson.

One of the nephews of Nancy Bibb Adamson was Henry D. McDaniel, Governor of Georgia, and son of Ira Oliver McDaniel.

The children of Nathaniel Coates and Nancy Bibb Adamson were Augustus Pitt Adamson, Martha Missouri Adamson, Amanda Augusta Adamson, William Felix Adamson, Sarah Sophronia Adamson and Philip Adamson.

John Adamson, brother of Greenberry Adamson, served in the Revolutionary War in Capt. Oldham's company of Maryland. His first wife was an Owen; his second wife was Sally Boyd. His will dated Nov. 10, 1828 and probated Jan. 17, 1832, gives his property to his wife, Sally, during her life. Other bequests are made to his children. He died in 1828. His children are as follows: Elisha, William, Hillary S. W., John Lloyd, Elizabeth, Keziah and Eleanor. Elizabeth, the oldest daughter by his first wife, married William Prather and had two sons, William and Henry Prather. Keziah married a Beckwith. William died in Lincoln County, Ky., in 1845. Lloyd married Jane Smith. He died in 1828, leaving the following named children: John S., Sarah E., Narcissa, Walter Hillary, Robert L. and Leonidas. Eleanor married John H. Duly and died, leaving two daughter, Eliza Ann and Emily Duly. The names of Keziah Beckwith's children were William W., John A., Lucy Amelia, Ann Henry and Robert A. Elisha (1850) and Hillary S. W. Basil Adamson had other children of whom very little information has been obtained. The records show that in the settlement of his estate the names of Elisha Adamson and Ann Boyd appear. Why no others are not named is not known, but the inference is that he had previous to his death made some provisions for them. Elisha Adamson, it is said, went to North Carolina. The census reports of that State for 1790 show the names of Jesse Adamson in Stokes County, and George Adamson in Ouslow County; whether they were descendants of Elisha is not known.

William Adamson went to Kentucky and is probably the ancestor of the Adamsons of Kentucky and Missouri.

One Thomas Adamson married Nancy Harbor and moved from Mason County, Kentucky, to Lexington, Missouri, where he died in 1891; his children were William Harvey Adamson, Mary Estelle, who married Ferris Hammond of Odessa, Missouri; Charles Edward Adamson of Pocatella, Idaho, who married Nellie Clare Hatton and has three children, Grace Nellie, Ethel Clare and Frank Charles. David Adamson of Odessa, Mo., married Millie DeHaven; has seven children, two in Minnesota, one in California and the others in Missouri. Miss Grace Nellie Adamson is a teacher in the High School at Malad City, Idaho. John C. Adamson, a banker of Nashville, Tenn., went from Mason County, Kentucky, where there are others of the name.

There is a large family of Adamsons in Tatnall County, Georgia, one of whom, Richard N. Adamson, was a former sheriff of that county. Efforts to learn their ancestry have been unsuccessful. There are also some in Florida, probably descendants of John Adamson, who went from Camden, S. C., after the Revolutionary War. Hundreds of letters have been written and records examined in an effort to make as accurate history of the family as possible. These records are incomplete and may contain errors, which we hope to correct and get additional data. It is the best that could be done under the circumstances. The family is a large and influential one and we may well feel proud to transmit its history to future generations.
