ALBERT RUFUS LYLES, M.D., received his early education at Gold City Academy, Kentucky; M.D. College of Physicians and Surgeons, St. Louis, Missouri, 1 March, 1890.

Lineage

The LYLE family is of the landed Gentry of England and is probably of Norman extraction, the family being DE LYLE or L'ISLE or LYLE, the LYLES of Scotland being a branch bearing the same arms of the Norman English families. MUND LYLE, ESQUIRE, son of Thomas LYLE of Wilbraham in County Cambridgeshire, England, was "Sewer" to Edward VI, Queen Mary, Queen Elizabeth and King James I. The first of this branch of the American family of whom we have accurate knowledge is Manasseh LYLE, one of the Loudoun County, Virginia branch. Manasseh LYLE, probably son of Thomas LYLE of the Berkeley County family that name, was *b.* in Loudoun County, Virginia, 31st May, 1770; *d.* 9th February 1810. He and his family moved from Bedford County, Virginia, to Allen County, Kentucky, in 1806, where he purchased land on which descendants of the same generation are still living; *m.* 21st January, 1792, his first cousin, Sarah CHAN *b.* in Maryland, 18th January, 1772, *d.* 18th October, 1829; she *m.* (second) Geo WILSON.
