ATHENS. — (m. G.) Clarke
 County Seat—N. E. R. R., C. and M.
 R. R. and Ga. R. R. The seat of
 learning for the Empire State of the
 South is located on the Oconee river,
 113 feet above sea level, with splendid
 water power, unrivalled drainage,
 good spring and well water, with every
 improvement and unsurpassed health,
 numerous fine typical Southern
 homes, making it pre-eminently the
 residence or home city of Georgia, as
 well as a manufacturing place.

Site of University of Georgia, which
 has several branch departments here
 and elsewhere, also the Lucy Cobb
 Institute for young ladies, Home
 School for young ladies, with several
 minor and public schools. Has ten
 white churches—representing Baptist,
 Primitive Baptist, Methodist, Presby-
 terian, Episcopal, Catholic and He-
 brew.

Is the initial point of the Northeast-
 ern Railroad running up to Rabun
 Gap, and the terminus of the Athens
 Branch Georgia Railroad; has direct
 communication now with Macon via
 Lula.

Is 104 miles from Atlanta by rail
 and 116 from Augusta.

Has a population of about 9,000, was
 incorporated Dec. 8th, 1866, and be-
 came a city in 1872, and has steadily
 improved and increased ever since.
 Is governed by a mayor and eight
 aldermen. Has a police force, fire de-
 partment, gas works, two cotton com-
 presses, an oil mill, an elevator, a

bobbin factory, large foundry and ma-
 chine works, paper manufacturing
 company, planing mills, flouring and
 grist mills, carriage, wagon, furniture,
 harness and other factories (water
 and steam), two banks with a quarter
 million dollars, besides the cotton and
 woolen mills (water power). The Ban-
 ner - Watchman, The Weekly Chron-
 icle, The Evening Graphic, Woman's
 Work, The Southern Farmer, and
 also a colored paper, The Clipper, are
 published here.

Athens has the most prosperous
 insurance corporation in the country,
 a good hotel, public halls, two libra-
 ries, a club and numerous lodges and
 societies.

The three cotton factories run about
 600 looms, and 18,000 spindles, with
 about \$1,000,000 capital. Some of the
 finest water powers attainable are
 hereabout. The Princeton Manufac-
 turing Company alone have unused,
 and dammed up, sufficient to run ex-
 tra 10,000 spindles. Telegraph West-
 ern Union, express Southern. Mail
 several times each day. Fifty thou-
 sand bales of cotton are annually re-
 ceived, of which the local mills con-
 sume about 8,000.

As a manufacturing point there are
 few places excelling Athens. As a
 city in which to live happily, with all
 the comforts, with the highest social
 surroundings and advantages of edu-
 cation and the arts, Athens has no
