At Court I Abel Hunt of the State of Kentucky & County of Barren being
well
of sound mind & memory do give & dispose of
my effects in the following manner; first after paying my
just debts I will & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Hunt all
my estate real & personal to her own use & benefit so long as
she shall remain a widow - I give to my son Alexander
Hunt my blacksmiths tools with all that pertains to
them; I also give him the privilege of settling & occupying
part of my land fifty acres when he shall choose not
interfering with the mention thereof or farms occupied
by my wife during the term of her natural life or widow
hood; I further direct that at the decease or marriage
of my wife all my property real & personal shall be sold
at public auction & the money arising therefrom to be
divided into twelve equal parts and disposed of in the
following manner; to my son Oliver Hunt I give one part
with the exception one hundred & fifty which I have already
given him shall be calculated in his part & considered
as so much paid; to my sons Noah Hunt & Daniel Hunt
I give one part; that is one part to be equally divided between
them; to my son Alexander Hunt I give one part; to Alfred
& Alexander Patterson sons of my daughter Hannah Hunt
I give one part; to my daughter Joann Hunt I give one
part; to my daughter Sarah Hunt I give one part; to
my son Alonzo Hunt I give one part; to my daughter
Elizabeth Hunt I give one part; to my son Jeremiah Hunt
I give one part; to my son Wiser Hunt I give one part;
to my son Francis Marion Hunt I give one part; to my
daughter Elizabeth Hunt I give one part; And I do hereby
revoke and disannul all other wills & testaments by me
heretofore made declaring this to be my last will and
testament; lastly I constitute and appoint my wife

bequeath in manner following to-wit - I give to my beloved
wife Judy Bailey during her natural life all my negroes
that I am possessed of and further it is my will that my
wife shall possess all my home hold & kitchen furniture
lamb beds and furniture cupboard Charles benches and
furniture & pork oven &c during her natural life, and
it is further my will that my wife have all my stock
of every description some horses cattle sheep hogs &c
during her natural life and after mine & my wife's death
it is my will & desire that all the property that I am pos-
sessed of at my death I bequeath and divide in manner &
form to-wit - First all my just debts must be paid -
I give to my son Callum H Bailey one negro man named
John - It is my will & desire that my son William J Bailey
shall have the plantations and the land whereon I now live
sit being in Barren County Kentucky on the waters of Bullen
River containing two hundred & thirty six acres by survey -
It is further my will & desire that my son William J Bailey
have a certain negro woman and her increase from this date
named Loma and her two children to-wit a boy named

Round and one named Nelson - I do further my will & desire that all the property I am possessed of at mine and my wife death that is not given and devised to my two sons Lewis Callum H Bailey and William H Bailey above named and the property before named to be sold at a reasonable Credit to soon as it is convenient by my executors and proceeds to be equally divided between my children hereafter named to wit John H Bailey Jesse Bailey Jacob H Bailey Elizabeth Clayton late Elizabeth Bailey Sally I Love late Sally I Bailey Calley I Freeman late Calley I Bailey Henry Shipley late Nancy Bailey Susan Lloyd late Susan H Bailey & Polly Lloyd late Polly Bailey - And lastly it is my will & desire that John Glover & my son Callum H Bailey and William H Bailey be my executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills & testaments heretofore by me made Given under my hand & seal this 14th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three

10 In the name of God Amen I Samuel Marshall of Barren County & State of Kentucky being of sound mind & memory do make Constitute and Ordain that my last will and testament hereby revoking all others - Improving all my debts which are very few and but small to be speedily & promptly paid, and the bequest hereafter bequeathed are to be discharged as soon as circumstances permit and in the

manner directed. I mean it is my will and desire that my beloved wife Abigail Marshall shall possess and inherit the following property for and during her natural life to wit one negro man named Lewis and a negro girl named Cinderella and at her death the above named negroes shall descend to her five children forever to wit James Harmon Marshall Mary Fann Marshall Robert Fowler Marshall Rachel Margaret Marshall Sarah Ellenides Marshall to be equally divided between them but with this reserved that my son Robert I Marshall shall be particularly attended to to have a support &c. - It is for his my will and desire that the balance of my property to wit shall be disposed in manner I found that my three daughters above named Mary, Rachel & Sarah E Marshall shall have a horse saddle bridle & blanket & a cow bedstead bed & furniture to make them equal with my other daughters that are married over & above the property named - I mean it is my will & desire that my beloved wife in addition to what I have bequeathed to her that she shall enjoy the plantation on which I live during her natural life time for the purpose of supporting my son Robert I Marshall, and in case he should out live his mother that he shall be supported out of the proceeds of the above named property - I mean it is my will and desire that my beloved wife shall have as much timber as shall be sufficient to keep up the buildings & fences on said farm that is to say the old survey including the land which I bought from William Bennett - I mean it is my will and desire that the property which I have not yet disposed of shall be sold on such Credit as my executors may think proper and the proceeds equally divided between my beloved wife giving her a share part in addition to what I have already bequeathed with all my children John C Marshall Ahm Marshall Andrew Marshall Elizabeth Marshall Samuel Marshall James H Marshall Robert I Marshall Mary Fann Marshall Rachel M Marshall & Sarah E Marshall. Given under my hand this 10th day of December 1842
