E. Duvose, I Elisha Duvose, of Kentucky State and County of Barren being
 Will & of sound mind and memory, but weak in body, and well knowing
 that according to the dispensation of the Almighty, my mortal body
 must be dissolved and die and wishing to make such disposition
 of ~~the~~ ^{my} earthly Estate, with which it hath pleased the Almighty Father
 of the Universe to bless me as appears just. do hereby make my last
 will and Testament in the manner and form following To wit, In the
 first place I wish all my just debts punctually paid and my funeral
 expences defrayed, and then my Will and Desire is that my beloved Wife
 Mary Duvose be invested with the full complete uninterrupted use and
 possession of all my estate both real and personal during her
 Natural life then my will and desire is that at the death of my
 said Wife that my beloved Brother Cornelius Duvose shall have my Negro
 Man Stephen and Harriet daughter of my Negro Woman Esther and the
 increase of said Harriet and that my Negro Woman Esther and the rest
 of her increase shall belong to Moses Cox (Dec^d) who married Sarah Bell.

 marry again, that said Esther and her increase shall belong to said children
 her by his present wife, and in Case Cornelius Duvose present Wife
 should die and he marry again that the Children he shall have on my
 have shall have the aforesaid estate together to him, and my Will and
 desire is that John Walker Bull son of my said Wife at the death of my
 said Wife, shall have ~~one~~ sixth part of my estate and that my beloved
 Brother Samuel Duvose and Jonathan Duvose shall each have one
 sixth part of my estate, and my Will and desire further is that John
 Duvose eldest son of my said Brother Cornelius Duvose, and Israel
 Cox eldest son of said Moses Cox shall each have one twelfth part of
 my estate, and if ~~any~~ the said Negroes bequeathed to said Moses Cox and
 Cornelius Duvose, should exceed what will be one sixth part, of my
 Estate to each of them that they shall pay the surplus to be equally divided
 among the rest above named, according to their parts, and if said Negroes
 should not amount, to what would make to said Moses Cox & Cornelius Duvose
 one sixth part of my estate, that then the Legators above named shall pay
 in proportion to their parts what will make up the deficiency. My Will
 further is that John Walker Bull pay ^{to} Moses Cox out of his part of my Estate one
 hundred dollars in Silver with lawful Interest on the same so that my
 will may be fully executed: which is that at my beloved Wifes death, the said
 Moses Cox and Cornelius Duvose should each have one sixth part, of
 my estate including the Negroes as bequeathed to them and that John Walker
 first named should have one sixth part of my estate except the above ~~100~~
 he is to pay to Moses Cox that my Brothers Saml and Jonathan Duvose should
 each have one sixth part, and that John Duvose and Israel Cox should
 each have one twelfth of my said Estate, and that if the Legators cannot agree
 price of the Negroes, that good honest disinterested men to be mutually
 chosen by them shall ascertain the value at the time of my Wifes
 Death, & I do further provide that if any of the above named Negroes
 should die before the division, that the property or estate herein bequeathed
 shall be divided so that each ones part first mentioned shall have
 one sixth part, except John Duvose & Israel Cox above named
 who is only to have ^{each} one twelfth part of my said Estate. And I do hereby
 appoint my beloved Brother Cornelius Duvose and Moses Cox above
 mentioned my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. hereby
 revoking all other Wills made by me In Testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this 19th day of January 1824.

Dougherty's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Robert Dougherty of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky do make ordain and declare this Instrument which is written with my own hand, and subscribed with my name to be my Last Will and Testament revoking all others.

Impremus. All my Debts which are very few, and but small are to be speedily and punctually paid, and the legacies here after bequeathed are to be discharged as soon as Circumstances will permit, and in the manner directed— Item To my beloved wife Nancy Dougherty I give and bequeath four Negroes, to wit, my Negro Man James, and his Wife named Nancy, a Negro Woman named Moriah and one named Lucy now lent to, and living at present with David Allen to be the property of my said Wife and their increase during her natural life and also the Mansion house and other buildings which I now occupy, to be included by one half part of one hundred and twenty Acres more or less whereon the stand for and during her Natural life; together with the whole of the household furniture and furniture of the Kitchen; together with the Stock of horses, Cattle, Sheep & hogs with the Poultry of any description; for and during her Natural life time and no longer, except as to such particular part, or parts as is or are, herein after, designated and disposed of.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Allen one Negro Girl named Clara, daughter of Lucy above named, now in said Marys Possession, going on four years old, to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Robert Dougherty the competency use and

311 benefit, of the residue of the aforesaid tract of Land after the one half is laid off to my wife as aforesaid; which will contain about eighty five Acres together with a ^{my} twenty five acres adjoining on the North East, which I purchased of Joel Miller and an Entry of one hundred Acres, which I made adjoining on the South East, or so much of said Entry as shall obtain or be held from a prior claim or claims, which I allow him the use benefit and profit of for and during the natural life of my said Wife his (mother) and no longer; provided also that she shall occasionally be supplied with fire-wood and timber for all necessary repairs about her farm if not to be had on her own part, off or out, of said residue above mentioned, and I also give unto my said son Robert, one Negro boy named Lewis, now about fourteen years old, which Negro it is my Will and desire shall remain in the possession of my said Wife, until my said son, shall arrive at the age of twenty five years unless she may think proper to deliver him sooner, and that, said Robert shall retain and be entitled to a three year old boy, named, with some white in her face now called his, and that he shall be allowed as soon as possible to go one year to school without interruption to school to some qualified teacher who shall teach him reading writing & arithmetic and English grammar the expense of which shall be paid from, or out of the proceeds of the farm and Stock before named, and also his clothing) and he shall also be entitled to and have the cott which my old black man will have next, he having put his last season to Cole Mitchell blue called whip, said Negro slave and Cott to him this Heirs forever— Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Dougherty one black slave three years old next spring, Crop-bred and white in her face & feet, now called his, — Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Gaspaway and her Heirs forever one Negro Girl three years old, named Mary as soon as she is ready to remove to Christian County— Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah one Negro Girl named King provided said Girl King shall continue with her in the possession and under the government, and tuition of my said Nancy Dougherty until she is twenty one years of age, which will be fourteen years from this date she now being seven years old, (should my said Wife continue to live that long) but in case of her decease, at any period, before that time said Negro shall immediately descend to and be delivered to my said daughter Sarah, provided however should said Sarah herself decease at any time previous to that date to wit, the year eighteen hundred and thirty six then in that case said Girl King shall be delivered to and be the property of my daughter Nancy from and after said date, (in case of the survival of my said wife said Negro continuing with her as before mentioned) but in case she deceases sooner than said date then in that case my said daughter Nancy shall have said Girl forever from thence.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Dougherty one Negro boy named Miller, 12 years old, which Negro it is my Will desire and injunction shall continue in the possession of my said Wife as her entire
