 I Will and desire that my Lands and every species of my property may be sold at twelve Months Credit and after my just debts are paid the balance of the money arising from the sale to be appropriated to the raising and Education of my Children who have not been raised and educated in that way that is thought to be most advantageous by my surviving friends James Hill Nelson Hill and Susannah Fitzjerrald
 2^d It is my Will and desire that my Children shall not be bound out nor put out to strangers but that they shall live with my three above named friends James Hill Nelson Hill and Susannah Fitzjerrald and be divided amongst them in that way they think best— 3^d When my youngest Child arrives of age it is my Will if there should be any money which has not been appropriated in the raising and educating of my Children that it shall be Equally divided amongst all my surviving Children and the heirs of any who may have married

Bybee In the name of God Amen I John Bybee of the County of
Barren and State of Kentucky being in good health and in perfect
mind and memory thanks be given to God calling unto mind the mortality
of my body and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die
do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say
first of all I give and bequeath to the earth to be buried in
Robert Christian Burial at the discretion of Executors Nothing doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to
bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form

First I give and bequeath to my son John Bybee a certain black Horse
to my son Le Bybee a Saddle mare also a cow and Wmams saddle Also
to my son Thomas Bybee two hundred acres of land head right lying in Barren
County in the County and State aforesaid & also to my son Le Bybee five
dollars cash the balance of my property I wish to be equally divided amongst
all my children after my decease & likewise constitute make and ordain
my son Thomas Bybee and Le Bybee the sole Executors of this my
last will and testament and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke
and disannul all and every former testament wills bequest and
Executors by me or any one before named written and bequeathed
testifying and confirming in this and no other to be my last will
and testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
