 children of the said Henry White and their lawful heirs

Now therefore we the undersigned children heirs and legates aforesaid of said Henry
 White and Elizabeth White deceased believing it would be to our interest to
 have a speedy sale and division of said estate do advise and consent and hereby
 authorize and request Joseph White and Simons White the Executors named in
 the aforesaid will that they forthwith bid on Wednesday the 18th Inst proceed
 and sell to the highest bidder on liveable men the said all the aforesaid personal
 estate and slaves together with the present growing crop and that they pay
 to Sept Halloway seventy dollars one of the proceeds of said estate as a full
 compensation for his services as an overseer for said Elizabeth White Deed
 the present year he having consented thereto and that they dispose of and divide
 the balance of said proceeds agreeably to the provisions of the will aforesaid.
