In the name of God Amen I John Courts of the
County of Barren & State of Kentucky of lawful age do make
this Instrument of writing my last Will and Testament setting
nothing at others heretofore made by me.
First I Give and bequeath to my wife Fanny Courts our Negro
girl named Nancy all the House hold and kitchen furniture
and all the stock of cattle horses and hogs for I during her
widowhood to be kept & used by her for the support of
herself and my children Nancy Courts Clara Courts Eliza
H Courts William J Courts Richard B Courts John Courts
Amanda Courts Emily Jane Courts & Maria Courts in
such manner as my wife may think proper and in case
of her Marriage a second time then it is my Will that the said
property should be divided between my wife and the whole
of my children according to the laws of the land.
Secondly It is my Will and Desire that five hundred acres
of land with all the improvements thereon including
my Powder Mills grist mill and Saw Mill lying in
the County of Hardin together with all the utensils of
every description used in and attached to said Mills for
carrying on business at said Mills shall be reserved by my
Estate to be used in the manner hereinafter directed.
The said five hundred Acres to be laid off as follows
