 Kentucky being very sick & Weak in Body but of perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling
 to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain
 this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principally
 and first of all I Give and Recommend my Soul into the
 hands of almighty God that give it and my Body I
 recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian
 burial at the direction of my Executors nothing Doubting
 but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless this
 life I have devised and disposed of the same in the following
 manner and form

First I Give and bequeath unto Elizabeth my wife
 all my lands Stock of every kind and all my Farming
 Utensils and house hold Furniture During her widow
 hood The Whole being for the use of Raising my Children
 with their Mother & and as hereafter I bequeath to my

three eldest Children namely, Esther & Nicholas and Corinna
 about to the amount of thirty Dollars each the one Daughter about
 and settled likewise wish each of the Sons to have a coat and saddle
 to be given to them at seventeen years of Age and the said to be
 one year old to the rest of my sons namely John & John
 and Samuel also they to have an equal portion with others
 as the now has or shall if Elizabeth my wife should die
 again they Land Stock Farming Utensils and house hold
 Furniture to be sold to at on years credit and divided among
 the whole following my Wife an equal part with the Children
 withholding the calculation of the three eldest Children the
 part they have got with it dividing the whole equally among
 all of them while each Child alike equal and if any of the
 rest of the Children should have received as hereafter mentioned
 the life calculation to be made as with the three eldest
 Children or if my Wife Elizabeth should die during my widow
 hood the said calculation to be made as above stated
 of her constitution make Ordain my Beloved Wife Elizabeth
 and my son Nicholas my sole Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and
 Disannul all and every other former Testament Will
 Legacies bequests and bequests by me in any way or before mentioned
 written and bequeathed to be my last Will and Testament
 this and no other I'm Will respecting I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal Sixteenth day of November 1841
 Thomas Light hundred and thirty
