This Register of the Ellis Family and its connections was first compiled by Col. Thomas Harding Ellis many years ago. It has been revised and in several particulars amended, notably in tracing the descent from Adam Thorowgood, the emigrant, and from Sir George Yeardley. Major Powhatan Ellis directed that it should be reprinted and distributed among the descendants of Charles Ellis and Margaret Keeling Nimmo, his wife. To his love of his clan and his generous loyalty to the ties of blood the members of his family owe this record of their honored ancestry.

1. John Ellis, of Tuckahoe, in the county of Henrico, and State of Virginia. The tradition in the family, is that he was of Welsh descent. By a deposition, of record in the Clerk's Office of Henrico County Court, sworn to in Court, February 1st, 1691, it appears that he was born about the year 1661. His appearance is noted as a witness in that Court, October 1st, 1683. An indenture, made the 31st day of the eleventh month, "commonly called January," 1697-98, between John Ellis, of the county of Henrico, Planter, and John Pleasants, senior, of the same county, conveying 240 acres of land situated in the said county, is acknowledged in open Court, by John Ellis, February 1st, 1697. In an account of goods sold, belonging unto Mr. Tertulian Sehut, deceased, by William Cocke, Coroner, also of record in the said office, there is the entry, "14th August, 1701, To 1 bay mare, at £4. 0. 0. sold John Ellis." At a Court held at Varina, for the county of Henrico, the first Monday in December, being the fifth day of the month, Annoque Domini, 1715, John Ellis appeared personally and acknowledged one deed dated the 3rd day of December, 1715, from himself to Robert Napier, to be his act and deed, and the same was thereupon admitted to record. Then Susanna, the wife of the said John Ellis, being first privately examined, relinquished her right of dower in the land by the said deed conveyed, which relinquishment was also admitted to record. A Patent, from George the 1st, witnessed by His Majesty's trusty and well beloved Alexander Spotswood, Lieutenant Governor, &c., &c., sealed with the seal of the colony, at Williamsburg, December 16th, 1714, grants unto John Ellis one certain tract or parcel of land containing five hundred acres lying and being in the county

of Henrico and on the eastern branch of Tuckahoe, for and in consideration of the sum of fifty shillings of good and lawful money paid to the Receiver General of His Majesty's Revenues in His Majesty's Colony and Dominion of Virginia. Also, one other Patent, witnessed by Henry Drysdale, Governor, bearing date the 24th of March, 1725, grants unto John Ellis, of Henrico county, for the consideration of 40 shillings, 400 acres of land lying and being in the same county. Both of which said patents are of record in the Virginia Land Office.

All the sons of William Ellis are dead. His will, dated 18th October, 1775, is admitted to record, November 3d, 1788.

He owned a large farm on Tuckahoe, called "Edge Hill," including valuable Coal Pits. His will, dated 16th September, 1771, is proved at March Court, 1776.

He has a grandson, 54. Daniel Ellis (older than Wm. B.) now living near Watkinsville, in Goochland county. The Ellises now on Tuckahoe are principally the descendants of Joseph Ellis. His will, dated 11th June, 1785, is proved in Court January 7, 1793.

8. Charles Ellis, was born on Tuckahoe, in the county of Henrico, Virginia, in the year 1719 (or 1720); was married to, 55. Susanna Harding, by the Rev. Emigrated from Amherst, in Virginia, to Oglethorpe, in Georgia, thence to Jefferson county, Kentucky, where a tract of land, of 701 acres, on Robinson's Creek and the waters of Green River, was surveyed for him, in April, 1784, and a grant for the same, issued to him from the Virginia Land Office June 5, 1787; thence to the District of St. Genevieve, in Louisiana, now Missouri. Died at the residence of his son, Willis Ellis, in Perry county, Missouri, in the year 1828. His will, dated 14th June, 1828, is admitted to record, 5th August, of same year.

Died 31st January, 1826, and was buried in the family burying ground at Red Hill. A merchant, by profession,—of the firm of "John and Richard S. Ellis, of Pedlar Mills, Virginia."

Moved to the City of Richmond, in the year 1795. Died, November 22nd, 1840, and was buried in the Shockoe Hill burying ground. A merchant, by profession,—of the firm of "Ellis and Allan" in Richmond and "Allan and Ellis" in London.

