D. 1868 thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight; personally appeared before me, Alexander McArthur Clerk of the Superior Court of said County, the same being a Court of record within and for the County and State aforesaid Elizabeth Coney aged 78 years, a resident of Montgomery County in the State of Georgia, who being duly sworn according to law, doth declare that she is the widow of John Coney deceased who was the identical John Coney who served under the name of John Coney as a private in the Company commanded by Captain Edward in the regiment of Georgia commanded by Genl Blackshear in the war of 1812 that her said husband entered the service as a substitute for Clement Kemell at Dublin in Laurens County in said State on or about the 1st 1814, and entered in actual service from said War for the term of three months, and whose services terminated by reason of an illness with discharge after the expiration of his said term of three months. She further states that the following is as full a description of her said husband as she can give at the time of his enlistment, viz; fair complexion blue eyes & black hair. She further states that she was married to the said John Coney in the County of Laurens State of Georgia, A. D. 1818 by one Joseph Wilson a Justice of the Peace in and for said County of Laurens, and that her maiden before her said marriage was Elizabeth Gay, and that she has
