

In the name of God Amen

I Amos Smith of the County of Barron and State of Kentucky being of sound mind the bodily infirmities and knowing that man was born to die do constitute and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, To wit,

First it is my Will and desire that all my Estate except my land should be sold at the discretion of my Executors and the money divided among my Legates as will be hereafter devised. Namely John Smith Lydia Smith, Nancy Amos, Cynthia Smith, Lincey Barron Daughter of Nancy Barker now Nancy Smith.

Secondly it is my desire if my Loving Nancy should survive me that she should have the half of my land including the Improvement whereon I now live as one Cow with the Household and Kitchen furniture During her life or widowhood at her Death or Marriage to be sold with the other half hereafter to be devised should my beloved Wife should marry again for her to have one equal share of my whole Estate with the rest of my Legates.

Thirdly I Give and bequeath to my son John Smith the other half of my land to include the improvement whereon he now lives but at his Mother's death or marriage to be sold as above directed.

Fourthly I do hereby constitute and Ordain Philip Hays and Richard Ellinger my true and loving friends the Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all manner of former former wills heretofore by me made. In testimony whereof I have set my Name and Affixed my Seal the twenty sixth day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventeen signed sealed and delivered
