my wife during my wife's lifetime of
said land and after my wife's death
desire that my son in law Alfred Button
and my daughter Martha his wife have
my home tract of land and one field on
Spots Creek known by the name of the
cherry field and my daughter Emma
Tuder have the balance of the tract
I desire that my wife have my negro
man Mike during her life and after
her death then he have the privilege
of choosing his master and be sold
and the proceeds equally divided between
my children I desire that my wife have
all my perishable property and money
after paying my debts and if she
should wish to sell any part of
the stock on the farm that she may
not want to keep and whereas I have
lately given to my son Watson Tuder
and Jacob Keeler my son in law
each a tract of land on Spots Creek
I desire that they have no more
of my estate except their proportionable
part of the negro man Mike as heretofore
stated and I hereby appoint my son
Watson Tuder and my son in law
Alfred Button my Executors to this my
last will and testament this 10th day
of February 1856
