JAMES FRANKLIN BELL, Major-General U. S. Army, *b.* 9th Jan. 1856, near Shelbyville, Shelby Co., Ky.; *m.* 5th Jan. 1881, in Rock Island, Ill., Sarah BUFORD, dau. of Thomas Jefferson and Grace (BOWERS) BUFORD of Rock Island, Ill. Another dau., Anna BUFORD, *m.* 17th Aug. 1886, Ernest Albert GARLINGTON, Brig.-Gen. U. S. Army. (For more, see "The Buford Family in America," by Capt. Marcus Bainbridge BUFORD, of the U. S. Navy, published in San Francisco, 1903.)



MAJOR-GENERAL JAMES FRANKLIN BELL had common school education in Shelbyville, Ky.; entered Cadet, 1874, and graduated U. S. Mil. Acad. at West Point, N. Y., 1878; commissioned Second Lieutenant, and, later, as First Lieutenant of Cavalry; served on plains in 7th U. S. Cavalry, 1878-94; captured band of half-breed Cree Indians, near Ft. Buford, S. D., 1883; in Sioux Campaign, Pine Ridge, S. D., 1891; Adjutant of regiment and Secretary of Cavalry and Light Artillery School, 1891-4; aide to Gen. J. W. FORSYTH, California, Arizona and State of Washington, 1895-8; served in Spanish-American Campaign in Philippine Islands, and in Philippine insurrection; promoted Captain U. S. A., Mar. 1899; appointed Colonel of Volunteers, 5th July, 1899; organized 36th Infantry, U. S. Vols., in Philippine Islands, July, 1899; commanded this regiment to Dec. 1899; awarded congressional medal of honor for gallantry in action, near Porac, P. I.; appointed Brigadier-General of Volunteers, 5th Dec. 1899; commanded 4th Brigade, 2d Division, 8th Army Corps, and 3d District, Department of Northern Luzon, to July, 1900; Provost Marshal-General, City of Manila, P. I., to Feb. 1901; appointed Brigadier-General U. S. A., Feb. 1901; commanded 1st District, Department of Northern Luzon to Nov. 1901; and 3d Brigade, Department of Southern Luzon, to Dec. 1902; returned to United States, 1903; Commandant of Infantry and Cavalry School, Signal School and Staff College, to Apr. 1906; Major-General U. S. A., 3d Jan. 1907; received degree of LL. D., State University of Kentucky, 6th June, 1907; Chief of Staff, U. S. A., from Apr. 1906, to Apr. 1910; since 1910 assigned to duty in the Philippines.

Lineage

WILLIAM BELL, the immigrant ancestor, was *b.* circa 1685-90 in the north of Ireland; *d.* Aug. 1757, near Staunton, in Augusta Co., Va. Was probably of Scotch origin, hence a Scotch-Irishman. Immigrated to America, with his wife and older children, probably entering the Delaware Bay and River and landing first in Penn-

sylvania. Settled in Augusta Co., Va., about eight miles northeast of the site Staunton, circa 1738-40, certainly prior to 1746. Was a staunch Presbyterian and founded the family locally known as "The Stone Church Bells," by which name they are distinguished from other families of the same name in Augusta Co. In his will, dated 25th July, 1757, and probated 17th Aug. 1757, he recommends that his body "be buried in decent order, as becometh, at the Stone Meeting House, etc. by my beloved wife, lately deceased." *m.* Mary (surname unknown). Was, perhaps, twice *m.*

DAVID BELL, *b.* circa 1722, probably in Ireland; *d.* Mar. 1780. He served as a private from Augusta Co. in the French and Indian War, in 1758, and at the time of his death was Captain of one of the militia companies of Augusta Co. Besides rendering military service in various capacities in the Old French War, in guarding the Virginia frontiers against the Indians, and in mustering and training men for the War of Independence, he furnished large quantities of cattle and provisions to the Virginia troops in the field between the outbreak of the Revolution and his death. Shortly after his marriage he purchased a tract of 400 acres of land in Beverly Manor, on a branch of Middle River, in Augusta Co., and on this tract he resided until his death. This tract immediately adjoined the tract of about 200 acres, on

Poage's Run, in Beverly Manor, which was the "home place" of William Bell, an immigrant. Capt. David BELL was a man of affairs, active and successful in business, of very considerable means, and a leading citizen of his community. *m.* circa 1754-55, in Augusta Co., Va., Florence HENDERSON, *d.* 1809-10, dau. of William and Susannah HENDERSON.

They removed to Fayette Co., Ky., about 1780. Capt. William ALLEN served in the Revolution. He was a son of Capt. James and Margaret (ANDERSON) ALLEN, a dau. of John ANDERSON a native of Ireland, who at an early date settled in Augusta Co., Va. Capt. James ALLEN was a captain of militia in 1756, participated in the battle of Point Pleasant, where his brother, Lieut. Hugh Allen, was killed, and *d.* in 1810, at the age of 94. He was the eldest son of William ALLEN, who came from Ireland and settled in Augusta Co., Va. probably as early as 1723, though the exact date is not known. Because of her great beauty and personal attractiveness, the wife of Capt. William ALLEN was widely known as "Charming Sukey Bell." Her nephew, Allen TRIMBLE, was twice Governor of Ohio; his brother William A. TRIMBLE, was a United States Senator from Ohio, and another brother, Rev. Joseph M. TRIMBLE, was a Bishop in the Methodist Episcopal Church.

DUDLEY of Lexington, Ky. Practised medicine for about two years in Mississippi. Returned to Kentucky, studied law and practised with success, but later abandoned a professional for a commercial life, which seemed more congenial to him. Was engaged in steamboating on the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers when the Civil War began. He helped to raise the Fifteenth Kentucky Infantry (Federal) and was elected its Lieutenant-Colonel. Was killed in the Battle of Perryville, Ky., while in command of his regiment gallantly leading a charge.
