Any sales of property made by my executors as aforesaid to be made on such terms and in such time as they may think advisable and most conducive to the interest of my estate - At the death of my wife I direct that all my estate and property of whatever kind be equally divided among my children, and to effect an equal and equitable distribution as aforesaid my surviving executor may in his discretion sell the whole or any part of the property aforesaid and divide the proceeds among my children as herein directed - I hereby appoint my beloved wife Fanny Cund and my son Mahalah Price Cund executors of this my last will and testament.