Richard Shelton Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, March, 13, 1775; married, 267, Emily Henrietta Douglass, on the 3rd of December, 1818; and had issue, 268, James Douglass, 269, Richard Shelton, 270, Emily Douglass, 271, John Thomas, 272, Charles William, 273, Sally Jane. Died at "Red Hill," April 17, 1846, and was buried in the garden attached to the house. A merchant, by profession,—of the firm of "John and Richard S. Ellis, Pedlar Mills, Va."

130. Josiah Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, January 5, 1777. A merchant, by profession—of the firm of "Ellis and Higginbotham," Richmond, Va. Died at "The Wilderness," in Amherst, April 20, 1836, and was buried in the family burying ground at Red Hill.

131. Mary Wright Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, January 6, 1779; married, 274, Thomas Montgomery, in the year 1813; and had issue, 275, Mary Wright Ellis. Died, August 3, 1814; and was buried in the Shelton burying ground on Harris's Creek.

132. Thomas Harding Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, May 14, 1781. Moved to the City of Richmond in the year 1804—there died, September 12, 1804, and was buried in the burying ground of St. John's Church on Church Hill. A lawyer, by profession.

133. Jane Shelton Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, September 22, 1783; married, 276, Thomas Newman Eubank, in the year 1810; and had issue, 277, Mary Jane, 278, Robert, 279, Josiah Ellis, 280, Thomas Newman, 281, Margaret Newman, 282, John Lewis, 283, Nancy Hunter, 284, Elias Newman and 285, Powhatan Ellis (twins), 286, Charles Richard and 287, Elizabeth (twins). Died at "The Wilderness," the residence of her husband, in Amherst, August 9, 1838, and was buried in the family burying ground at that place.

134. Lewis Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, July 18, 1785. Died, August 9, 1800, in the town of Staunton, Virginia, and was buried there.

135. Joshua Shelton Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, December 20, 1787; married, 288, Margaret Newman Eubank, on the 3rd of December, 1811; and had issue, 289, Josiah Corbin, 290, John Eubank, 291, Joshua Shelton, 292, Powhatan Lewis, 293, Robert Newman. Died at "Round Top," his residence, in the county of Amherst, May 24, 1825, and was buried in the family burying ground at "Red Hill." A planter, by profession.

136. Powhatan Ellis, was born at "Red Hill," in the county of Amherst, Virginia, January 17, 1790; married, 294, Eliza Rebecca Winn, on the 28th of February, 1831; and had issue, 295, Powhatan, 296, Rebecca. Emigrated to Mississippi, in the year 1817. A lawyer, by profession. Died, March 18th, 1863.

137. Peter Carter, son of Solomon Carter and Mary Ann Beckley, of Henrico county, Virginia. Died in Amherst, about the year 1787.

APPENDIX.

ELLIS.

David Ellis appears to have been the first of the name to emigrate to the colony, coming in the second supply from England. He is recorded among the early emigrants as living in the mines near Jamestown, and was one of the men sent by Captain Smith to build a home for King Powhatan on the York River. A recent sketch of the family in the Richmond Times-Dispatch states that John Ellis of Tuckahoe was the son of David. Col. Ellis, however, does not make this claim but begins his register with John Ellis, one of the grantees of the second charter of the Virginia Company, and himself, according to Col. Ellis, an emigrant.

The Ellis arms as given by Burke are:

I. John Ellis, of the county and parish of Henrico, in the State of Virginia, planter, emigrated from Wales to Virginia, about the year 1683, and settled on Tuckahoe creek. He was born about the year 1661, married Susannah, and had issue seven sons and one daughter, to wit:

John, Thomas, James, Henry, William, Charles, Joseph, Mary.

His will, dated October 11, 1728, is admitted to record in Henrico county court, the first Monday in December, 1728: his sons Thomas and William qualifying as his executors, with Thomas Harding and John Ellis as their sureties.

II. Charles Ellis, son of John, first above named, was born in Henrico county, in the year 1719-20.

She died April 25, 1824, and was buried at her father's place in Norfolk county. James Nimmo having removed from his farm called "Goshen," to the borough (now city) of Norfolk about the year 1788, resided at the south-east corner of Cumberland and Charlotte streets, where he died January 1, 1833, in the 78th year of his age. He was buried at Shenstone Green; the burial service being performed by the Rev. Henry W. Ducachet, D. D., rector of Christ Church, Norfolk.

