PEYTON HARRISON HOGE, graduate Hampden Sidney College, 1876; A.M., 1878; D.D., 1889; Union Theological Seminary Virginia, 1882; Pastor of the Fourth Presbyterian Church, Richmond, Virginia, 1882-85; Fourth Presbyterian Church, Richmond, Virginia, 1882-85; First Presbyterian Church, Wilmington, North Carolina, 1885-99; Moderator Synod of North Carolina, 1891; traveled in the Orient in 1898; Pastor Warren Memorial Church, Louisville, Kentucky, 1889-1907; Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church since 1907; President of Board of Union Theological Seminary, Virginia, 1897-98, and of the Presbyterian Theological Seminary of Kentucky since 1910; Moderator Synod of Kentucky, 1910; Author "Moses Drury Hoge—Life and Letters" (1899), "The Divine Tragedy, A Drama of the Christ" (1905); is descended from Benjamin HARRISON, *d.* 1645, of Wakefield, Brandon and Berkeley, Virginia; John CARTER, who came to Virginia in 1649; William



RANDOLPH of Turkey Island, *b.* 1607; John ROLFE, of Jamestown, the husband of Princess Pocahontas, 1614; Robert Bolling of Virginia, 1660; Myles CARY who came to Virginia in 1656, and Thomas CARR.

Lineage

The ancestor of this family was William HOGE, *b.* 1660, in Mussellburg, Scotland, *d.* 1745, at Kernstown, Virginia; came to America in 1680; he settled at Perth Amboy, New Jersey, 1689, where he married Barbara HUME, *b.* 1670, at Paisley, Scotland, *d.* 1745, at Kernstown, Virginia; a fellow passenger, whose parents died of the plague while on the voyage. Later he removed to Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and from there in 1735 the entire family with the exception of John removed to Opequon, Virginia; he and his wife are buried at Opequon Presbyterian Church Cemetery, Kernstown, Virginia.

Drury Lacy, D.D., Vice-President Hampden Sidney College, Moderator Presbyterian General Assembly, 1809.
