I Henry Judd senior of Warren County in the State
of Kentucky being in perfect health but of sound mind
and memory and calling to mind his Morality and conscience
of this life do make and Ordain this to be my last will
and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit
First I will and Desire that my well beloved Wife
Henry Judd have the use & my whole Estate both
Real and personal her life except the land that my
sons John & Henry lives on I will and Desire that
my son John Judd have the tract of Land that I
now live on and one Negro Boy by the name of Sam
off his Mother Drab & also my big Calico & big Bibles
one Bed and furniture

I Will and desire that my Daughter Susan Jones have
my Negro Girl by the name of Serena on Bed and fur-
niture one horse and Saddle & Bridle to be considered equal
in value to those that I have given my other Daughters
I Will and desire at the death of my wife & my Sister
that my Negro woman should & shall be valued by two
Disinterested persons and that she have her share in as
much of my Daughters Susan my Geo or Phoebe Enicks
and there as she chose to go to pay the other one half her
value in eighteen Months after they get her an
p^{ro}p^{er} person

I will and desire that my sons John Henry Juden have the track of Lands they live on to be equally divided between them also my Negro man Solomon to be valued by two Disinterested persons and that he have his choice in a Master of my sons John and Henry and the one he choises to go to shall pay the other one half his value in eight months after he gets him in possession.

I will and desire that my son Absolam Juden have one Bed and furniture and a big Chest of Drawers one hundred Dollars being out of the value of my parish lot property at the demand of my Wife provided their chests not be enough to make up one hundred Dollars it shall be made up out of the Estate that I have given his Brothers & Sister except my Daughter Nancy.

I will and desire that my son Henry Juden have one Bed and furniture if he comes back from Orleans if he should never come back I wish it sold and the Money Equally divided among my other sons.

I will and desire that my Plantation Windows and Kitchen furniture be Equally divided between my two sons Absolam & John Juden. I will and desire that my Bed and furniture be sold and the money divided between my two Daughters Susanna Lee & Phoebe Enick.

I will and appoint my three sons John Henry & Absolam Juden Executors to this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Seventh day of June 1815.
