lawful age at which time I wish the said Negro to be sold
and equally divided between the four daughters of Jimima
Douglass namely Lemira Polly, Tabitha & Rachel & their heirs
I give devise to my daughter Peggy Benick one Negro slave named
Lucas until her daughter Abby becomes of lawful age at which
time I wish the said Negro to be sold and equally divided between
three of her daughters namely Rachel, Polly and Abby, to have
their heirs forever

I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Polly Balis one
Negro woman named bales and one hundred dollars in
cash to her, her heirs forever
I give devise and bequeath unto my grand Son William Smith
(son of Rachel) one negre boy named Josh to him his heirs forever
I give devise and bequeath to my three grand daughters Polly
Smith Lemira Fox & Lizabeth Smith three Negroes namely Moll
Jenny and Lucy to them their heirs forever. Provided they can-
not agree in the division themselves I wish them to chose three
more of barrader to make the division.

I give devise and bequeath to my grand daughter Rachel Wood
one feather Bed and furniture to her her heirs forever
I give devise and bequeath to my grand Son William Smith
one Negro slave named Josh to him his heirs forever

me. Negro boy names Mark to him his heirs forever
I give devise and bequeath to my Grand Son Will. Benicks
and daughter Ann Benicks and Negro Girl name Amy to
them their heirs forever
I give devise and bequeath to my three Grand Sons Jas. Benicks
Lattimore Benicks and Sam. Benicks one hundred and fifty Acres
of Land to be equally divided between them as they become of age
beginning at the Beginning corner of the Meeting house Lot of
ored Oaks and thence running East to my line of the Land
