


COLLEGE BOYS DECLARE CHILDREN SHOULD NOT WORK IN COTTON MILLS

WAYCROSS WANTS PRESBYTERIAN COLLEGE.

WAYCROSS, May 21.—A mass meeting of citizens will be held tonight to consider ways and means for securing the Presbyterian college which is to be located somewhere in the Savannah presbytery. Waycross people have become thoroughly aroused to the importance of the institution and there is a strong probability that if a liberal offer is made she will secure it. Waycross is almost in the center of the presbytery, it is a temperance town and highly moral and has one of the prettiest locations in South Georgia. The location has already been assured and it is thought that a good sum will be offered in addition.

The committee sent out by the board of trustees of the proposed school returned from its tour of inspection. Several towns were visited and some nice bids were made for the college. A decision will not be reached until the board meets in June.
