Do make and constitute this my last will & testament hereby bequeathing
all other

Item 1st it is my will and desire I do hereby give & bequeath to
to my Beloved wife Molly Beard during her natural life my
Negro woman named by her

Item 2nd it is my will & desire and I do hereby give & bequeath to
my Beloved wife Molly Beard a certain mare named by the name of
white Star & it is my will & desire and I do hereby give to my Beloved
wife Molly Beard during her natural life my negro girl Betty

Item 3rd It is my will & desire and I do hereby leave to my Beloved wife
Molly Beard during her natural life the same I now live on and after
her death to be equally divided between my two sons William Beard &
Andrew Beard according to quality and quantity and it is my desire
that my son William Beard should live with his father and take
care of him as long as he lives

Item 4th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give to my Beloved wife
Molly Beard all my household & kitchen furniture also one half of
my stock of cattle hogs & sheep

Item 5th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give & bequeath to my
son Alexander Beard my still

Item 6th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give and bequeath to my
son William Beard my negro boy named Sampson and after the death of
his father the Negro girl Betty and also I leave to my son William Beard all
my stock of horse cattle hogs & sheep not herein otherwise disposed
of also the plantation whereon I live

Item 7th It is my will and desire and I do hereby give & bequeath to
my son Andrew Beard my negro boy named

Item 8th It is my will & desire and I do hereby give & bequeath to
my Daughter Betty Beard a good horse to be furnished her by my
Executor or Executors out of my Estate

Item 9th It is my will & desire and I do hereby give and bequeath
to my Daughter Betty Beard the benefit of a bond on John
Fluggins of one hundred dollars which has been put in the

Item 10th It is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath my negro man
Charles and freedom from bondage at my death

Item 11th It is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath to my daughter
My Harriet and my daughter's hands for as much of my Estate as I think
them entitled to I therefore make no provision for them herein

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint William Beard and Andrew
Beard Executors of this my Last will and testament given under
my hand and seal this 3rd day February 1834
