At a County Court held for said County at the Courthouse on Saturday the 1st of February 1820 the foregoing Indentment in Writing purporting to be the last Will of Henry T. Swearingin Decd. was exhibited in Court and Joseph R. Underwood one of the subscribing Witnesses thereto being sworn deposed and said that the said Henry T. Swearingin did in his presence pronounce the said Writing to be his Will and that he believed he was in his proper senses and of a disposing mind & Edmund Rogers & Henry M. Underwood being sworn said that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Henry T. Swearingin and that they believe that the said instrument of writing was wholly written by the said H. T. Swearingin Decd. and thereupon the said Writing was established as the true last Will & Testament of the said Henry T. Swearingin Decd. and Ordered to be Recorded as such.