N. B.—Argall Thorowgood, who married Elizabeth Keeling, was the son of Argall Thorowgood, Sr., and Ann Church. Argall, Sr., was the son of Lt. Col. Adam Thorowgood and Frances Yeardeley—he being the son of Adam Thorowgood, the emigrant. This Captain Adam Thorowgood was a brother of Sir John Thorowgood of Harrington, England, was born in 1602, came to Virginia in the ship Charles, in the year 1621. He settled first at Kecoughtan, Kichotan, or Kiquotan—where the town of Hampton now stands, or lately stood—in Elizabeth City county; and purchased from John Gundry a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres, fronting on Southampton river, with all the houses and their appurtenances and with rents and dues then belonging to the same, to wit: From Thomas Throwbrow for two and twenty poles of said land on the river front, let and farmed to him for the term of five years, yielding for rent every year a hen or a capon; from Thos. Flint, for the lease to him of two and twenty poles for the term of four years, yielding for rent every year two capons; and from Lancelot Barnes, for the lease to him of five and twenty poles for five years, yielding for rent every year two capons,—the tenant in each case leaving the houses tenantable at the expiration of his said term; for the consideration of one hundred pounds lawful money of England, to be paid in England; as appears by deed of record in the clerk's office of the General Court, dated 30th December, 1626. From this place he removed across the Bay to Lynnhaven, in Lower-Norfolk county. He was one of the burgesses to the General Assembly, for the county of Elizabeth City, in the years 1629, 1630, and 1632; a justice of the peace for the same county in the year 1631; and a member

of the council of State in 1637. He died in 1640. By his will, dated the 17th of February, 1639, admitted to record April 17, 1640, he bequeaths to the parish church of Lynnhaven one thousand pounds of tobacco in leaf, to be disbursed for some necessary and decent ornament. The bulk of his estate, whether in Virginia or elsewhere, he bequeaths to his wife Sarah, his son Adam, and his daughters Ann, Sarah, and Elizabeth: he bequeaths, also, to his godson Adam Keeling one breeding goat; he requests his well beloved friends, Capt. Thomas Willoughby and Mr. Henry Seawell, here in Virginia, and his beloved brother Sir John Thorowgood, of Kensington, near London, and Mr. Alexander Harris, his wife's uncle, living on Tower Hill, to be overseers of this, his last will and testament; and to each of his said overseers he bequeaths one gold ring, of twenty shillings' price, as a pledge of his love.

Sarah, relict of Captain Adam Thorowgood, married, secondly, John Gookin, to whom patents for land were granted in 1636, '37, '38 and '41; who was a burgess for the county of Upper-Norfolk (now Norfolk and Nansemond counties) in 1639, and died in 1643. He was probably a son or brother of Daniel Gookin, who removed from Canterbury, Kent, England, to county Cork, Ireland, and thence to Virginia, arriving in November, 1621, with fifty men of his own and thirty passengers, exceedingly well furnished with all sorts of provisions and cattle, and planted himself above Newport's News, at a place which he called "Mary's Mount." This place, in the massacre of March 22nd, 1622, he held against the savages, with a force of thirty-five men, disregarding the order of the governor and council to retire to Kichotan.

Elizabeth Keeling was the daughter of William Keeling, whose son, Captain William Keeling, (sometimes a vestryman, church warden, justice of the peace, sheriff, &c.,) qualified as his executor on the 20th March, 1753. He was clerk of the Eastern Shore church and chapel, by annual appointment of the Vestry of Lynnhaven parish, from 1729 to 1752, and sheriff of Princess Anne county 1749-51.

William was the son of Adam Keeling, who married Elizabeth Godfrey, daughter of John Godfrey, of Princess Anne county, on the 19th February, 1705, whose widow qualified as his executrix on the 4th March, 1711.

This Adam was the son of Captain Adam Keeling, who, by an order of the General Court of the 27th September, 1671, was ordered to be put in possession of a plantation in Lower-Norfolk county, formerly belonging to John Martin,

deceased: the said Adam (second here named) having married Ann, sole sister and heir of the whole blood of the said John Martin.

Captain Adam Keeling was the son of that Adam mentioned in the will of the first Adam Thorowgood, as his godson, who was the son of Ensign Thomas Keeling, one of the viewers of tobacco, appointed by the Assembly, January, 1639, for the southside of the river, in Lower-Norfolk county, and to whom patents for land, in that county, were issued in the years 1643 and 1651.

John D. Blair, pastor of the Presbyterian church in Richmond, was married, first, at the residence of Thomas Taylor, south-west corner of Main and 5th streets, in Richmond, to Lucy Singleton Taylor, by the Right Reverend Richard Channing Moore, D. D., November 20, 1828. She was the daughter of Thomas Taylor and Lucy Harrison Singleton, was born in the city of Richmond, November 4, 1811; baptised by the Rev. John Buchanan, D. 1st. Sir George Yeardley (Governor of Virginia) was born in England and resided in the colony of Virginia from 1609 to 1627. He died in Virginia November, 1627.

