In the name of God Amen I Daniel Stockton of Barren County & State of Kentucky being weak in body but of Perfect mind & memory looking unto my mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & Testament—that is to say Principally & first of all give & Recommend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that give it me & my body I Recommend to the latter to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors I do having such worldly estate whereof hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give & Dispose of the same in the following manner & form First I give & bequeath to Susanna Stockton my dearly Beloved wife & Heir my eldest son I Heigh Stockton my youngest son & the Child my Wife is now at this time Pregnant with if it should be born living each of them an Equal Share of all I singular my Lands & Tenements & all my Estate by him and them truly to be Disposed I likewise constitute make & ordain my Wife Susanna Stockton the sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament with this assent that Francis Lattimore is to see there is nothing in no part of my Estate Destroyed or put to other use than for her or their support or if it appears to the Lattimore that Susanna my Wife is extravagant with my Estate or putting it to any other use than for the lawful support of herself & Children no more make it appear by testimony then that Lattimore is to see my Executors & make an Equal Division as aforesaid Lattimore is to see that my Children are Educated & that I shall be brought in a virtuous line of life or if my Wife Susanna Stockton shall marry then Lattimore is also to be my Executor & make such Division as is above Directed I take such Children & do by them as he thinks is most to their advantage & I leave to Susanna my wife charge of Estate is to return to my Children at the Lattimore

(1) I do hereby utterly Disallow Revoke & disannul all & every other former will & Testament legacies bequeathed by me in any wise before mentioned with & without Ratifying & Confirming this is all other to be my last will & Testament at McIntosh where I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 14th Day of April in the year 1800

1. I do make or bequeath to my well beloved Wife Rach Smith the plantation whereon I now live during her life time and at her death to be equally divided between my well beloved Children (viz) Mary Jane & Melissa and my beloved wife Rachael Smith being now pregnant in case the child survive I will it an Equal Share in the land with my other beloved Children 2. I do allow my Negro man James to be and one half the price of James I do bequeath or make over to my beloved wife Rachael Smith to help to support my beloved Children and the other half the price of James I do bequeath or make over to my beloved Children as also mentioned to be equally divided among them at the age of Age - 3. I do allow my pairhead of horse bridle to be sold to the highest bidder at two years credit the price of Horse to be equally divided among my beloved wife

and the parts coming to my beloved wife Rachael when due and let out on interest till they come of age. And all the remainder of my Stock & household goods and furniture to be at the disposal of my beloved wife Rachael Smith In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Seal this eighth day of September 1800
