 my heirs now live I give by these presents all my estate and
 interest in the same to my wife Sarah and her children to have and
 to hold unto them their heirs and assigns forever. I do hereby give
 unto them one hundred acres of land lying in Barren County which
 I purchased of my Grandfather William Hatcher and all
 property I now possess and hold which might get from the estate
 of my Grandfather Hatcher and also that which is coming
 from the estate of my Grandfather Robert Hatcher hereof. If
 the said Sarah and Hatcher should be without an issue
 or with it is my will that the property or estate be equally
 divided between Henry B. Hatcher, Catharine B. Hatcher and
 Judah B. Hatcher this my last will and testament. I
 appoint Henry B. Hatcher my Executor. In witness
 whereof I set my hand and seal this 14th of September 1829
