Will & Read appointed for all mankind cause to do & being old & infirm but of perfect mind & memory do make this my last Will and testament in manner and form following Vizt I Recommend my soul to almighty God and my mortal body I leave to be buried in a Christian form But as to what worldly goods it has pleased God to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as follows Vizt it is my will and desire that all my last debts may be first paid Then it is my will & desire and for the love & regard for my son William Read that I give and bequeath to said William Read one hundred dollars. Then it is my will & desire & for the love & regard for my living Daughter Jane Young, former & Jane Read it is my will & desire & hereby give and bequeath to her & Jane Young one hundred dollars. Then for the love & regard for my Daughter Mary Eliza formerly Mary Read it is my will & desire and I hereby give and bequeath to her the said Mary Eliza all the property I left with her when I moved to Barren County it is my will & desire that the residue of my Estate be equally divided between my Children herein after named Vizt my living son James Read my living Daughter Mary Eliza formerly Mary Read my living Daughter Sarah McScale formerly Sarah Read to the heirs of my living son John Read because my equal part & to the heirs of my living Daughter Elizabeth Greth formerly Elizabeth Read one equal part to them & their heirs for ever & as I think that Margaret Harick formerly Margaret Read & my son Robert read has had their full part I also love them my blessing & it is ~~my~~ further my will and I do hereby appoint my son James Read Executor to this my last will and testament in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of ~~Sept~~ ^{Oct} in the year of our Lord 1811 & Henry one

Will I Andrew Cochran Sen^r of said County and State being in perfect mind & memory have taken into consideration the uncertainty of time and that it is appropiate to all Obedts die have thought it my indispensable duty to settle my worldly effects among my five children — In the first place I do settle all my just debts and funeral charges — I bequeath unto my son James A Cochran Cochran and James Cochran all my Land to be equally divided between said James & James Cochran they are to enjoy their horses saddles and bridles and nothing more that is called theirs I do bequeath unto said James one steered Cow and calf and likewise the hoggs that I called his one dead beasted & its furniture I do bequeath unto James Cochran also of the stock and house hold furniture one Cow and calf that known by the name of Harry one sow and pigs five dead beasted and its furniture — I do bequeath unto my Daughter Sally one dead beasted and its furniture one chest that goes by the name of hers and all her clothing one cow that goes by the name of Blacky & her calf one dead heifer and her calf one steer calf one three mares with a sore head saddles & bridle I do bequeath unto my Daughter Rachel one large pied cow with her calf one dead beasted & its furniture one beancow & her clothing one horse & saddle and bridle Also one no horned sow with her calf — I do bequeath unto my Daughter Molly one young gray horse saddle & bridle one dead heifer that known by the name of the english heifer one dead beasted and its furniture and also her clothing Also one dead heifer and her calf known by the name of the Jamison heifer also one pied heifer known by the name of the english heifer — It is my desire that my five named children live mutually together and follow their industry and labour but if otherwise all my effects not named in the above is to be sold and equally divided among them except Adam and said is to continue with five children and they are to give him at the rate of two shillings per day for every days labour but if any of the family should remove either by marriage or other wise they are excluded from paying any part of said negro mans here the family is at liberty to hire said negro to any honest person at just wages

I hereby declare this to be my last will and testament signed and sealed before the Witnesses present dated as above
