Item 6th. My Will and desire is, that all the rest of my Estate of every description be equally divided between all my childrens; Viz. Rebecca Dale, Nancy Shely, Hannah Shely, William Dale, John Dale, Melly Gore, Elizabeth Shely, Isaac Dale, Anne Dale, & Rosanna Dale, for them & their heirs forever to enjoy the same forever.

I am, &c. I hereby constitute and appoint my son Reuben Dale
my friend Shaver Hardy, Executors of this my last Will & Testament
revoking all Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made and
do declare this to be my last Will & Testament given under my hand
and seal the 19th day of September 1816.
