Will of Almighty to bestow upon me together with what I have former-
ly given to my children as I shall plainly set forth. do by these
present make and ordain this as my last Will and Testament in
witness
the following manner that is to say
first I do will and ~~bequeath~~ unto my beloved Wife Lucy Pulliam
one Negro Woman named Rachael and one Negro Man named Isaac
and one Negro Boy named Jerry and one hundred and fifty Acres of
Land whereon we live also two other small tracts adjoining one of
fifty Acres and the other one hundred and twenty four Acres and
four head of horse Beasts and six head of Choice Cattle also the whole of
the sheep and twenty head of the best Hogs together with the
whole of the household furniture for her support during her
natural life, and then to be disposed of as will be hereafter mentioned.
Secondly, I do give unto my Son Robert Pulliam one Negro Man named
George which I formerly gave into his possession of the value of three
hundred Dollars also two hundred Acres of Land on Green River
in Harlan County part of James Goodens 5000 Acre Survey
Deeded to me from Henry Rennick of the value of one thousand
Dollars— Thirdly I give to my Son Joseph Pulliam one Negro
Man named Aaron which I formerly gave into his possession
of the value of four hundred Dollars and one riding Horse which I
formerly gave into his possession of the value of forty Dollars
Fourthly I give unto my Daughter Mary Dickers one Negro Woman
named Jude which I formerly gave into her possession of the value
of four hundred Dollars also one Horse Beasts formerly given into her
possession of the value of forty Dollars and six shillings in specie
Fifthly I give to my Daughter Sary Pulliam two hundred Acres
of Land on Green River in Barren County whereon she now lives
of the value of eight hundred Dollars which was Patented to James
Harland and conveyed by Deed from M. J. Wood to Gideon Pulliam
husband to said Sary by my direction
Sixthly, I give to my Son Benjamin Pulliam one Negro Man named
Sam which I formerly gave into his possession of the value of four
hundred Dollars also one horse Beasts formerly given into his pos-
session of the value of forty Dollars also one hundred and thirty six Acres
of Land on Green River in Harlan County whereon he lives (which
is Part of William Pollards 19000 Acre Survey) of the value of two
hundred and seventy two Dollars— Seventhly I give unto my Son
Thomas Pulliam one Negro Girl named Isabel which I formerly gave
into her possession of the value of one hundred and sixty six Dollars

Eighthly I give unto my son William Pulliam one hundred Acres of Land on the Waters of Big Barren River no other being Patented to me after of Joshua Jenkins whom said William lives of the value of three hundred and thirty four Dollars also two Horses bracks which I formerly gave him of the value of one hundred and thirty four Dollars also one Negro Woman late yet to be Delivered at the value of two hundred Dollars - Ninthly I give to my Daughter Nancy Thomas one Negro Man named Frank which I formerly gave into her possession of the value of four hundred Dollars also one horse which I formerly gave into her possession of the value of eighty Dollars Tenthly I give to my son John Pulliam six hundred and thirty five Dollars formerly advanced to him and one horse of the value of forty Dollars formerly Delivered to him also George Jack a Negro man now Delivered at \$150.00 - Eleventhly I give to my Daughter Lucy Brooks one Negro girl named Nell formerly given into her possession at the value of two hundred Dollars and one horse formerly given into her possession of the value of forty Dollars also one Negro Boy named to be Delivered at three hundred Dollars Twelfthly I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Amos one Negro girl named Sam formerly given into her possession of the value of one hundred and seventy five Dollars also one Horse formerly given her of the value of forty Dollars - Thirteenthly I give to my son Charles Pulliam one Negro Man named Lewis formerly Delivered to him of the value of five hundred Dollars also one Horse formerly given him of the value of fifty Dollars Fourteenthly I give to my Daughter Mitty Owen one Negro girl named Grace formerly given into her possession of the value of two hundred Dollars also one Horse of the value of forty Dollars formerly given to her Fifteenthly I gave to my son James Pulliam the lands first above Devised to my wife Lucy after her Death also one Negro Boy named Tyeon yet in my possession - Sixteenthly I give to my Daughter Susannah Jarmon one Negro Woman named Mary formerly given into her possession of the value of four hundred Dollars also one Horse formerly given of the value of forty Dollars Seventeenthly I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Amos and Mitty Owen in addition to what is above said two hundred Acres of Land in Livingston County Patented to myself after of Richd B. Pulliam to be Equally Divided between them Eighteenthly of the Negroes yet remaining in my possession that is old Jack and a girl named Sarah not divided to remain until the Death of my wife Lucy & then together with the Negroes that shall remain which is above divided to her to be Equally Divided between my aforesaid Daughters namely Mary Lucy Elizabeth

Milly and Susannah to my son James - And Lastly I do nominate & appoint my sons Benjamin Pulliam Charles J Pulliam and James Pulliam to Execute this my last Will and Testament signed sealed and acknowledged this 27th day of October 1817 in the presence of

A Writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Benjamin Pulliam De^d was exhibited in Court and Summons ordered to be issued for Nitropus & the case come until the next Court, and again at a Court held for & being at the Court House on Monday the 19th day of January 1818 the case of the a^d Will was taken up & John Pulliam came into Court and made oath that a Material Witness to a^d Will was absent and moved the Court for a continuance of the same until the next Court which was granted on the application of the Court of a^d Continuance at which time Court at a Court held for said County at the Court House on the 16th day of February 1818 the said Writing was again exhibited in Court and Jacob Bungardner Christian Bungardner Jesse Wood & Dudley Roundtree Subscribing Witnesses there being sworn and examined and the Arguments of the Counsel for the Parties on both sides being heard and due consideration thereof being had the Court are of opinion that the said Writing does contain the true last Will & Testament of the said Benjamin Pulliam De^d and orders the same to be Recorded