2nd. Argall Yeardley was born in England, 1605, and resided in Virginia from 1609 to 1670. He died in Virginia in 1670. He was a member of the Council.

3d. Adam Thoroughgood (1st.) was born in England in 1602 and resided in the colony of Virginia from 1621 to 1640. He died in Virginia in 1640. He was a member of House of Burgesses and of the Council.

4th. Adam Thoroughgood (2nd.) was born in Virginia and died there. He was a member of the House of Burgesses.

5th. Jacob Johnson, Sr., resided in the colony of Virginia and died there. He was a member of the House of Burgesses.

6th. Jacob Johnson, Jr., was born in the colony of Virginia and died there. He was a member of the House of Burgesses.

7th. William Langley was born in the colony of Virginia and died there. He was a member of the House of Burgesses.

8th. Francis Mason was born in England in 1595 and resided in the colony of Virginia from 1613 to 1648. He died in Virginia in 1648. He was one of the founders (1607-1616) of Virginia.

9th. Richard Church resided in the colony of Virginia and died there in 1706. He was a member of the House of Burgesses.

Sir George Yeardley was a member of the Virginia Company in 1609 and came to Virginia in that year. He was Deputy Governor 1616-17; was appointed Governor and knighted in 1618. In July, 1619, he summoned at Jamestown the first Legislative Assembly ever convened in America. After his commission expired in November, 1621, he continued a member of the Council, and was again appointed Deputy Governor September 18, 1625, and Governor on April 19, 1626. He held the latter office until his death in November, 1627. He married Temperance West and had a son, Col. Argall Yeardley, of Northampton county, born 1605 and died about 1670, who was a member of the Council 1644-5. Argall Yeardley married, about 1650, Sarah, daughter of John Custis, of Northampton county, and had a daughter, Frances, who married Lieut. Col. Adam Thoroughgood.

Mrs. Margaret Keeling Ellis was left a widow in 1840. From that time to the day of her death she lived in the old home on Franklin and Second, which as long as it stood was the rallying place for all the Ellis clan. She was untiring in her devotion to her children and children's children, and to the example of her pure and honorable life her descendants are largely indebted. She was a woman of great simplicity of character, but firm in her conceptions of duty, unselfish to a fault and a faithful follower of Christ.

Col. Thomas Harding Ellis, to whom we are indebted for this record of the family, was a careful genealogist and a cultured historian. He made many contributions to the Virginia Historical Society publications, and co-operated with Mr. Fisher in the compilation of the history of the Monumental Church. He was an earnest lover of the Episcopal Church, and a man of courteous manners and of great personal charm. In his early youth he was Secretary of Legation in Mexico, and for a long time he was President of the James River and Kanawha Canal. He was one of the founders of the Hollywood Association, and is buried in the beautiful cemetery which he helped to establish. He was a man of wide acquaintance, honored and loved by all who knew him.

Col. Charles Ellis began his business life as a merchant. He was President of the Richmond and Petersburg Railroad, and as such did excellent service during the war in the transportation of troops. He was commissioned Colonel by the Confederate Government. Col. Ellis never married, but was to the day of his death the head of his clan. True to all his duties, loyal to all his traditions, a Virginian of Virginians, he spent a useful life in the city of his birth, and died respected of all and beloved by his kinsmen.

Major Powhatan Ellis, the youngest child of Charles and Margaret K. Ellis, was a gallant Confederate soldier. Entering the army in 1861, as first lieutenant of Co. D., Paducah, Kentucky, he rose to be adjutant general of the Department

of Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana. He served successively on the staff of General Tilgman, General Claiborne, General Polk, General Taylor, General Forrest and General Stephen D. Lee. The latter wrote of him a short time before Major Ellis' death, "I remember him most vividly as one of the most earnest, zealous and competent staff officers I had with me during the war." Major Ellis for many years prior to his death lived in Richmond, devoting himself to the care of his relatives. He kept in loving and sympathetic touch with all his scattered kinsfolk, to whom he was devoted with an unselfish loyalty which never failed. Gentle in all his ways, the very soul of honour, chivalric in his bearing, a lover of his kind, of his town and of his country, he has left a memory which should be a benediction to all who belong to the Ellis family of Virginia.
