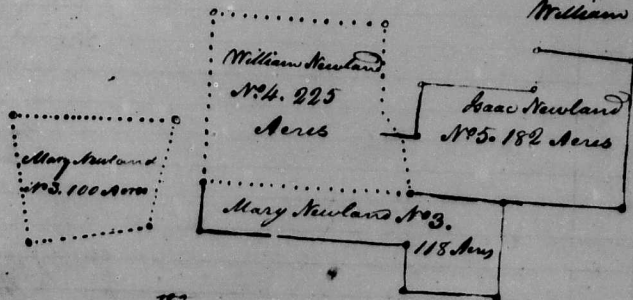


328 We the undersigned Commissioners appointed to settle with the Administrator of Eysiehl Newland deceased have after carefully examining all the bonds, accounts, sales and papers which were laid before us proceeded to settle with John A Newland the Acting Administrator of the said Eysiehl Newland of deceased and find him to be indebted to the Estate two hundred and forty dollars, this settlement took place in the year 1821. as Witness our hand & this 16th day of January 1824

In pursuance of his Compliance with an Order of the County Court of Barron in November 1819. to us deceased we have proceeded to lay off divide and allot to the Heirs and Children of Eysiehl Newland &c.
their separate parts, and Portions of said Deceaseds Estate as followeth
viz To John A Newland 163 Acres of Land (Lot No 2) also three Negroes
viz old Woman Clea, (Girl) Betsy, (child) Jolly, also thirty two dollars
To William Newland, two hundred & twenty five Acres of Land (Lot No 4)
Also two Negroes a man named Peter and a Girl named Charity also
thirty two dollars,
To Isaac Newland 182 Acres of Land Lot No 5. also two Negroes a man
named Jacob and a boy named Washenlow Also thirty two dollars
To Joseph W Newland 210 7/8 Acres Land Lot No 1. Also two Negroes a
Woman named Hannah and boy named Elias also thirty two dollars
To Mary M. Newland 218 Acres of Land Lot No 3. Also three Negroes two
boys, named Bob and Sam, a Girl named Maria also thirty two dollars
The different lots of Land as numbered and stated above will be
properly designated in the plat of the Surveyor, of same given under
our hand & this 16th January 1824.

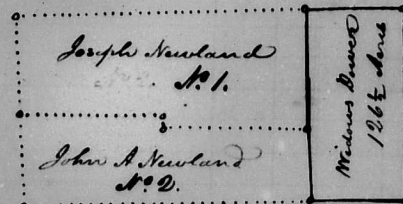

Daughter. Part of Eysiehl Newlands Deceaseds land Daring in the Land Slaves &c of her late
Husband Deceased, as followeth, To wit, one hundred twenty six and half acres
of Land, Beginning at a Sugar tree beach and white Oak, at Mrs. Wallers spring
thence South 101 poles, to a Stake. E 200 poles, to a beach and Hickory. N 101. poles
to Corner, thence West 200 to the Beginning as will appear more fully
by the plat and Survey hereto annexed Also a Negro Woman, named
Betsy, and her four Children (viz) Ann, Emmely, Irena (Girls) and

Therewith a bay which fine Negroes was appraised to \$125. dollars
 Also eighty dollars &c. from the amount sales of the said decedent's personal
 estate as Mintrip now hands this 16th January 1824.
