to Herr Strum and to my dear friend the pastor Conrath Dercap and his wife at Zweikirchen: greetings in God's name, and the comfort of Jesus be with you.

"If this writing finds you all in good health when it arrives, it will be a great joy to me. As for what concerns me and

my family, we have, in part, arrived safe and well in this land, but my little daughter Maria Margretha fell gently asleep in the Lord, in the hope of a blessed salvation, in the midst of our voyage, on the 10th of September, on the high sea. At twelve o'clock she bade farewell to this world of sorrow and at four o'clock she was consigned to the deep. As a last honor to her memory I had them sing for her the two funeral hymns: "When my last hour is come" and "Now let us lay away the dead". I also had a funeral sermon preached for her, but we were having a storm, and the waves rose as in the tempest described in Psalm 107 and in the eighth chapters of the gospels of Matthew and Luke. Then indeed we had reason to cry to God in the words of the hymn: "Great is the Danger on the Sea" (Verses 5 and 6 in the new Heidelberg Hymnal).

"Now as to our voyage, we traveled down the Rhine to Cologne. There we were not allowed to pass through, because the King of Prussia, since he could not have us, refused to let us go by. Therefore we were obliged to travel by land to Hertogenbosch, which is forty hours distant from Cologne, and to have our goods hauled all that distance cost us 3 florins 40 kreutzers for each hundred weight.

"Now as to the rest of our journey, we sailed on July 22 from Helforth Schlies (Hollensaliqu-Ed.) on the *Dollus Hunt* and reached harbor safely, thank God, on the 30th, for we had a storm that lasted 4 days and on Saint Jacob's Night wind and storm drove a ship between us and the coast of Flanders, so that it struck on a rock and split in two, and of about 700 passengers and crew only 72 escaped with their lives. Fourteen of these 72 were able to reach this land on another ship and have told us this.

"As for us, we sailed again on August 17 from Calais (Coxes-Ed.) in old England and came safely over the great sea to Philadelphia on the 14th of October, as healthy and hale, thank God, as when we left Wolfstein. If there is anyone else there who has a desire to come over here, so that he does not have a lot to pay for freight as far as Rotterdam. At Rotterdam one can buy all sorts of victuals

cheaply, and whatever articles one needs at sea.

"It happens just now that there is a good opportunity to send this, as the Nusslander (Immigration Agent) Nicklas Licht, with whom I am well acquainted, is on his way over again. So I take advantage of this to send my esteemed friend the Amtskeller an English bell for his church as a gift of gratitude from me. I send him honor the Amtskeller the bell for this reason: he showed both me and my brother many favors and kindnesses. And if he would like to have another, or anything special from this land, whenever we have opportunity we will take pains to get it and send it to him.

"I have nothing more to write for the present. Our whole journey from home to Philadelphia was 18 weeks and one day. Herewith I commend you all, as aforesaid, to the protection of the Almighty, and wish you all, according to your several offices, a quiet and peaceful sphere of duty, and remain your obedient servant.

"Johann Heinrich Schmitt, formerly a citizen and master smith in the village of Wolfstein. If you write me, address your letters to Joh. H. Schmitt, brother to 'Little' Schmitt on the Little Schwattar (Swattara), in care of Emvichs, in Berks County, Pennsylvania."

Philadelphia, Nov. 21, 1754.

(Note by the editor-translator: Johann Heinrich Schmitt has not been identified positively with anyone of that name in Pennsylvania records, but there are many possibilities. One of the most suggestive is that he may be the same as the large landowner Henry Smith of Lebanon Township, Lancaster County, who is listed in the 1771-1773 assessment lists as owning from 380 to 435 acres of land. It is evident that Schmitt was better provided with goods than the average immigrant from Germany of the period—Dr. Krebs informs me that in 1754 Frederick the Great forbade the passage of American-bound travelers below Cologne, in order to halt the mass migration and to force those involved in it to settle in his own territories.)

my family, we have, in part, arrived safe and well in this land, but my little daughter Maria Margretha fell gently asleep in the Lord, in the hope of a blessed salvation, in the midst of our voyage, on the 10th of September, on the high sea. At twelve o'clock she bade farewell to this world of sorrow and at four o'clock she was consigned to the deep. At a last honor to her memory I had them sing for her the two funeral hymns. "When my last hour is come", and "Now let us lay away the dead". I also had a funeral sermon preached for her, but we were having a storm, and the waves rose as in the tempest described in Psalm 107 and in the eighth chapter of the gospels of Matthew and Luke. Then indeed we had reason to cry to God in the words of the hymn: "Great is the Danger of the Sea" (Verses 5 and 6 in the new Heidelberg Hymnal).

"Now as to our voyage, we traveled down the Rhine to Cologne. There we were not allowed to pass through, because the King of Prussia, since he could not have us, refused to let us go by. Therefore we were obliged to travel by land to Hertogenbosch, which is forty hours distant from Cologne, and to have our goods hauled all that distance over in 5 dozens of kneaders for each hundred weight.

"Now as to the rest of our journey, we sailed on July 22 from Rotterdam (Hilversum-Eil.) on the *Prins Hendrik*. We reached harbor safely, thank God, on the 28th. For we had a storm that night and seven days a ship without us and the crew of Rotterdam so that it took us some time and cost us a great deal of money to get home. For some of those 12 men who were with us on another ship were not with us.

"On the 1st of August we sailed again on August 1st and came safely over the great sea on the 14th of October. We were not allowed to land at Rotterdam, as when we left Rotterdam. If there is anyone else who has a desire to come over here, I can tell him all his goods into money, for he does not have a lot to pay for goods at Rotterdam. At Rotterdam you can buy all sorts of victuals

cheaply, and whatever articles one needs at sea.

"It happens just now that there is a good opportunity to send this, as the Consul (Immigration Agent) Nickel Licht, with whom I am well acquainted, is on his way over again. So I take advantage of this to send my esteemed friend the Amstelster an English bell for his church as a gift of gratitude from me. I send his honor the Amstelster the bell for this reason: he showed both me and my brother many favors and kindnesses. And if he would like to have another, or anything special from this land, whenever we have opportunity we will take pains to get it and send it to him.

"I have nothing more to write for the present. Our whole journey from home to Philadelphia was 18 weeks and one day. However I commend you all, as aforesaid, to the protection of the Almighty, and wish you all, according to your several offices, a quiet and peaceful sphere of duty, and remain your obedient servant.

"Johann Henrich Schmitt, formerly a smith and master smith in the village of Wülffstein. If you write up, address your letters to Joh. H. Schmitt, brother to 'Storke' Schmitt on the Little Schwanau (Swatara), care of Emwiche in Berks County, Pennsylvania."

Philadelphia, Nov. 21, 1775

"Now by the editor-translator, Johann Henrich Schmitt has not been identified positively with anyone of that name in Pennsylvania records, but there are many possibilities. One of the most suggestive is that he may be the same as the large landowner Henry Smith of Lebanon Township, Lancaster County, who is listed in the 1771-1773 assessment lists as owning from 350 to 435 acres of land. It is evident that Schmitt was better provided with goods than the average immigrant from Germany of the period—Dr. J. V. de Great forbade the passage of Americans to halt the mass migration and to force territories.)
